## TALKING POINTS

### AT A GLANCE

Oregon will look for its first 3-0 start to Pac-12 play since 2013 when it hosts south division foe Colorado Friday night inside Autzen Stadium on FS1. The Ducks are riding a four-game win streak and have won six in a row at home dating back to last season. Colorado was victorious in its last visit to Eugene in 2016, but Oregon has won six of the last seven in the series and scored at least 38 points in eight consecutive meetings.

### AS A RANKED TEAM

The Ducks have won 27 of their last 30 games as a ranked team inside Autzen Stadium and are 93-18 all-time. Friday also marks the 20th game of **MARIO CRISTOBAL'S** head coaching career at Oregon and the Ducks have been ranked in 14 of those contests.

### ON THE ATTACK

The first Power 5 team to hold four consecutive opponents to single digit points since Michigan in 2015, Oregon ranks in the top 10 nationally in 11 different categories through the first five games. Opponents have reached Oregon territory just 19 times in 60 drives with three of those starting on the Ducks' side of the field.

## QUICK HITS: QB JUSTIN HERBERT

### 2019 SEASON

- » Owns a streak of 33 consecutive games with a TD pass, good for the longest in the country.
- » 15 TD passes through the first five games of a season matched the program record - Marcus Mariota (2014) & Akili Smith (1998).
- » One of three FBS quarterbacks (Tua Tagovailoa - Alabama & Justin Fields - Ohio State) with 15 TD passes and one or fewer INTs.
- » One of five FBS quarterbacks with five or more TD passes in two games this season.
- » Tied for seventh nationally with 15 TD passes, which have gone to eight different receivers.
- » His 14 TD passes over the last four games are tied for the most over any four-game span in program history.
- » Streak of 175 consecutive passes without an interception came to end against California.

### CAREER

- » Named the Google Cloud Academic All-America® Team Member of the Year (4.01 GPA - general science) as a junior.
- » Has led Oregon to an average of 37.6 points per game over his 33 career starts.
- » Oregon is 15-3 and averaging 44.5 points per game over Herbert's 18 career starts at Autzen Stadium.
- » Thrown for 47 of his 78 career TD passes inside Autzen Stadium.
- » Oregon is 19-7 in his last 26 starts over the last three seasons.
- » Second among active FBS leaders in passing TDs (78) and sixth in passing yards (8,411).
- » Has thrown a TD pass to 22 different players in his career.
- » One of 10 FBS quarterbacks since 2010 with two or more games of five TD passes in a game with less than 20 completions.

### HISTORY LESSON

Through the first five games, Oregon's defense has posted some of the best streaks and statistics in program history. Below are how some of this year's statistics stack up through the first five games in program history.

- » First time since 1960 that Oregon has held four consecutive opponents to under 10 points.
- » Didn't allow a TD over a three-game stretch (Nevada, Montana, Stanford) for the first time since 1933.
- » First FBS program to not allow a TD in three consecutive games in the same season since Alabama in 2016.

### SPREADING THE WEALTH

Behind a program modern-era record 11 different players scoring a touchdown in the win over Nevada, Oregon is tied for third nationally with 13 different players with a TD this season. Nine different players have caught a TD pass from either **JUSTIN HERBERT** or **TYLER SHOUGH**, which is tied for the second most in the nation behind Ohio State.

### DEFENSIVE NOTABLES

- » One of seven FBS teams (Iowa, Missouri, Ohio State, Penn State, TCU, Wisconsin) to allow fewer than 250 yards of offense in three games this year.
- » Ducks are one of three FBS teams (Minnesota, South Florida) that have not allowed a 40-yard play yet this season.
- » Defense has allowed just one TD in 32 first half drives this season.
- » Opposing offenses are 13 of 42 on third down this season in the first half.
- » The 4.40 points allowed per game in the first half is the third lowest in the nation.
- » 14 different players have at least a half-sack, good for the second-most nationally.
- » Oregon has an INT in 12 of the last 14 games, including seven straight, dating back to last year.
- » Behind four turnovers against Nevada that resulted in 28 points, Oregon ranks tied for fifth in the country with 9.8 points per game off turnovers.

