THE GAME

The University of Utah (1-2) will play under the lights on Friday, Dec. 11 when the Utes travel to Boulder, Colo. to take on the Colorado Buffaloes (4-0, 3-0 Pac-12). The game is set for a 7:30 p.m. MT kick on FSI. Search #GoUtes and #UBoyz on social media for conversation about Utah football this season.

UTES ON THE ROAD

Utah is 249-255-12 all-time when playing on the road with Colorado leading the all-time series in Boulder 16-13-1. Utah has won four of the last five games when playing on the road against Colorado, including the Utes' 30-7 win against the Buffaloes in 2018. The Utes won at Colorado in 2018 in snowy conditions on Nov. 17, clinching the Pac-12 South title. Utah scored 30 unanswered points against the Buffaloes in that game for the win.

NUMBERS TALK

- With a win, Utah will have won four straight against Colorado (2017, 2018, 2019)
- With a win, Utah will tie the all-time series against Colorado in wins and losses at 32-32 (3 ties).
- Utah has outscored Colorado 109-35 in the last three meetings between the two teams.
- Teams are only converting 28-percent of their third down attempts against the Utes, which ranks sixth in the FBS and first in the Pac-12.
- After Utah's game against the Buffaloes, Kyle Whittingham will have coached in 199 games as the head coach of the Utes. Whittingham is the third-most tenured head coach among active head coaches nationally.

QUICK HITS

- Utah has won nine of the last 11 games against Colorado, making up ground in the all-time series (31-32-3).
- Utah ranks second in the Pac-12 in time of possession, averaging 33:09 per game.
- Utah is among the least penalized teams in the nation at just 19, ranking sixth in the FBS and fourth in the Pac-12. Entering Utah's game against Oregon State (12/5), Utah had committed only eight penalties in two games.
- Utah has gained six turnovers this season which includes five interceptions. Utah's six turnovers gained ranks fourth in the Pac-12 while its five interceptions ranks first in the league, also ranking third in passing efficiency defense (122.06).
- Utah has held all three of its opponents to under 360 yards of total offense, ranking second in the Pac-12 in total defense (350.7).
- Utah's preseason ranking by AP was the second-highest preseason AP Poll rank the Utes have received since 2015 after being voted No. 14 in 2019.

TEAM LEADERS

Utah's team captains are elected during preseason camp each year by the team. This year, the offensive captains are senior Orlando Umana (OL) and graduate transfer Jake Bentley (QB). For the defense, Utah's captains are juniors Devin Lloyd (LB) and Mika Tafua (DE). The Utes also named their leadership council for the season which includes Umana, Bentley, Lloyd, Tafua, Devin Brumfield (RB), Britain Covey (WR), Solomon Enis (WR), Nick Ford (OL), Cole Fotheringham (TE), Brant Kuithe (TE), Drew Lisk (QB), Hauati Pututau (DT), Cameron Rising (QB) and Bryan Thompson (WR).

