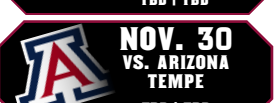
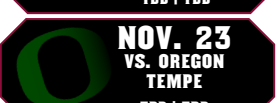

THE GAME - Sun Devil Football returns home this weekend to take on the Colorado Buffaloes in both teams' Pac-12 openers. The contest will get underway at 7 p.m. on Saturday, Sept. 21 at Sun Devil Stadium in Tempe. The game will be broadcast live on the Pac-12 Network while also being covered over the airwaves locally on ESPN Phoenix 620 AM.

THE OPPONENT - Colorado comes in with a 2-1 record on the season and won last year's contest in Boulder. Overall, however, ASU is 8-2 in history against the Buffaloes and have a penchant for putting up points against CU, averaging 37.1 points per game over 10 all-time contests. ASU is a perfect 5-0 against the Buffs at home.

KICKING OFF

-C Cohl Cabral and CB Kobe Williams have started 30 consecutive games for the Sun Devils, starting every contest since the beginning of the 2017 season.

-Freshman quarterback Jayden Daniels (Freshman of the Week) and sophomore defensive end Jermaine Lole (Defensive Lineman of the Week) both earned Pac-12 Player of the Week recognition for their performances in ASU's 10-7 upset of No. 18 Michigan State in East Lansing. ASU has had at least one player of the week in each of the first three weekends of the season.

-The #24/#24 Sun Devils are playing as a ranked team at home for the first time since Nov. 22, 2014, when the 13th-ranked Sun Devils defeated Washington State 52-31.

-ASU has its first 3-0 start since going 4-0 in 2016 and just the third 3-0 start since the 2008 season.

-ASU's victory over Michigan State was its fifth consecutive regular season win over a ranked non-conference opponent: #18 Michigan State/2019, #15 Michigan State/2018, #8 Notre Dame/2014, #20 Wisconsin/2013, #19 Missouri/2011.

-ASU is 37-10 in games played at Sun Devil Stadium since the 2012 season. The 37 wins are 17th most in the FBS in that time.

AN ASU VICTORY WOULD...

- Improve the Sun Devils to 4-0 to start the season for the first time since 2016 and only the fourth time in the 21st century (2004 and 2007 being the others)
- Make Jayden Daniels just the fourth Sun Devil quarterback since 1970 to start 4-0 in each of his first four career starts, joining Manny Wilkins (2016), Todd Hons (1982) and Danny White (1971).
- Mark a 9-2 all-time record over the Buffaloes and improve ASU to 6-0 over CU when the games are played at home.
- Give ASU a 38-10 record in home games since the 2012 season
- Move ASU to 26-15-1 in all-time Pac-12 HOME openers

MILESTONE COUNTDOWNS

- **7 rushing yards** needed for Eno Benjamin to eclipse 2,000 career rushing yards (currently at 1,993)
- **2 rushing touchdowns** needed for Benjamin to reach 20 rushing touchdowns in his career (currently at 17)
- **3 tackles needed** for Kobe Williams to reach 100 in his career
- **4 consecutive games with 10+ points** needed for ASU to set the FBS modern record record for most consecutive games scoring in double digits (currently at 122 games, trailing only Louisiana Tech's streak of 125 games from 2008-2018).

The Sun Devils have scored double-digit points in 122 consecutive games, the longest active streak in the FBS and the second-longest streak in the modern era of football behind only Louisiana Tech (125 straight games from 2008-2018). ASU also holds the FBS active streak for consecutive games scoring more than 7 points, currently doing so in 137 straight games. The Sun Devils last scored fewer than 7 points when they were shutout, 28-0, against eighth-ranked USC in the 2008 season. They have scored 30 or more points in 75 of those games (56.0 percent).

Eno Benjamin **has played 81 snaps in passing routes this season**, the second-highest total among FBS running backs and his 14 targets are tied for fourth. His 137 receiving yards this season are 5th among all FBS running backs and is tied for the national lead among backs with two touchdown receptions. Benjamin is the 15th-highest graded running back as a pass blocker with a score of 84.1 this season - a notable area of improvement early on after he finished outside the Top-100 in the category last year. Benjamin has forced 20 missed tackles a total tied for seventh nationally.

