OPENING STATEMENT

"A good win for us as a team, a difficult win. One of those wins you are hoping that you're able to do what we did today. It was tough on us given we haven't had much time to prepare for this game. Our players did a great job handling the information that we did have to get them at least familiar with San Diego State. I thought our defense played outstanding; they made a great number of improvements from the first two games to this third game. I'm excited about what our defense looks like. Offensively, we had some challenges today against a very good defense. It was tough to run the ball. It was tough to throw it. It was tough in protection. I think there are a lot of things we need to work on and fix on the offensive side. Sam threw his first interception for a touchdown, I'm sure he'll learn a lot from that. All in all, I'm just glad we were able to pull out the win. It was a great win for our defense, I thought our special teams played well. It was a great win for our program."

ON SECURING BOWL ELIGIBILITY IN HIS FIRST YEAR AS HEAD COACH

I don't think of it that way, we still got a season to play. I'm not even thinking about bowl right now. I'm focused on the next job or the next task in front of us which is Arizona. I'm going to enjoy this victory today; you know we've got plans to do a lot of things as we move through the season. Right now, I'm trying to digest what happened tonight. We had a great victory, and my mind is already on the things we need to fix to get ready for Arizona. That's great for the program and I've got aspirations for us to continue to win. I think all of those things take care of themselves. We're still marching forward trying to maximize every opportunity that we have in front of us.

ON WINNING THEY WAY THEY DID

We won the game with a day of preparation. I thought our players did a great job of getting a feel of what San Diego State does. Our defense played well and offensively was a bigger challenge. That's a very good defensive front and I think they're third in the country in rush defense and it showed today. It was difficult for us to get some things together running the football. Throwing the ball, we were okay other than the mistake that Same had. It was a very good defense and our defense rose up to their challenges and met them and offensively we got enough points to win the game. I think good teams find ways to win and they're not always pretty. They're not always an explosive offense and a great defense. Sometimes you've got to win ugly and it was one of those games given the lack of preparation I think it was a solid win for us. I'm very proud of these young men.

ON SPECIAL TEAMS AND K EVAN PRICE

"We got a hand up on one of their kicks and they had a couple of wide left or wide right kicks. I'm very excited about Evan. He's had experience last year which has helped him given he has the role with James retiring from football. He stepped in and did a fabulous job. We've got to continue to work on our mechanics with protection and the timing. He (Evan) is a lot faster with getting things in terms of his operation from snap, kick and hold. I think all of that has been going really well and he had a couple of big kicks for us today. I'm really happy that he has a couple of kicks under his belt from this year that he can continue to build his confidence and feel like he can do more for us as we march through the season."

ON SAM NOYER RUNNING

"Sam ran some today naturally because of plays breaking down. He is going to make some plays off-schedule. We don't need to do a lot of quarterback run options for him. We have some that are naturally going to happen from week to week. The other part of it is we don't want to expose him too much, doing a lot of those things. Sam is growing and learning. This challenge for Sam today, versus this San Diego State defense, was challenging. The seams to throw the footballs were a lot more difficult because there were a lot more defenders out there it seemed like than what he had seen the first couple opportunities he had against UCLA and Stanford. He made one big mistake today. I thought he did a nice job of at least generating some drives for us. When you talk to him, he is going to feel like he could have played it much better. I'm sure he could of. A lot of these things we are able to fix and kind of shore up. At least we are winning games and still have some issues to clean up after winning games. It is a lot easier to fix than after a loss. Sam has already told me after the game, 'I am going to be much better next week.' He is already thinking about next week too. He is going to be fine. I think we are all going to be fine offensively. I am very proud of how our defense played. They really look like the style of defense Colorado has had in the past when I was here. I am very proud of that transition and what it is working too. We will continue to work and get better at the things we need to fix in all of the areas of our team, on offense, defense, and special teams. We have good problems to have right now. We are 3-0, but we have some things we can continue to get better at."

Offensively, we've got to find a way to convert third downs and got to keep working. It was a crazy week to some degree. We were delayed getting here a little bit at the hotel because of some testing. But, you know, I thought the guys were fired up and ready to play football."

