**Ucla** UCLA has posted a 13-9 overall record against ranked opponents under Coach Mora and has won seven of the last 10... 2016: 0-2 --L v. Utah, L v. #7 Stanford; 2015: 4-1 --W @ #18 Utah W #20 Cal, L at #15 Stanford, W at #16 Arizona; W #19 BYU; 2014: 4-1 -- W #11 Kansas St., W #24 USC, W #14 Arizona, L vs. #12 Oregon, W at #15 ASU.

**Ucla** The Bruins have lost five games this season by a total of 32 points (6.4 avg. margin). In each of those games, they have had the ball with a final possession and a chance to tie or take the lead. The biggest margin was 9 points to Stanford after the Cardinal returned a Josh Rosen fumble for a touchdown on the final play of the game.

**Ucla** DE Takkari McKinley ranks first in the nation in tackles for loss/g (2.0) and has 13.0 tackles for loss in the last six contests. His total of 5.0 tackles for loss v. Utah was most by a Bruin since Damien Holmes had same number at Colorado in 2012 and is the most by a P12 player this season. Donnie Edwards is the only Bruin with more than 5.0 TFLs in game. Edwards had a school record 6.0 TFLs at Arizona in 1994 and 5.5 vs. SMU in 1994 (records date to 1985).

**Ucla** Bruin opponents are completing just 50.5% of their pass attempts this season, lowest mark in the Pac-12. The unit ranks 7th in the nation in pass efficiency defense (98.94), 2nd in P12. The yield of 5.4 yards per pass attempt is tied for lowest in the P12 this season with CU. Last time a Bruin defense held opponents below 50% was in 2001 (47.3%).

**PASADENA, Calif. (AP)** – Colorado ran 114 plays and held the ball for more than 41 minutes while the latest wave of injuries washed over UCLA's already battered defense. The weary Bruins weathered everything the Buffaloes could manage.

Soso Jamabo rushed for the go-ahead touchdown with 8:28 to play and the Bruins escaped. Josh Rosen passed for 262 yards and a touchdown for the Bruins, who won despite giving up 18 consecutive points in the second half and yielding 554 total yards. Rosen's 407 yards of total offense ranked as the ninth-best total in UCLA history and the 11th of at least 400 yards.

The Buffaloes dominated possession to an extraordinary degree, forcing UCLA's defense to stay on the field for 55 more snaps than its counterpart, including a 40-4 CU edge in the second quarter.

"That was the longest game I've ever played on defense, ever," said junior linebacker Jayon Brown, who led the Bruins with 18 tackles, the most since Randall Goforth registered 19 in a 2013 game at Stanford. "This was a first, just between the injuries we

had, the new injuries we got and all their first downs. Hope we don't ever have another one like this, but if we do, we'll be ready."

Patrick Carr rushed for 110 yards, and his TD run put Colorado into the lead, 31-28, with 12:04 to play. The Bruins answered with Jamabo's score before stopping the Buffaloes twice in UCLA territory on an 87-degree Halloween day in the Arroyo Seco. Junior defensive end Takkarist McKinley's pressure forced a poor throw by Sefo Liufau on fourth down with 3:34 to play. Later, freshman backup defensive back Nate Meadors intercepted a pass by Liufau near midfield with 51 seconds left.

"That was about as gritty a win as I've ever been around," UCLA coach Jim Mora said. "To overcome the things that we overcame in terms of personnel, that was staggering. I couldn't tell you who was in there on any given play. From cramps to sprained ankles to hamstrings, and then a true freshman seals it - a safety playing corner. That's a team win."

Paul Perkins had an 82-yard touchdown run among his 118 yards and two scores for UCLA, and Ishmael Adams returned an interception 96 yards for a second-quarter touchdown. Nate Starks rushed for a score for UCLA, which still could win the Pac-12 South by winning its final four regular-season games.

Liufau went 37 of 57 for 312 yards while Colorado set a school record for plays. The Buffs outgained UCLA by 144 yards, but still lost their 20th straight game against ranked teams, including 25 straight

The biggest margin was 9 points to Stanford after the Cardinal returned a Josh Rosen fumble for a touchdown on the final play of the game.

\*\*The record of the five teams to have beaten UCLA is a combined 30-12 (Utah 7-2, A&M 7-1, WSU 6-2, ASU 5-4, Stan 5-3).

