Hard Edge Notes & Numbers

» Arizona has won four of the last five games in this series and five of the last seven meetings dating to 1986.

» The Wildcats have picked up a victory in each of their last two trips to Boulder.

» The Cats are rested coming off their lone bye week of the season. They close out the year with eight straight conference games.

» For the first time since 2001, Arizona's defense has forced multiple turnovers in the first four games to open a season.

» Arizona ranks eighth nationally in rushing, averaging 296.0 yards per game.

» The Wildcats are the second most improved team in the FBS for scoring defense (from 38.3 ppg in 2016 to 22.3 in 2017).

» UA has played 27 freshmen, including 17 true freshmen, after three games.

» Junior S Demetrius Flannigan-Fowles has three interceptions and a fumble recovery over four games.

» Arizona's defense has allowed only three points in the fourth quarter over the last three games.

» The Cats' defense has 20 three-and-outs over four games. They had 30 total over 12 games a season ago.

» Arizona ranks 10th nationally by converting 81.8 percent of its fourth down tries.

» The Cats have outscored opponents 76-36 in the second half of games this season.

» True freshman LB Colin Schooler has 11 tackles, 2.0 TFL, 1 INT and 1 FF over the last two games vs. UTEP and Utah.

The Bear Down Tradition

Arizona's most memorable athletic tradition is the slogan "Bear Down," given to Wildcat teams by John "Button" Salmon, student body president and varsity athlete, shortly before he died in 1926 following an auto accident. Button Salmon's last message to his teammates, spoken to J.F. "Pop" McKale, coach and athletic director, was, "Tell them... tell the team to bear down." The rally cry predates "Win One for the Gipper" by two years.

Practices

Practices are generally closed to media with interviews permitted afterward in the lobby of the Lowell-Stevens Football Facility. Coach Rodriguez, offensive players and staff are available on Tuesdays. Coach Rodriguez, defensive players and staff are available on Wednesdays. Before covering a practice, please contact Blair Willis or Daniel Berk of the Arizona Athletics Communication Services staff. A weekly injury report is released on Thursday during the season, otherwise injuries are likely to not be addressed by the head coach. No injury questions should be directed to players at any time.

Postgame Interviews

Arizona has a closed locker room policy after games. There is no player availability on the field immediately after the game. Head coach Rich Rodriguez will address the assembled media only after his postgame radio show responsibilities have been completed both at home and on the road. Coach Rodriguez will address the media prior to any player comments. At home games, Coach Rodriguez will hold a postgame press conference in Room 370 of the Lowell-Stevens Football Facility. Selected offensive and defensive players will follow. For road games, each locker room situation will dictate postgame protocol. Please direct any specific requests for players to Blair Willis and Daniel Berk with the UA Communication Services staff.

Some Game Themes: Rested and re-focused, Arizona embarks on an eight-week stretch of conference play seeking to make a charge in the unsettled Pac-12 South ... First up, the trip to Boulder for a Family Weekend matchup against Colorado that pits two of the last three South Division champions against one another ... At stake is a much-needed first conference win to open the October slate, one that will be pivotal for each program as it relates to potential bowl prospects down the road ... While the Wildcats are coming off their lone bye week of the season, the Buffaloes are crossing the halfway point of 11-straight weeks of gridiron action to open the year ... Previous meetings have featured some explosive offensive performances, but the on-paper comparison hints that defense may play a more balanced role this time around. Colorado has been a vastly improved defensive team the last couple seasons, and Arizona has shown noticeable improvement on that side of the ball through the first month of this season, too ... Quarterbacks Brandon Dawkins (UA) and Steven Montez (CU) can both run the ball, which puts a premium on containing them in the pocket. Dawkins and UA's stable of running backs rely more heavily on the rushing attack, while Montez and the Buffs go to the air more often ... The Buffs' featured back – Phillip Lindsay – is a sturdy playmaker utilized as a pass receiver as well, which helps open up a handful of vertical receiving targets on the outside ... An area to keep an eye on will be in the red zone. The Buffaloes have scored only eight touchdowns (in 18 red zone trips) this season, but at the same time their opponents have scored only five touchdowns (in 13 red zone possessions). The Wildcats have scored touchdowns on 13 of their 16 such opportunities and allowed TDs on just seven of 17 tries ... Colorado feels good about its kicking game with James Stefanou converting 10 of his 11 field goal trips. And the Buffs aren't afraid to get tricky – they attempted a fake field goal that was unsuccessful last week against UCLA ... Meanwhile, Arizona has been hit or miss on special teams this season with a few big returns and some steady kicking. However, the Cats have a new long snapper and they missed a couple missed field goals against Utah which proved costly in a six-point loss ... If the Wildcats are to win on the road for the second time, they'll surely have to protect the football after being done in by five turnovers two weeks ago ... Arizona hopes to continue its recent success at Folsom Field, where it has won its previous two trips in 2013 and 2015 ... A Wildcat win would set the stage for two of the next three at home for Family Weekend and Homecoming festivities to come ... But first things first, to the Rockies we go.