In his final game as a Duck, quarterback **AKILI SMITH** threw for 456 yards and two touchdowns in the 1998 Aloha Bowl against Colorado. Smith's 456 passing yards are currently tied for the fourth-most in Oregon history.

- » Four different Ducks have been named to the PFF Pac-12 Team of the Week this season.
- » Sewell has been the top ranked offensive lineman in the Pac-12 twice this season.
- » Sewell was the top graded offensive lineman (96.6) in the nation week 3.
- » Hanson was the top graded center (90.7) in the nation in week 3.
- » Sewell's 90.3 run-blocking grade leads all Pac-12 offensive linemen and is fourth nationally.

## OFFENSIVE LINE NOTES

### BACK-TO-BACK

Highlighted by a staggering 11 knockdowns against Montana, **PENEI SEWELL** was the top graded offensive lineman in the nation by Pro Football Focus (PFF) during week 3 at 96.6 and earned Pac-12 Offensive Lineman of the Week honors. Sewell followed up his performance in week 3 with another strong outing at Stanford to earn his second consecutive Pac-12 honor. Sewell didn't allow a hurry, pressure or hit on the QB for the third straight week and was the top graded lineman in the Pac-12 for week 4. His dominant three-game stretch also resulted in Sewell being named the Outland Trophy Offensive Player of the Month for September.

### MR. VERSATILITY

Over his career, **CALVIN THROCKMORTON** has started 33 games at right tackle, five contests at left tackle, three at right guard, and two at center. He was the only FBS player to start at four (LT, C, RG, RT) of the five positions along the offensive line in 2018.

- » Made second career start at center at Stanford.
- » Has played 241 snaps at right tackle and 88 at center this season.
- » Played three different positions in two games last season - vs. UCLA (LT, C, RG) and at Utah (LT, C, RG).

### BATTLE TESTED

Led by a group of five seniors, the Oregon offensive line has an FBS-best 178 combined starts. Seven different players make up the total, while **SHANE LEMIEUX** and **CALVIN THROCKMORTON** are two of eight FBS offensive linemen that have started 40 or more consecutive games.

## OFFENSIVE NOTES

## BREELAND BREAKING THROUGH

Senior **TE JACOB BREELAND** became the eighth tight end in program history with 1,000 career receiving yards during his first career multi-TD performance against Montana. Breeland has been a big play target for **QB JUSTIN HERBERT** over their four seasons together with 22 receptions of 20+ yards.

- » Ranks in the top five nationally among FBS tight ends in receptions (23/T-5th), receiving yards (352/3rd) and TDs (5/T-2nd).
- » Has hauled in 23 of 28 targets on the season.
- » Has 19 catches for 326 yards and five TDs over the last four games.
- » Had a career-high 112 receiving yards against Nevada.
- » First Oregon tight end with a 100-yard receiving game since Pharaoh Brown against Arizona State in 2016.

## BOUNCE BACK

A year after finishing his sophomore season with 17 catches for 215 yards, junior **JOHNNY JOHNSON III** has surpassed both of those totals through the first five games of 2019. Johnson has been Oregon's leading receiver in twice this season and has set a new career best for catches in a game twice.

- » Ranks tied for 14th in the Pac-12 and the team lead in receptions (23) and 16th in receiving yards (275).
- » 14 of 23 catches have either resulted in a first down (13) or a TD.
- » Had a career-high 98 yards receiving against Auburn, while his eight receptions against Montana were a new career best.

## ONE-TWO PUNCH

One of just nine FBS teams with a 3,000-yard passer, 1,000-yard rusher and 1,000-yard receiver a year ago, Oregon welcomes back two-thirds of that trio. **QB JUSTIN HERBERT** became the fifth player in program history to throw for 3,000 yards (3,151), while **RB CJ VERDELL** was just the third freshman in program history to hit the 1,000-yard plateau (1,018) on the ground. The Ducks are one of four FBS teams (Clemson, Liberty, Memphis) that return a 3,000-yard passer and 1,000-yard rusher. It is the second time in program history Oregon has returned a 3,000-yard passer and 1,000-yard rusher (2014 - Marcus Mariota & Byron Marshall).



