#### The Game

Utah (5-6, 2-6 Pac-12) hosts Colorado (5-6, 2-6 Pac-12) in the regular season finale on Saturday, Nov. 25 at 8 p.m. MT in Rice-Eccles Stadium. The game will be televised on FS1. Radio is ESPN700 and Tunein.com. Search #CUvsUTAH for conversation.

#### **Quick Hits**

- > Saturday's game is the annual Senior Day and 22 players will suit up for their final home game as Utes. Fans are encouraged to be in their seats early for a pre-game ceremony for the seniors and their families. For a complete list of Utah's 2017 seniors, see 'Senior Day.'
- > Utah must beat Colorado to be bowl eligible for the fourth-straight year. The Utes have played in 11 bowl games under Kyle Whittingham and he has the best bowl win percentage in NCAA history at 91-percent (10-1).
- > The Utes have played to 50-straight sellout crowds in Rice-Eccles Stadium (47 standing room only) in a streak that dates back to the 2010 season opener. > Utah is averaging 45,895 fans to its home games in 45,807-seat Rice-Eccles Stadium this season. Heading into this Saturday's game, that figure ranks fourth in school attendance history.
- > Utah is 2-2 against the Pac-12 South this season, beating Arizona and UCLA and losing to USC and Arizona State.
- > The Utes and Buffs have met in football 63 times—Utah's longest series against a Pac-12 Conference team and the fifth-longest rivalry in school history. > Utah has a 4-2 advantage in the series in Pac-12 games, while Colorado leads the overall series 32-28-3. Utah leads 16-14-2 in Salt Lake City. > Last year's loss in Boulder snapped a four-game Utah win streak. See page 2 for the complete series history.

#### Gay, Wishnowsky Award Finalists

- > Junior punter Mitch Wishnowsky and kicker Matt Gay and have been named finalists for the Ray Guy and Lou Groza awards. They will be in attendance at the Home Depot College Football Awards on Dec. 7 in Atlanta, which will be televised live on ESPN.
- > Wishnowsky won the 2016 Ray Guy Award and was a unanimous consensus All-American. Utah has won the Ray Guy Award the past three seasons (Tom Hackett in 2014-15).
- > Gay, in his first season of NCAA football, leads the nation in most major kicking categories, including field goals made (a school-record 25) and 50-yard field goals (5). See Kicker U, Kicking Notebook and Punting Notebook for more.

#### **Utah-Colorado Series (28-32-3)**

Series Snapshot: At 63 games, this is Utah's longest rivalry against a Pac-12 Conference team and the fifth-longest rivalry in school history. Colorado leads the overall series 32-28-3, while the Utes have a 4-2 advantage in Pac-12 games. Utah had won four straight against the Buffs before last season's loss in Boulder, where CU leads 16-12-1. The series is tied 15-15-2 in Salt Lake City. Played annually from

1903-1962 with four exceptions, the rivalry would go dormant for 49 years before resuming in 2011.

#### Last Game • Nov. 26, 2016, Boulder • Colorado 27, Utah 22

Red zone failures and dropped balls derailed No. 21 Utah in a 27-22 loss to No. 9 Colorado. While exceptional play by Utah's special teams and defense kept the game close, the offense sputtered on five trips inside the red zone, producing just one touchdown, three short field goals and a turnover on the Buff 2-yard line. Utah's touchdowns came on a first-quarter 55-yard punt return by Boobie Hobbs and a touchdown reception by Demari Simpkins with 1:34 remaining in the game. The Utes had a chance to tie the score on the first play of the fourth quarter when Kyle Fulks returned a kickoff 93 yards to the Colorado 3-yard line, but settled for a field goal. Joe Williams rushed for 97 yards, while the defensive leaders were Chase Hansen (13 tackles, 1 TFL, 1 forced fumble), Kavika Luafatasaga (10 tackles, 2 TFL 1 forced fumble) and Hunter Dimick (3 pass breakups, 1 TFL and a half sack).

Onetime cornerback Terrell Burgess has moved to safety, where he is backing up Chase Hansen at strong safety. Burgess got his first career start last week at Washington in place of the injured Hansen ... Eight true freshmen have played: Javelin Guidry, Tyquez Hampton, Jaylon Johnson, Chayden Johnston, Ali'i Niumatalolo, Noah Rodriguez-Trammell, Bryan Thompson and Orlando Umana ... Utah's roster contains 32 players of Polynesian descent.