Kobe Williams has been the model of resiliency, **starting in 30 consecutive games for the Sun Devils** - every game since he arrived on campus in 2017. Williams is the 12th-highest graded defender in the Pac-12 with his 76.9 score from PFF. He is the 38th-highest graded overall cornerback in the FBS and sixth-highest graded player in the league. Williams has been targeted 11 times this season and allowed just five catches for 9 total yards - the third lowest total in the country. He has allowed -5 yards after the catch - marking him the only corner in the country with negative yards after catch allowed.

ASU has held opponents to 30 or less points in 12 of 16 games in Danny Gonzales' defensive scheme, notable as it DID allow 30+ in 32 of 43 previous games dating back in a span from 2013-17. Holding three straight opponents under 10 points scoring is a rare feat, one that has now happened just seven times in ASU history and not since 1979 (also in '55, '56, '57, '59 and '74). ASU's 21 points allowed through 3 games are the fewest since a 3-game stretch in 1993 where the Devils allowed a combined 20 points against Washington (17), Cal (0) and UCLA (3). ASU is second nationally in allowing just 7.0 points per game, trailing only a Wisconsin team (0.0 ppg) that has played just two games.

Evan Fields has **nine total defensive "stops" this season**, a total that leads all safeties in the Pac-12 and tied for seventh nationally. On run defense this season, Fields has recorded eight total defensive "stops" to lead all Pac-12 safeties and his 13.1 run-stop percentage is six percentage points higher than any other safety in the league and leads the FBS among safeties with at least 50 run defensive snaps. When he plays within eight yards of the line of scrimmage at the snap, Fields has recorded a 19.4 run-stop percentage - over 10 points higher than any other Pac-12 safety and leading the nation among safeties with at least 30 snaps.

The Sun Devils are one of just four teams to not allow a first half point this season, joining Memphis, Wisconsin and Baylor, though the latter two have played just two games. ASU and Wisconsin are the only teams not to allow a point through the first three quarters of any game this year. Wisconsin has not allowed any points this season but, again, has only played two games. The Sun Devil defense has not allowed a single point in the first quarter of any regular season games against a non-conference opponents under Herm Edwards (6 games). ASU hasn't allowed a first quarter score in 8 of 16 games in the Edwards era and is 7-1 in those games.

#10THINGS (Twitter-Friendly Notes)

1. @DarienButler20 is the 29th-highest overall graded linebacker in the country and second-highest graded linebacker in the league with his 78.2 grade from Pro Football Focus. His 81.4 score as a pass rusher is ninth among all linebackers in the FBS.
2. First 3 games for Eno Benjamin last year: 42 rushes, 179 yards, 1 rushing TD, 99 receiving yards and 2 TD receptions. First 3 this year: 54 rushes, 209 yards, 1 rushing TD, 137 receiving yards and 2 TD receptions.
3. @eno_benjamin5 has played 81 snaps in passing routes this season, the 2nd-highest total among FBS running backs. His 137 receiving yards are fifth among FBS running backs and he is tied for the national lead among backs with two touchdown receptions.
4. @TheEvanFields4 has nine total defensive "stops" this season (plays that constitute a "loss" for the offense according to PFF), a total that leads all safeties in the Pac-12 and tied for seventh nationally.
5. Arizona State holds the FBS active streak for consecutive games scoring more than 10 points, currently doing so in 122 straight games - just four shy of setting the FBS modern era record.
6. With a victory on Saturday, @JayD_5 would become just the fourth ASU QB since 1970 to win each of his first four career starts - joining @MannyWilkins5 (2016), Todd Hons (1982) and Danny White (1971).
7. Among teams that have played two games, the Sun Devils are one of just six teams in the country to not allow a first-half point this season (Wisconsin, Kansas State, Texas, Tech, Memphis, Baylor).
8. @ASUFootball and Wisconsin only teams to give up zero points in first three quarters of any game this season. Wisconsin has given up zero points, period (but only played 2 games) ASU, Memphis, Wisconsin and Baylor (2 games) only schools without any first half points allowed.
9. The 21 points allowed through 3 games are the fewest since a 3-game stretch in 1993 where the Devils allowed a combined 20 points against Washington (17), Cal (0) and UCLA (3).