- Kyle Whittingham, the longest-tenured coach in the Pac-12 Conference and the third-longest tenured head coach at the same school in the NCAA FBS, is in his 16th season at the helm at Utah, where he boasts a 132-66 record. Including 11 seasons as a Ute assistant coach, he has contributed to more victories (217) than any coach in program history.
- His many accomplishments include National Coach of the Year recognition in 2008 by the AFCA—when Utah was declared the national champion by an NCAA major selector while finishing No. 2 in the Associated Press poll—and the 2018 Pac-12 South Division title. He also earned 2019 Pac-12 Coach of the Year, 2019 AFCA Regional Coach of the Year, 2019 Dodd Trophy Award winner and was a finalist for the AFCA National Coach of the Year and Bear Bryant Award.
- Legendary for his postseason success, his 11 bowl wins (11-3) ties him for second among active coaches and ranks in the top-10 all-time (including ties). His glossy bowl record includes a 2-0 mark in College Football Playoff New Year's Six bowls, with wins over Pittsburgh in the 2005 Fiesta Bowl as co-head coach and Alabama in the 2009 Sugar Bowl.
- The Utes appeared in every weekly CFP ranking for the first three years of the system (2014-16) and have made the sixth-most appearances of any school with 30 total. Utah has finished in the CFP top-25 in five seasons: No. 22 in 2014 and 2015, No. 19 in 2016, No. 17 in 2018 and No. 11 in 2019. The Utes have made the final AP top-25 six times and the final Coaches' poll seven times under Whittingham. Their AP top-25 finishes were No. 2 (2008), No. 18 (2009), No. 21 (2014), No. 17 (2015), No. 23 (2016) and No. 16 (2019).
- Individually, Whittingham has had 20 players make major All-America teams (those determining the NCAA's consensus team). They are Luther Elliss (1994, consensus defensive lineman), Eric Weddle (2006, consensus defensive back), Louie Sakoda (2007, punter; 2008, unanimous consensus place kicker), Zane Beadles (2009, offensive line), Shaky Smithson (2010, punt returner), Star Lotulelei (2012, defensive tackle), Reggie Dunn (2012, kick returner), Nate Orchard (2014, defensive end), Kaelin Clay (2014, returner), Tom Hackett (2014, consensus punter; 2015, unanimous consensus punter), Mitch Wishnowsky (2016, unanimous consensus punter), Matt Gay (2017, consensus kicker), Bradlee Anae (2019, consensus defensive end), Julian Blackmon (2019, safety), Leki Fotu (2019, defensive tackle), Jaylon Johnson (2019, cornerback) and Zack Moss (2019, running back).
- In 2019, Whittingham guided the Utes to their second consecutive Pac-12 South Division title and third overall in his tenure as head coach. Utah's 11-3 record is the fifth 10-win season under Whittingham and the most wins by the Utes since 2008 (13-0). The Utes jumped to as high as No. 5 in all three polls (CFP, AP, Coaches), finishing ranked No. 11 in the College Football Playoff poll, its highest finish since the poll was created.

TEAM NOTES

Kyle Whittingham, the longest-tenured coach in the Pac-12 and the third-longest tenured coach at the same school in the NCAA FBS, is in his 16th season at the helm at Utah in 2020.

- He holds a 132-66 overall record as a head coach, ranking as the second-winningest head coach at Utah behind Ike Armstrong (141-55-15).
- He has contributed to more victories than any coach in program history (217) including his 11 seasons as an assistant coach (1994-2004).
- He has led the Utes to back-to-back Pac-12 South titles and has won National Coach of the Year recognitions – two in 2008 and one 2019. He was the AFCA Coach of the Year and Bear Bryant Award winner in 2008, and the Dodd Trophy Coach of the Year in 2019, also winning Pac-12 Coach of the Year last season.

According to figures compiled by each FBS program, the 2020 Utah Utes are the ninth-most “youthful” team in the nation.

- Eighty members of this year’s team are listed as either freshmen (true or redshirt) or sophomores, for a 66.9% composition.
- There were 41 true freshmen, 20 redshirt freshmen and 20 sophomores among the 121 listed on the roster to begin the season.
- The Utes’ 2020 recruiting class was ranked highest in school history, 29th in the FBS, by 247Sports.

Twenty-one of the 64 Utes who have played this season (33%) were making their first FBS game appearance, including 14 (22%) true freshmen.

Through three games this season, Utah has seen 11 players on offense and defense make their first FBS start.

- QB Cameron Rising, So.; RB Jordan Wilmore, So.; RB Ty Jordan, Fr.; TE Dalton Kincaid, Jr.; OL Keaton Bills, R-Fr.; OL Jaren Kump, Fr.; OL Sataoa Laumea, R-Fr.; LB Sione Fotu, Fr.; CB JaTravis Broughton, So.; CB Clark Phillips, Fr.; S Nate Ritchie, Fr.

Utah’s traditionally strong rushing defense has been on display through three games.

- The Utes lead the Pac-12 and rank 12th in the FBS, allowing just 104.7 rushing yards per game.
- Utah’s average of just 3.6 yards per carry allowed also leads the Pac-12.
- Utah ranked 3rd in the FBS in 2019, allowing just 81.8 yards per game and 3.0 per carry with a defense that ranked among best statistically in Pac-12 history.
- The 2020 Utah defense ranks second in the Pac-12, allowing 350.7 yards per game.

The Utes lead the Pac-12 and rank 6th in the FBS in opponent third-down conversions (28.9%; 11-38). That figure improved against Oregon State as the Utes allowed just 2-of-12 on third downs (16.7%).

The defense has plucked five interceptions in three games, tied for most in the Pac-12 with Oregon State, which has played five games. The Utes’ average of 1.67 interceptions per game is best in the Pac-12.

