ARIZONA NOTES & NUMBERS

» Arizona will face Colorado on the road on Saturday to get to the halfway point of the regular season.

» The Wildcats are 8-15 all-time against the Buffaloes and 5-6 all-time in Boulder. Arizona has found extensive recent success against Colorado, having won seven of nine matchups since 2012.

» Saturday's game will kick off at 12:30 p.m. MST (1:30 local time) on the Pac-12 Network. Ted Robinson and Yogi Roth will be on the call.

» Arizona allows an average of just 154 passing yards per game, which is second in the Pac-12 and fifth in the nation. Last time out against UCLA, the Bruins had just 82 passing yards on 8-for-19 passing for an average of 4.3 yards per attempt. UCLA had just three passing yards in the first half last weekend.

» Through five games, Stanley Berryhill III has a team-high 40 receptions for an average of eight per game, which is second in the Pac-12 and seventh in the nation. His 79.4 yards per game is the second-most in the Pac-12.

» Anthony Pandey had a career-high 13 tackles vs. UCLA and leads the team with 42 tackles this season. His 8.4 tackles per game is the fourth-most in the Pac-12.

» Arizona has converted 69% of the time on fourth downs this season, the second-best rate in the Pac-12.

» The Wildcats have held three of their first five opponents under 400 yards of offense. Across the 2019 and 2020 seasons, spanning 17 games, Arizona held their opponents under 400 yards just one time. In those three games, Arizona has outgained their opponent.

69% Arizona 9-13 on fourth down this season after converting two of their three attempts vs. UCLA. Arizona's **69%** conversion rate on fourth down is the second-best in the Pac-12.

34 Offensive lineman Donovan Laie has started the first **34** games of his career. Only eight other offensive linemen have started 30 or more consecutive games since Arizona began tracking game-by-game starters in 1993.

40 Stanley Berryhill III has **40** catches in the first five games of the season and is on pace for 96 catches, which would be a school record.

100 For the first time since 2008, the Wildcats have held their opponent to under **100** passing yards twice this season after UCLA had 82 last game.

154 Arizona allows just **154** passing yards per game, the second-fewest in the Pac-12 and the fifth-fewest in the nation.

WRAPPING UP SATURDAY: Anthony Pandey and Jaxen Turner set career highs in total tackles with 13 and 10, respectively ... Boobie Curry set a career high with six catches on six targets ... Arizona opened the scoring with a 28-yard field goal from freshman Tyler Loop in the 1st quarter. It marked the first time the Wildcats led a Pac-12 opponent since going up 13-0 on Colorado in 2020 ... Jamarye Joiner threw his first career touchdown pass to Michael Wiley at the end of the first half on a double pass ... The Wildcats allowed eight passing yards in the first half and 82 for the entire game, marking the first time Arizona has held an opponent under 100 yards passing since limiting Colorado to 92 in 2019. It was the fewest passing yards allowed since limiting The Citadel to 21 in 2010 ... Arizona converted on all three field goals with two from Lucas Havrisik and one from Tyler Loop ... Mo Diallo finished the game with half a sack and 1.5 TFLs ... Kenny Hebert forced his first fumble as a Wildcat and Treshaun Hayward recovered his first fumble as a Wildcat ... Treydan Stukes broke up a pass in the back of the endzone in the fourth quarter, giving him a team-high three PBUs this season ... Jordan McCloud was very effective before leaving the game due to injury as he was 21-for-30 for 182 yards and a 121 QB rating.

VERSUS COLORADO: Arizona is 8-15 all-time vs. Colorado, but is 7-3 since the Buffs joined the Pac-12 ... The Wildcats have won the last four contests vs. Colorado in Boulder ... Arizona has won three of the last four overall games vs. the Buffaloes ... Last season, Colorado beat Arizona 24-13 in Tucson ... Arizona took a 13-0 lead in the first half but surrendered 24-straight points ... Michael Wiley and Gary Brightwell each ran for over 100 yards, with Wiley leading the way with 126 yards on just nine carries ... Will Plummer started the game at QB and passed for 154 yards ... BJ Casteel had three catches for 71 yards, including a 42-yard reception ... Anthony Pandey had a terrific game on the defensive side of the ball as he had eight tackles, half for a loss and picked off two passes ... Isaiah Mays also chipped in seven tackles, one for a loss and forced a fumble.

ON PACE FOR GREATNESS: Nearly halfway into the regular season, Berryhill is on pace to catch 96 passes for 953 yards, which would surpass his total receptions and yards from his first three seasons at Arizona combined (56 catches for 733 yards). Should Berryhill stay on this pace, which isn't out of the realm of possibility considering he averages over 12 targets per game, he would challenge Bobby Wade's single-season reception record of 93 catches.

