The Game

No. 21/19 Utah (7-3, 5-3 Pac-12) visits Colorado (5-5, 2-5 Pac-12) in Boulder on Saturday, Nov. 17, Kickoff is 11:30 a.m. MT at Folsom Field, Pac-12 Networks will televise the game. Search #UTAHvsCU for conversation and follow @ utahathletics for live updates.

Bowls and Polls

- > At 7-3, Utah is bowl eligible for the 13th time under coach **Kyle Whittingham**. Whittingham has the best bowl win percentage in NCAA history (92%) and his 11 bowl wins (11-1) is tied for second among active coaches.
- > Utah jumped five places to No. 19 in the Coaches' poll and returned to the AP poll at No. 21 following last week's win over Oregon. Utah's highest ranking this season was No. 15 in the CFP and No. 16 in the AP and Coaches' polls on Oct. 29.

Quick Hits

- > Utah leads the Pac-12 South with a 5-3 conference record. For the Utes to win their first Pac-12 South title, they must beat Colorado this Saturday and Arizona State must lose to either Oregon or Arizona in the next two weeks. Utah and Arizona can tie for the title, but Utah has the tiebreaker.
- > Utah lost its two total offense leaders to injuries within four days of each other on Nov. 3 and 7. Quarterback Tyler Huntley and running back Zack Moss accounted for 84-percent of Utah's total offense (3,184 of 3,776 total yards) through the first nine games before missing last week's game against Oregon. Huntley, who could potentially return for a bowl game, was injured against ASU on Nov. 3 and Moss suffered a non-football injury on Nov. 7. The juniors were teammates at Hallandale High School in Florida.
- > Saturday's game is the first time since Utah and Colorado joined the Pac-12 in 2011 that they will not meet in the regular season finale. Utah closes its regular season against BYU on Nov. 24.
- > Utah has a 3-1 record against the Pac-12 South Division with wins against Arizona, USC and UCLA and a loss to Arizona State. The Utes are 2-2 against the North with wins over Stanford and Oregon, and losses to Washington and Washington State.
- > Utah has played Colorado more than any other Pac-12 school. At 64 games, it is the fifth-longest series in school history.
- > Colorado leads the overall series 32-29-3, but Utah has a 5-2 advantage in Pac-12 games.
- > The Buffs lead the series 16-12-1 in Boulder, where Utah last won in 2014. See page 2 for more on the series.

Utah-Colorado Series (29-32-3)

Series Snapshot: At 64 games, this is Utah's longest rivalry against a Pac-12 Conference school and the fifth-longest rivalry in school history. Utah leads Colorado 5-2 as members of the Pac-12, trimming CU's overall series lead to 32-29-3. Colorado leads 16-12-1 in Boulder, while the Utes have a 17-14-2 edge in Salt Lake City. Played annually from 1903-1962 with four exceptions, the rivalry went dormant for 49 years before resuming in 2011.

Zack Moss rushed for 196 yards—crossing over 1,000 yards for the season—and two touchdowns and Troy Williams passed for 181 yards and rushed for two scores to lead Utah past Colorado, 34-13. Utah's 310 net rushing yards also included a career-high 79 yards from Devonta'e Henry-Cole. Matt Gay made both his field goal attempts and all four PATs. Utah shut out the Buffs in the first half while jumping to a 28-0 lead. Cody Barton had 10 tackles, two sacks and a fumble recovery. Bradlee Anae forced the fumble that stopped CU deep in Utah territory early in the fourth

Two Minute Drill

The 11:30 a.m. kick time at Colorado this Saturday is the earliest start time for a Utah game since 2014 when the Utes and Buffs kicked off at 11 a.m. in Boulder ... Saturday marks the final regular season road game for 15 Ute seniors ... Utah's best offensive quarter is the second (94 points) and its best defensive quarter is the third (37 points) ... 2017 Lou Groza Award winner Matt Gay and 2016 Ray Guy Award winner Mitch Wishnowsky once again constitute the best kicking unit in the country. Gay leads the Pac-12 in field goals per game and is No. 3 nationally. Wishnowsky leads the Pac-12 in punt average and ranks No. 4 in the nation.

In the Huddle

Senior linebacker Chase Hansen is the third quarterback option behind Jason Shelley and Drew Lisk. Hansen, a former all-state quarterback at Lone Peak HS (Utah), played in two games at quarterback as a redshirt freshman in 2015 before moving full time to defense ... True freshman Devin Brumfield is third on the running back depth chart behind Armand Shyne and TJ Green. Brumfield, who has played in three games, can play in four total without burning a redshirt season ... Sophomore receiver Bryan Thompson came off the injured list to play for the first time last week against Oregon. He could play the rest of the season, including the bowl game, and retain his redshirt status ... Senior kicker Matt Gay was named the Pac-12 Specialist of the Week on Nov. 12 for his record-setting game against Oregon. Gay set the school single-game record with six field goals (6-of-6) and tied the school mark for kick scoring points in a game (20). It was his third Pac-12 award this season. See sidebar on page 5 for a complete list of Utah's weekly awards this season ... Nine true freshmen have played: Solomon Enis, Cole Fotheringham, Brant Kuithe, Devin Brumfield, Braeden E. Daniels, Maddie Golden, R.J. Hubert and Malone Mataele ... Five true or redshirt freshmen have started: Solomon Enis, Bronson Boyd, Jaylen Dixon, Cole Fotheringham, Brant Kuithe and Nick Ford ... Utah has 41 players of Polynesian descent on its roster.