The Utes lead the nation in punt return average (28.7) and lead the Pac-12 in punt coverage (.50 per return; 11th FBS).

For the second year in a row, Utah’s first touchdown of the season was scored by the defense.

- In Utah’s game against USC, linebacker Nephi Sewell scored Utah’s first touchdown of the season with 11:53 left in the second quarter on a 23-yard fumble return.
- In 2019, it was linebacker Francis Bernard with a 58-yard interception return for a score at BYU at the 10:17 mark of the second quarter. Utah won 30-12.

Utah’s season opener against USC marked the longest the Utes had gone between games.

- It had been 326 days since the Utes finished the 2019 season on New Year’s Eve 2019 in the Valero Alamo Bowl against Texas.
- The 326-day gap marks the longest stretch between Utah football games since the 1918 season was not played during the last pandemic (Spanish Flu). There were 681 days between games from Nov. 29, 1917 to Oct. 11, 1919.
- It was nearly a year between home games, spanning 357 days since Utah closed the 2019 regular season (Nov. 30 vs. Colorado).

The University of Utah football team has one scheduled regular season game confirmed, at Colorado (Fri., 12/11) and the final game for each team will involve all 12 programs, highlighted by the Pac-12 Championship Game with the other games selected after the two championship teams are determined.

- Head coach Kyle Whittingham has a winning record against Colorado (7-2).
- In four of the last five seasons, the Utes have either exceeded their preseason ranking or placed in the top-three of the South Division as voted, including winning back-to-back Pac-12 South Titles in 2018 and 2019.

Utah's football program excels in the classroom at an elite level among FBS programs and achieves one of the highest graduate rates in the country.

- Utah ranks No. 1 in the Pac-12 in Graduation Success Rate (GSR) at 93%
- The Utes earned a 2019 Academic Achievement Awards from the American Football Coaches Association for recording a perfect 100% single-year graduation success rate.
- Utah received a Public Recognition Award for 2019-20 for recording an Academic Progress Rate (991) in the Top 10% nationally.
- In the Spring 2020 semester Utah had 66 student-athletes on the honor roll (3.0 GPA or better) and 25 on the Dean's List (3.5 GPA or better).

Ten members of the 2020 Utes compete in 2020 having already earned bachelor's degrees: London Bartholomew, Vonte Davis, Samuelu Elisaia, Drew Lisk, Keegan Markgraf, Viane Moala, Samson Nacua, Pita Tonga, Maxs Tupai and Orlando Umana.

Junior TE Brant Kuithe earned a spot on the Pick Six Previews Preseason All-America team while five Utes have also earned spots on preseason watch lists.

- Kuithe is on the watch list for the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award, recognizing the nation's college offensive player of the year.
- Junior LB Devin Lloyd is up for the Butkus Award (nation's best linebacker) and the Wuerffel Trophy (community service award).
- Graduate Transfer QB Jake Bentley is currently in the running for the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award and the Maxwell Award (college player of the year).
- Junior WR/Ret. Britain Covey is on the watch list for the Paul Hornung Award, given to the most versatile player in college football.
- Senior LS Keegan Markgraf is on the watch list for the Patrick Mannelly Award, given to the nation's best snapper.

QUARTERBACK NOTEBOOK

The Utes enter their fourth game with two quarterbacks on the depth chart (graduate transfer **Jake Bentley** and senior **Drew Lisk**). Bentley has started the last two games (Washington, 11/28; Oregon State, 12/5).

Bentley has played in all three games this season, starting against Washington (11/28) and Oregon State (12/5). He has played in 36 career games in the FBS with 35 starts. He leads the Pac-12 among active quarterbacks in career games played and career starts, also ranking ninth among all active FBS quarterbacks in career passing yards (8,016; 7,527 at South Carolina and 489 at Utah).