MR. YAC: Stanley Berryhill III has been outstanding for the Wildcats through five games thus far. A team-captain and one of the recipients of the No. 1 jersey, Berryhill leads Arizona with 40 receptions and 397 yards, both career highs for one season. Where the Tucson native does his most damage is after the ball is in his hands, hence the name Mr. YAC. Through five games, 232 of Berryhill's 397 yards have been after the catch and also has two games with at least 70 YAC.

THE PANDY MAN CAN: Senior linebacker Anthony Pandey is back for his fifth year as a Wildcat and has a large leadership role under first year head coach Jedd Fisch as he was named a team captain. Pandey leads the Arizona defense in tackles with 42 and is fourth in the Pac-12 with an average of 8.4 per game. Pandey had a career-high 13 tackles vs. UCLA, his second double-digit tackling performance of the season and third of his career. His 13 tackles was the most of any Pac-12 player this past week.

HEY TRE: Linebacker Treshaun Hayward comes to Arizona with already boasting a very successful career. The 2019 MAC Defensive Player of the Year played 39 games for Western Michigan and totaled 229 tackles, 16 TFLs and 5.5 sacks. Hayward was flat out dominant in 2019 as he was named an All-American by Sporting News and Phil Steele. The Ypsilanti, Mich. native finished the season with a conference-high 142 tackles and added in 10.5 TFLs. His 142 tackles was the third-most in the country and was one of five players to post 130+ tackles and 10+ TFLs. Through five games at Arizona, Hayward has the second-most tackles on the team with 34 and is also second on the team with 2.5 TFLs. He recovered his first fumble as a Wildcat in the third quarter of the UCLA game and is 10th in the Pac-12 with 6.8 tackles per game.

CONVERTING UNDER PRESSURE: After converting two of their three fourth-down attempts vs. UCLA, the Wildcats are now 9-13 (69%) on fourth down this season, the second-best conversion rate in the Pac-12. Additionally, Arizona's nine fourth-down conversions are the most in the Pac-12 and the 10th-most in the nation. Arizona has gone for it on fourth down at least once in every game this season and have converted at least twice in three different instances.

NO FLY ZONE: Arizona has been exceptional defending the pass this season as they allow just 154 yards through the air per game, the second-fewest in the Pac-12 and the fifth-fewest in the nation. Against UCLA, the Bruins had just 82 passing yards for the game and threw for just three yards in the first half. 82 passing yards allowed is the fewest Arizona has allowed since limiting The Citadel to 21 in 2010 and it is the first

time the Wildcats held an FBS opponent to under 100 yards passing since Colorado had 92 in 2020. Additionally, Arizona has held their opponent to under 100 passing yards twice this season, making it the first time since 2008 that the Wildcats have done so.

WINNING THE YARDAGE BATTLE: Despite Arizona being 0-5 on the season, the Wildcat have outgained their opponents three times and have held those three opponents to under 400 yards in each of those games. How does that compare? Arizona had outgained their opponent three times in the previous 14 games entering the 2021 season. Against NAU in week two, Arizona held the Lumberjacks to 240 yards, the fewest since 2018 when Oregon State only had 238 yards in week four.

DO THE SAFETY DANCE: With a sack by Mo Diallo in the third quarter, Arizona became the first defense in the country with two safeties on the season. The previous safety came in the season opener against BYU as Rashie Hodge Jr. and Trevon Mason combined to bring down the BYU running back. Arizona had a two-safety season back in 2019, but prior to this year, Arizona defenses have forced only six safeties in the previous 15 seasons combined.

APPLYING PRESSURE: Through five games, Arizona has 27 tackles for a loss for an average of 5.4 per game, which is fifth in the Pac-12. Kyon Barrs, who leads the way for Arizona with four tackles for a loss and 2.5 sacks, is one of 15 players on the defensive side of the ball to be involved in a tackle for a loss.

KICKIN' KYLE: Sophomore punter Kyle Ostendorp has been terrific to begin the 2021 campaign. He opened the season vs. BYU with a trio of punts downed inside the 20, one of which pinned the Cougars at, their own 1-yard line, which eventually resulted in a safety. Against San Diego State in week two, he had an average of 52 yards per punt on 10 kicks, including a career-high 71-yard punt, which is the longest punt by an Arizona punter since Keenyn Crier's 84-yard punt back in 2007. Through five games, Ostendorp averages 46.1 yards per punt on 28 kicks. He has 10 punts of 50 yards or more and has downed seven inside the 20. His 10 50+ yard punts is the second-most in the Pac-12.

