JENNY COLEMAN



Career—Coleman has emerged as the team leader for the Buffaloes as one of two seniors on the squad and an essential part of the two best seasons in CU history, during her sophomore and junior seasons. Her career stroke average of 75.16 is the third best in CU history for those with 50-plus rounds played and the second-best for those with 100 rounds. She holds the record at CU for career birdies – with 281 birdies

she is 15 ahead of the closest Buff (Emily Talley). She has played in 40 events and 119 rounds in her career with one victory, five top five finishes, eight top 10 and 17 top 20 performances. She has four rounds in the 60s and 102 in the 70s. She has 16 subpar rounds and 29 total rounds at or under par in her career.

College-2013-14 (Sr.)—Coleman began her senior year on an impressive note, earning her fifth top five finish, and becoming the only Buffalo to do so in 2013 fall play. At the Buffs' first tournament of the season, the Ptarmigan Ram Classic, she shot an even par 216 (73-72-71) to tie for fifth and help the Buffs to a runner-up finish. Coleman recorded another top 15 finish in the next tournament, tying for 11th at the UNM Invitational, shooting a 73-74-73—220. Her nine birdies in the tournament helped her move into sole possession of the record at CU and reach a total of 268 in her career – a record she extended to 281 by the fall season's end.

2012-13 (Jr.)—Coleman helped lead the Buffaloes to one of the best seasons on the books and was rewarded with an individual invitation to the 2013 NCAA Championships. She played in all 10 events in the regular season and 12 overall counting the 2013 Pac-12 Championships and the NCAA Regionals, playing in 35 rounds with a stroke average of 74.11, the fifth best mark in CU history. At the NCAA Regionals, Coleman finished with a 72-79-71—222 scorecard, tying the third-best round by a Buff in the postseason (regional or finals) on the final day. Her 222 total was the fifth-best for the postseason. She really had two stand-out performanc-

es that put her name throughout the CU record book. The first was in the fall where she won the New Mexico Invitational, shooting a 70-70-68—208 on the par 73 course to finish at 11-under par 208. Her 208 was the best 54-hole mark in CU history for any tournament and her 11-under par score topped the school record by four strokes.

She then opened the postseason with a stellar third place finish at the 2013 Pac-12 Championships, shooting a 74-67-72—213. The third place finish, her second round 67 and her 54-hole score of 213 are all new CU postseason records. She became the first CU player to shoot a round in the 60s twice in the postseason and has two of the six such rounds in school history. Other than those two tournaments, she was just one round away in several other tournaments from competing for medalist honors. She finished 13th at the Windy City Classic and was in contention entering the back nine of her final round. She opened the spring with a 20th place showing at the loaded Sugar Bowl Intercollegiate in New Orleans and then followed that up with a 15th place finish at the Clover Cup. She was able to accomplish all this while the Buffs played the 20th-toughest schedule nationally throughout the season.

2011-12 (Soph.)—She cemented herself one of the five golfers in the rotation on the best team in school history behind three of the best players in program history. CU had two significant firsts by becoming the first top 10 ranked team in program history and advancing to the NCAA Cham-

pionships for the first time in program history. Her stroke average of 75.08 was third best on the team and also the seventh best mark in CU history. Her spring stroke average of 74.92 is the fifth-best mark in school history as the top six places on that chart have happened from 2010-11 and 2011-12. She had two top five and five top 10 performances on the season with two rounds in the 60s and 30 more in the 70s. She had six subpar rounds and three more at even par. She opened the fall season with a fifth place finish at the Ptarmigan Ram Classic, her first top five finish, by shooting a 2-over par 218 through 54 holes. She then finished 10th at the Edean Invitational, helping the Buffs to the tournament win with a 10-over par 226. When she was at her best, the Buffs were at their best. In the spring season, she finished tied for sixth at the Clover Cup and third at the Anuenue Spring Break Challenge, both of which the Buffs won, and 10th at the NCAA West Regional at Colorado National Golf Club when the Buffs advanced to the NCAA Championships for the first time. At both the Clover Cup and Anuenue, she finished at 4-over par 220 while she matched her 54-hole best of 4-over par 218 at the NCAA West Regional. She shot a 3-over par 69 in the second round of the Clover Cup and then was integral in the Buffs comeback at the NCAA West Regional. Her final round 3-under par 69 there helped the Buffs to a 9-under team score as the Buffs improved from ninth to fourth over the course of the final round. She then shot a 10-over par at the NCAA Championships with a solid 76-73-74-75—298 scorecard.

