Colorado Head Coach

Mike MacIntyre

General

"I thought UCLA is extremely talented and I think their quarterback is going to be really good. He is getting better and better. I thought our defensive staff did a good job of putting pressure on him tonight. I thought in the second half, the offense and the defense really made just good adjustments at half time. I saw some things they were doing a little different in a week off and corrected and did an excellent job. Hats go off to our coaching staff. I thought our kids came out in the second half and kept playing and playing. This group of young men, they have done it twice now. They just don't really blink. They are really calm. They keep playing. They are a physical group. They believe in each other. Hopefully we'll keep doing that down the road."

On Defensive Adjustments

"Defensively we were doing a little bit of stunting from some stuff they had done before. We didn't get over in a gap one time and a guy broke loose. In the secondary, we were able to change up a few things they were doing and our kids kind of camouflaged it a little bit. They understood it. I thought [Defensive Coordinator/OLB] D.J. (Eliot) did a good job if mixing up his pressures. We pressured a little bit more which I thought was good. Those were some of the changes we made. Then he just made a few different calls than we were thinking going in because they had changed a little bit. So he changed up a few of his calls which helped us."

On Halftime Adjustments Being More Effective This Season

"In the spring and in fall camp, I pushed us to do our whole offense and our whole defense quickly; and do it over, and over, and over. We kind of overload the kids early in camp. Then we just keep doing it and doing it. We try to take everything to the game. There are certain things we want to call and work on. But we are taking our whole package to the game. Therefore, when we get in a situation and they change some things, we can go to it because we've practiced it and done it enough. I think that's helped us have a little bit more in our arsenal. We are little bit concerned about doing that sometimes. With a new defensive staff last year, we kind of backed it down and tried to add some things and we just couldn't go back to them as much. This year, we accelerated that and pushed that hard. We really took advantage of our ability to meet with our kids in the offseason. We really pushed meeting, watching it, putting it in, installing it. Our kids have really been able to handle that. Our coaching staff has done a good job of being able to teach that and understand that. That, to me, has helped us."

On OLBs Drew Lewis and Davion Taylor

"I think he is getting comfortable out there now with an extra week of practice. We brought him some more with some of the things they were doing. He's mad at himself because he should've had a third sack. He should've had

three in a row. The quarterback is a great athlete and got outside of him one time. [OLB] Drew (Lewis) is doing really well. [Buff] Davion (Taylor) is starting to really flash. Those two guys can really run and I think you'll kind of keep seeing that. They are starting to really get comfortable, see things, and understand things. Drew can fly. He is a 4.4 guy. Davion is a 4.4 guy. They are 225 pounds. They are athletic. They are really starting to understand it. As the season goes on, I think they will make more and more plays."

On WR Laviska Shenault Jr.

"We're doing a good job with it. There will be some games and there were some things that happened tonight, where they were doubling him and Steven (QB Steven Montez) saw it and went other places. It also opened up some things for us in the run game. Steven is able to see it. Chev (Co-Offensive Coordinator Darrin Chiaverini) and they are able to see it upstairs, then we were able to execute some things that helped us. When teams do that, we'll take advantage of it in other ways."

On Impact Of Penalties On Both Sides

"Those are big situations. We had one right there at the end of the half, we would have been on the 10-yard line. Those are things that we have to control. It was a physical football game. I thought both sides played physical. We don't that (penalties) to happen. We'll look at it on tape and see exactly what happen. Those are things that we'll try to correct for sure."

On Slowing Down UCLA RB Joshua Kelley

"Early in the game we did a stunt and didn't get across. He kind of ran through an arm tackle and took off. Then in the first part of the second half, we fit a run wrong. We kind of settled in, kids understood what was going on, that's really what happened. He's a good, hard runner. He hit downhill quick, if you're not right there he can pop one."

