The Rankings

- > Utah dropped 10 places in the AP poll and nine in the Coaches' poll to No. 21/20 after last Saturday's 30-28 loss to Oregon.
- > Utah is in the AP and Coaches' polls for the 10th-straight week. The Utes broke in at No. 24 AP/No. 23 Coaches on Sept. 18. Their highest ranking was No. 11 on Nov. 13.
- > Utah was ranked No. 12 in last week's College Football Playoff (CFP) rankings. The new CFP rankings will be announced on Tuesday, Nov. 22. Since the CFP rankings were introduced in 2014, Utah has been ranked in the top 25
- > No. 9 Colorado is the second ranked opponent Utah has faced this season. The Utes lost to No. 4 Washington, 31-24, on Oct. 29. In its history, when both Utah and its opponent are ranked, the Utes are 10-9.

Five Facts

- > At 8-3, Utah is bowl eligible for the third-straight year. Utah is 3-0 in bowl games as a member of the Pac-12 Conference, beating Georgia Tech in the 2011 Sun Bowl and winning the Las Vegas Bowl in 2014 (Colorado State) and 2015 (BYU).
- > Senior running back **Joe Williams** crossed over 1,000 yards for the season last week against Oregon. Williams has rushed for 1,088 yards in just seven
- > Senior defensive end **Hunter Dimick** leads the nation in sacks with 14 and holds the Utah record for career sacks with 29.
- > Utah has played Colorado 62 times—its most games against a Pac-12 opponent and the fifth-longest rivalry in school history.
- > While the Utes trail the series 31-28-3 overall, they own a 4-1 advantage over CU as Pac-12 members and have won the last four games. See page 2 for the complete series history.

Utah-Colorado Series (28-31-3)

Series Snapshot: At 62 games, this is Utah's longest rivalry against a Pac-12 Conference team and the fifth-longest rivalry in school history. Although Colorado leads the series 31-28-3 overall, Utah has won the last four games and is 4-1 against the Buffs in Pac-12 play. Colorado leads 15-12-1 in Boulder, where Utah has won the last two games (in 2012 and 2014). Played annually from 1903-1962 with four exceptions, the rivalry went dormant for 49 years before resuming in 2011.

The Utes forced and recovered a fumble with 0:30 left to secure a 20-14 victory over Colorado and clinch a share of the school's first Pac-12 South Division title. Viliseni Fauonuku tied the school record with four sacks, one resulting in the final CU fumble. Gionni Paul had a game-high 13 tackles, an interception and a pass breakup; Marcus Williams had six tackles, an interception and a pass breakup; and Kylie Fitts blocked a field goal attempt, had 1.5 sacks and a pass breakup. Joe Williams rushed for a career-high 187 yards and a touchdown. Tom Hackett averaged 50.6 yards on seven punts, placing three inside the 20-yard line.

Wishnowsky is Ray Guy Award Finalist

First-year Ute sophomore Mitch Wishnowsky has been named one of three finalists for the Ray Guy Award, which honors the country's best punter. Wishnowsky leads the nation in punt average (48.6), punts of 50+ yards (26) and punts inside the 10-yard line (14). He is No. 2 in the nation and first in the Pac-12 in punts inside the 20-yard line (31) and percentage of punts inside the 20 (57.41%, 31-of-54). He has seven punts at or inside the 5-yard line. Wishnowsky has not had a touchback since the first game of the season and has led Utah to a No. 1 national ranking in net punting (45.20). Wishnowsky—a CBS Sports, SI.com, FoxSports.com, ESPN.com, Sporting News and SportsOnEarth.com Midseason All-American—is bidding to become Utah's third-straight Ray Guy Award winner as the country's best punter, following in the footsteps of Tom Hackett (2014-15 Ray Guy Award winner and consensus All-American). It is the first time that a school has had a finalist for the Ray Guy Award three straight seasons. Wishnowsky is Utah's third Ray Guy Award finalist, joining Hackett and Louie Sakoda (2008).

