

# BRITTANY FAN



**College—2014-15 (Fr.)—**Fan had quite an impressive debut season for the Buffaloes, posting a freshman school record 74.87 stroke average over 31 rounds. She earned six top 20 finishes, second most on the team and shot a team-leading 28 rounds in the 70s, four of those were even-par, which was tied for first on the squad. During the fall, Fan competed in four tournaments and tallied 75.56 stroke average. Her top fall performance came in the Minnesota Invitational where she finished tied for 14th overall after carding a 78-75-73—226 or 10-over par score. Fan had an even better spring, posting a 74.50 stroke average. The spring was highlighted by the fact she earned a top 25 finish in all six regular season tournaments. She had a career-best performance at the Silverado Showdown in Napa, Calif., recording a 74-75-73—222 score and tied for 11th place overall. Fan was named a WGCA Academic All-America Scholar and CU Female Freshman Athlete of the Year.

**High School—**She received both academic and outstanding achievement awards at the Kamehameha Schools before finishing her last year and a half of schooling online so she could increase her golf training. Fan graduated in August 2013, but due to her young age, took time off between high school and college to further improve her golf game, attending the KMR School of Golf, a PGA of America Approved Golf School based at the Ko'olau Golf Club, and competing in amateur competitions. She had an overall average of fifth in the Interscholastic League of Hawaii and was named a second-team Honolulu Star-Advertiser All-Star.

**Other—**She was the Hawaii State Junior Golf Association Match Play Girl Champion and the Makalei Invitational Ladies Champion. She claimed low-amateur honors at the Colorado Women's Open, becoming the only amateur to advance to the final round. She placed fifth at the Golfweek West Coast Junior Invitational. She had top 15 finishes at the USGA Women's Amateur and the PGA Junior Championship and had top 20 finishes at the Canadian Women's Amateur Championship, the Joanne Winter Arizona Silver Belle and the 2012 and '13 Callaway Junior World Championships. She won the Mauna Lani Resort Hawaii State Open women's amateur division title in December 2013.

**Academics—**She is currently an open option major, but is interested in business and advertising.

legiate. In the spring, Glenn competed as an individual at the LSU Tiger Golf Classic and the Denver vs. Colorado JV meet. She finished with an 80.63 stroke average over 16 rounds.

**2013-14 (Redshirt)**—Glenn redshirted her first year at Colorado. She has four years of eligibility remaining.

**High School**—In three varsity seasons with the Valor Christian women's golf team, Glenn and the Eagles won three straight Colorado High School 4A Regional Championships and back-to-back 4A State Championships in her final two seasons. In just her second season playing varsity golf, Glenn cut 20 strokes off her first year average. As a junior, she was named the Jefferson County MVP. She placed first individually in the Jeffco 4A League, had a top 10 performance at the state championship and earned seven first place finishes through 4A league and invitational play. She was also named first-team all-conference and a Valor Christian Champion of the Week. She continued to improve in her senior season, recording top five finishes in all of her team's 4A and 5A invitationals, including four first place finishes, and earning her second Valor Christian Champion of the Week title.

**Other**—In 2012, Glenn came in second place at the RMJGT Tournament of Champions and won the match play round at the RMJGT Ryder Cup, both in Scottsdale, Ariz. She also received the RMJGT Sportsmanship of the Year Award in December 2012. In 2013, she had a runner-up finish at the Colorado Women's Golf Association Match Play and tied for 16th at the CWGA Match Play Championship.