\*\*DE Takkarist McKinley ranks first in the nation in tackles for loss/g (2.0) and has 13.0 tackles for loss in the last six contests ... His total of 5.0 tackles for loss v. Utah was most by a Bruin since Damien Holmes had same number at Colorado in 2012 and is the most by a P12 player this season. Donnie Edwards is the only Bruin with more than 5.0 TFLs in game. Edwards had a school record 6.0 TFLs at Arizona in 1994 and 5.5 vs. SMU in 1994 (records date to 1985).

\*\*WR Darren Andrews, who had a career-best 9 receptions vs. Arizona, has made at least two catches in each of the last 16g -- over the last 4 games he has 25 catches for 292 yards.

\*\*Darren Andrews (980 yds) and Kenneth Walker (909) enter the Colorado game with over 900 career receiving yards. There have been 34 Bruins to previously reach that 1,000-yard milestone.

\*\*WR Jordan Lasley has 15 catches in the last three games and a scoring reception (52 yd at ASU, 5 at WSU, 75 v. Utah) in each.

\*\*The Bruins total of 510 yards gained vs. Utah was the most since it racked up 554 in game 10 of 2015 vs. Washington State.

\*\*UCLA allowed just one play of over 40 yards in the first seven games of the season. Utah had six such plays in the last game.

Three Bruin coaches and 12 players, including 2014 inductee John Sciarra, 2012 inductee Jonathan Ogden, 2010 inductee Randy Cross and 2008 inductee Troy Aikman, are enshrined in the National Football Foundation Hall of Fame.

UCLA has 15 former players working in the broadcast media - Troy Aikman, Charles Arbuckle, Wayne Cook, Randy Cross, Terry Donahue, Danny Farmer, Ryan Nece, Rick Neuheisel, David Norrie, Ron Pitts, Tom Ramsey, Matt Stevens, J.J. Stokes, Rick Walker, James Washington.

Five Bruins have been voted in to the NFL Hall of Fame-OL Johnathan Ogden-2013; QB Troy Aikman-2006; DB Jimmy Johnson-1994; WR/coach Tom Fears-1970; QB/P/PK/DB Bob Waterfield-1965.

The selection of defensive lineman Kenny Clark by the Green Bay Packers in the first round of the 2016 NFL draft marked the 32nd time a UCLA player has been taken in round one.

Twenty-two UCLA players have been selected to CoSIDA Academic All-America teams a total of 27 times. Offensive lineman Chris Joseph (2006, 2007) and wide receiver Cormac Carney (1981, 1982) were two-time first-team selections.

UCLA has produced six quarterbacks — Troy Aikman, Steve Bono, Billy Kilmer, Tommy Maddox, Tom Ramsey, Jay Schroeder — to have played that position on a Super Bowl team.

Quarterback Drew Olson finished eighth in the 2005 Heisman Trophy balloting. It marked the 21st time that a Bruin has finished in the top 10 of the Heisman Trophy voting.

UCLA has had at least one former player be a member of one of the teams in 32 of the last 35 Super Bowl games.

The only three-time consensus All-Americans in Pac-10 history are Bruins (LB Jerry Robinson and S Kenny Easley).

Since 2000, UCLA has had 20 finalists / winners of National player awards --- 2015 Ka'imi Fairbairn - Lou Groza Award winner; 2014 Eric Kendricks - Lott IMPACT Award winner; Butkus Award winner; Brett Hundley - Manning Award finalist, Unitas Award finalist; 2013 Anthony Barr - Lott IMPACT Trophy winner, Lombardi Award finalist, Bednarik Award finalist; Myles Jack - Hornung Award finalist; 2012 Johnathan Franklin - Doak Walker Award finalist; 2009 Kai Forbath - Groza Award winner; 2005 Mercedes Lewis-Mackey Award winner; 2004 M. Lewis, Mackey finalist; 2002 Mike Seidman-Mackey finalist; 2004 Chris Kluwe-Ray Guy Award finalist; 2003 Dave Ball-Bronco Nagurski Award finalist; 2001 Robert Thomas-Dick Butkus Award finalist; 2000 Freddie Mitchell-Fred Biletnikoff Award finalist; 2003 D. Ball-Vince Lombardi Award finalist; 2006 Justin Hickman-Ted Hendricks Award finalist; 2003 D. Ball-Ted Hendricks Award finalist; 2003 D. Ball-Chevrolet National Defensive Player of the Year Award.