## TEAM &amp; OFFENSIVE NOTES

## POINT OF EMPHASIS

A point of emphasis prior to head coach **MARIO CRISTOBAL'S** first season (2018), Oregon had the fewest number of penalties in the Pac-12 in 2018 after ranking dead last in all four penalty categories in 2017. The Ducks are back at it again, leading the conference in all four categories below.

## 50 BURGER

For the 10th straight year, Oregon opened its home schedule with a 50-point performance. The Ducks' 77-point home opener against Nevada equaled the program modern era record for points. The 50-point game was the 41st by the Ducks since 2009, good for the most by any FBS program over that span.

» Oregon is 81-0 all-time when scoring 50+ points.

» The 77 points against Nevada were the most in Mario Cristobal's career as a head coach, while the four 50-point performances in his 16 games as head coach are double the amount his FIU teams had over six seasons.

## A GAME OF FIRSTS

Oregon's 77-6 win over Nevada at Autzen Stadium in the home opener marked career firsts for a number of Ducks. Oregon had a plethora of players score their first TD while others recorded their first interception, sack and forced fumble on defense. A number of players from the highly regarded 2019 recruiting class also made their debuts.

» Six Ducks (Addison, Aiello, Breeze, Bay, Davis, Kampmoyer) scored their first career touchdowns.

» Backup **QB TYLER SHOUGH** completed his first career pass while also tossing his first two career TD passes.

» Three players (Aiello, Dollars, Jeannis) had their first career catch.

» Senior **TE JACOB BREELAND** had his first career 100-yard receiving game.

» Two Ducks (Niu, Stephens) intercepted their first career passes.

» Three Ducks (DJ Johnson, Lenoir, Niu) forced their first fumbles.

» Two players (Breeze, Carlberg) recovered their first fumbles.

» Four Ducks (Andrew Faoliu, Funa, DJ Johnson, Ware-Hudson) recorded their first sacks.

» 10 Ducks made their career debut with six on offense (Aumavae-Laulu, Crocker, Dollars, Herbert, Jaramillo, Randazzo) and four on defense (Dorlus, Poti, Ware-Hudson, Kristian Williams).

## WELCOME BACK

Highlighted by the return of **QB JUSTIN HERBERT** and **LB TROY DYE**, Oregon brings back 17 positional starters from last year's nine-win team. The 17 returning positional starters is tied for fourth most by an FBS program, while the Ducks return 10 starters on the offensive side of the ball, including all five offensive linemen.

## RECRUITING NOTES

### TAKING IT TO ANOTHER LEVEL

Head coach **MARIO CRISTOBAL** has taken Oregon's recruiting efforts to a different level since being named the head coach in December of 2017.

### OVERALL

- » Only Pac-12 program to have a top 2 class in the league each of the last two years, according to 247Sports composite.
- » First time ever that Oregon has finished in the top 2 in the Pac-12 recruiting rankings (247Sports) two consecutive years.
- » Over the last two classes, the Ducks signed the No. 1 ranked player in six different states (seven total).
- » The total of 21 ESPN300 signees over the last two years is the same total that Oregon signed over the previous five years (2013-17) combined.

### 2019 CLASS

- » The 2019 class finished No. 6 in the country by ESPN and No. 7 by both 247Sports and Rivals, all the best in program history.
- » The class rated as the top class in the Pac-12 Conference, the first time ever that Oregon claimed the top spot in the Pac-12.
- » In addition to signing Kayvon Thibodeaux, the top-ranked player in the 2019 class by ESPN, Oregon signed Malaesala Aumavae-Laulu, the top-ranked JC player by JCGridiron.com the same year.
- » Signed 12 players from the state of California.
- » Signed the top DE (Kayvon Thibodeaux), CB (Mykael Wright), ILB (Mase Funa), OL (Jonah Tauanu'u) and All-Purpose Back (Sean Dollars) in California.
- » Signed six of the top 21 players in California, according to 247Sports.