On QB Steven Montez

"His work ethic is there. He's seeing everything now. Kurt (QB Coach Kurt Roper) has done a great job with him on that. He's always been extremely accurate. He's stepping up in the pocket and throwing the ball instead of moving out and trying to make a play every time. He's going to make a bunch of big plays anyway. I've been very pleased with that. Our receivers are also catching the football when he throws it to them, that's a big part of his [completion] percentage. They're making really good catches and pulling balls in. I'm pleased with Steven, he just has to keep doing it."

On WR Jay MacIntyre's Pass

"He doesn't lobby for it, but they know he can throw. We've had him throw some other ones before. He made a heck of a throw and Kyle (TB Kyle Evans) made a heck of a catch. That was a big play in the game and got some momentum going, so that was fun to see."



Mike MacIntyre (Cont.)

On This Year's Group

"Their brotherhood. Their closeness. That's not just something (I've noticed), I'm having parents tell me about it, kids tell me about it, auxiliary people tell me about throughout the building. Their mental toughness. A lot of that I credit to our coaching staff and our captains and [Director of Football Strength and Conditioning] Drew Wilson and the strength staff for holding them accountable, and the culture of our program in going to class, all of that matters. I thought we were physically tough tonight. That's what we need to do in the Pac-12, that's another dimension we need to keep getting better at and I thought we did. The main thing I've seen though is just their brotherhood. It's really unique. Nobody's getting on each other (in a bad way), everybody is helping each other. Nobody is panicking, everybody is just playing. Same thing with the coaching staff, everybody is under control, everybody is working well. It's a unique thing to see. We'll have some hard situations ahead of us, but hopefully we'll be able to fight through those and do the same thing again."

On Trick Plays

"We practice trick plays all the time. I have a 'gadget' period that we do every day. We're going to keep doing them. We'll see things that teams are doing and work it. We kind of have an arsenal. We see things that look good for that game or what they're doing during the game and Chev (Co-Offensive Coordinator Darrin Chiaverini) calls it and runs with it. I let him call it and look at it where he feels like it's best to do it. He'll see stuff and he has a good feel for that."

On The Colorado Rockies Making The Playoffs

"I almost forgot to say something about the Rockies. How 'bout those Rockies?"



UCLA Head Coach Chip Kelly

On Strong Start Early

"I think that we were having some miscommunication up front but we started to get that settled down. I think that we can be consistent when we are running and throwing the ball. I think that we are a little balanced on the offensive side of the ball and that helped us out. Then we couldn't sustain offensively, we need to stay on the field a little longer. I think that we left our defense on the field for too long; some of those drives that Colorado put together in the second half. We just couldn't sustain our offensive consistency in the second half."

On The Impact Of Penalties

"They are self-inflicted wounds and it is something that we do, it is in our control. Obviously, against a good team like Colorado you can't extend them. The first two times they scored in the first half those drives got extended because of penalties. We have to make sure that we are playing with emotion not letting emotion play with us. And understanding that when we have an opportunity to get off the field, we have to get off the field, we can't be shooting ourselves in the foot in the penalty game. It is something that we have to clean up."

On Having A Game Plan For Laviska Shenault Jr.

"You have to make sure that you know where he is. (Colorado coach) Mike (MacIntyre) does a really good job, they have him lined up in wildcat and they move him around. He plays inside and outside receiver so they do a good job on how they disperse him. He is good football player, you have to give him credit."

On Montez Stressing The Defense

"Yeah, there were a couple times that we had him down but he is just such a big strong kid that he shook us off. You know that one at the end of the third quarter, we may have had him sacked to get them out of field goal range and it is a whole different ball game. But he was able to shake out guys off, stays on his feet and ends up getting a first down in the red zone and then score on the next play. So when you have a physical quarterback like that it is difficult and we didn't do a good enough job tackling him today."

On Joshua Kelley's Performance

"Josh gave us a little spark in the run game. There were some physical runs that he had to make and I think that Josh did it and came out the other side. It was good to see him start to get acclimated in terms of what we are doing. He practiced really well this past week so I was happy to see Josh and his performance this week."

