Colorado Head Coach Mel Tucker

General

"We have to give Air Force a lot of credit. Those guys have some good players, play extremely hard, are well coached and made more plays than we made. Execution for us is what is lacking on a consistent basis. When we execute, we can move the ball score and finish drives. When we don't, we are not very effective. Same thing defensively. When guys do their job and play sound and solid, we are able to stop people and get off the field on third down. It is death by inches. One guy has a lack of execution on a play there is a good chance you won't have a successful play. Our job as coaches is to figure out why we aren't as consistent as we need to be. We will look at the film and be very critical and get ready for the next one. That is what I told the players and we are going to move forward with this football team. I want to give air force a ton of credit. I have a ton of respect for Air Force and what they are all abbot. They made more plays than us."

On Coming Out Of The Gates Slow

"We are trying to figure that out. We came out and got a takeaway on defense early and had a drive early. That was better for us. It is consistency. You have to do it play in and play out. That is where we are lacking right now. If you don't execute it will catch up to you. Our guys fought and played hard, but it is not about that. It is about being able to execute for four quarters, 60 minutes. Plus being able to finish. That is where we are right now."

On The Week Of Preparation

"I felt really good about our preparation. We got better as the week went. Our Friday was as sharp of a Friday as I have seen. From a preparation standpoint, it felt great going into the game based on what we did Monday through Friday getting ready for this opportunity. Make no mistake about it, there is no excuse about how many days we had to be prepare. That is not what we are all about. We had a lot of opportunities to get our job done. You can point to several plays where we aren't at our best and didn't execute and it costed us."

On Aaron Maddox

"I haven't (talked to him). We will see what happens. He was in a lot of pain. I am looking forward to catching up with him and seeing how he is doing."

On Air Force's Offense

"They did a really good job and came out with some scheme runs that we had to adjust to on some certain formations. They did a really good job of scheming us up and we had to adjust to that. As you make adjustments they go to the next thing. They get you with explosive plays. Explosive passes hurt us in the first. In the second half those scheme runs were tightened down and we eliminated those. We were able to get off the field on third down and that is why we were able to hold them in the second."

On Air Force's Defense

"We knew they were going to bring pressure. They are very aggressive on defense. Everyone you play is going to bring pressure and mix their coverages. They play some man but also some zone. That is to be expected. Give those guys credit. They played hard and made plays. When you call a play, there are certain things you have to do. Typically, when you look at the film after the game you will say, 'This guy didn't do his job', or 'We should have done this.' It is death by inches. We have to coach off of it and we have to figure out how we keep that from happening. That is maturity as a football team. We will find answers and I am very confident with this staff. We have a very good staff with a lot of experience with players. We will figure it out."

On What He Learned About His Team

"You find out something about your team every day and every game. Whether you win or lose, you find out things. My expectation is for us to look critically at ourselves on what we can do better. Let's not fool ourselves. Look at it objectively and say, "This is how I have to improve." This is how I can get better and take the step to get better and move onto the next game. We have to play another game. It is going to come on us fast. All of our goals are ahead of us. This is a disappointment, but it's not the end of what we are doing. We didn't come this far just to come this far. It isn't over now. Tt was one game where we are disappointed. Now we have to get ready to go again. That is our expectation. get better, tackle better, run the ball better, a lot of places to
improve. So we will come back next week. And we're going
to improve this week and we'll be ready."

ON WHAT WAS SAID IN HUDDLE ABOUT MADDOX-"I mean, there's definitely an added emphasis on, you know, trying to try to play for him. I kept telling him everyone knows, I think everyone knows how much he wants to win, about how much he loves the ball. So stuff like that doesn't need to be said, you know, you just feel terrible for a guy who's been through that much and just to see him go down. But yeah, we want to definitely play for him, get the win for him and I just feel terrible that we couldn't do that for him."

ON THE 24 HOUR RULE-"I think, you know, we want to keep this feeling, you know, you don't have this feeling again, so I think we're going to come back tomorrow, and we're going to get better and watch film. And we'll see what we need to improve, you know, 24-hour rule applies, win, lose or draw. And you know, we're going to have the same focus, whether we win or lose, we're going to try to get better every day, whether we win or lose, and, you know, heading into conference, we definitely need to get better. And so, you know, we should come in and have the same approach."