**Personal**—Victoria Sheridan Glenn was born on December 13, 1994 in Littleton, Colo. Her parents are Geoff, the CEO of Three G Body and Paint Incorporated in Littleton, and Rolinda Glenn, an accountant. Glenn has one younger brother, Tanner, who currently attends Valor Christian. A former state champion gymnast, Glenn turned to golf after a serious injury ended her gymnastics career after her freshman year. She says that once she found golf, she also found a new direction in life. Glenn also enjoys skiing, scuba diving, riding all-terrain vehicles, playing piano and traveling. She says an interesting fact about her is that her grandmother is Japanese. # MEGAN HAASE



**College—2014-15 (Jr.)—**Haase competed in three tournaments, totaling seven rounds. She recorded an 83.86 stroke average. She participated as an individual at the Golfweek Conference Challenge, Ron Moore Intercollegiate, recording a season-best 77 in the final round and the Denver vs. Colorado JV meet.

**2013-14 (So.)—**Haase competed in two tournaments, recording an 82.67 stroke average through six rounds. She played

in the Buffs' first and last tournaments off the fall, the Ptarmigan Ram Classic and the Pac-12 Fall Preview, shooting two rounds in the 70s.

**2012-13 (Fr.)—**Haase established herself as one of three true freshmen to remain in the top rotation throughout the fall season for the Buffaloes. She played in all five tournaments and 15 rounds, compiling a stroke average of 78.93. Haase competed in four more tournaments in the spring, posting a stroke average of 78.55 through 11 rounds. Of her 26 rounds, 17 were in the 70s. Her best event was the New Mexico Invitational, in which teammate Jenny Coleman won and the Buffs placed eighth. She compiled a 10-over par 229, including a 1-over par 74 in the final round to finish tied for 39th with a scorecard of 79-76-74—229.

**High School—**Haase concluded her high school career at Lewis and Clark playing the best golf of her career. She finished tied for third place at the 4A state championship with a two-round score of 72-75—147, helping L&C to a third place team finish. She won the District 8 4A individual title in a playoff after second round 1-under par 71. She won on the third playoff hole over teammate Sierra Kersten. Under coach Michelle Grafos. She lettered four times in golf to date and Lewis and Clark won the 2009 Washington High School State Championship her freshman season when she earned First Team Greater Spokane League honors, a feat she accomplish in her sophomore through junior campaigns, as well. She had four top 10 individual finishes at the State Championships, as well, as she placed fifth as a freshman, 10th as a sophomore and third her junior and senior seasons. She also played the post position in basketball and was captain of her freshman and junior varsity teams.

**Other—**She finished 10th at the Girls Juniors America's Cup competition in Reno, Nev., in 2011, and her 3-under par 69 in the second round was the low round of that day and was named the team MVP. She finished the 54-hole event at 3-over par 219. She placed 35th at the Junior World Championships at Torrey Pines Golf Course in San Diego, shooting a 8-over par 230 on the par 74 course. She held a ranking of 42 for the class of 2012 on the Junior Golf Scoreboard rankings and held that ranking throughout the summer. She qualified for the USGA and had two top 10 finishes at American Junior Golf Association tournaments. She is the women's competitive course record holder for the Meadowood Golf Course for the front nine when she shot a 31 when she was 14 years old.

**Best Career Round In Competition—**68 (-4; 2011, Sun Willows Golf Course, Pasco, Wash., a northwest junior golf tour event).

**Academics—**She is majoring in journalism at Colorado with an emphasis on broadcast production. She was on the honor roll since her freshman year at Lewis and Clark High School.

**Personal—**Megan Haase was born March 9, 1994, in Spokane, Wash., to Bill and Debbie Haase. She has one brother, Justin, who plays golf for Seattle University. Her father played football at Sacramento State. She is a card carrying member of Cherokee Nation. Her hobbies include working out, hiking, reading and hanging out with friends. She chose Colorado because it is an all-around great school, the golf program is strong and she believes coaches Kelly and Franklin can take her game to the next level. She was also impressed with Boulder on her visit.