2010-11 (Fr.)—Coleman got her career off to a great start, completing one of the best freshman seasons in CU history. She was the only player on the team to improve her stroke average from the fall to the spring and she sliced over two-and-a-half strokes off her average, improving from 78.07 in the fall to 75.45 in the spring. Her spring stroke average was third best on the team but fifth best in school history and her overall average was fourth best. Her 35 rounds tied the record for most in school history. She had five top 20 finishes, four in the spring, and 28 of her 35 rounds were in the 70s, tied for fifth best in school history. She had three rounds under par and one more at even par, with all four of those rounds in the spring. Her best finish of the season was an 11th place at the San Jose Spartan Invitational, the second tournament of the spring where she posted her first career round at or under par with an even-par 72 in the first round. She also tied for 12th twice, ironically at the two events that CU hosts, the Heather Farr Memorial at CU's Colorado National Golf Club in the fall and the MountainView Classic in Tucson, Ariz., in the spring. At the MountainView, she went under par in each of the second two rounds, and then she became the fourth player in school history to post three straight rounds under par when she scored a 1-under par 71 to open the inaugural Pacific Coast Collegiate. Her 76-71-71—218 score card at the MountainView was her best of the season and represents her best 54-hole score. She ranks

tied for second on the list for most consecutive rounds under par. To open the spring, she had four top 20 finishes in the first five tournaments and finished tied for 25th in the other, the Gator Women's Invitational. In the post season, she placed tied for 43rd at the Big 12 Championships and tied for 69th at the NCAA East Regional, shooting 14-over par 230 both times.

Best Round In Competition—67 (-5; Pac-12 Championships, second round, April 23, 2013).

High School—Coleman graduated from Palos Verdes Peninsula High School in 2010 and earned four letters in golf there under coach Bob Wilton. She owns the school record by shooting a 33 on the front nine. She was named first-team All-Bay League each of her four years and the Palos Verdes most valuable player and named to the All-Area top 8 team, and a CIF Individual Region finalist each of her last three years. She was the Bay League Individual Champion on her junior and senior seasons and was named the Bay League Player of the Year her last three years there. PVPSH advanced to the California State Championships and took fifth place her senior season.

In The Classroom—She is majoring in business at Colorado. In high school, she was named to the principal's honor roll all four years, earned California Scholarship Federation recognition her sophomore through senior seasons and was named to the Mu Alpha Theta National Math Honor Society both her junior and senior years.

Personal—Jennifer Lauren Coleman was born August 26, 1992, in Torrance, Calif. She is the daughter of Colin and Barbara Coleman and her twin sister, Kristin, is also on the CU golf team. She enjoys cooking and playing tennis and her goal after college is to be a professional golfer. She met Donald Trump at his golf course in Los Angeles and met Arnold Palmer at the Rolling Hills Country Club last year.

KRISTIN COLEMAN



Career—Coleman emerged as a veteran after two-and-a-half years playing in the top rotation during one of the most successful stretches in school history. As one of two seniors on the team, she continues to shine as a leader. Her career stroke average of 77.00 is currently fourth-best in CU history for those with at least 100 rounds played and eighth-best for those with at least 50 rounds. She has played in 37 career events and 111 rounds. She has three top 10 and seven top 20 finishes with 80 rounds in the

70s, six subpar rounds and 14 total rounds at or under par in her career.

College-2013-14 (Sr.)—Through 12 rounds in the fall, all of which counted towards the team score, Coleman currently holds a career-best stroke average of 75.17. Coleman opened the season with her best performance, shooting a 73-72-72—217 at the Ptarmigan Ram Classic, where she placed eighth and helped the Buffs to a second place finish. All but one of Coleman's rounds were in the 70s, with three matching a season-best 72. She found success once more as the fall season came to a close at the Pac-12 Fall Preview, shooting 4-over par 223 to place just outside the top 20, tying for 22nd.