- Bentley is 50-of-78 passing for 489 yards and three touchdowns (4 INT) this season. He has five passes of 20 yards or longer with a season-long coming against Washington when he linked up with Bryan Thompson for 33 yards.
- He has thrown three touchdowns this season, giving him 58 career passing TDs (55 at South Carolina). His 58 touchdowns ranks 17th among active quarterbacks in the FCS, leading all active Pac-12 quarterbacks.
- Bentley had season-highs in completions (18) and passing yards (174) in Utah's win against Oregon State (12/5), finishing the game 18-of-27 passing with zero interceptions and one touchdown.
- He was 16-of-23 passing for 144 yards and a touchdown, adding 33 rushing yards on 10 carries with a rushing score against Washington. His rushing touchdown against the Huskies was his ninth-career rushing TD (8 at South Carolina) and his first since Nov. 10, 2018. It also tied for the third longest rushing touchdown of his career, also rushing for 19 and 11-yard rushing TDs against Vanderbilt in 2017.
- Bentley rushed and threw for a touchdown against Washington, the first time he has done both in the same game since Nov. 10, 2018 against Florida.
- He was 16-of-28 passing for 171 yards and a touchdown against USC (11/21), the first time he had played in a football game since Aug. 31, 2019 when he suffered his season-ending injury with South Carolina.
- His 33-yard rush in the second quarter against the Trojans was a career-long, passing his previous career-best of 24 that came in 2017.

Lisk, who was awarded a scholarship in the summer of 2018, has played in six career games for the Utes. He is currently listed No. 2 on the depth chart.

- He played in four games last season, going 7-of-9 passing for 52 yards.
- He was a perfect 6-for-6 passing against Idaho State in 2019 (38 yards, 0 TD, 0 INT).

Sophomore **Cameron Rising**, who is sidelined after being injured in the opener, redshirted at the University of Texas in 2018, prior to transferring to Utah.

- He spent the 2019 season as a redshirt at Utah, serving as the scout team quarterback while spending game days in the coaches' booth with Ludwig. He ranked as the No. 8 pro-style quarterback in the nation coming out of high school (Newbury Park HS).

- Rising started the game against the Trojans (11/21), going 3-for-6 passing for 45 yards (1 INT) before having to leave the game with an injury.

RUNNING BACK NOTEBOOK

Three different running backs have earned starts through the first three games of the season for the Utes with junior **Devin Brumfield** starting against USC (11/21), sophomore **Jordan Wilmore** starting against Washington (11/28) and freshman **Ty Jordan** earning starts in the last two (Washington, 11/28; Oregon State, 12/5).

Jordan has started the last two games, playing in all three this season. He leads the team in carries (44), rushing yards (296), rushing yards per carry (6.7) and all-purpose yards per game (123.3).

- Jordan ranks 13th overall (second among freshmen) in the FBS and fourth in the Pac-12 in rushing yards per carry (6.73). He is also 25th overall (first among freshmen) in the FBS and fifth in the Pac-12 in rushing yards per game (98.7).
- He has four plays of 20 yards or longer this season (3 rush, 1 rec.).
- He led the Utes in carries (27) and rushing yards (167) against Oregon State (12/5), recording his first-career 100-yard rushing game as a Ute. He scored his first-career touchdown as a Ute in the second quarter, punching in a one-yard rushing TD.
- Jordan's 167 rushing yards against the Beavers was the first time a true freshman had rushed for over 100 yards in a game since 1995 when Chris Fuamatu-Ma'afala rushed for 108 yards against BYU. It is also the most rushing yards in a game by a true freshman since Fuamatu-Ma'afala had 180 against Utah State in 1995.
- Jordan finished with a career-high 189 all-purpose yards (167 rush, 22 rec.) against Oregon State, his second-straight 100-yard all-purpose game (128 at Washington). He ranks second among freshmen in the FBS in all-purpose yards per game (123.3).
- He had 10 carries for 97 yards (9.7 ypc) and four receptions for 31 yards (128 AP) against Washington.
- His 46-yard rush in the second quarter against Washington is the longest rush for the Utes this season.
- In his collegiate debut against USC, Jordan led Utah in all-purpose yards, finishing with 32 rushing and 21 receiving. He had seven carries (4.6 ypc) and one catch in the game.

Wilmore has played in two games this season, earning his first collegiate start against Washington (11/28). He ranks third among running backs on the team in carries (18) for 54 yards (3.0 ypc).

- Wilmore led the team with 10 carries against USC (11/21), recording 38 yards. His 29-yard rush in the third quarter was a career-long, beating his previous career-long 23-yard rush against Idaho State in 2019.

Brumfield started against USC (11/21) and has played in all three games. He ranks second among running backs in rushing yards this season (85) on 21 carries, averaging 4.0 yards per carry with one touchdown.

