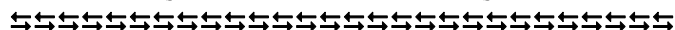

QUICKLY

Colorado finishes the season with a **5-7** record, dropping its last seven games (South Florida can share CU's misery a bit, as the Bulls opened 7-0 and lost its last five) ... This was the first game in 2018 where CU never led ... Cal won the coin toss, ending a run of six straight wins by CU; the Buffs were **8-4** this season (and a crazy **29-9** over the last three years, **1,686-to-1** odds of winning that many times out of **38** tries) ... Cal now leads the series **6-4** (4-0 in Berkeley, 3-2 since CU joined the Pac-12 in 2011) ... With the loss, interim head coaches at Colorado are now **2-3** ... CU's last turnover gained was a Derrion Rakestraw interception in the fourth quarter at Arizona; the Buffs were plus-8 after that pick, but ended the

year with the opponent forcing **12** turnovers over the last 13 quarters ... CU did outgain its 2018 opponents, **4,711-4,563**.

CU Final Stats Leaders. CU's 2018 stat champions:

Rushing: Travon McMillian, Sr. (201-1,009 yards, 5.0 avg., 7 TD)

Passing: Steven Montez, Soph. (399-258-9, 2,849, 19 TD)

Receiving: Laviska Shenault, Soph. (86-1,011, 11.6 avg., 6 TD)

Scoring: Laviska Shenault, Soph. (11 TD, 66 points)

Tackles: Nate Landman, Soph. (116 through 11 games; final TBD/coaches video)

1,000/1,000. With both McMillian (1,009 rushing yards) and Shenault (1,011 receiving yards), it's the first time in CU history the Buffaloes have a 1,000 rusher and receiver in the same season.

CU Defense. Colorado allowed a season-low **211** yards (the fewest since UCLA had 210 in Boulder in 2016 (the fewest allowed in a road game since 2005, when Oklahoma State had just **208** in a 34-0 CU win in Stillwater)).

► Cal going **1-of-17** on third down was the second worst by an opponent in CU history (dating back to 1953); the only worst performance by an opponent was on Oct. 24, 1992, when Kansas State was **0-of-12** in a 54-7 Colorado win.

► Cal was a combined **4-of-37** on second and third down combined, but was **3-of-3** on fourth down tries.

First Quarter Buffs. The Buffs came into the game not allowing a first quarter touchdown for a nation's best six straight games (tied with Army). That streak obviously ended.

► The teams combined in the quarter for 12 first down plays for 20 yards (CU 7-11, Cal 5-9).

INDIVIDUAL LINER NOTES

TB Travon McMillian (21-58, 0 TD rushing)

► He posted the 17th 1,000-yard season in school history (15th different player), and with Phillip Lindsay gaining over 1,000 yards in each of the last two seasons, it's the second time CU has had a 1,000-yard runner three years in a row (along with 1988—Eric Bieniemy, 1989—J.J. Flannigan & Darian Hagan; 1990—Bieniemy).

► He finished tied for 52nd on CU's all-time list (**1,009** yards).

WR Laviska Shenault (7-65, 0 TD receiving)

► For the year, he had **86** receptions (third-most for a CU single season), **1,011** yards (ninth most), or **11.6** per.

(He will once again qualify for the national statistics as he again played in the NCAA-required minimum 75 percent of a team's games played).

► It is the 10th 1,000-yard receiving season in school history, and he is the seventh different player to record one.

QB Steven Montez (33-16-3, 170, 2 TD, 93.6 rating; 10-53 rushing; 223 yards total offense)

► He remained in fourth place on CU's all-time passing yards list (**6,841**), behind Sefo Liufau (9,568), Cody Hawkins (7,409) and Joel Klatt (7,375) but closed the game on second in total offense (**7,648**); he trails Kordell Stewart (7,770) and Liufau (10,509).

► He now has **46** career TD passes (trailing 60 by both Hawkins and Liufau); his **19** this season is record for a CU junior.

ILB Rick Gamboa (0,4–4 TT)

► He tied the school record for the most games played in a career by a defensive player with his **50th** today: Jimmie Gilbert played in 50 at DE/OLB between 2013-16 (bowl games NOT included).

► He unofficially has **93** tackles for the season (39 UT); if that holds, he finishes his CU career with **385** (sixth all-time at CU).