On Takeaways From Today's Game

"It is in the details, it's the little things. There are some good things that we can improve upon but the penalties are hurting us, and we can't live with those if we are expecting to beat a really good football team. That is what Colorado is right now, Mike has done such a nice job here. We have to continue to improve, we got knocked down but we aren't going to stay down, we are going to get back up and get ready for our next opponent."

ON THE OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION IN THE SECOND HALF- "Yeah at half time we got together as an offense and we made a few adjustments and we just had to execute better. We were killing ourselves with a few penalties and things like that so we knew if we cut the penalties out, just focused on our job at hand and we'll be ok so. Yeah we just came out in the second half with a different attitude so we just tried to execute, focus on the details."

ON WHY THE TEAM COMES ALIVE IN THE SECOND HALF THIS YEAR- "Yeah we have a tighter group and the brotherhood on this team is really good. We believe in each other and we don't doubt each other at all. We don't blink and just keep moving forward."

ON HOW LAVISKA'S VERSATILITY OPENS THE OFFENSE- "Yeah I mean it opens it a lot. Laviska's versatile so you can move him around so it's kind of hard to defend him. When guys are doubling him, there's less guys in the back so that opens up the running game for me so I'm just really appreciative of the players that we have."

ON CU'S STATEMENT WIN AGAINST UCLA- "It's awesome, to get a win at home in front of our home crowd, we just have to continue to do this. We have another game against Arizona State and it's home so we just have to make sure that we lock in for that game and you know be in our P's and Q's and execute."

ON HIS IMPROVEMENTS- "I mean I'm just getting more comfortable with the offense in general so it's not anything really specific but I give all of my credit to the offensive line because without those guys I wouldn't be able to do what I do so as long as they give me one guy that I can make miss or two guys I'm willing to do that so I'm just really grateful for all of those guys."

ON HIS FIRST START AS A BUFFALO- "I'm willing to do whatever it takes for the team. If the coach needs me to touch the ball 20 times a game I'll do that. GENERAL-"We just continue to fight every single play. It doesn't really matter what's going on in the game. We just kind of feel like we are going to win and we look to each other and say, 'Let's go'. We made some big plays in the third quarter to get us ahead. Montez made that long run on a really good play call by [Co-Offensive Coordinator/WR coach] (Darrin) Chev (Chiaverini). Montez looked like he could run there. It was all fun for all of us. We just have to continue to do that every game because there are going to be highs and there are going to be lows. We have to continue to fight together."

ON QB STEVEN MONTEZ-"He's grown up a lot. He continues to grow every single day. He's a leader on this team and a great quarterback. He's always had the talent. He's always had the arm. Now it's just putting it all together and it's something special to watch. He is going to really help our team."

ON SLOW START-"We didn't really panic. We knew that we would get it going. We have confidence in coach (Darrin) Chev (Chiaverini) calling the plays. We have confidence in every one on the field. We knew that once we hit a big play here or there we would get it going and that's what we did."

ON THE TEAM'S MINDSET MOVING FORWARD-"It feels good to go out there and get the win today. We've been working hard. Like I always say, this isn't the end game for us. We have another game next week at home against a very good ASU team. It's really just now preparing for them."

ON HOW THE OFFENSE GOT GOING-"We just came out and started to play at our tempo. I think they got a little tired because we were running that ball quick and making them run sideline to sideline, and then getting them back on the ball and running another play. I think the altitude kind of got them a little bit there in the second half. The second part of it was just us doing our thing and playing good football. Coach Chev (OC Darrin Chiaverini) was making great calls and we put guys out in space and made people miss. We just were making plays."

ON HIS FIRST DOWN SCRAMBLE-"I just thought it was another play. The guy kind of got on my back, I tried to duck him and he slid right off. There was pretty much nobody else out there except a guy in front of me and I gave him a jab step and he missed. It wasn't like that was the play that won the game. It was just another play in the game. I think it helped us win a little bit."