- Brumfield has played in 24 career games with three starts.
- He scored his first rushing touchdown of the season against Washington (11/28), punching in a two-yard rushing score in the second quarter. It was his third-career rushing touchdown.
- His 10 carries against Washington tied for the team lead in the game.

Redshirt freshman **Micah Bernard** has also seen time at running back in the first three games. He has seven rushes for 47 yards (6.7 ypc) and two catches for 13 yards.

- Bernard rushed for a career-high 26 yards against Oregon State (12/5), carrying the ball three times while averaging a game-high 8.7 yards per carry. His 25-yard rush against the Beavers is the fourth-longest rush by a Utah running back this season.
- He had a career-high three rushing attempts against Washington (11/28), going for 13 yards (4.3 ypc).
- Bernard was a versatile back in high school (Gahr HS), finishing with 1,322 all-purpose yards (606 rec, 716 rush) his senior year.

WIDE RECEIVER & TIGHT END NOTEBOOK

Utah had 3,187 yards passing in 2019 with 2,722 of those yards coming at the hands of the Ute receivers and tight ends. Out of those 2,722 yards recorded in 2019, 78-percent of that production has returned in 2020 (2,137 yards). Eight different Ute tight ends and wide receivers have caught at least one pass this season.

Junior wide receiver **Bryan Thompson** leads the Ute wide receivers in receiving yards through three games with 113 on five catches (22.6 ypc). He is one of three Ute receivers that have scored receiving touchdowns this season.

- He led the Utes in receiving yards against Washington (11/28) with 65 on three catches and a 13-yard receiving touchdown. He averaged 21.7 yards per catch in the game, the second time this year and sixth time in his career he has averaged over 15 yards per catch (with two or more receptions).
- He currently holds the two longest receiving plays on the team this season with his 30-yard catch against USC (11/21) and his 33-yard reception against Washington, both coming from Jake Bentley.

Junior wide receiver **Solomon Enis** has started the first three games for the Utes at wide receiver, leading the Utes receivers in receptions (6) for 55 yards (9.2 ypc). He has played in 31 career games with seven starts.

- Enis had three catches for 42 yards against USC (11/21), averaging 14.0 yards per catch with a long of 25 yards.

Senior wide receiver **Samson Nacua** has played in 43 career games with seven starts.

- He scored Utah's only offensive touchdown against USC (11/21) on a seven-yard reception. He has 11 career receiving touchdowns, the most by any active Ute receiver.
- He has either led or tied for the lead on the team in receiving touchdowns in two of the last three seasons.

Junior wide receiver **Britain Covey** has been Utah's leading receiver twice, in 2015 as a freshman (43 receptions, 519 yds) and in 2018 (60 receptions, 637 yds). As Utah's swiss army knife on the field, the junior has recorded 2,461 all-purpose yards (205 rush, 1,287 rcv, 604 PR, 365 KR).

- Covey has played in 31 career games with 16 starts, playing in two games this season with a start against Oregon State (12/5).
- Was second on the team in receptions against Oregon State (12/5), catching four for 54 yards (13.5 ypc).
- His third quarter receiving touchdown (8 yards) against Oregon State was his first receiving score since Utah's game against USC in 2018 when he caught a 46-yard touchdown from Tyler Huntley. He has six career receiving touchdowns as a Ute (4 in 2015, 1 in 2018, 1 in 2020).

All-Pac-12 junior tight end **Brant Kuithe** was Utah's receiving yards leader from a year ago, recording 602 yards on 34 receptions with six touchdowns, adding six rushes for 102 yards (3 TDs). He has played in 31 career games with 13 starts.

- Kuithe is leading the Utes this season in receptions (16), yards (122) and yards per game (40.7).
- Kuithe has either led or tied for the lead on the team in receptions in all three games (4 vs. USC, 11/21; 4 vs. UW, 11/28; 8 vs. Oregon State, 12/5), giving him eight career games that he has either led or tied for the team-lead in receptions in a game.
- His eight receptions against Oregon State (12/5) was a career-high for the junior, beating his previous career-best of five set against UCLA in 2019. He finished the game against the Beavers with a season-high 76 yards.
- Kuithe ranks fifth overall in the Pac-12 in receptions per game (5.3). He also ranks fourth in the FBS and first in the Pac-12 among tight ends.