Last Time Out: It goes down as a game of “what ifs?” for Arizona, which came up short (30-24) at home against Utah in the conference opener for both teams on Friday, Sept. 22. Despite a valiant defensive effort, the Wildcats turned the ball over five times, including most critically late in the fourth quarter following an onside kick recovery that could have set up a game-winning touchdown. Trailing by 13 points, Brandon Dawkins hit Tony Ellison for a 30-yard touchdown pass to bring the Cats within six points at 30-24. UA recovered the ensuing onside kick and seemed to have momentum in hand for a game-winning drive. Dawkins took the first snap for a gain of 15 on a quarterback sweep, but lost the ball as he went to the ground. It was ruled a fumble on the field recovered by Utah, and despite appearing to perhaps be down on video review, there wasn't enough video evidence to overturn the call. The Utes ran only 26 seconds off the clock as the Cats used their final timeouts, setting up one last hope of a comeback with 2:07 left. Starting at their own 25-yardline, Arizona would go four plays and out to end the game and effectively end the game ... The late fumble was one of five for the Wildcats, including an earlier fumble by JJ Taylor on a promising drive and three interceptions thrown by Dawkins. The final interception was a pick-six, that put Utah ahead 27-17 in the third quarter. Dawkins also was unable to find an open receiver on a fourth down attempt that could have gone for a touchdown, and the Cats also saw Nick Wilson drop a critical pass that may have resulted in a score on a drive that otherwise ended with a long missed field goal by Lucas Havrisik. Another field goal was blocked to prevent a tie at the end of the first half when a Utah defender clearly roughed snapper Donald Reiter. Arizona's defense was strong throughout, holding Utah to only 341 total yards (112 on the ground) and forcing two turnovers of its own. Alas, the chances were aplenty, but Arizona couldn't capitalize as it fell to Utah for the second consecutive season.

Last Meeting: Colorado defeated Arizona for the first time in five years with a 49-24 victory last November 12 at Arizona Stadium. It was the latest example of what could go wrong will go wrong for the Wildcats who were penalized 13 times for 138 yards (the yardage being the highest against Arizona under head coach Rich Rodriguez). Arizona battled in the first half behind some spirited running from Samajie Grant and Brandon Dawkins, but the Wildcats left points on the field, including two missed field goals, and trailed 28-10 at half-time. The Cats simply couldn't catch a break, either one they created or maybe with a call or two here or there in the game. The Buffaloes were the benefactors with Phillip Lindsay leading the charge on 119 rushing yards and three touchdowns. Quarterback Sefo Luifau was steady as well, passing for 213 yard and three touchdowns. Luifau's own rushing touchdown in the third quarter put the visitors ahead comfortably at 42-10. Still, Arizona didn't give in. Backup quarterback Anu Solomon help guide the Cats on a 75-yard scoring drive. Then, after a Brandon Rutt interception, Zach Green capped a quick three-play drive and suddenly it was a 42-24 contest early in the fourth quarter. UA's defense responded and forced a punt, but momentum shifted away from the Cats when a 15-yard personal foul was called on Arizona to set the Cats back deep in their own territory. On Colorado's ensuing possession, Lindsay put the game away for good, scooting 34 yards to set the score at its final with 3:34 remaining.

Series History: Colorado owns a 14-5 advantage in this series, though Arizona has won five of the last seven overall ... The Wildcats had won four straight under Rich Rodriguez, prior to a home loss (49-24) last November to the Buffaloes ... Three of Arizona's five victories over the Buffs have come in Boulder, including in 2013 and 2015 ... The Wildcats emerged victorious in their most recent trip to Boulder, a 38-31 win on Oct. 17, 2015 ... Since Colorado joined the Pac-12 Conference in 2011, Arizona enjoys a 4-2 advantage. The winning team has scored at least 38 points on the six meetings between these schools as Pac-12 members ... The Buffaloes have a 251-204 edge in scoring in all games played in Boulder ... These schools first met on Nov. 26, 1931, when Colorado defeated Arizona, 27-7, in Tucson. The first meeting in Boulder was a 28-25 win for the Buffaloes on Oct. 21, 1950.

Youth Movement: Arizona is surely one of the youngest teams in the Pac-12, if not the country, entering 2017. The Wildcats' roster includes 61 freshmen (including redshirts) on the 120-man roster. Yes, over half the roster is a freshman eligibility-wise and there are more freshmen than sophomores, juniors and seniors combined. Through four games, Arizona has played 27 freshmen, including 17 true freshmen. That tally of 17 true freshman ranks tied for fourth-most among FBS programs according to research done by Brett Moore of the Illinois Sports Information Department. Furthermore, 83 of the 120 players are freshmen or sophomores, and the roster includes 77 players in their first or second year of the program. Lastly, among all classes of eligibility, there are 48 players in their first year of the program.

Defensive Improvement: With four games in the books, one-third of Arizona's 12-game regular season has been completed. The early returns show significant improvement on the defensive side of the ball where coordinator Marcel Yates is in his second year. His unit fully understands the concepts he began implementing some 18 months ago, and he's seen youth and athleticism infused at most all positions, notably at linebacker and safety. Here's a look at the major defensive categories and the improvement the Wildcats have made thus far with the understanding there's still eight straight weeks of football to go.

Scoring Defense: Using data from CFBStats.com, Arizona is one of the nation's most improved teams in terms of scoring defense (which actually includes all points allowed by a team). The Wildcats are allowing 22.3 points per game this season, which is a 16-point improvement over the average from 12 games last season. The only FBS team to show more improvement thus far is Purdue, which has a 16.5-point decrease in its points allowed per game (from 38.3 to 21.8). The Wildcats are tied with Penn State which also has a 16-point improvement to date (from 25.4 to 9.4). In terms of actual scoring defense, the Wildcats are allowing only 20.0 points per game this season. Nine of the 89 points allowed have directly resulted from Arizona's offense, including a safety in the loss to Houston on Sept. 9 and a pick-six (plus extra point) the last time out against Utah. Coach to Cure MD: Many programs did this last week during the Wildcats' bye week, but this Saturday head coach Rich Rodriguez and all members of the Arizona coaching staff will wear a patch on their left arms to help defeat a terrible genetic disorder. It's called Coach To Cure M-D. The American Football Coaches Association, which Rodriguez is the acting president of the organization, is working to raise awareness and research funding to cure Duchenne (doo-SHEN) Muscular Dystrophy, the most prolific genetic killer diagnosed in childhood. Bear Down on Fourth Down: In only four games, the Wildcats have successfully converted nine fourth downs in 11 total attempts. The 81.8 percent success rate is No. 10 nationally, while the attempts (11) rank 13th and the conversions (9) rank tied for fifth. Last season, Arizona ranked No. 123 in the FBS for fourth down conversions with a percentage of 27.9 (5-of-18).