Utah's All-Time Record

Utah's all-time football record is 675-462-31. The Utes are 408-192-16 at home (90-35 in Rice-Eccles Stadium, which opened in 1998), 244-253-12 in road games and 23-17-3 in games played at neutral sites.

Utah vs. the Pac-12

Utah is 33-38 against Pac-12 teams as a conference member and 109-156-6 all-time against Pac-12 schools. The series breakdown follows: Arizona (4-4/23-19-2), Arizona State (2-6/8-22), California (2-2/5-6), Colorado (5-2/29-32-3), Oregon (2-4/10-22), Oregon State (4-2/9-11-1), Stanford (3-1/5-4), UCLA (5-3/6-11), USC (3-5/6-11), Washington (1-5/1-11), Washington State (2-4/7-9).

Last Game

In his first career start, redshirt freshman Jason Shelley completed 18-of-31 passes for 262 yards with no interceptions and rushed for both of Utah's touchdowns in a 32-25 win over Oregon. Armand **Shyne**, in his first start since 2016, rushed for a career-high 174 yards on 26 carries and averaged 6.7 yards per carry. Matt Gay set a school record by making six field goals (6-of-6) and tied the school record for kick-scoring points in a game with 20. He made a 55-yarder to end the first half and give Utah a 19-7 lead. Chase Hansen led the defense with 13 tackles, including 3.5 tackles for a loss (1.0 sack). Cody Barton had 11 tackles, 3.0 tackles for loss (1.0 sack) and a forced fumble.

Whittingham File

In his 14th season as Utah's head coach, Kyle Whittingham is the longest-tenured coach in the Pac-12 Conference and the third-longest tenured coach at the same school in the NCAA FBS. Whittingham was the National Coach of the Year in 2008 when he led Utah to an undefeated season, a No. 2 AP final ranking and a national champion designation by an NCAA major selector. He came to Utah as an assistant coach in 1994, and in his 25th season on the staff, has contributed to more victories (203) than any football coach in school history. His 118-59 head coaching record includes an 11-1 mark in bowl games. Whittingham's bowl win percentage (92%) is the best in NCAA history, while his 11 bowl wins ties for second among active coaches (one behind Alabama's Nick Saban). Including ties, Whittingham ranks in the top-10 in all-time bowl victories by a head coach. Whittingham's postseason success includes a 2-0 mark in BCS bowl games (2005 Fiesta Bowl vs. Pittsburgh, 2009 Sugar Bowl vs. Alabama). His teams have finished in the AP Top 25 five times. Quarterback Notebook

- > Junior Tyler Huntley, who started the first nine games of the season, posting a 6-3 record, sustained a potentially season-ending injury against Arizona State on Nov. 3. There is a chance Huntley could return for a bowl, depending on the date. More on Huntley under Tyler's Totals below.
- > Redshirt freshman **Jason Shelley** assumed the starting job against Oregon on Nov. 10. He has played in five games with one start (1-0). > Shelley has completed 24-of-45 passes for 361 yards (0 TD, 1 INT).
- > In his first career start, **Shelley** completed 18-of-31 passes for 262 yards with no interceptions and rushed for both of Utah's touchdowns in a 32-25 win over Oregon.
- > Shelley completed three passes for 20-plus yards against Oregon, including two for 30-plus yards. He has two 40-yard passes (40 vs. Oregon; 40 vs. Weber State).
- > Shelley has 22 rushes for 69 yards (2 TD) with a long of 40 yards against Weber State.
- > Sophomore **Drew Lisk**, a former walk-on awarded a scholarship in the summer of 2018, has played in one game as a Ute, seeing brief action against West Virginia in the 2017 Heart of Dallas Bowl.
- > Lisk was a first-team all-state quarterback for Jordan HS, leading the state of Utah with 4,706 yards of total offense (sixth most in state history) as a senior.

Tyler's Totals

- > Tyler Huntley is 12-7 in his two-year starting career (6-3 in 2018).
- > Huntley was 150-of-234 passing (64.1%) for 1,788 yards and 12 touchdowns (6 INT) through the first nine games.
- > Huntley ranks eighth in program history in single-season completion percentage (.641 in 2018) and ninth (.638 in 2017).
- > During Utah's four-game winning streak in October, Huntley completed 73-percent of his passes (66-of-90) for 879 yards and seven touchdowns.
- > **Huntley** is only the 10th player in program history to complete 300 passes and his 354 career completions also ranks 10th.
- > **Huntley's** 4,259 career passing yards ranks 11th in school history.