### 2018 CLASS

- » His 2018 class ranked 13th by both 247Sports and Rivals despite Cristobal becoming the head coach just weeks before the initial signing period.
- » The 11 ESPN300 signees by coach Cristobal were the most amongst new head coaches.
- » One of five teams (Georgia, Ohio State, Penn State & Texas) with three offensive linemen in the ESPN300.
- » Added the top player in four different states.
- » Signed 11 players from the state of California.

## DEFENSIVE NOTES

## D-LINE PROPS

On the heels of a two-sack performance in the win over California, freshman **KAYVON THIBODEAUX** was named the Pac-12 Defensive Lineman of the Week. Thibodeaux joins senior **GUS CUMBERLANDER** in winning the award this season, making the Ducks one of two programs with two different players that have taken home the honor. Thibodeaux register his first career multi-sack game against Cal and was the third-highest graded (92.4) defensive end in the nation by PFF.

## HOLLAND N-OATES

Coming off a rookie campaign where he led Oregon with five interceptions, sophomore **JEVON HOLLAND** has established himself as one of the nation's premier playmakers on defense in college football. The Ducks starting safety, nickel and punt returner has picked off passes in each of the last two games to run his season total to three and career total to eight.

» Tied for fourth in the country with four three interceptions.

» He is second in the nation among active players in interceptions per game with eight in 18 games.

» The eight career picks are the second most by a sophomore, trailing only Syracuse's Andre Cisco who has nine.

» He is second in the nation in punt return average (24.43 yards per return), while ranking eighth in punt return yards (171) and a tie for second in 20-plus yard returns (4).

» Against Auburn he picked off a pass, had four tackles and returned three punts for 131 yards.

» Named to the Paul Hornung Award Honor Roll following the season opener.

» Became the first FBS player since 2007 with 130 punt return yards and an interception in the same game.

» His 131 punt return yards were the most by an Oregon player since Bralon Addison in 2013.

» His 81-yard punt return in the second quarter was the longest punt return in a college game at AT&T Stadium.

## BALL HAWKS

One of two FBS teams (Iowa) that had four players with three or more interceptions in 2018, Oregon's returns three players from that quartet in **THOMAS GRAHAM JR.**, **JEVON HOLLAND** and **DEOMMODORE LENOIR**. The Ducks are joined by fellow Pac-12 member Cal as the only two teams in the country that return three players that had three or more INTs last season.

» Oregon has an INT in 12 of the last 14 games, including seven straight.

## DEFENSE DOES IT AGAIN

Since the start of the 2017 season, only Utah State (13) has more defensive touchdowns than Oregon. The Ducks' nine defensive TDs the last three seasons are tied for the most by a Power 5 team. Oregon's defense has also fueled its offense, as the Ducks rank fifth nationally with an average of 7.74 points off turnovers per game since the start of the 2017 season.

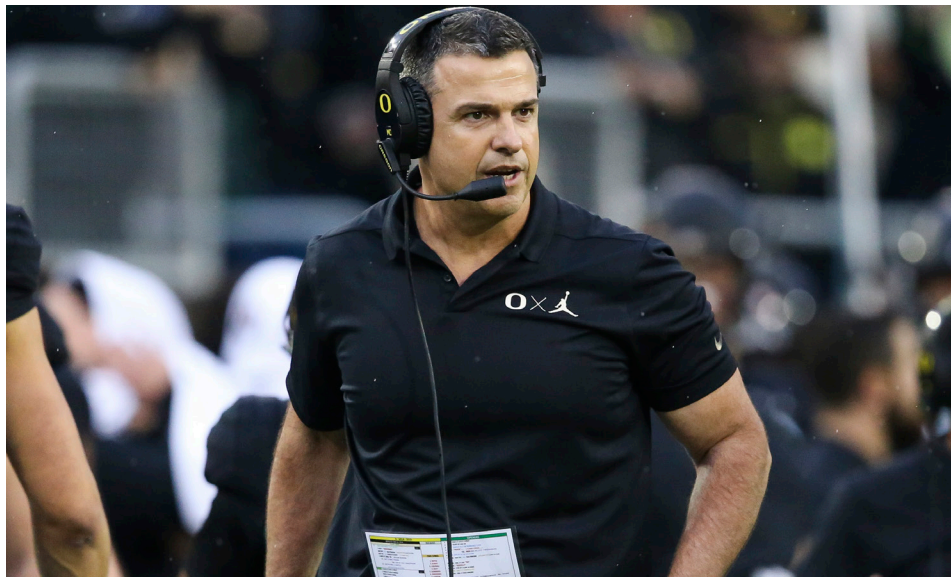

Mario Cristobal was named the University of Oregon's 34th head football coach on Dec. 8, 2017.