Junior tight end **Cole Fotheringham** has started in 26 of the 31 games he has played in during his time as a Ute.

- He has two catches for 22 yards (11.0 ypc) this year, including a season-long 15-yarder against USC (11/21).

Transfer tight end **Dalton Kincaid (Jr.)** came to the Utes from San Diego where he was an All-American, ranking first among tight ends in the FCS and FBS in yards per catch (18.98) in 2019.

- Kincaid has played in all three games, starting against Washington (11/28). He has one reception for 14 yards, coming against USC (11/21).

OFFENSIVE LINE NOTEBOOK

On the offensive line, Utah returned four of its five starters from 2019 where the Utes led the Pac-12 in rushing yards per game (201.4). The Utes have also introduced youth into the starting lineup this season with three freshmen earning starting spots.

- Utah has had three freshmen start on the offensive line in all three games this season with **Keaton Bills** (R-Fr.) at left guard, **Sataoa Laumea** (R-Fr.) at right guard and **Jaren Kump** (Fr.) at right tackle.
- Three of Utah's offensive linemen earned All-Pac-12 in 2019 with **Nick Ford**, **Simi Moala** and **Umana** all receiving honorable mention recognition.
- **Ford** started at center against Washington (11/28) and Oregon State (12/5), and at left tackle against USC (11/21). He has 24 career starts in 28 games (2 starts at center, 1 start at left tackle, 2 starts at right tackle, 19 at right guard).
- Sophomore **Simi Moala** started at left tackle against Washington (11/28) and Oregon State (12/5). He has played in 17 games with 14 starts (2 at left tackle, 12 at right tackle).

DEFENSIVE LINE NOTEBOOK

Utah's front four continues to prove that they are one of the strongest units each year, holding two of their three opponents to under 100 yards rushing this season with all three opponents finishing well under their season average. The Utes rank first in the Pac-12 in rushing defense (104.7) and 12th in the FBS.

- USC was averaging 174.0 rushing yards prior to the game on Nov. 21 with the Utes holding them to 93.0. Washington was averaging 250.0 rushing yards per game prior to Nov. 28, ranking 10th nationally with Utah holding them to 88.0 yards. Oregon State was putting up 190.8 rushing yards per game prior to Dec. 5 with the Utes holding them to 133.
- Five of Utah's six sacks this season have come from the defensive line. Junior **Mika Tafua** and senior **Hauati Pututau** have two each with senior **Maxs Tupai** recording the fifth.

Tafua is leading the Utah defensive linemen in total tackles (11) and is tied for the lead in sacks (2.0). He has played in 28 career games with 22 starts on the defensive line.

- Tafua tied his season-high in tackles with five against Oregon State (12/5), also recording his second sack of the season. His sack for a loss of five yards was with 34 seconds remaining in the game with the Beavers driving, forcing a third-and-long and an eventual turnover on downs to seal the 30-24 win.
- Tafua had the most tackles among Utah defensive linemen against USC (11/21) with five, adding his sixth-career sack (loss of nine yards).

H. Pututau leads the Utes in career games played with 42, earning four starts. He ranks second among defensive linemen in total tackles (10), adding three tackles for loss (2.0 sacks) and a pass breakup.

- Pututau has tied his career-high in tackles with four against USC (11/21) and Oregon State (12/5).
- Recorded two tackles for loss against Oregon State (12/5), the most in a game for the senior. His previous career-high for tackles for loss in a game was 1.5 against USC in 2018.

Tupai has started all three games this season, one at defensive end and the other two inside at tackle. He has 12 career starts on the defensive line and has played in 34 career games.

- He has two tackles (1.0 sack, 1.0 TFL), a pass breakup and a forced fumble through three games.

The Utes have also seen four newcomers see action on the defensive line this season.

- Junior transfer **Devin Kaufusi** earned the start at defensive end for the Utes against USC (11/21) and has played in all three games. It was his fourth-career start at the FBS level after starting three games for BYU from 2018-19. He recorded three tackles (1.0 TFL) and a pass breakup against USC.
- The Utes have also seen four freshmen earn playing time on the defensive line. **Van Fillinger** (Fr., DE) and **Tennessee Puttutau** (Fr., DT) have played in all three games with **Xavier Carlton** (Fr., DE) playing in two and **Miki Suguturaga** (R-Fr., DE) playing in his first game against Oregon State (12/5).