On getting ready to play on short notice

"Well, the only thing I'll say is that the staff and the players did a really good job of getting ready to play. At one point in the week we thought we were going to play Washington. That obviously didn't go that way. Then JD worked his tail off helping to get this game. When we got it, we told the guys on Thursday night about six o'clock. We had practiced a couple days, so that we were working into whatever it was. More fundamentals than anything else. I thought the coaches did a great job of getting together and putting a plan together."

On Darren Hall and Dwayne Johnson Jr.

"Well I think Darren and Dwayne love to play. They love their teammates. They are two guys who we count on as far as leadership. They're very much the guys that you want to have on your football team."

On the personal fouls

"We'll address it. I think there's a lot of passion when you're playing that hard. When guys are making penalties and some of them are physical, that's part of the game. During the game itself, I think they had three targeting penalties that happened in the first half. Now I know one of them was on them, but I've never seen that in the first quarter and all three of them weren't targeting."

On the quarterback situation

"As we went through the week all the way till Thursday we're hoping for Lucas. Weren't sure if that was going to happen. Jeff did a good job getting the other two guys ready. At the same time and then obviously, as we got closer to gameday we thought that Lucas wasn't gonna be able to go. Same with Greg Bell and Bill Dunkle. From that standpoint, we decided that we would play both of them, and see who reacted well, and who played well. I think we just got to keep honing in at that position."

On Jordan Brookshire

"I would say I think he did some good things. He pulled the ball a couple times, he used his feet, extended plays. Then there's some things that I know he'll want to do better. Just like every guy out there. Nobody played a perfect game and we've got to obviously keep getting better as a football team."

On why they couldn't build off of pick-six

"I think in some ways we did build on it. I think you look at what we did defensively. I don't know how many three and outs we were able to get in the second half from a defensive standpoint. Offensively, we'd take two steps forward and then a step back. So, we just have to really become more consistent in what we're doing and how we're doing it."

On the pick six

"That was awesome. Darren Hall ended up playing 87 snaps on defense, which is by far more than you like to play. To have D-Hall step in front of it and take it back. We talked about scoring on defense. We talked about getting the ball back for the offense. Obviously, that was a lift for everybody."

On defending Jarek Broussard

"I thought early in the game we missed some tackles. I didn't think we tackled well. Part of that is the leverage that you get from the other 11 guys, or other 10 guys out there. I really think that the guys did a nice job of making him go east and west instead of north and south. I thought the coaches had a real good plan with different personnel groups."

On the biggest challenge coming into today

"I never saw it as a challenge. I don't know if our team saw it as a challenge. As far as the protocols and getting ready to play. I never said that on our on our football team. That tells me that we got the right guys and tells me that their coaches are doing a great job with them. The most challenging to some degree was making sure all the testing got here and getting the results back."

On the lack of a run game

"It's the back, it's the line, it's the receivers, it's the tight ends ,it's the second level, it's third level. It's really all those things and not executing as well as we would like to."

On the craziness of this week

"Well since March, we've kind of been prepared for anything. I can tell you how we talked about how we've got to be a team that adapts to whatever is in front of us and do it together as a team."

On what this loss means

"I think you learn something from every time you go out and play. We learned something from a coaching standpoint, you'll learn something from a player's standpoint. Those are all valuable lessons. We're disappointed, we're ticked off. No doubt about it. But the guys in that locker room who represent San Diego State, they are definitely gonna get better because of the experience."