ON THE CONFUSION ON LAVISKA SHENAULT JR.'S RECEIVING TOUCHDOWN-"We heard something from the sideline. Coach Roper (QB Coach Kurt Roper) was telling us to tighten those receivers, so K.D. (WR K.D. Nixon) started telling them to tighten down. Then, Laviska was looking at him and was like, 'What?' It is kind of hard to hear each other when you are talking across the field. I just told him to tighten down and for him and Tony to take two steps down. That was it and he absolutely toasted the corner, and he couldn't run with him. You get the ball in number two's hands and he is more than likely going to score with it."

ON LAVISKA SHENAULT JR.'S VERSATILITY-"He can really do it all. They've got him playing the tight end position. Whenever he's not getting the ball, he's drawing two or three defenders because that's how many guys it takes to get him on the ground. He is a very special player for us. He makes a lot of great plays. He even plays a little quarterback back there in the wildcat. He can do it all. He's a great player. He's my dog."

ON HIS 35-YARD TOUCHDOWN RUN-"We only ran that play one other time. They didn't really see it and they really didn't know what it was. When we did the mesh or whatever, the end had been chasing the running back down all night and trying to catch him from behind. We read it and pulled it. (Tight End) Chris Bounds made an incredible block and sealed the guy inside. I lost a little bit of weight so

I was able to get into the end zone. If I was 250 or 245 (pounds), I probably get hawked at the 10-yard line. I'm just happy that I hopped on that treadmill."

ON THE TEAM'S CONFIDENCE-"It is (the win) a confidence booster. In the second half, we played well. The first half was very sloppy and I think a lot of people would agree with that. Our guys have a lot of confidence which could be good, but could also be an achilles heel for us. I think we just have to come in on Monday next week and take it exactly how we've been taking it. Work hard Monday through Friday and then the product comes out on Saturday. We just have to keep working and stay humble."

ON THE TEAM TAKING IT WEEK BY WEEK-"We've done a really good job this year of taking it one step at a time, and not looking ahead to who is next. Not looking ahead to going to a bowl game or doing all of that stuff. The guys are in the moment and are figuring out that we need to take it one step at a time if we want to start stacking wins on top of each other. Our guys do a great job of studying and practicing. Hopefully we keep it up."

ON TRAVON MCMILLIAN-"I was very impressed by Travon. He's a great running back. We kind of knew that when he came in. He just looks the part and when he runs, you can tell that he is very athletic. One thing that we didn't know until we actually started playing football is that he can stop and go on a dime. His cuts are really clean and really quick. I think it's kind of deceptive. He looks like a bigger back. He is a pretty big dude, but when he stops and he goes, he really puts the moves on them. He's a very athletic and talented back."

WR Laviska Shenault Jr.

ON THE MISCOMMUNICATION ON HIS RECEIVING TOUCHDOWN-"Me and my receiver (K.D. Nixon) were just trying to communicate. I thought I saw something else. I was trying to make sure I was going to run the right route. I thought it was the route that I had, but I wanted to make sure. The receiver was talking to me and I thought he was saying something else. I was just trying to understand and make sure I was doing the right thing."

ON THE 4-0 START-"It's just another day in the office."

ON THE DIFFERENT ROLES HE PLAYS-"It's very difficult, but I just try to know everything I am doing, study more and study hard. When they ask me to do it, I just do it. I just study."

ON DIFFERENCES BETWEEN FIRST AND SECOND HALF-"I think the offense got put in certain situations where it's hard to move the ball, especially with Colorado's game plan. They like to blitz on third down a lot and when you have to gain a lot of yards to push it down the field it makes it hard."

ON TYPE OF TEAM THEY COULD BECOME-"I think once we clean up penalty mistakes and the mental mistakes, the little things, it'll get there. We all believe in the process and we all believe in Coach Kelly."

ON HOW HE PLAYED-"There's always improvement but for the most part I feel like the offense as a whole was working well. My biggest goal is to put points on the board every drive and we didn't do that so I always feel like there's room for improvement."