MANDRAKE OF THE WEEK

- » The Mandrake has quickly become a figure of Herm Edwards' lore at Arizona State. The Mandrake embodies strength, speed, athleticism, aggressive, high motor, and mental toughness.
- » This season, the Sun Devils have unveiled a special Mandrake practice uniform to be worn player that most embodies these characteristics in the previous weekend's game.
- » This week's recipient of that honor was Evan Fields, who finished with a career-high 13 tackles against #18 Michigan State in a 10-7 victory.
- » On run defense this season, Fields has recorded eight total defensive "stops" to lead all Pac-12 safeties and his 13.1 run-stop percentage is six percentage points higher than any other safety in the league and leads the FBS among safeties with at least 50 run defensive snaps. His 15 tackles on run plays are second among Pac-12 safeties.
- » When he plays within eight yards of the line of scrimmage at the snap, Fields has recorded a 19.4 run-stop percentage - over 10 percentage points higher than any other Pac-12 safety and leading the nation among safeties with at least 30 snaps on run defense when lined up within eight yards of the line of scrimmage
- » Fields has nine total defensive "stops" this season, a total that leads all safeties in the Pac-12 and tied for seventh nationally.

FOCUSING ON FOOTBALL

- » The Sun Devils lay claim to three of the Pac-12 top-20 highest graded defenders regardless of position accoring to Pro Football Focus in LB Darein Butler (8th, 78.2), CB Kobe Williams (12th, 76.9) and DL Jermaine Lole (16th, 75.5). The three players have ASU tied at the top of the league for Top-20 league defenders with Utah and Oregon through the first three weeks of the season.
- » Butler is the 29th-highest overall graded linebacker in the country and second highest graded linebacker in the league. His 81.4 score as a pass rusher is ninth among all linebackers in the FBS.
- » Kobe Williams is the 38th-highest graded overall cornerback in the FBS and sixth-highest graded player in the league.
- » Jermaine Lole ranks as the second-highest graded edge defender in the Pac-12 while his 82.5 score in run defense is good for the 16th-best score among classified edge linemen in the FBS.
- » Aashari Crosswell has recorded an 87.3 grade in run refense this season, the fourth-highest graded safety in the FBS.
- » Eno Benjamin is the 15th-highest graded running back as a pass blocker this season with a score of 84.1 this season.
- » Donovan West was the fourth-highest graded guard in the Pac-12 in the Week 3 victory over #18 Michigan State and the 12th-highest graded offense lineman in the league overall.

ALL ABOUT THE BENJAMINS

- » Eno Benjamin has continued to do his part to make people miss this year, forcing 20 missed tackles this season - a total tied for seventh nationally.
- » Eno Benjamin recorded his 10th career 100-yard rushing game against Kent State, finishing with 102 yards on 22 carries. The 10 games with 100 yards are tied for ninth in program history with Ben Malone.
- » While it may seem like a slow start for the Pac-12's leading rusher, it is worth nothing that his numbers are very comparable between the first three games last year and the first three this year. In 2018 through three games, he ahd 42 rushes, 179 yards, 1 rushing TD, 99 receiving yards and 2 TD receptions. This season he has 54 rushes, 209 yards, 1 rushing TD, 137 receiving yards and 2 TD receptions.
- » Benjamin has played 81 snaps in passing routes this season, the second-highest total among FBS running backs and his 14 targets are tied for fourth. His 137 receiving yards this season are fifth among all FBS running backs and he is tied for the national lead among backs with two touchdown receptions.
- » At 1,993 career rushing yards, Benjamin is within striking distance of 2,000 career rushing yards and needs just two rushing touchdowns to reach 20 for his career.
- » Eno Benjamin is the 15th-highest graded running back as a pass blocker this season with a score of 84.1 this season. That's a notable area of improvement early on after he finished outside the Top-100 in the category last season.

DAAAAMNNNN DANIELS

- » When being blitzed this season, Jayden Daniels has the fourth-highest NFL QB rating in the country at 148.1. While under pressure in general, Daniels has posted the 12th-highest NFL QB rating of any quarterback in the FBS (2nd in the Pac-12) at 106.0.
- » Daniels is one of 19 FBS quarterbacks that have played at least three games this season to not

throw an interception.