ON HIS FORCED TURNOVERS THIS FAR-"You know, it's less me and more coaches put me in good positions and guys, follow making plays. So, I mean, it's all cool. Turnovers are cool, you know, you try and help your team get momentum. You try to help your team head in the right direction but it means nothing if you lose. So, I mean, I could care less about what kind of turnovers I had, how many I have in the season. I want to win. So whatever I have to do to win that's my approach."

ON IF THE FIRST TWO GAMES IMPACTED THIS GAME-"Yeah, yeah, I mean, I just thought we didn't execute today, especially on offense and I mean, a lot of that just plain and simple is on me. I just got to do a better job, can't come out there lethargic like that. And we just have to come out faster, and just better, just better execution. But although I mean, all the credit in the world Air Force, they played a hell of a game. They played lights out. They're a very disciplined football team. They're a very good football team. So all the credit to them."

ON IF THERE WAS AN EMOTIONAL LET DOWN-"I think that we were definitely up for it. I mean, it's not like, all of us didn't want to play, you know, we're definitely up for it. We just didn't execute, we didn't do a very good job executing the plays that were called in the assignments that we had. And then it just it didn't, it didn't bode well for us, we put ourselves behind the sticks a lot. And that that got us into trouble. So we just have to do a better job of cleaning that stuff up. And I think we'll be in a lot better shape. I think we clean up some of those penalties, some of those missed throws, some of those missed assignments, I think that we will be in a lot better shape."

ON WHAT WILL HELP THE OFFENSE EXECUTE-"I mean, to be honest, I don't know that question. I don't think I have an answer for that. As of right now. I mean, I think we have to figure it out. I think we have to keep practicing hard. And I think that'll help us be more consistent. But as of just kind of just like a magic switch kind of flip and everything changes and all of a sudden we're consistent now. I don't think we have that. So I think we just have to keep just continuing to practice and just work at our fundamentals and work in the mental game. And I think that'll make us more consistent if we keep doing that on a day to day basis."

ON THE AARON MADDOX INJURY-"Yeah, just prayers to him. First of all prayers to him. I don't know exactly what his injury is but I heard it didn't look too good. So prayers to Aaron Maddox for that. But he's a key part on our defense he's a hitter, he'll come down, he'll hit you. And I mean, Coach 'Tuck' likes that on the defense. So he's a big piece. Hopefully, his injury is not too bad a he'll be back soon."

ON IF HE WAS DOING ANYTHING DIFFERENT-"To be honest, no, it didn't it kind of just felt the same, felt like the same sense of urgency. Just kind of just felt the same and just kind of felt like things started to click for us a little bit. I mean, we have to figure out a way to get them clicking earlier, you know, we can't just go out there and not produce for a whole half of football."

ON HOW IMPORTANT MONDAY PRACTICE IS-"Oh, it's very important. It's very, very important for us to come out here and correct all these mistakes that we made and just start getting prepared for ASU, because they have a very good football team up there in Tempe. So we're excited about it. We're excited for the opportunity to play football again. I mean, this is obviously a tough loss, but 24-hour rule, after 24 hours, I mean, hey, it's out of our mind, out of our heads, so we're on to ASU. So We're excited, we're excited to get an opportunity to play football next week."

ON IF THE LOSS IS GOOD FOR A WAKE-UP CALL-"To be honest, I'm not sure yet. I'm not really sure how we're going to respond to it. I mean, that'll be obviously a big test for us on Monday, how we're going to respond to this loss and how our guys come back. I mean, I think it could kind of be like a little gut check, a little punch in the gut, see what we're working with. But I mean, I think the guys are going to come out strong. I mean, we got some tough guys in our locker room. So I think they'll come back on Monday and be ready to work and I mean really we'll come back tomorrow and get our rehab in and people will probably watch film tomorrow so it really starts tomorrow, just getting all of those mistakes on paper understanding what we did wrong and just fixing the small details of the play that we need to get corrected to have success."

ON IF THE AIR FORCE DEFENSE CHANGED ANYTHING-"No, they were good on defense don't get me wrong, they were a very good defensive team. I think we just had a hard time executing, I think a lot of it was putting ourselves behind the sticks, didn't put us in a good position to be successful on second and third down. And then I think just not executing in the plays just missing throws, missing assignments, just missing blocks, it was just a bunch of different stuff. Just a bunch of different stuff that kind of put us in a bad situation. We were able to give ourselves a chance at the end but the way we the way we want to run this offense, we don't want just a chance at the end, we want to be up top at the end. So we have to come back and work at it and hopefully get better over this next week and come into ASU more prepared."

