DAVID TANN, COLORADO MESA

SENIOR, RB, 5-10, 215

CEDAR RAPIDS, IOWA



David Tann ran for a career-high 272 yards on Saturday in an 87-14 win at New Mexico Highlands University.

As a team, CMU rushed for an RMAC Record 708 yards and totaled an RMAC Record 933 yards of total offense. His four rushing touchdowns were part of an RMAC record 10 rushing touchdowns on

the day.

CMU scored 11 total touchdowns, tying the RMAC record.



2016 NFFCC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK



SEPTEMBER 5

JUSTIN DVORAK, COLORADO SCHOOL OF MINES (SENIOR, QB, 6-0, 220, TOMBALL, TEXAS)

Justin Dvorak threw for six touchdowns and 402 yards in #18/21 Colorado School of Mines' 57-21 rout of #5/4 CSU-Pueblo. Dvorak played only three quarters but put up huge numbers on efficient 27-of-36 passing, including four of his six touchdown throws coming in a 36-point second quarter. Dvorak was not sacked or intercepted in the game. He became Mines' career touchdown pass leader in the process and now has 87.



SEPTEMBER 12

DUSTIN RIVAS, COLORADO MESA UNIVERSITY (JUNIOR, S, 5-11, 180, THORNTON, COLO./HORIZON HIGH SCHOOL)

Dustin Rivas helped the Colorado Mesa Mavericks stay undefeated with a 47-33 win against Chadron State College on Saturday. Rivas finished the game with three interceptions, including a pick six for 22 yards. He added six tackles (four solo) and returned two punts for 42 yards, both for 21 yards. In two games this season, Rivas has accounted for 14 tackles (eight solo), three punt returns for 43 yards, 67 all-purpose yards and defended three passes.



SEPTEMBER 19

AUSTIN EKELER, WESTERN COLORADO UNIVERSITY (SENIOR, RB, 6-0, 195, EATON, COLO./EATON HIGH SCHOOL)

Austin Ekeler ran for 283 yards and two touchdowns in Western State's 24-15 win over Chadron State. The 283 yards is the second most single game rushing yards in Ekeler's career and the seventh most in school history. With the score 17-15 in the middle of the fourth quarter, Ekeler broke a 69-yard run for a touchdown solidifying Western's lead and the victory. Ekeler leads the RMAC in rushing yards and rushing touchdowns.



SEPTEMBER 26

STEVEN MONTEZ, COLORADO (R-FRESHMAN, QB, 6-5, 225, EL PASO, TEXAS/DEL VALLE HIGH SCHOOL)

In Colorado's 41-38 win at Oregon, redshirt freshman Steven Montez made his first collegiate start, completing 23 of 32 passes for 333 yards (three touchdowns/two interceptions), for a passer rating of 177.7. He also had 21 rushes for 135 yards (6.4 per), with a touchdown and a long run of 32 yards. It all added up to 468 yards of total offense and 23 first downs earned (eight rush/15 passing). His 135 yards rushing were the most in a debut by a starting quarterback. His 468 yards of total offense were the fourth-most in a single-game in Colorado history. It was the first-ever 300 passing/100 rushing game in school history and just the second 200/100 game. His 14 straight completions in the first half tied for the second-most in school history (; it matched the most in one game.



OCTOBER 3, 2016

SHAY FIELDS, COLORADO (JUNIOR, WR, 5-11, 180, BELLFLOWER, CALIF./ST. JOHN BOSCO)

In CU's 47-6 win over Oregon State, Fields caught seven passes for 169 yards, with three touchdowns (covering 51, 33 and 63 yards), and earned five first downs in all. He became just the fourth Buffalo to have three touchdowns receiving in a game, joining Richard Johnson vs. Kansas in Boulder, Nov. 13, 1982; Rae Carruth vs. Iowa State in Boulder, Nov. 3, 1996; and Nelson Spruce vs. California at Berkeley, Sept. 27, 2014 (but is the first Buffalo to have three touchdown receptions in a single half). The 169 yards are the 14th most in Colorado history, and he now has nine career plays over 50 yards, four this year. He moved into 10th place all-time in receiving yards at CU with 1,544 yards.



OCTOBER 10, 2016

BERNARD McDONDLE, CSU-PUEBLO (JUNIOR, RB, 5-9, 188 | LITTLETON, COLO./COLUMBINE)

Bernard McDondle totaled 151 of his career-high 276 yards in the first half on Saturday in a road win against Adams State University. He also tallied three of his four rushing touchdowns in the first two quarters. McDondle rushed 18 times to average 15.3 yards per carry. The junior's long rush was for 80 yards to the end zone at the tail end of the third quarter. His other three scores came from 43, 32 and 20 yards out. The four touchdowns are the most by an RMAC rusher this season. He has rushed for more than 100 yards in each of his four games played.

OCTOBER 17, 2016

PHILLIP LINDSAY, COLORADO (JUNIOR, TB, 5-8, 190, AURORA, COLO.)

In Colorado's 40-16 win over No. 24 (USA Today/Coaches) Arizona State, Lindsay rushed 26 times for 219 yards and three touchdowns (8.4 per carry; along with 4-20 receiving). Against the nation's No. 5 rushing defense, Lindsay had his third 100-yard career rushing game and his first 200-yard game (he did not lose any yards, and has 618 gross yards and 614 net on the season); it was the sixth-highest game in CU history with no yards lost rushing. His 75-yard touchdown run was the longest play of his career and the 25th rushing of 75 yards or longer in Colorado annals. Lindsay became the 13th player to gain 3,000 all-purpose yards in school history (ending the game with 3,204); he also became the 14th member of CU's 500/500 Club (rushing and receiving yards).



OCTOBER 24, 2016

DAVID TANN, COLORADO MESA (SENIOR, RB, 5-10, 215, CEDAR RAPIDS, IOWA)

David Tann tied the RMAC record for rushing touchdowns with six Saturday night in a 63-42 win over Adams State University. Tann also caught a 72-yard touchdown pass. Overall Tann finished with 157 rushing yards, 105 receiving yards and 262 yards of total offense. His seven touchdowns in a game is one shy of the RMAC record. Tann scored the first seven straight touchdowns for CMU in the win over Adams State.