Second Half Surge: Through four games, Arizona has been strong on both sides of the ball in the second half. The Wildcats have outscored foes 76-36 after intermission this season, something drastically different than in 2016 when opponents had a 224-156 advantage in the second half. A big key has been UA's defense locking in and shutting down what the opposing offense has presented. Opponents are averaging 219.25 yards and 12.25 first downs in the first two quarters of games this season, but only 156.75 yards and 7.75 first downs after halftime. Those numbers are even better the last three outings when UA has allowed a total of 338 yards and 18 first downs in the second half against FBS opponents Houston, UTEP and Utah. The key? Third down defense. In those last three contests, opponents are a combined 3-for-18 on third down conversions in the second half. The Wildcats have surrendered only three fourth quarter points in their last three outings.

Takeaway Trends: The Wildcats have forced at least two turnovers in each of the first four games of the season, something that hadn't been done to open a season since 2001. Further, dating to the season finale in 2016 – a Territorial Cup victory over Arizona State – the Wildcats now have forced multiple turnovers in five-consecutive contests. Totaled up, it's 11 takeaways in five games that has yielded a plus-2 turnover margin for the Wildcats. Before the current five-game streak, the Wildcats caused multiple turnovers in only seven of the previous 24 games. Additionally, the last time Arizona had a string of five straight games with multiple takeaways was a stretch that saw the Cats do so in the final two games of 2012 and the first three contests of 2013. There hasn't been a streak of six straight games since 2007, when the Cats actually did so over seven consecutive contests. The importance of forcing multiple turnovers? Arizona is 27-7 (.794) when doing so under Rich Rodriguez, a mark that improves to 14-1 (.933) if there are three or more takeaways in a game.

Dartin' Dawkins: Redshirt junior quarterback Brandon Dawkins has picked up where he left off last season with his ground production. In the season opener versus NAU, Dawkins rushed for 92 yards on just seven carries. He ripped off a 66-yard touchdown sprint and also scored on a 10-yard run. Dawkins was stymied a bit in the second game versus Houston, being held to just 26 rushing yards on 13 carries, but bounced back against UTEP. The junior notched his fourth career 100-yard rushing game, going for 133 yards on 14 carries. He also tied his career high with three rushing touchdowns. Against Utah in Arizona's Pac-12 opener, Dawkins rushed for 90 yards and a touchdown on 18 carries. Dawkins now has 1,464 rushing yards in his career, which is the most by an Arizona quarterback since at least 1958. Dawkins passed Ronald Veal, who rushed for 1,419 career yards and was the leader prior to Dawkins. Dawkins also has 16 career rushing touchdowns. For his career, Dawkins is averaging 7.0 yards per carry, which is the highest YPC ever by an Arizona quarterback with at least 100 carries. Dawkins rushed for 944 yards in 2016, five shy of the school single-season record for a QB held by current offensive analyst B.J. Denker who had 949 in 2013.

About the Arm: Dawkins has shown he can make plays through the air as well. Dawkins set a new career high with three touchdown passes earlier this year against UTEP. He combined that with three rushing scores for six total touchdowns against UTEP. It's the first time an Arizona player has accounted for six touchdowns in a game since quarterback Willie Tuitama in 2007. Tuitama threw for five touchdowns and rushed for one in a win over Washington State. Dawkins' previous career best for touchdown passes was two against Arizona State in 2015. Against the Miners, Dawkins was 18 of 21 for 155 yards, the three touchdowns and no turnovers. He tossed touchdown passes to Shun Brown, J.J. Taylor and Bryce Wolma. The 86 percent completion percentage against UTEP was the highest of Dawkins' career. His previous best was 76 percent, set last year against Hawaii when he completed 16 of 21 passes. Dawkins has at least one touchdown pass in 11 of his last 14 games and has at least one in five of his last six contests. Dawkins set a career high in completions (24) against Utah in the team's Pac-12 opener and threw for 248 yards. His 42 attempts that game were also a career high. Against Houston, Dawkins completed 17 of 29 passes for 178 yards. The 17 completions were the second most of his career, before he completed 18 against the Miners and 24 against the Utes.

School-er Zone: In his first two collegiate games, true freshman linebacker Colin Schooler had a combined four tackles as he introduced himself to Division I football. His last two games have proven he's fully introduced himself and is onto the next stage. Schooler has 11 tackles, two tackles-for-loss, one interception and one forced fumble in his last two games against UTEP and Utah. Against the Miners, Schooler had three tackles, and added a forced fumble, which teammate Demetrius Flannigan-Fowles recovered, and also had an interception he returned 53 yards deep into UTEP territory. Then in his Pac-12 debut against the Utes, Schooler had a career high eight tackles to lead the Wildcats. He also added a pair of tackles-for-loss; the first of his career. Schooler has 15 tackles on the season, tied with seniors Brandon Rutt and Dane Cruikshank for fifth-most on the team. Of the seven Wildcats who have 15 or more tackles on the season, four, including Schooler, are freshmen.