2012-13 (Jr.)—Coleman finished the fall with a stroke average of 78.33, fifth best on the team, having played in all five events and 15 rounds for the Buffaloes. She had eight rounds in the 70s and all 15 of her rounds counted toward team scoring, helping the team to two top nine performances in the fall. Coleman shot a season-low 73 in the first round of the team's first two tournaments, helping her to her season-best finishes at 35th and 39th, respectively. As the Buffs continued play in the nation's 20th-toughest schedule, Coleman played in four of the team's six spring tournaments, including the 2013 Pac-12 Championships. In spring play, she shot three more rounds in the 70s, finishing with an 81.00 stroke average through 12 rounds.

2011-12 (So.)—Coleman cemented herself in CU's top five rotation throughout the best season in program history, as she helped the Buffs earn the program's first top 10 ranking and first trip to the NCAA Championships. She had a stroke average of 76.65, fifth best on the team, and had two top 20 finishes and 28 rounds in the 70s with two rounds under par and another pair at even par. She basically book-ended the season with

her top two performances, with one coming in the second tournament of the season and the other the second-to-last. She finished 12th at the New Mexico Invitational after shooting a 3-over par 222 with two even par rounds. She then performed near her best when it counted most, recording

a 4-over par 220 at the NCAA West Regional at Colorado National Golf Club. She shot 1-under par 71s in the first and third rounds, her only two rounds under par on the season. Her 71 in the final round helped the Buffs to a 9-under par team score as the Buffs moved up from ninth to fourth to advance to the program's first ever NCAA Championship. She also had solid performances at the Clover Cup, as the Buffs won aided by her 22nd place finish of 11-over par 227. She matched that score at the Pac-12 Championships, finishing tied for 32nd.

2010-11 (Fr.)—Coleman had one of the best freshman seasons in CU history, compiling a stroke average of 76.06, the 10th best mark in CU history and third best by a freshman. She had 34 of 35 rounds counting toward team scoring, the second most in CU history with a mark that matched the school record entering the season, as she is second to teammate Jess Wallace. Her 35 rounds also matches the school record. She had 30 rounds in the 70s, third best in CU history, again matching the CU record as it stood before the season, as only Wallace's 32 rounds and Emily Talley's 31 rounds from this season are higher. She made an instant impact, compiling one of the best fall seasons in CU history with a stroke average of 74.67, and while that was the fourth best on the team, it was the ninth best in CU history as the 2010-11 squad produced four of the nine instances in CU history where a golfer went under 75 in the fall. She had two top 10 finishes, both in the fall, and had two rounds under par, needing one more to hit the top 10 of that career chart. She

MEGAN HAASE



Career—Haase has spent two seasons with the Buffs, including playing in all of the team's fall tournaments her freshman year. She has compiled a stroke average of 79.50 in 32 rounds with 19 in the 70s and 20 of her rounds counting toward team scoring.

College—2013-14 (So.)—Haase competed in two tournaments, recording an 82.67 stroke average through six rounds. She played in the Buffs' first and last tournaments off

the fall, the Ptarmigan Ram Classic and the Pac-12 Fall Preview, shooting two rounds in the 70s.

2012-13 (Fr.)—Haase established herself as one of three true freshmen to remain in the top rotation throughout the fall season for the Buffaloes. She played in all five tournaments and 15 rounds, compiling a stroke average of 78.93. Haase competed in four more tournaments in the spring, posting a stroke average of 78.55 through 11 rounds. Of her 26 rounds, 17 were in the 70s. Her best event was the New Mexico Invitational, in which teammate Jenny Coleman won and the Buffs placed eighth. She compiled a 10-over par 229, including a 1-over par 74 in the final round to finish tied for 39th with a scorecard of 79-76-74—229.