ON MOOD OF LOCKER ROOM-"It's definitely not upbeat or happy. We definitely have work to do, we know what we have to do. It's very frustrating because you know what the mistakes are and you know what you left out there, and when you have that type of game it's really frustrating."

ON FIRST GAME BACK-"It felt great to be back out there. Obviously not the outcome we wanted but I think we're starting to figure things out a little more. Our running game started opening up a little more, so I'm excited. It's tough to go 0-4 but I'm excited for what's to come for our young team."

ON FIRST HALF PERFORMANCE-"I think it was just our communication. The O-line, our tight ends, the whole offense was just in sync with each other, and some calls I made were off but I'm going to get that fixed."

ON FIRST GAME AT CENTER-"It was crazy to be on the other side. It gives you a different perspective on the whole game. I got way more respect for centers now that I'm playing it."

ON BEING SUSPENDED-"It was tough knowing that I hurt the team based off my decisions. But I learned from that and those three games were tough to just sit and watch our team, especially when we're struggling, but I learned from my mistakes and it's good to be back."

RB Joshua Kelley

ON PERFORMANCE TONIGHT-"Football is a funny game and tonight it was all offensive lineman. It's kind of easy for me to just run through open holes because those guys were fighting their butts off."

ON DIFFERENCE BETWEEN HALVES- "We got to give credit to Colorado...they made adjustments on defense. I feel like we executed great throughout the game but you can only control what you can control, I tip my hat off to them...they made great plays out there."

ON DIFFERENCE IN RUNNING GAME COMPARED TO PREVIOUS GAMES-"It was me just trusting my coaching better. Me just saying 'I'm going to press holes, I'm going to trust in my coaching.' Our offensive line has always done a great job all year, the tight ends, receivers, they've all blocked. It was just me trusting in my coaching. I just looked myself in the mirror and said 'I need to be better'."

ON UCLA'S FIRST 0-4 START SINCE 1971-"Personally for me that doesn't matter, because I know the season isn't over. I know that we can bounce back. I have confidence in my teammates, coaches, everybody. We look to control what we can control, and we have U-Dub (Washington) next week, so we just got to keep hammering at it and fixing all the little details."

Colorado is 4-0 for the 31st time in its history, but for the first time since 1998 ... CU is now **3-5** in Pac-12 openers, but won for the first time in Boulder (**1-4**) ... CU improved to **23-28-1** when wearing all black uniforms, just the second win in the last 16 games in the look ... UCLA still leads the series by a **10-4** count (4-3 in Boulder, 6-2 as members of the Pac-12) ... The **38** points and the **22-point** win were both the most/largest by CU against UCLA ... This marked the first game at **Folsom Field** where the end zones were painted (496 games all-time) ... Almost in half: the temperature at kickoff for New Hampshire on Sept. 15 was **90**

degrees; tonight, it was **46** ... Colorado had two 80-plus yard TD drives in the first half, bringing the total to five on the year, and its five TD drives in all added to **370** yards ... The **23** combined possessions (10 in the first half) were both season lows in a CU game ... Colorado has scored in **15** of **16** quarters this season, including **12** in a row ... CU is now **16-0** under MacIntyre when holding the opponent to 17 points or less ... The Buffs were held scoreless in both drives in the opening halves after going **3-for-3** in both to start the season ... This is just the second season in CU history the Buffs have scored **30** or more points in each of the first four games of the season ... the other? In 1896 when Grover Cleveland was president ... **PK James Stefanou** is now **55-of-55** for his career in PAT kicks ... **OLB Drew Lewis** had the first multi-sack (2) game of his career.

Scoring Run. Colorado has scored 30-plus points in all four games this season, the most since a five-game run in 2002. The Buffs have now scored **161** points, or 40.3 per.

100/100. Colorado is now **35-10** all-time with a 100-yard rusher and a 100-yard receiver (2-0 this season), with a third of those (15) since CU joined the Pac-12.