Wilson Climbing the Charts: Senior running back Nick Wilson entered his senior season having already cemented himself as one of Arizona's all-time leading rushers. The senior from Fresno, California is currently eighth all-time at Arizona with 2,595 rushing yards on 459 carries. Against Utah, Wilson had 45 yards on 13 carries and passed David Adams for eighth all-time at Arizona in rushing yards. Wilson passed Clarence Farmer on the all-time list with his 39 yards against UTEP in Week 3. With a 1,000-yard season, Wilson could climb to as high as fourth all-time at Arizona. Wilson has 28 career rushing touchdowns to his credit, which is tied with Nic Grigsby for third all-time in school history. Wilson rushed for a freshman-record 1,375 yards and 16 touchdowns in 2014 and has battled injuries the past two seasons, being held to 189 carries over two years. His ability certainly hasn't dipped, however, as he still has averaged 5.6 yards per carry. For his career, Wilson is averaging 5.7 yards per carry. He's also proven to be a capable pass catcher with 19 catches for 159 yards and a touchdown in his career. See charts on Page 7.

Easy as 1-2-3 and Out: The Arizona defense has been much better about getting off the field before allowing a first down this year. Through four games, Arizona has posted 20 three-and-outs, averaging five a game (note: a three-and-out would be considered any possession defended in which the offense does not score or gain a first down). Only 23 teams in the country are averaging five or more three-and-outs a game this season. Arizona's defense has forced a three-and-out on 20 of 55 drives this season, a 36.4 percentage. Last season, in 12 games, Arizona had just 30 three-and-outs the entire season. Arizona has at least three three-and-outs in each of the first four games this season. Over the last six games of last season, Arizona was held below three three-and-outs three times and didn't have any at Washington State. The Cats had nine three-and-outs against UTEP, which was the program's most since also having nine at Nevada in 2015. The unit then backed it up with four more three-and-outs against Utah, including three in the second half.

Wow, Wolma: True freshman Bryce Wolma has made quite an impression so far this season for the Wildcats at the tight end position. Wolma has played in all four games, but didn't notch his first reception until Week 2 versus Houston. Against the Cougars, Wolma had five catches for 38 yards, providing an active target for quarterback Brandon Dawkins. He upped his production against UTEP, grabbing six balls for 41 yards, including a 1-yard touchdown catch from Dawkins. Wolma, from Saline, Michigan, had four catches for 29 yards against Utah, including a career-best 18-yard reception. Through four games, Wolma's 15 receptions lead the team, and he's third in yards with 108. Wolma has helped fill the void left by Trevor Wood, who missed two games before returning against Utah. Wolma is averaging 7.2 yards per catch and 27 yards a game.

Going Streaking: With exactly 200 rushing yards against UTEP on Friday, Arizona has now rushed for at least 150 yards in 10 straight games dating back to last season. This is the longest streak by the Wildcats since rushing for more than 150 in 11 straight over the final eight games of 2013 and the first three games of 2014. Over its last 10 games, Arizona has rushed for 2,643 yards on 451 carries, averaging 5.86 yards per carry. The Wildcats also have 27 rushing touchdowns during the 10-game span and have gone over 200 yards in six of the 10 games.

All of the Starts: Experience certainly won't be an issue for the big boys up front for the Wildcats this season. The Arizona offensive line features six players who have started at least four games each. All total, the Wildcats have 110 career starts and 141 games played returning among their top six linemen. Redshirt senior right guard Jacob Alsadek leads the way with 39 career games played and 37 starts. Senior left tackle Layth Friekh has 30 career games and 25 starts to his credit. Another senior, Gerhard De Beer, has played in 26 games over the past three seasons with 15 starts. Additionally, redshirt sophomore Nathan Eldridge started all 12 games at center last year, while fellow redshirt sophomore Cody Creason has 16 games and five starts on his resume. Finally, redshirt junior Christian Boettcher has played in 16 games with 11 starts. Last season, Eldridge became the first UA freshman to start at center since Blake Kerley in 2006. Both players went on to start all 12 games that season. The big boys up front helped Arizona rush for 1,017 yards total against Arizona State in the 2016 season finale and NAU in the 2017 season opener, which is a two-game program record.



More on Magee: Since arriving at Arizona prior to the 2012 season with Rich Rodriguez, running backs coach and co-offensive coordinator Calvin Magee has proven to be one of the top assistant coaches in the country. In Magee's now five-plus seasons with Arizona, the Wildcats have rushed for 13,550 rushing yards and have never been worse than 41st in the country in rushing offense. The Cats surpassed the 13,000-yard mark against Houston. Magee and the Cats have had success, no matter the personnel. In 2012 and 2013, Magee mentored All-American Ka'Deem Carey as he shattered the Arizona record books. In 2014, current Wildcat Nick Wilson had the finest freshman season in school history and is himself climbing the record books now as a senior. In 2015 and 2016, Magee had to navigate various injuries, but still saw Arizona produce 2,886 rushing yards in 2015 and 2,820 yards last year with converted wide receiver Samajie Grant starting at running back the last handful of games. Through four games this season, Arizona is eighth in the country in rushing, averaging 296.0 yards per game. Quarterback Brandon Dawkins leads Arizona with 341 rushing yards on the season and six rushing scores. Freshman J.J. Taylor is second on the team with 229 yards.