ON GIVING UP THREE POINTS-"It's a huge confidence booster. The attitude and energy on the sideline the entire game was great. OUICKLY

▶ Series. CU takes a 2-0 lead in the series with SDSU, the other game a 34-14 win in 2002 ... Colorado has now started 3-0 for the third time in four seasons (2017, 2018, 2020) ... That 3-0 start makes Karl Dorrell the seventh coach in CU history to win his first three games; the only other coach to do so since 1905 of was Rick Neuheisel in 1995 (with Dorrell the offensive coordinator on that staff) ... CU is now 68-24 against unranked teams in November dating back to 1985 ... The opponents did not start a drive in CU territory until the 11th possession tonight (SDSU at the CU43), or the 39th opponent drive of the year ... This was the first time CU opened with three opponents from the same state since 1924 (Western State, Regis, Colorado College) and first time ever with three from a state other than Colorado ... The Buffaloes have now led for 158:37 (tied for 14:08 and have trailed for just 3:15 this season ... CU has also scored in all 12 guarters to open a season for the first time since 1998, when the Buffs scored in the first 16.

▶ **First Fumble.** CU's first fumble of the season (fumbled center snap) occurred with 5:29 left in the second quarter, or 144 minutes and 31 second into the season; that's the second longest in school history, behind 1:46:06 in 2014 (*the longest time without a fumble lost is 1:88:01 in 2011*).

DEFENSE. Several good defensive notes today:

▶ 10. The fewest points CU allowed in a game since the first two games of the 2017 season, when CSU and Texas State were each held to a field goal—also the last two times that CU did not allow an offensive TD. It was CU's **75th** straight win when holding the opponent under 13 points (since a 7-0 loss at Nebraska in 1988).

▶ **100/100.** Colorado improved to **47-1** all-time when holding an opponent under 100 yards in both rushing yards (79 by SSU) and passing yards (76). CU is now **105-15-1** since the start of the 1985 season when holding an opponent under 100 yards rushing and 300 yards total offense.

▶ **155.** The 155 yards by SDSU was the first time an opponent was held under 200 since 2016 (Arizona State, 199), and the fewest since earlier that same year when Idaho State had 96.

▶ **2.63.** SDSU's average per play (**59-155**) was the smallest since that Idaho State game (when the Vandals averaged 1.75 per).

▶ **1-of-19.** SDSU's *second* down efficiency (thus when combined with 4-of-17 on third and 0-of-1 on fourth, added to **5-of-37**).

▶ **18-22.** SDSU ran 18 plays in plus territory for a net yards, and never penetrated CU's 20 (red zone).

▶ **30/59.** Of SDSU's 59 plays, 19 went for zero gains and 11 for minus yardage (CU had 13 tackles at or behind the line of scrimmage).

RED ZONE. CU is now **13-of-13** when penetrating the 20 this year (**11** TD, **2** FG).

FIRST CAREER STARTS Two made their first career starts: **SECOND-YEAR FRESHMEN (1):** WR La'Vontae Shenault.

SOPHOMORES (1): TE C.J. Schmanski.

Note: Schmanski (a walk-on from Monarch High School in Louisville, Colo. – six miles outside of Boulder – became the 10th player dating back to at least 1992 to start a game as a walk-on. The previous nine: **OG Jack Shutack**, who made five starts at right guard last year. The others: **FS Ryan Moeller** (2014); **FB Jordan Murphy** (2013); **WR Dusty Ebner** and **C Keenan Stevens** (2009); **WR Steve Melton** (2008); **ILB Jake Duren** and **SS D.J. Dykes** (2007) and **WR Cody Crawford** (2006). Schmanski also made his first career receptions.

FIRST CAREER ACTION Redshirt freshman **PK Mac Willis** (Cherry Creek HS) appeared in his first career game (kickoff man).

THIRD COLORADO PREP FIRST Junior S Curtis Appleton (Cherry Creek) had his first career interception, joining Schmanski and Willis with firsts tonight by Colorado prep products.

INDIVIDUAL LINER NOTES

ILB Nate Landman (9,2–11 TT; 3 QBS, 4 TFL, 5 3DS)

▶ He is just the third player since 2010 to have three quarterback sacks in a game for the Buffaloes; **DL Mustafa Johnson** had three against Nebraska last year and **DT Leo Jackson** three against Texas State in 2017. All three of Landman's sacks came on third downs; we'll check the last time an ILB had three in a game; Landman had four in 2018; Addison Gilliam had 3½ in 2014, as did Michael Sipili in 2010).