High School—Haase concluded her high school career at Lewis and Clark playing the best golf of her career. She finished tied for third place at the 4A state championship with a two-round score of 72-75—147, helping L&C to a third place team finish. She won the District 8 4A individual title in a playoff after second round 1-under par 71. She won on the third playoff hole over teammate Sierra Kersten. Under coach Michelle Grafos. She lettered four times in golf to date and Lewis and Clark won the 2009 Washington High School State Championship her freshman season when she earned First Team Greater Spokane League honors, a feat she accomplish in her sophomore through junior campaigns, as well. She had four top 10 individual finishes at the State Championships, as well, as she placed fifth as a freshman, 10th as a sophomore and third her junior and senior seasons. She also played the post position in basketball and was captain of her freshman and junior varsity teams.

Other—She finished 10th at the Girls Juniors America's Cup competition in Reno, Nev., in 2011, and her 3-under par

69 in the second round was the low round of that day and was named the team MVP. She finished the 54-hole event at 3-over par 219. She placed 35th at the Junior World Championships at Torrey Pines Golf Course in San Diego, shooting

a 8-over par 230 on the par 74 course. She held a ranking of 42 for the class of 2012 on the Junior Golf Scoreboard rankings and held that ranking throughout the summer. She qualified for the USGA and had two top 10 finishes at American Junior Golf Association tournaments. She is the women's competitive course record holder for the Meadowood Golf Course for the front nine when she shot a 31 when she was 14 years old.

ALEXIS KEATING



Career—Keating has been an important part of the Buffaloes' rotation since her true freshman season. She has had two subpar or even-par rounds, one round in the 60s (becoming just the fifth CU freshman to accomplish this feat) and 30 rounds in the 70s. She has recorded a 77.32 stroke average, with 39 of her 44 rounds counting toward team scoring.

College-2013-14 (So.)—Keating competed in all four of the Buffs' fall tournaments, compiling a 78.58 stroke average through

12 rounds. She had her best performance to open the season, finishing tied for 27th at the Ptarmigan Ram Classic with a 10-over par 226 (75-77-74) scorecard.

2012-13 (Fr.)—Keating began making her mark from her first tournament as a freshman, and didn't let up throughout the season. She compiled a stroke average of 77.13 having played in all 15 rounds and five tournaments for the Buffaloes in her first semester of college golf. She opened her college career with a pair of 2-over par 74 rounds (scored on the same day) as she finished the Ptarmigan Ram Classic in 24th place with a 10-over par 226. In 17 rounds in the spring, Keating recorded a 76.59 stroke average, to improve her season average to 76.84, the second best on the team. She had her best performance of her young career at the Anuenue Spring Break Classic, finishing with a scorecard of 69-76-74—219 to tie for 21st place. After a historic first round of play, Keating sat in fourth place, becoming just the fifth CU freshman and 15th Buff to shoot a round in the 60s. Overall, it was just the eighth round in the 60s by a freshman in program history. Throughout the season, she had 23 rounds in the 70s.

High School—Keating concluded her stellar high school career by winning the first state championship in Elma High School history. She finished second individually after shooting a 74-76—150 at the state championships while her sister, Lauryn, a freshman, took third. The sisters were coached by their mother, Michele. Alexis was Elma High School's No. 1 player all four seasons and also won WIAA State medalist honors her sophomore season. On top of her runner-up finish as a senior, she also finished second as a junior and fifth as a freshman at the state championships. She has been the WIAA District IV Individual medalist each of her four years to date and led Elma to the District Championship as a junior and senior. A four-time Evergreen League MVP, she was named the Seattle Times Ath-

lete of the Week as a freshman and the Olympian Athlete of the Year in Golf as a sophomore. She has also participated on the Dance and Drill team at Elma all four years of high school.

Other—She placed 33rd at the 2010 Calaway Junior World Championships at Torrey Pines Golf Course in San Diego and 29th at the Junior America's Cup at Genoa Lakes Golf Clouse in Reno, Nev., in 2011. She was a member of the WJGA North Pacific Junior Ladies Team in both 2010 and '11 and her team in 2010 defeated Canada. She is currently ranked 56th in the class of 2012 on the Junior Golf Scoreboard rankings. She took home ninth place at the AGJA Junior at Centennial Golf Course in Medford, Ore., in 2010 and that same year won the AJGA Junior Qualifier at Wenatchee Golf Course in Wenatchee, Wash.

Best Career Round In Competition—66 (-6; 2011, The Home Course, Dupont, Wash., in the Washington State Junior Golf Association District III Championship).