- » Daniels has done his part to escape pressure as shown by his 24 QB scrambles this season, a total that is tied for 14th among FBS quarterbacks. His 112 yards on the ground excluding quarterback sacks are 32nd among FBS quarterbacks.
- » Daniels became the first true freshman quarterback in program history to start the first game of the season.
- » Daniels broke the Sun Devil record for passing yards in a first career game in the season opener, which was previously 160 by Jeff Krohn in 2000. It should be noted that this includes just a first career GAME appearance, not first career start.
- » Daniels became the third freshman in ASU history to win his first career start, joining John Walker (1984) and Dennis Sproul (1974) as the only other QB's to win their first career starts as freshmen.
- » With his 72-yard touchdown pass to Eno Benjamin in the fourth quarter against Sacramento State, Daniels became the first ASU quarterback ever to throw a touchdown pass over 70 yards in consecutive games (had a 77-yard pass to Brandon Aiyuk in Week One).
- » His 304 passing yards against Sacramento State were the third-highest total by a Sun Devil freshman in program history behind Rudy Carpenter (467 in 2005) and Jeff Krohn (432 in 2000).

THROWING UP ZEROES

- » The Sun Devils are one of just four teams to not allow a first half point this season, joining Memphis, Wisconsin and Baylor, though the latter two have played just two games.
- » ASU and Wisconsin are the only teams not to allow a point through the first three quarters of any game this year. Wisconsin has not allowed any points this season but, again, has only played two games.
- » The Sun Devil defense has not allowed a single point in the first quarter of any regular season games against a non-conference opponents under Herm Edwards (6 games).
- » ASU hasn't allowed a first quarter score in 8 of 16 games in the Edwards era and is 7-1 in those games. ASU allowed just 5.3 points per first quarter last season, good for 44th nationally. In 2017, ASU allowed 6.7 first quarter points per game - the 82nd worst tally nationally.

KEEP IT CLOSE

- » ASU's 5-1 mark under Herm Edwards in games of three points or less is the best in college football the past two seasons (minimum four games). Cal is 4-1 and TCU is 3-2.
- » Arizona State was 4-1 in such games last season, which was the most field goal or less wins by a Pac-12 team since Oregon State did the same in 2006, and just the second time a Pac-12 team won four field goal games in the previous 18 seasons.
- » ASU's tough scoring defense kept ASU in every game last season, with nine games being decided by one possession - second in the nation behind Texas and the second-highest total by a Pac-12 team since 1980 (Stanford with 10 in 2012).
- » Unfortunately, ASU was also on the wrong end of five of those one-possession games - tied for the most losses by a touchdown or less of any team in the nation.

MAKE 'EM PAY

- » The Sun Devils have forced a turnover in nine consecutive games dating back to last season.
- » ASU has outscored opponents 677-355 in points off takeaways since 2012.
- » Since 2012, ASU has scored 66.5 percent of the time following an opponent turnover (113 of 170) while finding the end zone 84 times in that span (49.4 percent).
- » Conversely, opponents have scored just 50.8 percent of the time following an ASU turnover since 2012 (60 of 118) with 46 touchdowns (39.0 percent).

LOCKING IT DOWN

- » Limiting the big play has been a focus for defensive coordinator Danny Gonzales and continues to be a focal point through two games with ASU tied for 29th in the country with just 29 plays over 10 yards allowed thus far.
- » ASU has allowed just three plays over 30 yarrrds this season, a total tied for 22nd nationally. The Sun Devils are one of just 32 teams nationally to not give up a 50-yard play on the year.
- » ASU's run defense has been especially efficient, with just one play over 20 yards allowed this season - tied for the 8th-lowest total in the country.
- » Last year, ASU was tied for 11th nationally in allowing just 8 plays over 40 yards, an



area the Devils had struggled in in recent seasons (allowing 20, 16, 30, 21 in the previous four seasons and finishing 103rd, 79th, 128th, 110th, respectively). ASU was also tied for 9th nationally in allowing just 3 plays of over 50 yards on the year.