LINEBACKER NOTEBOOK

The Utes have started with three linebackers in all three games in juniors **Devin Lloyd** and **Nephi Sewell**, and true freshman Sione Fotu.

Lloyd, who has played in 31 career games with 17 starts, leads the Utes in total tackles this season. He has 29 tackles through three games with a team-high five tackles for loss.

- Lloyd has led the Utes in tackles in two games this season, recording a career-high 11 in against USC (11/21) and Washington (11/28). His previous career-best was 10 which he set against Northern Illinois in 2019.
- Lloyd has three career double-digit tackle games and has either led or tied for the lead in total tackles for the Utes in seven-career games.
- He has four career games with two-or-more tackles for loss in a game, including two this season (3.5 vs. Idaho State, 2019; 2.0 vs. Texas, 2019; 2.0 vs. USC, 2020; 2.0 vs. Oregon State, 2020).
- He is tied for fifth in the Pac-12 and 33rd in the FBS in tackles per game (9.7). He is also tied for fifth in the Pac-12 and 10th in the FBS in solo tackles per game (6.0).
- Lloyd is 17th in the FBS and is seventh in the Pac-12 in tackles for loss per game (1.7).

Sewell ranks second on the team in total tackles this season with 24 (2.0 TFL) with one interception, a pass breakup and a fumble recovery for a touchdown. Sewell has played in 29 career games in the FBS with 23 starts, starting all three games this season (23 games with 19 starts at Nevada from 2017-18).

- Sewell tied his career-high in total tackles against USC (11/21), recording 10 (2.0 TFL). He also had 10 tackles against Washington State in 2017 when he was playing with Nevada.
- He recorded his first-career fumble recovery for a touchdown against USC, returning it 23 yards for Utah's first touchdown of the game. It was his third-career fumble recovery, also picking up two at Nevada.
- He also notched his first interception as a Ute against USC in the second quarter, giving him three career interceptions (2 at Nevada).

Fotu has started all three games at linebacker for the Utes with nine tackles and a pass breakup. It was the first time in this decade that the Utes had a true freshman start at linebacker in a season-opener.

- Fotu recorded a career-high four tackles and a pass breakup in his collegiate debut against USC (11/21).

SECONDARY NOTEBOOK

The Utes have debuted a brand new secondary in the first three games of the season with senior **Vonte Davis** (S), sophomore **Ja-Travis Broughton** (CB), and freshmen **Clark Phillips III** (CB) and **Nate Ritchie** (S) all starting for the first time in a Utah uniform.

Utah has five interceptions through three games, which ranks first in the Pac-12. **Davis** leads the Utes in interceptions with two (1 vs. Washington, 11/28; 1 vs. Oregon State, 12/5).

- Utah finished the game against Washington (11/28) with three interceptions. Freshmen **Faybian Marks** (CB) and **Zemaiah Vaughn** (S) both recorded their first collegiate interceptions in the first and second quarters with **Davis** (S) notching his first interception as a Ute in the fourth quarter.
- Marks finished the game with two tackles and the interception with a 28-yard return. Vaughn returned his interception 73 yards before being forced out of bounds as the first-half clock expired, while Davis recorded three tackles and his 18-yard interception return.
- The Utes had a combined 119 interception return yards, the most since Utah had two interceptions returned for 127 yards against San Diego State on Nov. 1, 2008.
- Vaughn's 73-yard interception return is the longest for the Utes since Jaylon Johnson returned a pick-six for 100 yards against Stanford in 2018.
- The last time Utah had three interceptions in a game was against Arizona on Nov. 22, 2017 (S Corrian Ballard, NB Javelin Guidry, S Chase Hansen).
- The last time a freshman had an interception in a game was against Idaho State in 2019 (JaTravis Broughton). It was also the first time the Utes have had two freshmen have an interception in one game since joining the Pac-12 in 2011.

Phillips is third on the team in total tackles and is leading the secondary, recording 20 tackles (2.0 TFL) in three starts.

- Phillips recorded nine total tackles in his collegiate debut against USC (11/21), the most by a Utah freshman in a season-opener since Eric Rowe notched nine against Montana State in 2011.
- Phillips' 18 of his 20 total tackles this season are solo tackles, averaging 6.0 per game.
- He ranks first among freshmen in the FBS in solo tackles per game (6.0), also ranking tied for 10th overall (fifth in the Pac-12).