On May 13, 2007 UCLA became the first school in history to win 100 NCAA team championships. The Bruins currently have 113 NCAA titles to their credit (winning Men's Water Polo in 2015).

**OTHER TIDBITS**

**VS. COLORADO** - UCLA leads the series with Colorado by a 9-2 count. The Bruins have won all five meetings since the Buffs joined the Pac-12 Conference in 2011.

Last year in the Rose Bowl, Colorado ran 114 plays from scrimmage, including a 40-4 edge in plays during the second quarter, and held the ball for more than 41 minutes, but the Bruins came away with a 35-31 win. Soso Jamabo ran for the deciding score midway through the fourth quarter. Josh Rosen passed for 262 yards and a touchdown pass. The Bruins endured an 18-0 scoring run by Colorado in the second half after building a 21-6 lead at the intermission. CU went ahead 31-28 after scoring on a fumble return and a short run in the first four minutes of the fourth quarter, setting the stage for Jamabo's score. A late interception by Nate Meadors ended CU's hopes of a final comeback.

On the last trip to Boulder in 2014, UCLA needed a Brett Hundley touchdown dash in the second overtime to hold off the Buffaloes, 40-37. The Bruins scored the first 17 points in the contest only to see CU tally the last 17 points in regulation to tie the score at 31-all. Paul Perkins' 92-yard run, tied for the second-longest run in school history, opened the game's scoring. UCLA led 31-14 to begin the fourth quarter before the Buffs battled back to even the score on a field goal in the final minute of regulation.

**BRUINS IN THE POLLS** — The Bruins finished ranked in the final polls in 2013 for the first time since the 2005 season. It was most recently in the top five of the Associated Press poll in the 2001 season, when it spent two weeks at No. 4 after winning its first six games.

**NON-SATURDAY GAMES** — UCLA will play a Thursday night affair on Nov. 3 at the University of Colorado. Last season, in back-to-back weeks, the Bruins took the field at Stanford (loss) and in the Rose Bowl versus California (win). In 2014, on Thursday night at Arizona State, the Bruins bested the Sun Devils and on Friday of Thanksgiving week, at home, in the Rose Bowl against Stanford, the Cardinal dropped the Bruins.

In 2013, the Bruins won at Utah on a Thursday night and at home versus Washington on a Friday night. The last time UCLA had previously played a Friday game during the regular season was in 2011 at Arizona State. The most recent previous home game to have been played on Friday had been against Arizona on Oct. 27, 1978.

In 2012, UCLA opened the season with a win at Rice on a Thursday evening. In 2011, it played at Arizona on a Thursday evening. In the 2010 season, the Bruins played three non-Saturday games - Oct. 21 at Oregon, Nov. 18 at Washington and Nov. 26 at Arizona State.

Prior to 2010, the last time the Bruins played a regular-season non-Saturday game was Friday, Nov. 28, 2008 at Arizona State, dropping a 34-9 decision. The Bruins also played a Monday night game that year, defeating Tennessee, 27-24 in overtime on Labor Day night (Aug. 30). Before 2008, UCLA had not played on a week night since Thurs., Sept. 30, 1993, a 52-13 victory at San Diego State. The Bruins also played at San Diego State on Thurs., Sept. 26, 1991 (won, 37-12).

**BRUIN FRESHMEN OVER THE YEARS —**

UCLA played eight true freshmen in the 2016 opener at Texas A&M - DL Boss Tagaloa, K JJ Molson, LS Johnny Van Bleyker, P Autin Kent, , DB Brandon Burton, LB Lokeni Toailoa, WR Ethan Fernea, RB Brandon Stephens. RB Jalen Starks, LB Krays Barnes and WR Theo Howard saw action against UNLV.

The Bruins played a total of 10 true freshmen in 2015. Five saw action in the 2015 season-opener against Virginia --- QB Josh Rosen, RB SoSo Jamabo, RB Bolu Olorunfunmi, DB Octavius Spencer and TE Chris Clark. Nine true frosh took the field in the 2014 season. Seven saw action in the 2014 opener at UVA .

The Bruins established a new school mark in 2013 when guard Scott Quessenberry took the field at Oregon as the 18th true freshman to see action that season. Fifteen true frosh had seen action that season in the opener against Nevada. UCLA played 12 true freshmen in 2012. One first-year player saw action in 2011. In both 2009 and 2010, UCLA played 10 true freshmen.