- » The Devils gave up just 22 plays over 30 yards, tied for 34th-fewest nationally. In the previous four years, ASU had given up 38, 44, 40, 40 such plays, ranked 116th, 124th, 117th and 119th.
- » ASU was tied for 13th nationally for fewest passing plays over 40 yards allowed this season, allowing just five. ASU was 90th in the category the previous year with 12 such plays allowed and 127th in 2016 with 22 passing plays over 40 yards allowed.
- » ASU was ninth with just three 50+ yard plays allowed last season after finishing in the bottom 10 nationally in four previous seasons.

ON THE DEFENSE

- » ASU is second in the country in allowing just 7.0 points per game through three games. The Sun Devils allowed just 25.5 points per game last season, good for 53rd nationally. While not where the team wants to be, the total was notable as ASU was 103rd nationally at 32.8 points per game allowed in 2017 and had finished 99th or worse in three consecutive seasons prior to the marked improvement this past season.
- » ASU has held opponents to 30 or less points in 12 of 16 games in Danny Gonzales' defensive scheme, notable as it DID allow 30+ in 32 of 43 previous games dating back in a span from 2013-17.
- » Holding three straight opponents under 10 points scoring is a rare feat, one that has now happened just seven times in ASU history and not since 1979 (also in '55, '56, '57, '59 and '74).
- » ASU's 21 points allowed through 3 games are the fewest since a 3-game stretch in 1993 where the Devils allowed a combined 20 points against Washington (17), Cal (0) and UCLA (3). Only the 1985 team (12 combined points: MSU 12, Pacific 0, USC 0) and 1957 team (13 combined points: Wichita State 0, Idaho 7, San Jose State 6) have allowed less in the first three games of a season during the modern era.
- » The Sun Devils have the 29th-best rushing defense nationally (second in the Pac-12) at 91.7 rush yards allowed per game.
- » ASU is 35th nationally in total defense (third in the Pac-12) with 303.0 yards allowed per game.

NO FLY ZONE

- » Kobe Williams is the 12th-highest graded defender in the Pac-12 with his 76.9 score from PFF. He is the 38th-highest graded overall cornerback in the FBS and sixth-highest graded player in the league.
- » Williams has been targetted 11 times this season and allowed just five catches for 9 total yards - the third lowest total in the cluntry. He has allwed -5 yards after the catch - marking him the only corner in the country with negative yards after catch allowed.
- » Williams' 52.5 NFL quarterback rating when targetted is tied for the 43rd-lowest in the country and 9th in the Pac-12
- » The Sun Devils have the 31st highest pass coverage score in the FBS according to Pro Football Focus through the first two weeks of the season, while rankings 29th in the national in pass efficiency defense at 111.38.

NO BUTLER'S ABOUT IT

- » Butler is the 29th-highest overall graded linebacker in the country and second-highest graded linebacker in the league with his 78.2 grade from Pro Football Focus. His 81.4 score as a pass rusher is ninth among all linebackers in the FBS.
- » Butler's nine quarterback pressures this season are the most among Pac-12 linebackers and tied for sixth among all Power Five linebackers.
- » Butler has 10 defensive "stops" this season, with is 29th among Power Five linebackers and seventh in the Pac-12.
- » The sophomore captain - the first true sophomore captain in ASU school history - has not been credited with a missed tackle this season, marking him one of just five outside linebackers in the Pac-12 to lay that claim.
- » Among Power Five edge defenders (outside linebackers and defensive ends), Butler is one of just 29 players on a Power Five team to not miss a tackle on the year.

DON'T BE CROSS

- » Aashari Crosswell has recorded an 87.3 grade in run refense this season, the fourth-highest graded safety in the FBS.
- » Last season, Crosswell led the team in interceptions with four (t-4th among FBS freshmen) while recording 127 yards in interception returns - the latter good for the seventh-most nationally and the most for a freshman in the country

- » He had a team-high 9 pass breakups last season - more than any Sun Devil recorded in 2017 and tied for fourth among freshmen in the FBS this season. His 13 total passes defended were tied for third among FBS freshman and fifth among all Pac-12 players regardless of year.
- » He was one of just two Pac-12 true freshman to play at least 750 snaps (786), one of just 7 freshmen to do so nationally in a Power Five conference

GO D.J., THAT'S MY D.J.