Broughton ranks fourth on the team in total tackles and second among the secondary through three games, notching 18 tackles (1.0 TFL) and a team-high two pass breakups.

- Broughton recorded a career-high nine tackles in Utah's win over Oregon State (12/5), adding a pass breakup to his stat line. It beat his previous career-best of five tackles, set against USC this season.
- Broughton earned his first-career tackle for loss against USC (11/21).

Ritchie is fifth on the team in total tackles this season with 17 (2.0 TFL).

- Ritchie recorded a career-high seven tackles in Utah's game against Washington (11/28).
- His second tackle for loss of the season came with under three minutes to play in the game against Oregon State (12/5), stopping the Beavers on a fourth down attempt (4-and-1) on the Utah 31-yard line, tackling running back Calvin Tyler for a loss of one yard. He finished the game with five total tackles.

Davis has 11 total tackles and three passes defended (2 INT, 1 PBU).

- Davis recorded a career-high tying seven tackles against USC (11/21), adding a pass breakup. He also had seven tackles against Northeastern Oklahoma A&M College in 2017 when he played for Blinn College.
- He leads the Utes in interceptions this season with two, which also ties for the lead in the Pac-12. His 35-yard return against Oregon State was a career-long, beating his 18-yard return against Washington (11/28).
- He has back-to-back games with interceptions (1 at Washington, 11/28; 1 vs. Oregon State, 12/5). The last time a Ute had interceptions in back-to-back games was against Washington (11/2/19) and UCLA (11/16/19) when Julian Blackmon came away with picks in both games.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTEBOOK

Markgraf has taken 139 career snaps as a Ute (55 punts, 19 FG, 64 PAT).

- He has been a part of 22 snaps this season (10 punts, 4 FG, 8 PAT).

Redding is a perfect 4-for-4 from field goals and 8-for-8 on PATs this season.

- He is 5-of-5 from 20-29 yards and 7-of-9 from 30-39 yards in his career as a Ute. He is 14-of-17 in field goal kicking in his career and is 64-of-64 on PATs.
- Redding tied his career-high in field goals made against Oregon State (12/5), knocking in 33, 27 and 20-yard field goals. He also hit three against USC in 2019. He scored 12 points against the Beavs with three PATs.
- He has three career games with two-or-more field goals in a game (3 at USC, 2019; 2 at Washington, 2019; 3 vs. Oregon State, 2020).
- Redding knocked in a season-long 36-yard field goal against USC (11/21), the Utes' first score of the game. A field goal has been the Utes' first points in season openers in back-to-back seasons.

Lennon has 10 punts for 396 yards (39.6 ypp) with three landing inside the 20-yard line with one touchback.

- He averaged a season-high 43.7 yards per punt in Utah's win against Oregon State (12/5).
- He has a season-long punt of 47 yards, coming twice (at Washington, 11/28; vs. Oregon State, 12/5).
- Of the three punts he has had land inside the 20-yard line, two have landed inside the 10-yard line.

Freshman **Jordan Noyes** and sophomore transfer **Skyler Southam** have both handled kickoffs this season.

- Noyes has 11 kickoffs for 694 yards (63.1 ypk) with four touchbacks. He had a career-high 65.8 yards per kick against USC (11/21).
- Southam entered the game against Oregon State (12/5) in the second half, finishing the game with four kickoffs for 222 yards (55.5 ypk) and one touchback.

Junior return specialist **Britain Covey** has started as Utah's punt returner in the last two games. He is currently sixth all-time at Utah in career punt return yards (604), passing Steve Odom (548, 1971-73) and Gay Adelt (598, 1940-41). He is also fifth all-time in career punt returns (57), passing Henry Lusk (56, 1991-95).

- Covey has two punt returns this season for 68 yards (34.0 ypr) with one touchdown.
- Covey returned a 64-yard punt return for a touchdown against Oregon State (12/5), the first punt return for a TD for the Utes since Demari Simpkins' 66-yard return to the house against Colorado in 2019.
- It was his second-career punt return for a touchdown and the second-longest punt return of his career. He had a 77-yard punt return for a touchdown against Fresno State as a freshman in 2015.
- Covey is one of just two players in the Pac-12 that have a punt return for a touchdown this season (Jaydon Grant, OSU), which is also tied for third in the FBS.