Wilborn in Rare Territory: In the season opener, defensive end Kylan Wilborn became the first true freshman defensive lineman at Arizona to start a season opener since at least 1992. Interestingly, Tedy Bruschi, a defensive end at Arizona before a standout career as a linebacker in the NFL, was slated to start the 1991 season opener as a true freshman. However, a training camp injury prevented that from happening and he didn't start until later in the season. He then sustained another injury and redshirted the season. Wilborn, however, has been productive from the start and has had an impressive four-game stretch to open his career, starting all four contests. Wilborn was a standout in his debut against the Lumberjacks and had two tackles, including a sack where he forced a fumble that was recovered by fellow lineman Finton Connolly. Wilborn, from Northridge, California, quickly impressed coaches in training camp after a standout career at Notre Dame High School in Sherman Oaks. Wilborn followed up his debut with another solid performance against Houston. He once again had two tackles and had another tackle for loss to his credit. Then against UTEP, Wilborn had another tackle-for-loss and finished with three total stops. Against Utah, in the Pac-12 opener, Wilborn set a new career high with five tackles. He didn't record a tackle-for-loss for the first time this season, but forced and recovered a fumble in the 30-24 loss. He leads the team with his three TFLs. So far this season, true freshmen Wilborn, Scottie Young Jr., Tony Fields II, Colin Schooler and Kurtis Brown have combined for 9 1/2 tackles-for-loss in four games. Last season, Arizona true freshmen had just 4 1/2 tackles-for-loss in 12 regular season games.

Big Play Shun: Junior Shun Brown turned into a big-play threat last year as a sophomore for the Wildcats, and that has certainly carried over to this season. Brown had a 63-yard punt return for a touchdown against UTEP, marking his second punt return touchdown of the season in just three games. Brown became the first Wildcat since Mike Thomas in 2008 to have multiple punt return touchdowns in the same season. The punt return touchdown against UTEP featured a spin move once he got into UTEP territory that was featured on SportsCenter's Top 10 Plays. Currently, Brown is second in the country, averaging 27 yards per punt return. He trails just Dante Pettis from Washington (38.8). Brown, who had a 36-yard touchdown catch against the Miners as well, is second on Arizona with 180 receiving yards in four games. All six of his career touchdowns have been for 30 or more yards, showcasing his big-play ability. Last season, Brown had 12 plays of 20 or more yards, which was second on the team to quarterback Brandon Dawkins. This year, Brown already has seven plays of 20 or more yards, which is second on the team to Tyrell Johnson, who has eight with five coming on kickoff returns.

Touchdown Tony: In his fourth year in the program, redshirt junior wide receiver Tony Ellison has emerged as a serious threat for quarterback Brandon Dawkins and the Arizona offense. Through four games, Ellison leads Arizona in receiving yards with 182. He has 14 catches, which is second on the team, and two touchdown catches, which is the most on the Cats. Ellison is just one catch behind freshman tight end Bryce Wolma, who leads the team with 15 catches. Ellison, who had just three catches for 32 yards in his first two seasons with the Wildcats, hauled in his second touchdown of the season and his career against Utah. The Granite Bay, California native hauled in a 30-yard touchdown pass from Dawkins in the fourth quarter. Ellison also had a 43-yard touchdown catch in the season opener versus NAU, which is Arizona's longest pass play of the season. Ellison is averaging 13 yards per catch on the season, second to Shun Brown on Arizona.

Demetrius the Thief: Through three games this season, junior safety Demetrius Flannigan-Fowles is tied for sixth in the country, averaging 0.8 interceptions per game. He has three on the season in four games. Flannigan-Fowles had two interceptions in the season opener versus NAU and then picked off another pass versus Houston. He entered the season with three career interceptions in 25 games. Twice in his career, Flannigan-Fowles has picked off at least one pass in back-to-back games. Last season, he notched an interception in Week 2 versus Grambling State, and then had another one a week later against Hawai'i. Before he picked off passes in back-to-back games this season, he was the last Wildcat to do it last year. Flannigan-Fowles also already has more interceptions than any individual Wildcat had last season. Against UTEP, Flannigan-Fowles didn't have an interception, but did recover a fumble forced by linebacker Colin Schooler. He then had seven tackles and a pass breakup against Utah. No Arizona player last year had multiple interceptions and a fumble recovery. Additionally, Flannigan-Fowles had two tackles against the Miners and now has 107 stops for his career.

A Dane-dy Start: Prior to the season, senior Dane Cruikshank moved positions, switching from the boundary cornerback spot to the "Spur" safety spot for the Wildcats. The senior from Chino Hills, California embraced the move and was named a captain for Arizona's season opener versus NAU. The position change seems to have agreed with Cruikshank, who started all 12 games for the Wildcats a year ago. Cruikshank had six solo tackles, one tackle-for-loss and a forced fumble versus Houston. It was the second solo tackle-for-loss of his career and first forced fumble. Cruikshank then had two tackles, and another half tackle-for-loss against UTEP in another strong showing. Against Utah, Cruikshank again combined on a tackle-for-loss with defensive lineman Finton Connolly. Cruikshank didn't have any tackles-for-loss in his first 11 games as a Wildcat, but has three over his last five games after notching one in last year's season finale against Arizona State. Cruikshank has 15 tackles in four games for the Wildcats this season.