Cristobal, who possesses over 20 years of coaching experience along with an extensive track record of success as one of the nation's best offensive line coaches and an elite recruiter, was named the Ducks' head coach after spending the 2017 season as Oregon's co-offensive coordinator, run-game coordinator and offensive line coach.

Since taking over as head coach, Cristobal has captivated the passionate Duck fan base with the culture he is creating and the standards he has set for the program. His vision to restore Oregon as one of the nation's elite programs is backed by two consecutive top 15 recruiting classes and a relentless commitment to excellence in every phase of the program.

In Cristobal's first season as head coach, Oregon's focus on culture and development helped play a big part in the first three-game win streak to close a season since 2011, highlighted by the Redbox Bowl victory over Michigan State. The Ducks' 5-1 start featured back-to-back ranked wins at California and against Washington, as the 9-4 campaign marked the third-most victories by a first-year head coach at Oregon.

One of four FBS first-year head coaches to win a bowl game in 2018, Cristobal's vision of an offense that prides itself on a balance of power and speed helped Oregon finish the season as one of nine FBS teams with a 3,000-yard passer, 1,000-yard rusher and 1,000-yard receiver. Oregon ranked 17th nationally in scoring offense (37.2 ppg) during the regular season and displayed the grit Cristobal is instilling with its 7-6 win over Michigan State to close the season. It marked the fewest points given up by Oregon in a bowl game since the 1917 Rose Bowl.

Cristobal's emphasis on player development yielded 11 Pac-12 All-Conference selections and three All-Americans along the offensive line in Shane Lemieux, Calvin Throckmorton and Penei Sewell. Senior defensive back Ugochukwu Amadi became the first player in program history to win the Lombardi Award, which is given to the top FBS player regardless of position. Amadi was one of four Ducks selected in the 2019 NFL Draft.

A renowned recruiter, Cristobal led Oregon's relentless effort to sign the nation's No. 13 class in 2018 according to 247Sports, just under two months after being named the head coach. A year later, Cristobal and his staff landed the highest-ranked class in program history at No. 6 by ESPN, marking the first time Oregon has ever had the top class in the Pac-12. Oregon is the only Pac-12 program to finish with a top two class in the league each year and has added the top player from seven different states over that span.



In his first year at Oregon as co-offensive coordinator, the run-game was a major factor in the up-tempo Duck offense that tied for the Pac-12 lead with seven 40-point performances. The Ducks scored 40 rushing touchdowns during Cristobal's first season, the most since 2014. Royce Freeman ranked 11th nationally with 1,475 yards and tied for 12th with 16 rushing touchdowns. The Ducks finished the regular season with more than 3,000 yards on the ground, averaging 268 yards rushing per game. The Ducks' rushing offense ranked eighth in the FBS at the end of the regular season.

Cristobal's streak with an offensive lineman selected in the NFL Draft extended to five consecutive years when senior left tackle Tyrell Crosby was taken by the Detroit Lions in the 2018 NFL Draft, while Freeman was taken in the third round by the Denver Broncos. Under Cristobal, Crosby allowed only three quarterback hurries and no sacks on his way to being named an Outland Trophy candidate and the recipient of the Morris Trophy as the top offensive lineman in the Pac-12.

Cristobal came to Oregon with a reputation as one of the nation's top recruiters. He was named the National Recruiter of the Year by 247Sports in the 2015 cycle, and was ranked as the nation's No. 2 recruiter in the country by 247Sports at the time of his hiring based on the final haul he brought to Alabama. His 2015 class included 2018 NFL first-round picks Minkah Fitzpatrick (Miami Dolphins), Daron Payne (Washington Redskins) and Calvin Ridley (Atlanta Falcons).