UCLA started a true freshman quarterback (Josh Rosen) in the season opener last season for the first time in school history. The last true freshman defender to start an opener was safety Rahim Moore in 2008 vs. Tennessee.

## UCLA OFFENSE

### OFFENSIVE LINE —

Redshirt senior **CONOR McDERMOTT (#68-Political Science major)** made 12 starts last season at left tackle and was named to the second-team all-conference team. The team surrendered just 14 sacks, second-fewest in school history. The O-Line has helped produce a 1,000-yard rusher in each of the last two seasons. McDermott made his first start as a blocking tight end against Oregon in 2014. He then went on to start the last seven games of that season at left tackle. Played on special teams and as a reserve along the offensive line in 2013. McDermott redshirted in 2012.

Redshirt junior **SCOTT QUESSENBERRY (#52-Political Science major)** sat out last season due to injury. He owns 27 career starts at the center (9) and guard (18) positions. In 2014, he started all 13 games and was named honorable mention all-conference while blocking for the Pac-12's leading rusher, Paul Perkins. He made his first start at Oregon in 2013, when he joined a group of three other freshmen to make it the first trio of true freshmen

to ever start a game together on the Bruin offensive line.

Redshirt junior **KENNY LACY (#76-Political Science major)** started 10 games at guard in the 2015 season. He saw his first game action in the 2014 season at Arizona State. He went on to make two more starts that season at guard in home games against Utah and Oregon. Redshirt Sophomore **KOLTON MILLER (#77 undeclared)** started five games in 2015 at tackle and the first five in 2016 before injury sent him to the sidelines. Redshirt freshman **ANDRE JAMES (#75 undeclared)** made his first career start this season, in place of Miller, at Arizona State. Redshirt freshman **JOSH WARIBOKO-ALALI (#56 undeclared)** started for the first time at Washington State, in place of Lacy.

### RECEIVERS —

Redshirt junior **DARREN ANDREWS (#7-Political Science major)** appeared in 12 games with seven starts in the 2015 season. He ranked third on the squad with 43 receptions and 443 receiving yards. Redshirt senior **ISHMAEL ADAMS (#1-Sociology major)** shifted to the offensive side of the ball in 2016 spring practice. In 2015, he appeared in 10 games and made eight starts in the secondary. ## UCLA HEAD COACH JIM MORA



On December 10, 2011, former Atlanta Falcons and Seattle Seahawks head coach Jim Mora was named UCLA's 17th head coach in school history.

The 2015 season saw Coach Mora equal Terry Donahue's school-best four-year win mark of 37 contests, extend the school's win streak in games away from the Rose Bowl to a school record total of 12 and participate in a fourth straight bowl game. Eight Bruins, including first-round selection Kenny Clark and second-round pick Myles Jack, were chosen in the 2016 NFL Draft, the most by the program since 1988. The total of eight players selected in the draft was the most of any Pac-12 school and the most UCLA has ever had picked in the seven round draft format.

In addition, the Bruins achieved numerous individual school marks in 2015, including kicker Ka'imi Fairbairn, the program's second Lou Groza Award winner, becoming the conference's all-time leading scorer; Jordan Payton emerging as the school's all-time leading receiver; running back Paul Perkins producing a second-straight 1,000-yard season; freshman quarterback Josh Rosen establishing multiple school milestones. The team set a school mark for the most 500-yard total offense games in a season (6) and recorded its first road shutout since 1987 while keeping as many as three opponents out of the end zone for the first time since the 1988 season.

In 2014, Coach Mora guided the Bruins to the ninth 10-win season in school history, matching the school record for wins in a season. It marked the third straight year in which Mora's Bruins had produced at least nine wins, a first in program history. His 29 total wins are the most-ever by a UCLA coach in his initial three seasons on the job.

Following the victory in the 2015 Alamo Bowl, UCLA had captured wins in 10 straight games away from the Rose Bowl to tie that school record, including a school-best 7-0 slate in 2014. That win was also the team's third over teams ranked among the Associated Press' Top 15 at the time of the contest, which was the most by the program since it defeated four such teams in 1952. The Bruins capped off the season ranked No. 10 in the final AP poll which was the highest for the program since 1998.

