

# Arizona State Postgame Notes - Colorado

## **REAL DEAL N'KEAL**

-With 62 yards in the game, N'Keal Harry moved into 8<sup>th</sup> in Sun Devil Football history among wide receivers in career receiving yards – surpassing Chris McGaha and Jaelen Strong in the process. Next in his climb up the Sun Devil record books are Eric Guliford (2,408) and D.J. Foster (2,458).  
-Harry now has a catch in 31 consecutive games in his career, every game he has played as a Sun Devil. He entered the game tied for the 7<sup>th</sup>-longest active streak of consecutive games catching a pass in the FBS.

## **BUILDING AN IDENTITY**

-The Sun Devils drove 86 yards on 13 plays for a touchdown on its opening drive of the game, the longest opening drive of the season for ASU.  
-The 13 plays and 86 yards were both the second-longest amount of plays/yards for any Sun Devil drive this season while the 6:33 time of possession was good for the longest drive of the season by time this year.

## **ALL ABOUT THE BENJAMINS**

-Eno Benjamin had two rushing touchdowns in the first half alone, bringing him to a total of seven combined touchdowns over the last three games (6 rushing, 1 receiving). In the first 16 games of his career at ASU, Benjamin combined for just four total touchdowns (2 rushing, 1 receiving, 1 blocked punt return).  
-With 120 yards on the afternoon, Benjamin eclipsed the triple digit mark for the third consecutive game. Benjamin has 538 yards in the current three-game stretch. Prior to that, he had just 321 total rushing yards in his career.

## **HOLD ON TO THAT BALL**

-A Sun Devil running back has not lost a fumble (or fumbled period) on 699 consecutive rushing plays – a streak of 25 consecutive games. That last fumble came on a direct snap to a running back of the Sparky formation. If only conventional running plays were included, the stretch would be 1,038 carries over 37 games without losing a fumble.  
-ASU entered the game tied for first nationally with just two turnovers on the season and maintained that trend in not turning the ball over Saturday afternoon.

## **A POTENT OFFENSE**

--ASU has scored at least a touchdown in 127 consecutive games, tied with Louisiana Tech for the active FBS record.

## **A MANNY OF THE PEOPLE**

-Manny Wilkins finished the afternoon with 222 passing yards, going over the 7,000-yard mark in his career.  
-With Saturday's effort, Wilkins moved past Ryan Kealy into fifth all-time at ASU with 7,045 career passing yards.