Team Notes

- Air Force's 81 yard touchdown connection from Donald Hammond III to Ben Waters ties as the fourth longest in school history and is the
 longest since Adam Fitch hit Greg Kirkwood for 84 yards vs. Washington in 2005. The pass is the eighth longest given up in Colorado
 history.
- Air Force led 20-10 at halftime. The Falcons have led at the half in both games this season.
- Air Force blocked a PAT in the fourth quarter, its first blocked kick this season. The Falcons have blocked at least one kick in each of Troy Calhoun's 13 seasons as head coach. It was Air Force's first blocked PAT since the season-ending game against Colorado State last year, Nov. 22, 2018, when Ben Harris blocked a PAT.
- Air Force played its first overtime game since 2016, a 34-27 loss at home to Hawaii. Air Force won a road overtime game for the first time since 1996, a 20-17 win at Notre Dame, snapping a four game road OT losing streak. Head coach Troy Calhoun improved to 4-4 all-time in overtime games.
- Air Force improved to 2-0 for the first time since 2016. The 2-0 start is the fifth under head coach Troy Calhoun (2007).
- Air Force posted its first win over an Autonomous 5 team since beating Georgia Tech, 14-7, in the 2010 Independence Bowl Dec. 27, 2010. The win is the first over an A5 team in the regular season since beating Notre Dame, 41-24, in South Bend in 2007.
- Air Force improved to 19-28-2 all-time against teams from the Pac-12. The win is the first over a Pac-12 team since beating Washington, 20-17, Sept. 3, 2005 in Seattle at a neutral site. The victory is the first on the road over a Pac-12 team since beating #23 California, 23-21, Sept. 21, 2002.
- Air Force snapped a five-game losing streak to Colorado, winning for the first time in the series since a 58-35 win in Boulder in 1968. The Falcons improved to 5-12 all-time vs. Colorado, including a 4-7 mark in Boulder.
- Air Force improved to 2-0 this season against non-conference opponents. The Falcons improved to 37-24 against non-conference opponents under head coach Troy Calhoun.
- Air Force snapped a two-game losing streak in games following an open week, improving to 5-7 in such games under head coach Troy Calhoun.

Individual Notes

- Junior QB **Donald Hammond III** connected on an 81 yard touchdown pass to Ben Waters which ties as the fourth longest pass in school history and is the longest since 2005. Hammond finished 7-of-12 passing, for a career-best 155 yards and tied a career-high with two TD passes. He ran six times for 22 yards, which included a two-yard touchdown run in the second quarter. Hammond leads the Falcons in rushing touchdowns with four on the season and 13 for his career.
- Senior WR Geraud Sanders scored his first touchdown of the season on a 32 yard reception in the first quarter.
- Senior WR **Ben Waters** scored the first touchdown of his career on an 81 yard scoring strike. The pass play ties as the fourth longest in school history and is the longest since 2005. Waters had his first-career reception earlier in the game which was good for 11 yards and a first-down on a third-and-10.
- Junior DB Milton Bugg III recorded his second-career interception. Bugg also had a pick in the season opener.
- Junior RB **Kadin Remsberg** recorded career highs with 23 carries for 146 yards to record his second-career 100-yard game. His career highs in carries and yards came at Wyoming last season with 20 carries for 128 yards. His 25-yard TD run on the first play of overtime gave Air Force the go-ahead points in the win.
- Senior SPC Jake Koehnke kicked a career-long 47 yard field goal in the fourth quarter. His previous career-long was 43 yards.
- Junior DE Jordan Jackson blocked an extra point in the fourth quarter. It was his first-career blocked kick.
- Senior DB Jeremey Fejedelem led Air Force in tackles with a career-high 14, including a career-high 12 solo tackles. He is the first Falcon to record double-digit tackles in a game this season. It is his seventh-career double-digit tackle game. Fejedelem also added a sack and two tackles for loss.
- Senior DB Grant Thiel tied a career-high with seven tackles, all solo.
- Junior DB Demonte Meeks set a career-high with seven tackles, surpassing his previous best of five.