Utah is the only Pac-12 South Division team without a loss within the division. The Utes are 4-0 against the South and 1-3 against North Division teams ... Utah is 4-1 on the road ... Utah is 2-0 on natural grass ... The average point differential in the previous five Pac-12 games between Utah and Colorado is 4.2 points a game ... Against AP top-25 opponents, Utah is 21-60 all-time, 19-21 since 1994 and 6-10 as a member of the Pac-12 ... Utah is 72-20 all-time when ranked in the AP poll and 19-9 since joining the Pac-12 Conference in 2011. See pages 16-18 for Utah's complete history in the national rankings ... Injury Count

Utah has lost five starters for the season: running back **Armand Shyne**, centers **Hiva Lutui** (in spring camp) and **J.J. Dielman**, tight end **Siale Fakailoatonga** and defensive end **Kylie Fitts**. Neither **Lutui** nor **Dielman** (second-team All-Pac-12 at right tackle in 2015 before replacing Lutui at center) has a redshirt year available. **Fakailoatonga** and **Fitts** plan to apply for a medical extension. Also out for the season with an injury is linebacker **Marcus Sanders-Williams**. A total of 17 starters have missed games this season due to injury.

Award Count

Sophomore punter **Mitch Wishnowsky** has been named one of three Ray Guy Award finalists and will participate in the Home Depot College Football Awards Show in Atlanta, Ga., on Thu., Dec. 8 at 5 p.m. MT). Wishnowsky is two-time Ray Guy Punter of the Week (vs. Arizona and Arizona State) and has won the Pac-12 Special Teams Player of the Week twice (vs. Southern Utah, Oregon). Linebacker **Sunia Tauteoli** was the Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Week and FWAA/Bronko Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week vs. BYU. Defensive end **Hunter Dimick** was the Walter Camp Defensive Player of the Week and Pac-12 Defensive Player of the week vs. Arizona State and running back **Joe Williams** was the Walter Camp Offensive Player of the Week, Maxwell Award Player of the Week and Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Week vs. UCLA. Punter Kicker **Andy Phillips** was honored as a Lou Groza Award Star of the Week vs. UCLA. See the sidebar on page 6 for more awards.

Last Game

An overturned call in the end zone with two seconds remaining allowed Oregon to slip past No. 11 Utah, 30-28, in the final home game for 24 Ute seniors. Utah had taken a 28-24 lead with 2:18 remaining on a 30-yard touchdown pass from Troy Williams to Evan Moeai before the Ducks responded with the game-winning touchdown on a pass that was initially ruled incomplete out of bounds. Joe Williams rushed for 149 yards to become the 13th player to rush for 1,000 yards in school history (1,088) and Hunter Dimick's two sacks gave him the school career sack record (29). Cody Barton led Utah with a

Utah's all-time football record is 660-452-31. The Utes are 400-188-16 at home (82-31 in Rice-Eccles Stadium, which opened in 1998), 240-247-12 in road games and 21-17-3 in games played at neutral sites.

Utah vs. the Pac-12

Utah is 25-28 in league games as a conference member and 101-148-6 all-time against Pac-12 schools. The series breakdown follows: Arizona (2-4/21-19-2), Arizona State (2-4/8-20), California (2-2/5-6), Colorado (4-1/28-31-3), Oregon (1-3/9-21), Oregon State (4-2/9-11-1), Stanford (2-0/4-3), UCLA (3-3/4-11), USC (2-4/5-10), Washington (1-3/1-9), Washington State (2-2/7-7).

Whittingham File

Twelfth-year head coach **Kyle Whittingham**—the 2008 National Coach of the Year—became the 24th active FBS coach in the country to reach 100 wins on Oct. 8 against Arizona. Whittingham (103-49) is the second-winningest coach in school history and has won more games than any Utah coach in the last 68 years. In his 23rd season overall at Utah, he has participated in more victories than any football coach in school history (188). Whittingham's 90-percent bowl winning percentage (9-1 record) ranks first all-time in the NCAA. His postseason victories include a 2-0 mark in BCS bowl games as the cocoach of Utah's Fiesta Bowl win over Pittsburgh in the 2004 season and the head coach for Utah's 2009 Sugar Bowl win over Alabama. See the sidebar on page 2 for more on Whittingham.