Prior to arriving in Eugene, Cristobal spent four seasons (2013-16) at Alabama as the assistant head coach, offensive line coach and recruiting coordinator, helping the Crimson Tide to the CFP National Championship following the 2015 season, as well as a runner-up finish after the 2016 season.

Cristobal's offensive lines at Alabama produced a plethora of standout players and NFL draft picks. Over Cristobal's four seasons, five Alabama offensive linemen were selected in the NFL Draft, good for a tie for the second-most from one program over that span. Included were three in the top two rounds, including 2016 first-round selection Ryan Kelly (Indianapolis Colts).

In each of his four seasons, a different offensive lineman earned first-team All-America honors, while Kelly won the Rimington Trophy as the nation's top center and was named the SEC Scholar Athlete of the Year in 2015. The following year, Cam Robinson claimed the Outland Trophy. Both Kelly and Robinson won the Jacobs Blocking Trophy as the SEC's top offensive lineman.

In 2015, Cristobal's offensive line unit won the inaugural Joe Moore Award as the Most Outstanding Offensive Line Unit in college football. The physically-dominating group helped Derrick Henry break Herschel Walker's SEC single-season rushing record en route to winning the Heisman Trophy, Walter Camp Award and the Doak Walker Award.

Alabama's offense ranked in the top 25 nationally in time of possession three times and in rushing offense twice from 2013-16. The Crimson Tide also had the SEC Player of the Year three times over that span in Amari Cooper (2014), Henry (2015) and Jalen Hurts (2016).

Prior to joining Nick Saban's staff at Alabama, Cristobal spent six seasons (2007-12) as the head coach at Florida International (FIU), solidifying his standing as one of the country's top young college football coaches and recruiters after taking over a program under heavy NCAA sanctions and coming off a winless season. Cristobal led the Panthers to the most successful year in school history in 2011, capturing a program-record eight wins, including a road win at eventual co-Big East Champion Louisville.

Cristobal was named the Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year in 2010 after leading FIU to its first Sun Belt Conference championship and a bowl victory over MAC champion Toledo, and he finished his FIU career having produced NFL talents such as T.Y. Hilton and Jonathan Cyprien.

Cristobal coached at Miami (Fla.), his alma mater, under Larry Coker for three years before accepting the head job at FIU. As the tight ends coach for the 2004 and 2005 seasons, he helped develop multiple players into NFL draft picks, including first-round pick and All-Pro Greg Olsen. In 2006, Cristobal took over a Miami offensive line that featured four new starters and saw a 39 percent decrease in sacks allowed from the previous season (36 to 22).

Cristobal spent three years (2001-03) at Rutgers under head coach Greg Schiano, working with the offensive tackles and tight ends for the first two seasons before shifting his focus solely to the offensive line in 2003. Cristobal was a critical factor in Rutgers' resurgence to competitiveness and helped lay the foundation in recruiting and coaching for a program that went from obscurity to college football's upper echelon in a matter of five years. Cristobal helped Rutgers to a 5-7 mark in 2003, the school's best record since 1998. One of Cristobal's most accomplished pupils was tight end L.J. Smith, the Philadelphia Eagles' second-round pick in the 2003 NFL Draft.

Cristobal began his coaching career in 1998 as a graduate assistant at Miami, working with the Hurricanes for three seasons under Butch Davis. He joined the Hurricanes' staff six years after finishing a four-year playing career at Miami as a standout offensive lineman under hall of fame coach Jimmy Johnson. Cristobal was a first-team All-Big East selection in 1992 and helped the Hurricanes to a pair of national championships (1989, 1991).

A native of Miami and a prep standout at Christopher Columbus High School, Cristobal graduated from Miami in 1993 with a bachelor's degree in business administration and later earned a master's degree from Miami in 2001. Following his college career, Cristobal signed a free-agent contract with the Denver Broncos in 1994 and then played for the Amsterdam Admirals of NFL Europe in 1995 and 1996.

Cristobal and his wife, Jessica, were married in June 2006 and have two sons, Mario Mateo and Rocco.