NFL Cats: A month into the NFL season, the Arizona Wildcats have eight former players currently in the league. Three more have been signed to practice squads. The headliner is of course Rob Gronkowski, who entered his eighth season in the NFL with 6,095 yards and 68 touchdowns on 405 catches. He'll have another former Wildcat on the roster with him in New England in linebacker Marquis Flowers, who was traded by Cincinnati near the end of training camp. Kicker Nick Folk won the job in Tampa Bay and will prepare to enter his 11th season as a pro, where he will play for former Arizona State head coach Dirk Koetter. Brooks Reed had a fast start to his season, coming up with a sack on the final defensive play of the game for the Atlanta Falcons in Week 1 to secure a win over the Chicago Bears. The list of Cats in the NFL includes: Marquis Flowers (LB, New England Patriots), Nick Foles (QB, Philadelphia Eagles), Nick Folk (K, Tampa Bay Buccaneers), Robert Golden (S, Pittsburgh Steelers), Rob Gronkowski (TE, New England Patriots), Earl Mitchell (DT, San Francisco 49ers), Will Parks (S, Denver Broncos), Brooks Reed (DE, Atlanta Falcons), Scooby Wright (LB, Arizona Cardinals, practice squad), Reggie Gilbert (LB, Green Bay Packers, practice squad) and Cayleb Jones (WR, Minnesota Vikings, practice squad).

From the Diamond to the Gridiron: Arizona's roster features two players – Donovan Tate and Malcolm Holland – who spent a combined 10 seasons playing professional baseball. Tate played six seasons in the San Diego Padres and Los Angeles Dodgers systems after being the No. 3 pick of the 2009 Major League Baseball Draft by the Padres. He retired from baseball following the 2016 season. A top-tier quarterback prospect when he was at Cartersville High School in Georgia, Tate decided to give college football a try after his baseball career ended. Tate, now 26, reconnected with coach Rich Rodriguez, who recruited the quarterback out of high school. He moved to Tucson in the summer and has five years to play four seasons. He made his collegiate debut Friday against UTEP. He completed the only pass he attempted for 10 yards. Holland was a 33rd round pick of the Dodgers in 2011 and signed with the club. He retired after the 2014 season and joined Arizona in 2015. Holland, a former middle infield partner of current Dodgers shortstop Corey Seager in the minors, redshirted in 2015, before playing in all 12 games last year as a reserve corner and special teams contributor.

Up Next: Arizona returns home for a Family Weekend matchup with UCLA on Saturday, Oct. 14. The game will be televised by the Pac-12 Network beginning at 6 p.m. (MST).

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — Sefo Liufau has his groove back, and so does Colorado's offense.

It came at just the right time for the Buffaloes with a season-defining stretch up next.

Liufau passed for three touchdowns and ran for another, helping No. 16 Colorado roll over Arizona 49-24 on Saturday night for the Buffaloes' first four-game winning streak in 14 years.

The victory keeps Colorado (8-2, 7-1 Pac-12, No. 12 CFP) atop the Pac-12 South with games against No. 23 Washington State and No. 13 Utah coming up to close out the regular season.

"We're right where we want to be," Liufau said.

Liufau was sharp after being banged up against UCLA, hitting 19 of 27 passes for 213 yards, including two touchdowns to Shay Fields. Liufau also ran for a 2-yard score.

Phillip Lindsay ran for 119 yards and three touchdowns, helping the Buffaloes to their best start since opening the 2001 season 8-2.

"It felt great, especially with the passing game; it has not been there," Fields said. "It's something we stressed before this game."

While Colorado is on course for the Pac-12 South title, Arizona (2-8, 0-7) is in the midst of its first seven-game losing streak since 2004.

The Wildcats moved the ball well on offense but failed to capitalize on some early chances to allow Colorado to pull away.

"It hasn't been a great season, but we're still going to come out and play," Arizona quarterback Brandon Dawkins said. "We're not going to hand any teams any wins."

Samajie Grant ran for 113 yards and two touchdowns and the Wildcats outgained Colorado 417-388 in total yards. Arizona also had 13 penalties for 143 yards and three drives that ended with missed field goals by Josh Pollack.

"Those are killers," Arizona coach Rich Rodriguez said of the penalties. "It's hard for us to stop somebody and we finally stop them, to give them a first down on a penalty with poor technique. You're not a good football team when you do those things and you don't give yourself a chance to beat anybody."

THE TAKEAWAY

Colorado: The Buffaloes played the way they were supposed to against a downtrodden opponent to remain a game ahead of No. 13 Utah in the Pac-12 South.

Arizona: The Wildcats' defense was picked apart yet again, and their offense was unable to capitalize on numerous chances. Arizona has two games left to avoid going winless in the Pac-12.

» Senior Samajie Grant, who moved from wide receiver to running back earlier this season, produced his first career rushing touchdown and his first career 100-yard rushing performance. Grant finished with 113 yards and two touchdowns on 16 carries, averaging 7.1 yards per carry. Grant's two touchdowns were both from three yards out. His long rush on the night was a 45-yard tote.

» Redshirt sophomore linebacker Brandon Rutt intercepted Colorado quarterback Sefo Liufau for his first career interception Saturday. It was the team's seventh interception of the season.

The 2014 Pac-12 Coach of the Year, **Rich Rodriguez** begins his sixth season at the helm of the Arizona football program. He was introduced as the Wildcats' 30th head coach on Nov. 22, 2011.

Entering the 2017 season, Rodriguez carries a career record of 156-113-2 in 22 seasons, marked by Division I records of 60-26 at West Virginia, 15-22 at Michigan and 36-29 with the Wildcats. He began his head coaching career at Salem (W.Va.) University in 1988 and then coached at Glenville State (W.Va.) from 1990-96.