# ALEXIS KEATING



**College—2014-15 (Jr.)**—Keating continued to play an important role in the Buffaloes' rotation as a junior. She competed in all 11 team events and had two top five finishes, highlighted by shooting a school-record 66 in the final round of the 2015 Pac-12 Championships in Boulder, which helped propel CU to a program-best fifth place finish. Keating took fifth place, overall. Earlier in the year, she earned a third place finish at the Ptarmigan Ram Fall Classic, carding a 70-72-71—213 or 3-under par. She was third on the team with a 75.03 stroke average and second with 25 rounds in the 70s along with three subpar rounds. Keating concluded her year with five top 25 finishes overall. She

was named a Pac-12 All-Academic Honorable Mention and earned CU Athlete of the Week honors.

**2013-14 (So.)**—Keating competed in all of the Buffs' tournaments as a sophomore, seeing 25 of her 32 rounds count toward team scoring. She recorded 22 rounds in the 70s. Through 12 rounds in the fall, Keating compiled a 78.58 stroke average. She improved that number to 77.00 through 20 rounds in the spring. She had her best performance of the fall to open the season, finishing tied for 27th at the Ptarmigan Ram Classic with a 10-over par 226 (75-77-74) scorecard. Keating gained momentum early in the spring, beginning the season with three consecutive top 30 finishes. First, she finished 9-over par 151 for a 28th place finish at the Peg Bernard Invitational. Next, Keating led the Buffs in the Bruin Wave Invitational, shooting 10-over par 226 to finish 18th. Keating had the best performance of her collegiate career in the Buffs' next tournament, tying for 12th at the Clover Cup. She shot a season-low 71 in the first round and helped the Buffs to a third place team finish.

**2012-13 (Fr.)**—Keating began making her mark from her first tournament as a freshman, and didn't let up throughout the season. She compiled a stroke average of 77.13 having played in all 15 rounds and five tournaments for the Buffaloes in her first semester of college golf. She opened her college career with a pair of 2-over par 74 rounds (scored on the same day) as she finished the Ptarmigan Ram Classic in 24th place with a 10-over par 226. In 17 rounds in the spring, Keating recorded a 76.59 stroke average, to improve her season average to 76.84, the second best on the team. She had her best performance of her young career at the Anuenue Spring Break Classic, finishing with a scorecard of 69-76-74—219 to tie for 21st place. After a historic first round of play, Keating sat in fourth place, becoming just the fifth CU freshman and 15th Buff to shoot a round in the 60s. Overall, it was just the eighth round in the 60s by a freshman in program history. Throughout the season, she had 23 rounds in the 70s.

**High School**—Keating concluded her stellar high school career by winning the first state championship in Elma High School history. She finished second individually after shooting a 74-76—150 at the state championships while her sister, Lauryn, a freshman, took third. The sisters were coached by their mother, Michele. Alexis was Elma High School's No. 1 player all four seasons and also won WIAA State medalist honors her sophomore season. On top

of her runner-up finish as a senior, she also finished second as a junior and fifth as a freshman at the state championships. She has been the WIAA District IV Individual medalist each of her four years to date and led Elma to the District Championship as a junior and senior. A four-time Evergreen League MVP, she was named the Seattle Times Athlete of

the Week as a freshman and the Olympian Athlete of the Year in Golf as a sophomore. She has also participated on the Dance and Drill team at Elma all four years of high school.

**Other**—She placed 33rd at the 2010 Callaway Junior World Championships at Torrey Pines Golf Course in San Diego and 29th at the Junior America's Cup at Genoa Lakes Golf Course in Reno, Nev., in 2011. She was a member of the WJGA North Pacific Junior Ladies Team in both 2010 and '11 and her team in 2010 defeated Canada. She took home ninth place at the AGJA Junior at Centennial Golf Course in Medford, Ore., in 2010 and that same year won the AJGA Junior Qualifier at Wenatchee Golf Course in Wenatchee, Wash. Keating shot a 74 in the 2014 United States Women's Amateur Public Links Qualifier at the Home Course in DuPont, Wash., advancing to the championships, where she finished tied for 33rd in stroke play and qualified for match play.

**Best Career Round In Competition**—66 (-5; 2015, Boulder Country Club, Boulder, Colo., in the 2015 Pac-12 Championships).