Linebacker Eric Kendricks, who became the school's all-time leading tackler during the season, went on to be UCLA's first recipient of the Butkus Award and the second-straight winner of the Lott IMPACT Trophy. Quarterback Brett Hundley set numerous school career records, including bests for most touchdown passes and total offense. Perkins led the Pac-12 in rushing and produced the second-highest rushing yardage total in school history.

In 2013, Mora led the Bruins to the eighth 10-win season in school history, tying the school mark for most wins in a season. UCLA remained in the AP rankings throughout the full 2013 season for the first time since 1998. Linebacker Anthony Barr was selected as a first-team All-America and as the school's first winner of the Lott IMPACT Trophy. A school record 18 true freshmen saw action during the season and seven true freshmen position players started in a game to match that school record. Five Bruins, the most by the program since 2002, were selected in the 2014 NFL Draft, headed by Barr's pick at No. 9 overall by the Vikings.

In his first year, Mora guided the Bruins to the 2012 South Division Championship of the Pac-12 Conference and matched the school-record for wins by a first-year coach, with nine. The Bruins, who played in the Holiday Bowl, set numerous offensive records during the course of the 2012 season, including establishing a new school rushing leader, in Johnathan Franklin, and several passing marks achieved by Hundley. On defense, Barr emerged as one of the most dynamic performers in the country in his first season as a linebacker and led the nation in sacks for a good portion of the year. Kendricks led the conference in tackles, ranking 11th in the country. Four players were selected in the 2013 draft, including defensive lineman Datone Jones in the first round by the Packers.

Mora came to UCLA after spending part of 2010 and most of 2011 as a television analyst and contributor for the NFL Network and the NFL on Fox. He brought 25 years of NFL coaching experience with him to UCLA, including four years of NFL head coaching experience while at the helm of the Atlanta Falcons (2004-06) and the Seattle Seahawks (2009).

Mora took over for Mike Holmgren as head coach of the Seattle Seahawks in 2009. He had served as assistant head coach and defensive backs coach for Seattle in 2007 and 2008. The Se-

ahawks went 10-6 and finished first in the NFC West in the 2007 season and won the Wild Card game. In his initial season as the head coach of the Falcons in 2004, Mora guided the team to an 11-5 record, becoming just the eighth rookie head coach in NFL history to win 11 games and the 11th to bring home a Division title. Atlanta captured the NFC South title and earned an appearance in the NFC Championship game for only the second time in franchise history. Mora was selected as the NFC Coach of the Year.

The Falcon's defense improved from a league ranking of 32nd in 2003 to No. 14 overall the next season, fueled by a league-leading and franchise record 48 quarterback sacks. Atlanta topped the NFL in rushing in all three of coach Mora's seasons as head coach. In 2006, Michael Vick became the first quarterback in NFL history to rush for at least 1,000 yards.

Mora had joined the Falcons from the San Francisco 49ers where he spent seven seasons, from 1997-2003, including the last five as the defensive coordinator. In his first year, the 49ers finished No. 1 in the NFL in total defense, No. 2 in pass defense (with 25 interceptions), takeaways (41) and run defense, as well as No. 3 in the League in sacks (with 54). The 1998 squad tied for No. 1 in the NFC, and No. 4 in the NFL, with 21 interceptions. The 1997 team advanced to the NFC Championship Game, while the 1998 and 2002 squads captured Wild Card Game wins.

Mora worked the previous five seasons (1992-1996) on the staff of his dad, Jim E. Mora, as the secondary coach with the New Orleans Saints. His defensive expertise began to take shape and the Saints boasted the No. 1 pass defense in the NFL during his first two years. In 1985, Mora broke into the NFL coaching ranks with the San Diego Chargers under head coach Don Coryell. He spent seven seasons with the Chargers, advancing from the league's first quality control coach position to defensive backs coach.

Mora began his coaching career in 1984 at the University of Washington. He joined the staff of Don James in the role of defensive assistant following a four-year playing career as a defensive back for the Huskies. While at UW, Mora had the opportunity to be a part of two Rose Bowl teams (1981-loss to Michigan/ 1982-win over Iowa) as a player, in addition to helping the Huskies land a berth in the 1985 Orange Bowl (win over Oklahoma) as a graduate assistant. During his five seasons in the Husky program, Washington compiled a 48-12 record, ranked among the nation's top 10 teams on three occasions, and did not finish lower than second in the Pac-10 standings.

## ROSE BOWL STADIUM



The nation's most famous college football stadium – The Rose Bowl – is now in its 35th season as the home of the UCLA Bruins football team. The stadium is recognized as both a United States National Historic Landmark and a California Historic Civil Engineering landmark.