- » D.J. Davidson was ASU's Mandrake of the Week against Sacramento State after he was the fourth-highest graded defensive interior lineman in the Pac-12 for Week 2 among players that appeared in at least 50 percent of the plays.
- » Davidson has the sixth-best run "stop" percentage among Pac-12 interior linemen at 10.5 percent.
- » His 8 solo tackles on run defense are second among Pac-12 interior defenders while his six defensive "stops" are third.
- » Davidson has eight total defensive stops this season, good for seventh among all interior defensive linemen on a Power Five team.

LOLEEEEE, LOLE, LOLE, LOLEEEEE

- » Jermayne Lole ranks as the second-highest graded edge defender in the Pac-12 while his 82.5 score in run defense is good for the 16th-best score among classified edge linemen in the FBS (third-best among Power Five outside linemen), though many of his grades come as an interior lineman.
- » Lole has 11 tackles in run defense, tied for second among interior linemen in the Pac-12 while his 14.2 run-stop percentage is also second among those interior linemen.
- » Lole has had a positive run impact percentage on 25.9 percent of run plays this season - the 20th-best score among defensive interior linemen this year.

MAGNIFICENT MERLIN

- » Last season, Merlin Robertson was named the Pac-12 Freshman Defensive Player of the Year.
- » Robertson became the fifth Sun Devil to earn a Pac-12 Freshman of the Year honor and the third to be named the Pac-12 Defensive Freshman of the Year. He joins Vontaze Burfict (2009) and Junior Onyeali (2010) as the third person to be distinguished as the Pac-12 Defensive Freshman of the Year.
- » Robertson led the team in tackles (77), tackles for loss (8.5) and sacks (5.0). Added an interception, two breakups, a fumble forced and a fumble recovered.
- » He was the first freshman to lead the team in tackles since Jason Shivers in 2001 and the first freshman to lead the team in tackles for loss and sacks since Junior Onyeali in 2010.
- » Led all FBS freshmen (true or redshirt) with 35 defensive "stops" in 2018 - tied for 17th among all Pac-12 defensive players.
- » Also led Pac-12 freshmen (true or redshirt) with 27 total QB pressures - second most among all freshmen in a Power Five conference. It was the 20th-most for any player in the Pac-12, regardless of year and second-most among all linebackers in the Pac-12
- » Played on 749 snaps as a truth freshman, despite missing the bowl game and half a game Oregon - the eighth highest total among true freshmen in Power Five conference nationally.
- » Missed just eight tackles on the season, according to Pro Football Focus, tied for the fifth-fewest among linebackers in the Pac-12 and 33rd among all Power Five linebackers.

GOLD RUSH

- » ASU has had a 100-yard rusher in 14 of its last 21 games dating back to 2017 (Demario Richard with 4 and Eno Benjamin with 10).
- » ASU had 26 rushing TDs last year and reached 25 rushing touchdowns for the fifth time in the last seven seasons. Those five times are notable as the Devils had just three previous seasons with at least 25 rushing touchdowns from 1980-2011 (1985, 1986 and 1996).
- » The Sun Devils have rushed for over 2,000 yards seven times in the last eight seasons at ASU after doing so just one single time from 2000-2011 and only eight times total over 30 years from 1981-2011.
- » ASU finished with the 18th-highest graded rushing attack of 2018, according to Pro Football Focus.

ON THE RECEIVING END

- » Through three games, Brandon Aiyuk is 16th nationally and fourth in the Pac-12 with 302 receiving yards on the year
- » At 23.23 yards per reception, Aiyuk leads the Pac-12 and is 13th nationally in the category and his four plays over 25 yards are 10th nationally.



- » Aiyuk's 77-yard touchdown reception against Kent State was the longest passing play/score by a Sun Devil since Demario Richard's 93-yard catch and run against New Mexico in 2015.
- » Frank Darby now has 35 total receptions as a Sun Devil and nine of those have gone for 40+ yards (25.7 percent).
- » Last season, 50 percent of Frank Darby's targets last year came on deep passes, a total that led the Pac-12. He averaged 20.0 yards/catch, which would have put him 14th nationally had he caught five more passes to reach the catches/game minimum.