**Academics**—She majors in communication at Colorado and is seeking a teaching license in elementary education. She was named a 2014 Pac-12 All-Academic honorable mention. She is a member of the National Honors Society and was named to the Evergreen League All-Academic team her junior year.

**Personal**—Alexis Markel Keating was born August 6, 1994, in Olympia, Wash., to Mark and Michele Keating. She has two younger siblings, Lauryn, also on the CU golf team and Spencer. Lauryn was a freshman at Elma when Alexis was a senior and the duo led her school to a state championship, coached by their mother, Michele. She enjoys scrap booking, dancing and playing card games with her family. She once played in a foursome with Alexis Thompson when they were both 8 years old at the U.S. Kids World Golf Championships. She chose Colorado because the coaches and players made her feel welcome and Boulder felt like a place she could call home. She feels the program is very strong and that it will be an excellent place to grow as a person and player.

**High School**—Throughout four years of high school competition, under coach Michelle Keating, her mother, Keating has earned one State Championship title, has two third place finishes in the State tournament and is a three-time Evergreen Division All-Academic Award recipient. She placed third during her freshman and sophomore seasons, and took home her first State title as a junior, which Keating highlights as the biggest moment of her high school career. She won the state championship after coming back from four

strokes behind with only six holes to play. Twice, she has been named the Evergreen League MVP and she has earned medalist honors in 35 of 36 matches as a member of her high school team. In 2012, as a freshman, she and her sister, Alexis, (a senior at the time) helped lead Elma to its first High School State Championship in school history.

**Other**—Keating was part of the 2013 Junior Girls Golf America's Cup in Albuquerque, N.M. and again in 2014, when the event was held in Walla Walla, Wash. She placed 78th at the 2013 USGA Junior Girls Championship in Fort Wayne, Ind. and 65th overall at the 2014 Junior World Championship in San Diego, Calif. Keating recorded her best career round in the 2011 Washington State Junior Golf Association District Tournament, where she shot a 72 on The Home Course in Dupont, Wash.

**Academics**—Keating is an open option major.

**Personal**—Lauryn Raquel Keating was born in Olympia, Wash. on April 18, 1997. Her parents are Mark and Michelle Keating. # ESTHER LEE



**College—2014-15 (So.)**—In Lee's first year competing for the black and gold, she put together one of the best seasons in CU history, finishing her 2014-15 campaign with a team-best 73.03 stroke average. She recorded 10 top 20 finishes, which is tied for second most all-time in a single season and also notched a school record 72.25 spring stroke average. Lee won her first collegiate tournament, earning medalist honors at the Bay Area Intercollegiate in the spring where she shot a school-record 206 in the 54-hole

event. All-together, Lee tallied five rounds in the 60s between the fall and spring, the most by any golfer in a single-season. She led the team with three top five finishes, eight subpar rounds, was second on the team with four even-par rounds and third on the squad, recording 26 rounds in the 70s. Lee finished as the No. 22/23 (GolfStat/Golfweek) ranked individual in the country and was awarded several accolades for her impressive season, including being the first Buff ever to be named to the All-Pac-12 First Team, earned a place on the WGCA All-American Second Team and Golfweek All-American Third Team along with earning CU Female Athlete of the Year honors and CU Athlete of the Week, twice.

**2013-14 (Fr. at Duke)**—In her first collegiate tournament, Lee turned in a top 20 finish as she tied for 16th with rounds of 79, 71 and 24 for a 224 at the Landfall Tradition in Wilmington, N.C. Lee competed in three tournaments during her freshman season. Her best finish came in the Darius Rucker Intercollegiate when she finished in 12th place at six-over par, helping the Blue Devils win the meet.