One of the finest football stadiums in America, the Rose Bowl was built specifically for football, but has been utilized as a venue for portions of the 1932 Olympic Games' cycling events and was the soccer site for the 1984 Olympics. The Rose Bowl has also played host to five NFL Super Bowls – XI in 1977, XIV in 1980, XVII in 1983, XXI in 1987 and XXVII in 1993. It was a venue for the 1994 World Cup and the 1999 Women's World Cup soccer tournaments, including the championship games. The USA women's soccer team victory over China in the 1999 event drew over 90,000 fans. In addition, the 1983 Army-Navy game was played in the Rose Bowl.

On Jan. 1, 2015, the Rose Bowl served as the site of one of the College Football Playoff semifinal games. The previous January, the Rose Bowl hosted the final BCS Championship contest. It had also played host to the BCS Championship game in 2002, 2006 and 2010.

Considered an ideal concert venue, the Rose Bowl has hosted shows by such groups and artists as Beyonce, Jay-Z, Kenny Chesney, Jason Aldean, One Direction, U2, 'N Sync, Eagles, Rolling Stones, Pink Floyd, Michael Jackson, Metallica, Guns and Roses, Depeche Mode and Journey.

The iconic stadium is in the process of completing a \$181 million dollar renovation, and now features a new video board, improved exiting, wider aisles in the end zones and the Terry Donahue Pavilion. The Pavilion area houses the press boxes, broadcast booths, premium seating, boxes and suites. In December of 2015, the radio and TV booths were renamed "The Keith Jackson Broadcast Center". Jackson, the former sportscaster, coined the phrase "The Granddaddy of Them All" for the Rose Bowl Game. Also added are field level entrances and

exits, and additional concession stands and restroom facilities.

Since 2007, UCLA and its opponents have dressed in new locker rooms located underneath the south concourse of the stadium. The locker area features all of the latest amenities to benefit the players, coaches, sports medicine and equipment staffs. In addition, a new media interview room and working press area was included in the upgrades.

In 1998, new individual chairs were installed in the seating areas between the end zones. Also, improved seating areas for the physically challenged were installed, as well as a new sound system.

Completed in 1922 at a cost of \$272,198, the Rose Bowl was first used for the USC-California football game that year which was won by the Golden Bears 12-0. The stadium was originally horseshoe shaped and seated 57,000 persons when it hosted the 1923 Rose Bowl Game. The south end zone was enclosed prior to the 1929 game to increase seating capacity to 76,000. Further enlargements took place in 1932 (83,677) and 1949 (100,807). A record crowd of 106,869 fans witnessed the 1973 Ohio State – USC Rose Bowl contest. With the current seating configuration for UCLA home games, the capacity is 80,616.

The Rose Bowl has many firsts in its vast history. On Jan. 1, 1927, radio stations across the nation were linked together for the first time in a coast-to-coast broadcast. On Jan. 1, 1954, The UCLA-Michigan State Rose Bowl Game was the first west-to-east color telecast on a nationwide connection.

The Rose Bowl has 77 rows of seats. It measures 880 feet from the north to south rims and 695 feet from east to west. Its circumference around the rim is 2,430 feet, compared to 1,350 feet at field level. It took 28 miles of lumber to provide the original seats. The square footage of the grass on the floor of the stadium is 79, 156.

The Aggies had a fourth-and-1 from the 1 in overtime when Knight waltzed into the end zone for the score in the opener

for both teams.

Texas A&M sealed the victory when Justin Evans knocked down Josh Rosen's pass at the goal line on fourth down.

Rosen threw three interceptions while working under heavy pressure from a defense led by Myles Garrett. The Aggies looked to have this one wrapped up when they led by 15 in the fourth quarter after scoring two third-quarter touchdowns.

But UCLA's offense got going after that, scoring twice in two minutes with the second one coming on a 62-yard pass by Rosen to Kenneth Walker to cut it to 2. A 2-point conversion pass from Rosen to Austin Roberts after that TD tied it with 2:39 remaining.

The Bruins were driving again after a third straight punt by A&M when Evans intercepted Rosen's pass for the second time to give A&M a chance to win it in regulation.

But Knight's pass was knocked down in the end zone to send the game into overtime.