Academics—She is interested in majoring in Business at Colorado and is also interested in physical therapy. She is a member of the National Honors Society and was named to the Evergreen League All-Academic team her junior year.

Personal—Alexis Markel Keating was born August 6, 1994, in Olympia, Wash., to Mark and Michele Keating. She has two younger siblings, Lauryn and Spencer. Lauryn was a freshman at Elma when Alexis was a senior and the duo led her school to a state championship, coached by their mother, Michele. She enjoys scrap booking, dancing and playing card games with her family. She once played in a foursome with Alexis Thompson when they were both 8 years old at the U.S. Kids World Golf Championships. She chose Colorado because the coaches and players made her feel welcome and Boulder felt like a place she could call home. She feels the program is very strong and that it will be an excellent place to grow as a person and player.

Career—In her sophomore year, Oleksiew has solidified her place as a key part of the Buffs rotation. Through 35 rounds, 28 of which have counted toward team scoring, she has compiled a 76.31 stroke average. She has had four even-par rounds and 29 rounds in the 70s. Both of her top 20 finishes have come in her sophomore season.

College—2013-14 (So.)—Oleksiew competed in all four of the Buffs' fall tournaments, compiling a 75.00 stroke average,

ranking second on the team. In each of the tournaments, she had at least one round of 2-over par 74 or better. She had two top 20 finishes, recording her career-best finish at the New Mexico Invite on September 21. A pair of par 73s helped her to an 11th place finish and a 1-over par 226 scorecard. She also excelled at the Edean Invite in October, improving each round to finish 9-over par 225 and tie for 16th. Eleven of her 12 rounds have counted toward team scoring.

2012-13 (Fr.)—In her first semester of college golf, she hit the ground running and played in the first two events in the fall season for the Buffaloes before being sidelined the last two events with an off-the-course injury. She finished the fall season with a stroke average of 77.17, second best on the team, with five of her six rounds in the 70s and one at even par, a 72 in the final round of the Ptarmigan Ram Classic in Fort Collins. In the spring, she competed in all six of the team's tournaments, with a 76.94 stroke average through 17 rounds. Her season stroke average of 77.00 ranked third on the team. She continued to perform well, having 13 of her rounds in the 70s. Her best performance of the year came in March at the Anuenue Spring Break Classic, where she finished 9-over par 225. In each of the three final tournaments of the season, she had a round of 2-over par 74 or better.

High School—Oleksiew graduated from the IMG Pendleton College Prep School in Bradenton, Fla., after also attending Southridge High School in Surrey, British Columbia, her freshman and sophomore seasons. As a freshman and sophomore, she was the MVP of the senior golf team and a member of the Effort Honor Roll. She had stroke averages of 76.7 as a freshman and 75.0 as a sophomore. At IMG as a junior, her stroke average fell to 74.3 and she was ranked second at the Academy for fitness level among the women's athletes there. She also played field hockey at Southridge High School

and was named the MVP of the junior team. She is also a national and international level alpine skier and has several top performances including at the British Columbia Gold Cup Nationals and the Whistler Cup 2K Worlds.

Other—She finished seventh at the 2011 British Columbia Amateur Championship and was sixth place at the International Junior Golf Tour Tournament of Champions. She took a fourth place at the HJGT Harmony and won the AJGA National Qualifier in Texas in 2010. She was fifth at the Alberta Junior Girls Championship. She played for the Maple Leaf Junior Golf Tour and helped Team Canada win the Saxon Championship in Australia and the World Youth Team Challenge, both in 2008. She also played for the WGA Team Canada from 2009-10 at the Stephen Ames Cup.

Best Career Round In Competition—71 (-2, Arbutus Ridge Golf Course, British Columbia, Canada, ISA High School Championships).

Academics—She is undecided on a major at Colorado. She was a member of the honor roll with distinction as a freshman and sophomore at Southridge High School. At IMG Pendleton, she was named to the Academic Headmasters List and to the National Honor Society of High Schools Scholars as a junior.

Career—After walking on to the team in 2012, Zech has compiled a 77.92 stroke average through 38 rounds, 26 of which have counted toward team scoring. She's recorded 27 rounds in the 70s, including 21 as a freshman.