Defensive Bests. UCLA's **289** yards were the fewest allowing in eight Pac-12 Conference openers by the Buffaloes (previous low was 414 by Washington last year). The **138** passing yards were the low in a Pac-12 lid-lifter as well as the second fewest yards by UCLA in the 14 game series (85 in the first game in 1980, but it only threw 10 passes).

MacIntyre & Turnovers. CU, now **29-38** under Mike MacIntyre, is in his sixth year (the first of seven CU coaches to open 4-0 in year six), had its 15th turnover-free game under him (10-5 in those games); that 22.4 percent rate is the best in CU history (next: 15.0 under Bill McCartney). CU is now 54-24-4 in 82 games without a turnover since World War II.

INDIVIDUAL LINER NOTES

QB Steven Montez (26-22-0, 237, 1 TD, 173.9 rating)

► With **237** yards passing, he became the seventh Buffalo to reach 5,000 passing yards (**5,084**). And in "true" quarterback rushing (meaning sacks are deducted), he now has 1,010 yards, the 10th player in CU history to hit the 1K plateau. His 81 yards tonight were the third-most in his career.

► **First Down:** he completed his first 12 passes on first down and was 13-of-14 in the game for 118 yards; on the year on first down he is now 48-of-56 for 481 yards (3 TD/1 INT); that's an 85.7 completion percentage and a rating of 172.0.

► **First Quarter:** through four games, Montez is **33-of-37** for **362** yards and **5** TDs (216.0 rating).

► He improved to **11-8** as CU's starting QB (8-3 at home).

TB Travon McMillian (21-102, 1 TD rushing)

► This was his third 100-yard game at CU (he had five at Virginia Tech); the last CU running back to have three 100 yard games in the first four of the season was Hugh Charles in 2005. (the last to have four in the first five was Rashaan Salaam in 1994).

► WR Laviska Shenault (12-126, 1 TD receiving)

► He now has 38 receptions for 581 yards (four games); he has one receiving TD in all four games, he's the first Buff to have one in four straight since Nelson Spruce had seven over 2013-14 seasons; Spruce opened 2014 with TDs in five straight.

UCLA GAME NOTES

At Colorado – Sept. 28, 2018



Joshua Kelley recorded his first 100-yard rushing game as a Bruin after totaling 124 yards on 12 carries. He also had three receptions for 10 yards.

Kicker JJ Molson, with three field goals (21, 50 and 40 yards at Colorado, has now converted his last nine straight attempts. He converted a career-best 50-yard attempt (previous long was 49 yards vs. Oregon State 2016) in the second quarter. He also matched his previous high for field goals in a game with three (last vs. Cal, 2017) With the kicks vs. Colorado, Molson has moved into a tie for 8th on the all-time UCLA field goal list (Chris Sailer 1995-98) with 33 career field goals. He has now hit 12 of the last 13 field goal attempts, with a 47-yard miss at USC in 2017, over the last two seasons.

Boss Tagaloa made his first career start on offense (center). He had eight previous starts along the defensive line in 2017.

Theo Howard, with three receptions vs. Colorado, has now caught a pass in each of his last 20 games.

True freshman receiver Michael Ezeike caught his second career touchdown pass at Colorado. He caught his first career touchdown pass at Oklahoma. The season record for most scoring receptions by a true freshman is three which is held jointly by Thomas Duarte (2013) and Raymond Burks (1973).

Linebacker Tyree Thompson tied his career-best with eight tackles vs Colorado.

Linebacker Keisean Lucier-South totaled a career-best three tackles for loss vs Colorado. His previous high of 1.5 came in last season's game vs Colorado.

Demetric Felton had a career-best three receptions for 49 yards.

The cumulative record of the teams which UCLA, now 0-4, has lost to this season is: 14-1 --- Cincinnati (4-0), Oklahoma (4-0), Fresno State (2-1), Colorado (4-0).

The Bruins will host Washington (3-1) next week in the Rose Bowl on Saturday, Oct. 6. Time to be announced.