Rodriguez's third season with the Wildcats was highlighted by a 10-4 record, a Pac-12 South Championship, a Fiesta Bowl berth and winning the Territorial Cup game against ASU. Arizona finished the regular season with 10 wins for only the third time in program history as Rodriguez was named the 2014 Pac-12 Coach of the Year. The streak continued as Rodriguez and the squad defeated a top-10 ranked program for the third-straight campaign with a 31-24 road victory over No. 2 Oregon on Oct. 2.

Offensively, quarterback Anu Solomon became the first freshman ever to start a season opener for the school and went on to throw for 3,793 yards with 28 passing touchdowns and only nine interceptions. He owns the UA freshman records for passing yards, passing touchdowns, pass attempts (540) and pass completions (313). Freshman Nick Wilson collected seven games with 100+ yards and with his 1,375 markers on the season, he set the school freshman rushing record.

Linebacker Scooby Wright III was easily the nation's most prolific defender. Based on a vote of head coaches, media and college athletics personnel, he won the Bronko Nagurski Trophy, the Rotary Lombardi Award and the Chuck Bednarik Award, all given annually to the nation's top defender. Also the Pat Tillman Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year, he ranked in the top five among FBS players for total tackles (163), tackles for loss (29.0), sacks (14.0) and forced fumbles (6). Wright is UA's sixth all-time unanimous All-American.

In 2013, the Wildcats posted an 8-5 record with a bowl victory over the Boston College Eagles in the AdvoCare V100 Bowl in Shreveport, La. Arizona knocked off a top-10 ranked team with a 42-16 win over No. 5 Oregon on Nov. 23.

Running back Ka'Deem Carey earned consensus All-America honors for the second-straight season, was named the 2013 Pac-12 offensive Player of the Year and a Doak Walker Award finalist. He ended his three seasons in Tucson as Arizona's all-time career rushing leader (4,239 yards) and all-time all-purpose yardage leader (5,483). Carey recorded 16-straight games in which he eclipsed the century mark rushing, the longest streak in Pac-12 history and the longest for any FBS player in the last 10 seasons.

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — Brandon Dawkins accounted for three touchdowns and Arizona ran for 506 yards to open the season with a 62-24 victory over Northern Arizona on Saturday night.

Arizona struggled to slow the FCS Lumberjacks and sputtered on offense in the first quarter before coming alive.

Shun Brown sparked the Wildcats with a 66-yard punt return for a touchdown and Dawkins got their offense going with his arm and his legs. The junior ran for 92 yards and two touchdowns on seven carries, and threw for 89 yards and a score to help the Wildcats win their 17th straight home opener.

Arizona had six different players score rushing touchdowns and fell just short of the school record of 511 yards rushing set in the 2016 season finale against Arizona State.

Case Cookus threw for 306 yards on 21-of-38 passing for Northern Arizona, but also had three turnovers. Cory Young ran for 115 yards and two scores.

The Lumberjacks had a rough trip to Tucson two years ago, losing 77-13 as Arizona set school records for points, total yards (792) and rushing yards (499).

Northern Arizona was much better defensively at the start and had no trouble moving the ball against Arizona's young defense. The Lumberjacks broke off several long plays, including Young's 58-yard touchdown run, and out-gained the Wildcats in the first half.

The problem was turnovers.

Cookus lost a fumble when he was blindsided in the first quarter, setting up Wilson's 46-yard touchdown run.

Cookus later tried to squeeze a pass into coverage near the end zone that was picked off by Demetrius Flannigan-Fowles at the 1-yard line. Flannigan-Fowles had another pick late in the half, setting up a 10-yard scoring run by Dawkins that put Arizona up 34-14 at halftime.

Dawkins raced off for a 66-yard touchdown to open the second half and Arizona's defense, which gave up 203 yards in the first quarter, slowed the Lumberjacks before allowing a couple of late scores with the game out of reach.

THETAKEAWAY

Northern Arizona proved it can move the ball on offense, but can't afford the turnovers, particularly against an FBS team.

Arizona did what it was supposed to against an FCS school, but there are still questions on defense.

UP NEXT

Northern Arizona faces Western Illinois next Saturday.

Arizona hosts Houston next Saturday in what should be a high-scoring game.

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — After the Houston Cougars had to deal with a hurricane and devastating flooding in their home city, they finally got back to playing football Saturday night.

And gave Major Applewhite his first victory as a head coach.

Ex-Texas A&M quarterback Kyle Allen threw for 225 yards and a touchdown but was intercepted twice in his first game for Houston and the Cougars had to hold on to beat Arizona 19-16 in their week-delayed season opener.

"I'm really, really proud of our players. They've been through a lot," Applewhite said. "Fortunately, not many were affected by the flood but just the circumstances of being 19, 20, 21, 22 years old, just all the stuff they've been dealing with."

John Leday's 81-yard kickoff return set up Houston's go-ahead touchdown with 45 seconds left in the first half. Josh Pollack kicked three field goals for Arizona (1-1), the last, from 42, yards cut the lead to 19-16 with 8:32 to play.

Khalil Tate replaced Arizona quarterback Brandon Dawkins early in the fourth quarter and the Wildcats were at the Houston 32 when Garrett Davis' interception with 3:49 remaining preserved the win.

Dawkins, who returned for the final three minutes, fumbled the ball away twice, one for a safety, in the second half.

Arizona coach Rich Rodriguez said Dawkins "got a little nicked up. I am not going to elaborate. I'm not a doctor."

Asked how Dawkins played, Rodriguez said, "I don't know if anybody offensively played really well. I'll have to watch the film. It wasn't our best effort."

Allen, one of the nation's top recruits from suburban Phoenix in 2013, started 14 games and played in 20 for Texas A&M before transferring to Houston. He sat out last season as a redshirt. He said he didn't find out until Saturday that he would start.