Quarterback Notebook

- > Junior transfer **Troy Williams** has started every game. He is 8-3 this season and 8-4 in NCAA career starts (0-1 at Washington in 2014).
- > Williams has completed 183-of-327 pass attempts (56.0%) for 2,419 yards and 14 touchdowns (5 INT). He also has 91 carries for 227 net yards and five touchdowns (second on the team).
- > Williams has thrown 10 touchdown passes with just one interception in Utah's eight conference games, including a career-high four TDs against Arizona State.
- > Williams has seven 200-plus yard passing games this season and in his career: 296 vs. Arizona State, 272 vs. Southern Utah, 270 vs. USC, 266 vs. Cal, 257 vs. San Jose State, 245 vs. Arizona and 235 vs. Oregon.
- > Williams ranks fifth in the Pac-12 in passing yards per game (219.9) and passing yards (2,419), third in passing yards per completion (13.22) and fifth in total offense (240.5 ypg).
- > Williams has 11 completions of 40 yards or longer (69, 64, 59, 57, 54, 52, 49, 45, 43, 42 and 40 yards), which is tied for second in the league.
- > Williams began his career at Washington, where he played in five games with one start (loss vs. Arizona State in 2014).
- > Williams has an NCAA career completion percentage of 56.7 (206-of-363), passing for 2,595 yards and 14 touchdowns (7 interceptions).
- > True freshman **Tyler Huntley** has appeared briefly in three games (Southern Utah, San Jose State, Arizona).
- > Huntley has completed 4-of-6 passes for 24 yards.

Running Back Notebook

- > With 1,088 net rushing yards in just seven games played, senior **Joe Williams** is the 13th player in school history to rush for 1,000 yards in a season (three players did it twice in their careers for a total of 16 career 1,000-yard seasons).
- > In the five games since coming out of retirement, **Williams** is averaging 202.6 yards per game and has accumulated 1,013 of his 1,088 net yards. His five-straight 100-yard games ties him with five others for the second-longest streak in school history (last: Devontae Booker, 2014).
- > Williams is averaging 155.4 yards per game overall, which is on school-record pace. The record for rushing yards per game in a season is 137.0, set by Carl Monroe in 1982.
- > Williams also leads the team in carries (158), yards per carry (6.9) and rushing touchdowns (9).
- > Even with missing four games, **Williams** ranks third in the Pac-12 and 24th in the NCAA FBS in rushing yards (1,088). He is tied for sixth in the Pac-12 in rushing TDs (9).
- > Williams would stand third in the nation and first in the Pac-12 in rushing yards per game (155.4) had he played in enough games to be eligible for the rankings (the NCAA minimum is 75% of all games).
- > Williams was named the Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week and Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Week vs. UCLA after rushing for a school-record 332 yards. He also tied the school mark with four rushing touchdowns in that game.
- > Williams' 332 rushing yards vs. UCLA ranks second in the NCAA FBS this season. It is the fourth-best single-game rushing mark in Pac-12 history and the first 300-yard game in Utah history.
- > Williams has seven career 100-yard rushing games (2016 in bold): UCLA (332), Colorado (187), Arizona State (181), Oregon State (179), Washington (172), Oregon (149) and UCLA (121).
- > Williams retired on Sept. 13, but returned to the team on Oct. 11 when injuries decimated the position.
- > True freshman **Zach Moss** has played in eight games (missing three with injury) and has three starts.
- > Moss ranks third on the team in net rushing yards (346) and average yards per game (43.2), while averaging 4.6 yards per carry.
- > **Moss** led Utah in rushing against both San Jose State (95 yards) and USC (90 yards).
- > Junior **Troy McCormick Jr.** missed four games with an injury before returning against Arizona State. In seven games this season, he ranks fifth on the team in net rushing yards (192), while averaging 5.2 yards per rush (third on the team).
- > **Armand Shyne**, who played in five games before a season-ending injury, was leading the team in rushing at the time of his injury and still ranks second in net yards (373) and carries (78). He has four rushing touchdowns. Shyne finished his season averaging 74.6 yards per game and 4.8 yards per carry.