**High School**—Lee, a graduate of Los Alamitos High School in Alamitos, Calif. was listed third on the Junior Golf Scoreboard, fourth in the Golfweek Junior rankings and No. 10 in the Polo Junior Golf rankings when she completed high school. In 2012, she was named to the First Team Rolex Junior All-America and played on the Junior Ryder Cup team. She recorded seven top 10 finishes in seven events on the AJGA tour in 2012 with one of her best finishes that year coming at the Polo Golf Junior Classic when she earned co-medalist honors. In 2011, Lee tallied six top 10 finishes and one victory and competed in the Junior Solheim Cup for the U.S. in Trim, Ireland, where she posted a 1-1-1 record and helped her team win the tournament. Lee finished in the top 10 on five different occasions and claimed one win in 2010. As a senior, she was named the Orange County Player of the Year and The Press Telegram Player of the Year as a junior.

Over her four-year high school golf career, Lee posted 26 total wins and as a sophomore, her high school team placed second at the state championship.

# JAMIE OLEKSIEW



**College—2014-15 (Jr.)**—Oleksiew recorded a 78.76 stroke average, playing in 29 rounds and 10 of the Buffs' 11 tournaments in her junior season. In the fall, she posted a 78.09 stroke average over four meets and had her best performance of the year at the Minnesota Invitational. She recorded an 80-73-73—226 or 10-over par scorecard and finished tied for 14th place overall. She completed the spring portion of the schedule with a 79.17 stroke average in 18 rounds, including 11 in the 70s. In total, Oleksiew had 17 rounds in the 70s, which was fifth most on the team.

**2013-14 (So.)**—Oleksiew competed in all 11 of the Buffs' tournaments as a sophomore, with 26 of her 31 rounds counting toward team scoring. In the fall, Oleksiew compiled a 75.00 stroke average, ranking second on the team. Her 77.42 season stroke average ranked third. In each of the fall tournaments, she had at least one round of 2-over par 74 or better. In total, she had 24 rounds in the 70s. She had two top 20 finishes, recording her career-best finish at New Mexico's Dick McGuire Invitational on September 21. A pair of par 73s helped her to an 11th place finish and a 1-over par 226 scorecard. She also excelled at the Edean Invite in October, improving each round to finish 9-over par 225 and tie for 16th. Oleksiew had her best performance of the spring at the Anuenue Spring Break Challenge, where she tied for 37th.

**2012-13 (Fr.)**—In her first semester of college golf, she hit the ground running and played in the first two events in the fall season for the Buffaloes before being sidelined the last two events with an off-the-course injury. She finished the fall season with a stroke average of 77.17, second best on the team, with five of her six rounds in the 70s and one at even par, a 72 in the final round of the Ptarmigan Ram Classic in Fort Collins. In the spring, she competed in all six of the team's tournaments, with a 76.94 stroke average through 17 rounds. Her season stroke average of 77.00 ranked third on the team. She continued to perform well, having 13 of her rounds in the 70s. Her best performance of the year came in March at the Anuenue Spring Break Classic, where she finished 9-over par 225. Columbia Gold Cup Nationals and the Whistler Cup 2K Worlds.

She played for the Maple Leaf Junior Golf Tour and helped Team Canada win the Saxon Championship in Australia and the World Youth Team Challenge, both in 2008. She also played for the WGA Team Canada from 2009-10 at the Stephen Ames Cup.

**Academics**—She majors in economics with a minor in technology, arts and media (TAM). She was named a 2014 Pac-12 All-Academic honorable mention. At IMG Pendleton, she was named to the Academic Headmasters List and to the National Honor Society of High Schools Scholars as a junior.

**Personal**—Jamie Oleksiew was born August 9, 1994, in Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada, to Lawrence and Lisa Oleksiew. She enjoys reading, skiing, playing the flute, working out, listening to music, dance and acting. She was a ski racer at a national and international level. She chose Colorado because of the overall atmosphere of the campus and she feels CU is a perfect match for her because of the mix of academics and athletics. She lists the biggest moment of her high school career the decision to move to Florida to attend IMG Pendleton College Prep School.