"I've waited a year and a half, two years and it was just really good to get back out there," he said, "with a new squad, with a lot of guys I'm really close with, a lot of guys I trust a lot and really care about."

Allen said the issues that led to the interceptions are easily correctable.

Applewhite said he thought Allen "did fine."

"It was good to see him play," Applewhite said. "I hadn't seen him play in two years."

Rodriguez said his defense played better than it did a week ago against Northern Arizona.

Allen, who completed 25 of 32 passes, threw 49 yards to Keith Corbin to set up his first TD pass as a Cougar, five yards to Linell Bonner to put Houston up 10-3 with five minutes left in the half.

Arizona, helped by a pass interference penalty in the end zone, tied it 10-10 on Zach Green's 1-yard run 2:22 before halftime.

Leday took the subsequent kickoff and the last man who had a chance to stop him, Kwesi Mashack, tackled him at the Wildcats 16. Dillon Birden's 3-yard touchdown run with 45 seconds gave Houston its 17-10 halftime lead.

EL PASO, TEXAS (AP) — Brandon Dawkins scored six touchdowns -- three passing and three rushing -- to lead Arizona to a 63-16 win over UTEP on Friday night.

Dawkins, who played only one series in the fourth quarter, threw for 155 yards on 18-of-22 passing and ran for 143 yards on 13 carries.

Arizona came into the game as a 25-point favorite, but struggled in the first quarter against winless UTEP before scoring 28 unanswered points.

The Wildcats (2-1) scored on the first play of the second quarter when Dawkins found freshman J.J. Taylor for 2-yard TD on fourth-and-goal, capping a 12-play, 78-yard drive. Dawkins connected with Shun Brown on a 36-yard touchdown pass followed by a 5-yard Dawkins TD run three minutes later to push the lead to 28-0.

After UTEP (0-3) scored on a pass from Zack Greenlee to Tyler Batson with 2:50 remaining in the half, Dawkins scored his fourth touchdown on a 3-yard run as the Wildcats scored 35 second-quarter points to take a 35-9 lead. It was the first points allowed by the Wildcats in three quarters after holding Houston scoreless in the second half last week.

Arizona continued its offensive onslaught in the third, scoring two more touchdowns -- on Dawkins' 13-yard run and Bryce Wolma's catch.

"It just came down to execution," Dawkins said. "We executed a lot better, I executed a lot better and that's the kind of result you're going to get."

UTEP scored its lone second-half touchdown on Mark Torrez's 6-yard run in the third and Arizona closed with 21 unanswered points.

Arizona coach Rich Rodriguez was impressed with how Dawkins came back from last week's loss to Houston. "He showed me that he is the competitor I thought he always was," Rodriguez said. "That's one thing that will not change about Brandon. He is a competitive guy. He played well, he did a nice job and bailed us out a couple of times."

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — When Utah quarterback Tyler Huntley went down with a shoulder injury in the second quarter, the Utes had an experienced and reliable alternative ready.

Troy Williams, a senior who started 13 games last season, came on and guided the No. 23 Utes to a 30-24 victory over Arizona on Friday night in the Pac-12 opener for both schools.

"We're in a good place quarterback-wise," Utah coach Kyle Whittingham said. "Obviously we want Tyler back as soon as possible, but Troy won nine games for us last year, and he was ready."

Not that was easy.

Chris Hart recovered Arizona quarterback Brandon Dawkins' fumble at Utah's 20-yard line with 2:33 left to preserve the victory.

Wildcats coach Rich Rodriguez didn't think it was a fumble.

But, Dawkins said, "You've got to go with what the refs call and that's what they called. I shouldn't have made it close. I should have held the ball a little tighter and not let them get a late strip there. So that's on me regardless."

Utah (4-0) led throughout and was up 30-17 late in the fourth quarter, but Dawkins threw a 30-yard TD pass to Tony Ellison with 2:44 to play, cutting the lead to six. The subsequent onside kick attempt bounced downfield, and Arizona's Shawn Poindexter recovered at the Utes' 35.

On the next play, Dawkins ran 15 yards to the 20 but fumbled, and Hart recovered.

The Wildcats (2-2) committed five turnovers, including three interceptions by Dawkins.

Utah scored a touchdown on its first possession, and then Arizona twice cut the lead to three -- the last time at 20-17 on J.J. Taylor's 7-yard TD run with 4:38 left in the third quarter.

But 2 1/2 minutes later, with Arizona deep in its own territory, Dawkins threw short over the middle and Javelin Guidry intercepted, returning it 14 yards for a touchdown that made it 27-17.

Huntley completed 8 of 9 passes for 98 yards before he left with an injured shoulder after being sacked by Tony Fields with 8:45 left in the half.

Taylor fumbled at Utah's 1-yard line in the second quarter, and the Utes drove all the way to the Wildcats 8. Six plays into the long drive, Huntley was injured and Williams -- who started 13 games last season -- took over. On his first play, Williams connected on a 40-yard pass to Darren Carrington, helping to set up one of Matt Gay's three field goals, this one from 26 yards, to put the Utes up 13-3 with 5:39 left in the half.

"I prepare like I'm the starter every week," Williams said. "I'm working hard every day. When my number is called I make sure I'm ready to go in. (The play) got me into things. Got me in a groove a little bit. I wanted to play smart football. I didn't want to force anything."

Utah grabbed a quick 7-0 lead on its first possession with a six-play, 73-yard scoring drive. Huntley threw 8 yards to Samson Nacua for the touchdown.