#### Kicker U

Utah will be well represented at the prestigious Home Depot College Football Awards in Atlanta on Dec. 7. Juniors Mitch Wishnowsky and Matt Gay are among three finalists for the Ray Guy and Lou Groza awards, which honor the nation's best punter and kicker. Wishnowsky, the 2016 Ray Guy Award winner, repeats as a finalist, while Gay is a finalist for the Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award in his first collegiate season. Wishnowsky ranks second in the nation in net punting (43.21) and percentage of punts inside the 10-yard line (23.81%, 10-of-42 punts), while leading the Pac-12 (10th in the nation) in punt average (45.0). Gay leads the nation in most major categories, ranking No. 1 in field goals made (25), field

goals made per game (2.27), 50+ yard field goals (5) and field goals attempted (29). His 86.2% field goal percentage, which includes a 5-of-6 success rate from 50 yards and out, leads the Pac-12 and ranks 11th in the nation. He is 33-of-33 in PATs.

#### Last Game

The Utes let a seven-point lead with two minutes left in the game slip away, losing to No. 16 Washington 33-30. After taking a 30-23 lead on a 5-yard run by Tyler Huntley, both teams traded possessions before the Huskies knotted the score with under a minute remaining. Washington got the ball back one last time with 29 seconds left and scored on a 38-yard kick as time expired. Huntley passed for 293 yards and two touchdowns and rushed for 48 yards and a score for a Utah offense that piled up 410 total yards against the nation's fourth-ranked defense. Raelon Singleton had 81 receiving yards and two touchdowns. Terrell Burgess had a team-high eight tackles in his first start.

#### **Utah's All-Time Record**

Utah's all-time football record is 666-459-31. The Utes are 403-191-16 at home (85-34 in Rice-Eccles Stadium, which opened in 1998), 241-251-12 in road games and 22-18-3 in games played at neutral sites.

Utah is 27-35 against Pac-12 teams as a conference member and 103-153-6 all-time against Pac-12 schools. #### Whittingham File

In his 13th season as Utah's head coach, **Kyle Whittingham** owns a 109-56 overall record. His bowl win percentage of 91-percent (10-1) is the best in NCAA history and his 10 bowl wins ties him for second among active coaches (one behind Alabama's Nick Saban). The 2008 National Coach of the Year, Whittingham's postseason success includes a 2-0 mark in BCS bowl games (2005 Fiesta Bowl vs. Pittsburgh, 2009 Sugar Bowl vs. Alabama). His teams have finished in the AP top 25 five times, including the last three seasons. He came to Utah in 1994 as the defensive line coach. In his 24 seasons as an assistant and head coach, he has participated in more wins (194) than any football coach in school history. See the sidebar on page 2 for more on Whittingham.

#### **Quarterback Notebook**

- > Sophomore **Tyler Huntley** is 5-4 as the starter this season and in his career. He missed two and a half games with an injury before returning against Arizona State on Oct. 21.
- > Huntley crossed 2,000 yards passing for the season in last week's game at Washington. He has 2,246 yards passing yards (249.6 ypg) and 15 touchdowns (10 INT).
- > Huntley ranks second in the Pac-12 and 15th in the country in total offense per game (302.9).
- > Huntley's 65.4% completion rate ranks third in the Pac-12 and 13th in the nation.
- > Huntley completed 70-percent of his passes against Washington, the fourth game this season where his completion rate was at 70-percent or better and his sixth game at 65-percent or better.
- > Huntley is second among Pac-12 quarterbacks and second on the team in rushing yards per game (53.3). His 143 carries, 480 net rushing yards and four touchdowns also rank second on the team.
- > Huntley's 480 rushing yards makes him the third quarterback in the Kyle Whittingham era to rush for 400-plus yards in a season (Brian Johnson, 478 in 2005; Travis Wilson, 490 in 2015).
- > **Huntley** rushed for a career-high 93 yards against UCLA.
- > Huntley has three 300-yard (seven 200-yard) passing games this season and in his career. His career high is 341 yards vs. San Jose State.
- > Huntley is one of just 11 players in Utah history with seven 200yard passing games in a season.
- > Huntley linked up with 10 different receivers for at least one pass against Washington, marking the eighth game this season he has passed to eight or more receivers in a game.
- > Huntley has thrown seven passes this season for 40-plus yards and 26 of 20-plus yards (27 in his career).
- > Senior **Troy Williams** is 0-2 this season in starts against Stanford and USC and has played in six games total. Williams is 9-6 as the starter in two seasons at Utah (9-7 overall, with one start for Washington in 2014).
- > Williams is 45-of-86 (2 TD, 4 INT) passing for 631 yards. He has also rushed for 49 yards and two touchdowns and has one reception, which went for a TD at USC.
- > Williams has two 200-yard passing games this season (238 vs. Stanford, 262 at USC) and nine career games with 200-plus yards (seven in 2016).
- > In his two-year Utah career, Williams has thrown 27 passes for 30 or more yards, 15 that were 40 yards or longer and eight of 50 yards and up.
- > Williams has had 20 completions twice this season (7 in his career). His career high of 24 completions came against Cal in 2016.