Receiver Notebook

- > Senior **Tim Patrick** is Utah's leading receiver with 38 receptions for 606 yards and five touchdowns. He played sparingly in four games (missing the Arizona game entirely) due to injuries.
- > **Patrick** ranks 11th in the Pac-12 in receiving yards per game (60.6) and is 10th in yards per catch (15.95). He has five touchdown receptions (tied for ninth in the Pac-12).
- > Patrick has three 100-yard receiving games this season and in his career: 121 vs. San Jose State, 105 vs. Southern Utah and 100 vs. USC.

- > **Dimick's** 14 sacks is tied for third all-time in a season at Utah. He needs one sack to move into a tie for second (15, Jimmy Bellamy, 1991). The school single-season sack record is 18.5 (Nate Orchard, 2014).
- > **Dimick** has a school-record 29 career sacks.
- > **Dimick** is tied for third in the nation in tackles for loss (19.5) and TFL per game (1.8).

- > Wishnowsky, a CBS Sports, SI.com, FoxSports.com, ESPN. com, *Sporting News* and SportsOnEarth.com Midseason All-American, has led the nation in punt average all but one week. He has 54 punts for 2,625 yards.
- > Wishnowsky has not had a touchback since the first game of the season.
- > Wishnowsky broke the school record for punt average in a game against Southern Utah (55.5). His 52.7 average against Washington is fourth-best single-game average by a Ute.
- > Wishnowsky has had five punts of 50+ yards in a game twice (SUU, Washington), which is the second-most 50-yard punts in a game in school history.
- > Wishnowsky is a three-time Ray Guy Punter of the Week (Sept. 5, Oct. 10, Nov. 15) and was the Pac-12 Special Teams Player of the Week on Sept. 5.

Kicking Notebook

- > **Andy Phillips** is a four-time Lou Groza Award semifinalist and the only member of the 2016 field to make the cut in each of the last four seasons.
- > **Phillips**, a two-time All-Pac-12 selection (first team in 2014), has handled every Utah field goal attempt since 2013 while appearing in all 49 games.
- > **Phillips** has made 14-of-17 (82.4%) of his field goal attempts, including 5-of-7 from 40+ yards.
- > **Phillips** is second in the Pac-12 in field goal percentage (82.4) and tied for fourth in field goals per game (1.27) and total field goals (14).
- > **Phillips** was named a Lou Groza Award Star of the Week after going 3-for-4 in field goals against UCLA, with makes of 45 yards (twice) and 46 yards.
- > **Phillips** is Utah's career record-holder for field goals made (77), field goal attempts (92) and points scored (403).
- > **Phillips** has made 83.7% of his career field goal attempts (77-of-92), which currently ranks third all-time at Utah.
- > **Phillips** has made 75.6% (34-of-45) of his career field goal attempts from 40+ yards and is 4-of-4 from 50+ yards (long of 53).
- > **Phillips** holds the Utah career records for PATs made and attempted. He is 172-of-173 (99.4%) in career PATs.
- > **Hayes Hicken**, in his first season kicking off, has 52 of Utah's 65 total kickoffs. He is averaging 62.2 yards a kickoff with 26 touchbacks.

Special Teams Notebook

- > **Boobie Hobbs** leads the nation in punt returns with 26. He ranks fourth in the Pac-12 in punt return yards (166) and is sixth in the league in punt return average (6.4).
- > Utah's leading kick returner is **Cory Butler-Byrd** (12 kick returns for 326 yards).
- > **Butler-Byrd's** 99-yard kickoff return for a touchdown to open the game against UCLA was his second career kick return touchdown. He had 175 yards in kickoff returns against the Bruins, the sixth-most in a game in school history.
- > Senior **Chase Dominguez** is in his fourth season as the starting snapper. He has handled every snap for Utah's punts and placekicks since 2013 (49 games).
- > **Dominguez** has 538 career snaps: 273 punts (including four fake punts), 92 field goals and 173 PAT.
- > Sharrieff Shah and Justin Ena are in their first year as cospecial teams' coordinators. Shah manages the return teams and Ena oversees the coverage units. Kyle Whittingham coaches the kickers and punters.

Standing Ovation

Utah has sold out 44 consecutive games in Rice-Eccles Stadium, dating back to the 2010 season opener. Of the sellouts, 41 were played before standing-room only crowds, including every game for the past two seasons. Utah has enjoyed a 98-percent renewal rate by its season ticket holders for seven straight years.