PASADENA, Calif. (AP)- Josh Rosen threw for 267 yards and Soso Jamabo rushed for three touchdowns as the UCLA defeated UNLV at the Rose Bowl. The Bruins scored a pair of fourth quarter touchdowns to secure a 21-point lead after UNLV had reduced UCLA's cushion to seven points, 28-21, midway through the third quarter.

Rosen, UCLA's sophomore quarterback, completed 23 of 38 passes in the team's second game of the season. He threw one touchdown pass and added a score on the ground.

The Bruins totaled 219 yards on the ground. Jamabo registered 90 yards on 11 carries, as all three of his touchdown runs came in the first half. Brandon Stephens finished with 71 yards on 11 attempts.

"It's good to get a win," UCLA head coach Jim Mora said. "That was a hard-fought game against a really worthy opponent. That's a [UNLV] team that has made a lot of improvement in a year..."

UCLA never trailed and led by as many as 21 points late in the second quarter. UCLA secured a 28-7 lead with 3:49 to play before half on a 7-yard carry by Jamabo.

UNLV responded with a touchdown in the final minute of the second quarter, cutting UCLA's advantage to 28-14. The Rebels reduced the Bruins' cushion to 28-21 with 5:13 left in the third after Stanton's 11-yard touchdown carry. UCLA's Bolu Olorunfunmi helped the Bruins push their lead back to 14 points, 35-21, with a one-yard carry at the 11:39 mark in the fourth quarter. UCLA pushed its margin back to 21 points, as Rosen kept the ball for a one-yard touchdown carry with 5:57 to play to cap the Bruins' 88-yard, 13-play drive.

PROVO, Utah (AP)- Josh Rosen threw for 307 yards and two touchdowns as UCLA suffocated BYU 17-14 on Saturday night. Defenses controlled most of the night, but UCLA was able to hold BYU to 273 yards, including 23 on the ground (fewest since 2008 against Arizona State). The Cougars were held to negative rushing yards until late in the third quarter and 91 of those offensive

yards came on their final possession. Rosen, who registered his eighth career 300-yard passing day, completed a handful of big passing plays, including a 33-yard touchdown to Darren Andrews and a short scoring toss to fullback Cameron Griffin which opened the scoring. Andrews finished with four catches for 91 yards for the game. Jordan Lasley was also on the receiving end of four of Rosen's tosses for 21 yards. BYU quarterback Taysom Hill finished with 250 passing yards, one touchdown one interception and was sacked four times (Jayon Brown, Kenny Young, Takkarist McKinley, Rick Wade).

UCLA gave up 378 rushing yards and five rushing touchdowns in the first two games, but held running back Jamaal Williams to 28 yards and shut down the mobile Hill. The Bruins also blanketed the Cougar receivers, giving Hill few options in the pass game.

Nate Starks made his first start of the season and finished with 39 yards rushing on a career-high 15 carries.

The win marked the 28th straight victory overall for the Bruins in a game in which they have held the opponent to less than 20 points and the 47th straight such victory in the regular season. UCLA owns a 14-2 record in the month of September under Coach Mora.

The Bruins begin Pac-12 play against No. 7 Stanford next Saturday.

PASADENA, Calif. (AP) -- UCLA contained Christian McCaffrey, kept Stanford's offense out of the end zone and generated just enough points to lead the Pac-12 champions until the Cardinal's final drive.

J.J. Arcega-Whiteside caught an 8-yard touchdown pass from Ryan Burns with 24 seconds to play, and No. 7 Stanford rallied

for its ninth consecutive victory over the Bruins, 22-13. McCaffrey rushed for 138 yards for the Cardinal, but they struggled on offense for 3 1/2 quarters. Stanford got the ball back with 2:05 left and coolly put together a 70-yard drive capped by Burns' fade to Arcega-Whiteside, who got one foot in bounds on an acrobatic play. Solomon Thomas then returned Josh Rosen's fumble 42 yards for a touchdown on the game's final play, punctuating the heartbreak for a lively Rose Bowl crowd. Even with that TD, Stanford had its lowest-scoring performance since the 2015 season opener.

"That's about as difficult as it gets," said UCLA coach Jim Mora. "It stings when you lose like that, and played so courageously on defense, and done such a great job against a really good team, and they make the play. Doesn't matter who you play. Losing like that is just awful."

Rosen passed for 248 yards for the Bruins, hitting Nate Iese for his only touchdown in the first half. He got the Bruins to midfield in the final seconds, but couldn't reach field goal range before fumbling on a sack from behind.