- > Junior **Zack Moss**, a semifinalist for the Maxwell Award as the Collegiate Player of the Year, suffered a season-ending injury on
- > Moss currently ranks third in the Pac-12 in rushing yards per game (121.3) and is No. 7 in the nation. At the time of his injury, his 1,092 net rushing yards was tied for third in the conference and sixth in the nation. More on Moss under Moss Lost below.
- > Junior Armand Shyne is second among the running backs and third overall with 63 carries for 340 yards (2 TD).
- > In his first start of the season against Oregon last week, Shyne ran for a career-high 174 yards on 26 carries (6.7 average).
- > Shyne's 174 rushing yards against Oregon is the second most by a Ute this season (Moss, 211 vs. UCLA). It is the first 100-yard game by Shyne this season.

- > Moss rushed for a career-high 211 yards on 26 carries with three touchdowns against UCLA, becoming the 11th player in school history to rush for 200 yards in a game.
- > Moss's 2,647 career rushing yards ranks fourth in school history.
- > Moss's 477 career carries ranks seventh in school history.
- > Moss has 23 rushing touchdowns in his career, tying him for fourth all-time.
- > Moss scored 12 total touchdowns this season (11 rush, 1 receive).

- > Gay is a three-time 2018 Pac-12 Special Teams Player of the Week (vs. Stanford, USC and Oregon). He was also a Lou Groza Star of the Week (Stanford).
- > Gay is 20-of-23 in field goals with eight makes of 40 yards or longer (8-of-11), including a 55-yard field goal against Oregon. All three misses were from 43 yards and two were blocked.
- > Gay has made his last 18 field goal attempts, which ties the school record set by Joe Phillips (2009-10).
- > Gay is 12-of-12 inside the 40-yard line this season and 33-of-34 in his career. He is 43-of-49 inside the 50-yard line in his career and 6-of-7 from 50-plus yards (1-of-1 in 2018).
- > Gay broke the Utah school record for field goals with a 6-for-6 performance against Oregon. His six field goals ties for the most field goals in a game in the nation this season.
- > Gay has made at least four field goals in a game twice this season (4-for-4 vs. Stanford) and four times in his career.
- > Gay tied the school record for points in a game by a kicker against Oregon with 20 points (6 FG, 2 PAT). He is one of two kickers nationally to score 20 points in a game this season.
- > Gay is third all-time at Utah with 50 career field goals and fourth in attempts (57). He is fourth all-time at Utah in career kick scoring (225).
- > Gay is third in the Pac-12 with 35 PATs (35-of-35) and is 75of-75 in his career.
- > Gay has all of Utah's 62 kickoffs this season with a 63.8 average and 44 touchbacks.
- > Gay made seven preseason All-America teams, including the AP first team.
- > Gay led the nation in 2017 in field goals attempted (34) and made (30), field goals made per game (2.31) and 50+ yard field goals (5, tie).

Special Teams Notebook

- > Britain Covey is the starting kickoff and punt returner.
- > Covey is third in the Pac-12 in punt return average (10.3) and ranks second in both returns (19) and yards (195).
- > Covey tied his career high with 77 punt return yards on five returns against Washington.
- > Covey has three kick returns for 76 yards (long of 38).
- > Central Michigan transfer junior **Keegan Markgraf** has done all the snapping duties in the last three games after managing the short snaps in the first seven games. True freshman Maddie **Golden** was the deep snapper in the first seven games.
- > Mitch Wishnowsky is in his third season as the holder.
- > Maxs Tupai and Terrell Burgess have blocked a field goal.
- > Assistant coaches Sharrieff Shah (return teams) and Justin Ena (coverage units) are in their third year as the co-coordinators of the special teams, while head coach Kyle Whittingham manages the kickers and punters.





Standing Ovation

The Utes have sold out 56 straight games in Rice-Eccles Stadium since the 2010 season opener, including 52 standing room-only crowds. From 2014-17, Utah's season attendance exceeded its seating capacity of 45,807. The 2015 Utes averaged a school-record 47,533 fans to their games.

Chayden **Johnston** has a congenital heart condition (Tetralogy of Fallot) ... Rex Jordan attended a performing arts school and plays the piano and bass guitar ... Ali'i Niumatalolo's father Ken Niumatalolo is the head football coach at Navy. His family was in the 2014 documentary Meet the Mormons. He plays the piano and cello ... SALT LAKE CITY—Two early turnovers led to a 10-0 Weber State lead before Utah reeled off 41 unanswered points to run away with a 41-10 win before a standing room crowd of 45,988 at Rice-Eccles Stadium. The Wildcats clawed out just 59 yards of total offense (36 through three quarters against the first string defense)—the third fewest by a Utah opponent in program history. Zack Moss rushed for 150 yards, including an 86-yard touchdown run that was the fourth-longest rush in Utah history. In his return to action after a two-year absence, Britain Covey finished with 79 receiving and 38 rushing yards. True freshman tight ends Cole Fotheringham and Brant Kuithe scored on their first college receptions. John Penisini had a team-high six tackles, including three of Utah's 12 tackles for loss.