College—2013-14 (So.)—Zech competed in three tournaments in the fall, with six of her nine rounds counting toward team scoring. She compiled a 78.33 stroke average, ranking fourth on the team, and recorded six

rounds in the 70s in her first two tournaments of the season. She tied for 30th at the Ptarmigan Ram Classic to begin the season, finishing with a scorecard of 76-77-74—227. At the New Mexico Invite, she shot 10-over par 229.

2012-13 (Fr.)—Zech walked-on for the Buffaloes and her impact on the program was immediate in the fall season, as she played in four tournaments and 12 rounds. She compiled a stroke average of 77.67, with nine rounds in the 70s, the second-best mark on the squad. In the spring, she competed in all six tournaments, compiling a 77.88 stroke average. Career—Dougherty finished her career having played in eight events and 23 rounds for the Buffaloes. She had one additional year of eligibility, but graduated in December of 2013 and served as a student-assistant coach for the Fall 2013 season.

College—2012-13 (RS-Jr.)—In her fourth season on the squad, Dougherty was suddenly thrust into the upperclassman role as the only player remaining from the 2009-10 season and one of

just three left from CU's record-breaking 2010-11 squad. In what turned out to be her final season, she played in three events with a stroke average of 82.7 and had her career best round of 77 in CU's first fall event, the Ptarmigan Ram Classic in Fort Collins, Colo., and shot a 29-over par 245 (85-77-83) with one round in the 70s and finished 80th.

2011-12 (Jr.)—She took a redshirt season recovering from injury, not seeing action in any tournaments.

2010-11 (So.)—She played in two tournaments for the Buffs, compiling five rounds and coming up with a stroke average of 82.20, all in the fall. She had two rounds in the 70s, coming up with identical 79s in the first and third round of the Ptarmigan/Ram Fall Classic. She was involved in a multi-car accident and unable to finish the third round of the Heather Farr Memorial. She had compiled a 25-over par 167 in the first two rounds before withdrawing.

2009-10 (Fr.)—She played in three tournaments as an individual for the Buffaloes in her freshman season, with nine rounds of action. She compiled an 82.56 stroke average, 83.17 in six rounds in the fall and 81.33 in three rounds in the spring. She had two rounds in the 70s. She finished tied for 81st with a 28-over par 244 performance in the Heather Farr Memorial Invitational, 61st in the BYU at Entrada Classic with a 36-over par 252 and tied for 92nd in the MountainView Collegiate with a 31-over par 247.

High School—Dougherty was a four-year letter winner at Pioneer high school and was a four-time All-League selection and the team's Most Valuable Player. As the number one golfer on her team, Dougherty led the Pioneer golf team to four-straight league championships. She advanced to the Regional Qualifiers all four years and as a senior she was

a medalist after shooting a 71 at the Mare Island Golf Course. In her junior season, Dougherty was named the MVP of the league and was a second-team All-Metro selection. She currently holds the prep record at Pioneer high for

her low round of 69 that she carded her senior year at the Rio La Paz Golf Club. A dual sport athlete, Dougherty also lettered four years in varsity soccer. She was a four-year starter and a three-time first team all-league selection. As a junior, Dougherty was named the offensive MVP after leading her both her team and the league in assists.

Other—2010: She participated in the California State Women's Amateur in San Jose, Calif., in the off season and shot a 82-84-79—245. She went through qualification for both the U.S. Women's Open and U.S. Amateur championships. For the open qualifying, she played at Coral de Tierra, Calif., and fired a 82-88—170.

Best Career Round In Competition—69 (-3; Rio La Paz, Calif.; TCC League Sectionals in high school).

Academics—Dougherty graduated in December 2013 with a degree in Business Marketing. A four-year P.A.T.R.I.O.T. award winner for maintaining above a 4.0 GPA in high school, Dougherty was also a member of the National Honors Society, the California State Scholarship Federation and she graduated sixth in her class.

Personal—Mary Devin Dougherty was born on December 27, 1990, and is the daughter of Neil and Rebecca Dougherty of Woodland, Calif. Dougherty comes from a very athletic background and is a second generation Buffalo as her father, Neil, is a former member of the ski team at CU.