NOBODY'S BUSINESS BUT THE TURKS

- » Michael Turk's 49.5 yards per punt average on 17 punts this season is good for third nationally
- » Turk has pinned nine punts inside the 20, tied for the second-highest total nationally.
- » The 63.0 yards per punt mark by Turk on Aug. 29 vs. Kent State broke an NCAA record. The previous record for highest average yards per punt in a game with minimum five attempts was Braden Mann of Texas A&M on Sept. 22, 2018, as he had a 60.8 yards per punt average vs. Alabama on punts of 56, 65, 62, 61 and 60 for 304 yards. Turks punted five times for 315 yards with boots of 64, 62, 65, 49 and 75 in his Sun Devil debut.
- » Turk crushed Sun Devils school records for punting average, breaking the previous school record for average on five punts of 55.0 by Danny White in 1972. Turk's 63.0 yards per punt would have set records for every minimum number of punts in a game with the closest being Tony Lorick's 59.3 yards per punt on three punts in 1962.
- » Turk's 75-yarder to in the opener was tied for the seventh-longest punt in school history and remains the longest punt in the FBS this season.

Z'S PEDIGREE

- » Cristian Zendejas has quickly added his name to the ASU family legacy in two games at placekicker, following his dad (Luis Zendejas 1981-84) and uncle (Alan Zendejas 1987-89). Luis Zendejas is the former all-time leading scorer in Sun Devil history before he was passed in 2016 by Lou Groza Award winner Zane Gonzalez.
- » Zendejas was named the Pac-12 Special Teams Player of the Week for his effort against Sacramento State as he became the first Sun Devil kicker since 2016 to make four field goals in a game, when Zane Gonzalez kicked four against UTSA. The four field goals are tied for sixth in a single game in school history.
- » Zendejas is a perfect 8-for-8 on field goals through the first two games of the season and is 5-for-5 on extra points. His eight field goals are tied for the national lead with four other kickers.
- » Only 32 placekickers have no missed a field goal this season, of which Zendejas is one. He is one of just eight of those that have not missed a field goal with at least six attempts.

KEEPING MOMENTUM

- » The Sun Devils have scored double-digit points in 122 consecutive games, the longest active streak in the FBS and the second-longest streak in the modern era of football behind only Louisiana Tech (125 straight games from 2008-2018).
- » ASU also holds the FBS active streak for consecutive games scoring more than 7 points, currently doing so in 137 straight games. The Sun Devils last scored fewer than 7 points when they were shutout, 28-0, against eighth-ranked USC in the 2008 season. They have scored 30 or more points in 75 of those games (56.0 percent).
- » The Sun Devils have won at least seven games in five of the last seven seasons.
- » Sun Devil Football has had one of the top home field advantages in the FBS in the last six seasons, recording a 37-10 record at Sun Devil Stadium since 2012. The 37 wins are tied for 17th nationally in that time.

THE KIDS WILL BE ALRIGHT

- » The Sun Devils played 25 freshmen in the season opener (15 true, 10 redshirt) - the most ever in the modern era at ASU. That was the third-highest total in the country behind only Clemson (38 - 27/11) and Baylor (35 - 20/15).
- » All told, 28 true or redshirt freshmen have played for the Sun Devils this year.
- » Jayden Daniels became the first TRUE freshman quarterback to start for the Sun Devils on Opening Day in ASU's modern era (freshmen became eligible to play in 1972).
- » Daniels is just the sixth true freshman to start any game at quarterback in ASU history, joining Dillon Sterling-Cole (2016), Brock Osweiler (2009), Jake Plummer (1993), John Walker (1984) and Dennis Sproul (1974).
- » For the first time in program history, a freshman was named a team captain after Herm Edwards dubbed true freshman quarterback/athlete Ethan Long as special teams captain

before the season. Additionally, Darien Butler will be the first true sophomore captain in program history after the linebacker was named captain for the team's defense. Prior to this season, no player that had been with the program for less than three years had ever been named a team captain in ASU history.

- » Arizona State is the only team in the country starting two true freshmen on its offensive line.