TEMPE, Ariz. (AP) -- Zane Gonzalez kicked three field goals to become the NCAA's all-time leader and Arizona State grinded out a 23-20 victory over UCLA Saturday night. Gonzalez converted the 89th successful field goal attempt of his career and his third of the game provided the winning margin.

UCLA quarterback Josh Rosen suffered a pair of injuries in the game, both of which forced him from the contest but rallied to throw for a career-best 400 yards, tied for the fifth-best single game mark in school history.

Gonzalez hit from 35, 23 and 46 yards to reach 89 career field goals, passing Florida State's Dustin Hopkins, who had 88 from 2009-12. Arizona State needed all of those after struggling offensively. UCLA had a strong defensive game, holding the high-scoring Sun Devils to 275 total yards. Offensively, the Bruins had four turnovers and missed on two scoring opportunities in the first half, when JJ Molson failed to convert a pair of field goal attempts.

Rosen left in the first half with a leg injury, but returned in the third quarter to throw scoring passes to Jordan Lasley (52 yards) and Nate Iese (18 yards). The sophomore was unable to come back after injuring his right shoulder on a hard hit in the fourth quarter. He connected on 24-of-43 passing attempts with an interception.

The Bruins could not muster a rushing attack against the active ASU defense, finishing with minus-1 yard rushing on 23 carries.

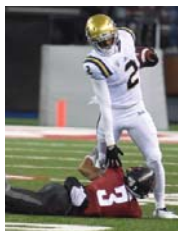

PULLMAN, Wash. (AP) -- Over the past three weeks, Washington State has defeated Oregon, Stanford and UCLA. The Cougars holding on for a 27-21 win over the Bruins, who played without injured quarterback Josh Rosen, on Saturday night before a Homecoming crowd which was pelted by rain throughout the contest.

Gerald Wicks' first touchdown late in the second quarter gave the Cougars a 10-0 lead going into the break. The Bruins answered with the first score of the second half on a 22-yard scoring strike from Mike Fafaul to Darren Andrews. The score coming after a fumble by WSU quarterback Luke Falk.

Wicks' second 1-yard plunge pushed the lead to 17-7 and Jamal Morrow added a 3-yard TD run late in the third as the Cougars upped their advantage to 24-7.

The Bruins rallied in the fourth quarter. Fafaul led a 15-play, 75-yard drive which culminated on a five-yard scoring pass to Jordan Lasley. WSU answered with its own 15-play drive for a field goal with 5:09 to go. The Bruins were not done and went 63 yards on six plays for a second touchdown pass to Andrews, who finished with 116 receiving yards on the night.

UCLA forced the Cougars to punt on the next possession and took over at their own 30 with 2:47 to play. Fafaul connected with Lasley on the first play of that drive, but he fumbled and WSU took over. The Bruin defense forced another punt, but Fafaul's final pass was intercepted.

Falk failed to throw a touchdown pass for the first time in his career and was intercepted in the end zone in the first half by Jayon Brown. UCLA saw its defense give up more than 24 points in regulation for the first time this season.

PASADENA, Calif. (AP) -- Five years after Utah running back Joe Williams and UCLA quarterback Mike Fafaul left Fork Union Military Academy together, they both posted record-breaking performances. Williams rushed for a school-record 332 yards and four touchdowns, and No. 19 Utah held off UCLA. He broke off TD

runs of 3, 43, 64 and 55 yards in the game.

Fafaul made his own history, setting UCLA records for pass attempts (70) and completions (40) while throwing for 464 yards, third most in school annals.

The former walk-on, who started for the second straight game in place of the injured Josh Rosen, had five touchdown passes and four interceptions for the Bruins while posting the third-biggest passing performance in UCLA history, trailing only 500-yard games by Cade McNown and Drew Olson.

Senior defensive end Takkarist McKinley stood out for the Bruin defense. He recorded six tackles, three sacks, 5.0 tackles for loss, two pass defenses, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. His sack and quarterback strip fumble recovery gave UCLA the ball at the Utah 14-yard line. Three plays later the Bruins were in the end zone with a 21-14 lead.

Tight end Nate lese was on the receiving end of eight balls from Fafaul for a total of 146 yards and two scores. lese consistently broke tackles on his career-high catches and found the end zone on plays that covered 50 and 13 yards.