- > Moss has three 100-yard games this season and in his career (153 vs. UCLA, 141 vs. USC, 128 vs. North Dakota).
- > Moss also has 27 receptions for 209 yards.
- > Moss leads Utah in all-purpose yards with 1,036 (827 rush, 209 receive). He has led Utah in all-purpose yards in six games, including a career-high 167 vs. USC.
- > Moss has a team-high 56 first downs (50 rushing, 6 receiving).
- > Moss has six plays of 20-or-more yards this season (4 rush, 2 receive). He had a career-long 25-yard reception at Washington and a career-long 31-yard rush at USC.

- > Gay's 4-of-4 field goal kicking against SJS included kicks of 56 and 51 yards, marking the first time a Ute made two 50-yard field goals in one game.
- > Gay made 14 straight field goal attempts in the first four games before missing from 50 yards out against Stanford.
- > Gay is perfect in extra-point kicks (33-of-33).
- > Gay played soccer at Utah Valley in 2014 and 2016. His only previous football experience came as a high school senior at Orem High in 2011.
- > Junior Mitch Wishnowsky has kicked off 63 times with 44 touchbacks and a 62.3 average, which includes 1-of-2 in onside kicks. He kicked and recovered an onside kick against Wash-
- > Senior Hayes Hicken has five kickoffs with one touchback and two (unsuccessful) onside kick attempts.

#### **Punting Notebook**

- > For the second-straight year, 2016 Ray Guy Award winner and unanimous consensus All-American Mitch Wishnowsky has been named a Ray Guy Award finalist. He was a 2017 Midseason All-American by Athlon and the All-American.
- > Wishnowsky ranks second in the nation in net punting (43.21) and percentage of punts inside the 10 (23.81%, 10-of-42).
- > Wishnowsky leads the Pac-12 and ranks 10th in the nation in punt average (45.0). He has 42 punts for 1,889 yards.
- > Wishnowsky is tied for 10th nationally in punts downed inside the 10-yard line (10), which includes three at the 5-yard line, one at the 3-yard line and one at the 2-yard line.

The Utes have sold out 50 straight games in Rice-Eccles Stadium since the 2010 season opener, including 47 standing room-only crowds. From 2014-present, Utah's season attendance has exceeded its seating capacity of 45,807, including a school-record 47,533 attendance average in 2015.

Safety **Philip Afia** grew up playing soccer and had never even seen a football game before trying out for his high school team as a freshman kicker ... Bradlee Anae enjoys cliff jumping, surfing and hiking. His sister Adora Anae is an All-American and All-Pac-12 volleyball player for the Utes ... Jackson Barton and Cody Barton are among five members in their immediate family to play for Utah. Sister Dani is on the Ute volleyball team and was second-team All-Pac-12 and All-Freshman team in beach volleyball last spring. Father Paul played football and baseball for the Utes. Mother Mikki (Kane) Barton, a member of Utah's Crimson Club Hall of Fame, was an all-conference basketball and volleyball player at Utah. In basketball, she was the 1993 Western Athletic Conference Player of the Year, a three-time first-team all-WAC pick and a two-time honorable mention All-American. She also played two seasons of volleyball and led the nation in blocks in 1993 while making the all-conference team ... Nick Ford's heritage is black Portuguese and native American. He enjoys playing the piano and guitar, swimming, surfing, biking, horseback riding, camping and science ... Leki Fotu played on the USA Rugby Boys High School All-American team and trained with the London Wasps' rugby team in 2013 ... Matt Gay's only previous football experience came as a high school senior at Orem High (Utah) in 2011. He played soccer at Utah Valley University in 2014 and 2016 before walking on to the Utah football team in August. Gay, a junior in eligibility, replaced four-year starting placekicker and school record-holder Andy Phillips, a former U.S. Ski Team member who also came to the U. with no previous college football experience ... Tyquez Hampton has not declared a major but is interested in a career in nursing ... Jordan Howard was seriously wounded when he was 16 years old in a shooting that left two friends dead. He and four friends were walking to a movie when a man (since convicted of murder) stepped from a car and sprayed them with gunfire. A bullet struck near Howard's left eye, which doctors initially thought would need to be removed. Howard, who bears a scar by his eye, was awarded a scholarship during preseason camp ... Ali'i Niumatalolo's father Ken Niumatalolo is the head football coach at Navy. His family was featured in the 2014 documentary Meet the Mormons, produced by the LDS church ... Pita Tonga is the son of two former Ute student-athletes. Pita Sr. was Utah's tackle leader in 1994 while Susana (Tauteoli) Tonga was a first-team all-WAC basketball player. Her 36 points against Fresno State was a school record.