WOLMA NAMED CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALIST: Senior tight end Bryce Wolma was named a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy on Wednesday morning, as announced by the National Football Foundation. The Campbell Trophy recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation for his combined academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership. Wolma, who graduated in the spring of 2021 with a degree in business management, finished undergrad with a GPA of 3.49 and has been studying Entrepreneurship as his postgrad study. The Saline, Mich. native caught his first touchdown pass of the season last week at Oregon on an 11-yard pass from Jordan McCloud. Wolma has five catches for 36 yards this season and has 47 catches for 412 yards and four touchdowns for his career.

I AM #1: At the beginning of camp, Jedd Fisch announced he would be holding a competition for who gets to wear the No. 1 jersey for the season. The Monday of week 1, it was announced that team captains and Arizona natives Stanley Berryhill III and Jalen Harris would each don the No. 1 jersey. Berryhill III is Arizona's leading returning wide receiver while Harris registered 18 tackles and 2.5 for a loss last season.

MCCAULEY NAMED TO RIMINGTON TROPHY WATCH LIST: For the third time in his career, senior Josh McCauley was named to Rimington Trophy Watchlist, which recognizes the top center in the country. The former walk-on has started all 27 games he has played in in the last three seasons and has anchored the Wildcats offensive line from the center position. Last season, he helped pave the way for big rushing games by Wildcat backs that included 268 yards vs. Colorado and 158 yards vs. USC. The Mesa, Ariz. native helped the Wildcats average 174 yards on the ground in 2019 and started all 12 games at center in 2018 when Arizona had the Pac-12's top rushing unit (202.4 ypg). Additionally, he was a key piece of the 2018 line that allowed the third-fewest sacks in the Pac-12.

STATE 48: The Wildcats roster features 34 players that call the state of Arizona home, including five players who stayed home in Tucson to continue their football careers. Arizona's 34 in-state players make up over 29% of the total roster. Among the notable Arizona natives are freshman safety Jaydin Young, sophomore running back Drake Anderson, redshirt freshman quarterback Gunner Cruz, redshirt sophomore wide receiver Jamarye Joiner, freshman quarterback Will Plummer, freshman running back Stevie Rocker Jr., junior linebacker Rashie Hodge Jr., redshirt junior defensive lineman Jalen Harris, redshirt senior offensive lineman Josh McCauley and sophomore offensive lineman Jordan Morgan.

WILDCATS IN THE NFL: As of week two, the Wildcats are once again well represented in the National Football League with nine former letterwinners active across the league. One of Arizona's most prestigious alums, tight end Rob Gronkowski, returned from retirement in 2020 to rejoin his longtime quarterback Tom Brady with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Over 10 seasons in New England and Tampa Bay, Gronkowski has hauled in 8,668 yards and 90 touchdowns. Quarterback Nick Foles is in his 10th NFL season after rewriting the Wildcats record books during his time in Tucson. The most recent Wildcats to make the transition to the NFL are running back Gary Brightwell (New York Giants) and defensive end Roy Lopez (Houston Texans). RECAP

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — Jarek Broussard ran for a career-high 301 yards, Ashaad Clayton ran for two touchdowns and the Colorado Buffaloes stayed undefeated with a 24-13 win over Arizona on Saturday night.

Broussard has run for at least 100 yards in all four games this season and broke loose with long runs on two separate drives in the second quarter that set up touchdowns. The 5-foot-9, 185-pound sophomore repeatedly sliced through the middle of Arizona's defense without much resistance — reeling off runs of 75, 72 and 59 yards — and the Buffaloes piled up 407 yards on the ground.

Colorado (4-0, 3-0 Pac-12) is one of just two remaining undefeated teams in the Pac-12, along with USC. Arizona (0-4, 0-4) has lost 11 straight games dating back to last season.

Arizona freshman quarterback Will Plummer made his first career start, filling in for the injured Grant Gunnell. He had some good moments, finishing 19 of 32 passing for 154 yards, but threw a costly interception at the 1-yard line on a drive that could have tied the game in the third quarter.

The Wildcats stayed in the game thanks to a stellar ground game. Michael Wiley ran for 126 yards and Gary Brightwell added 113. Arizona had a chance to tie the game in the fourth quarter but Colorado made a goal-line stand with six minutes left that kept the Wildcats out of the end zone.

Colorado rallied for a 14-13 halftime lead after falling into a 13-0 hole by early in the second quarter.

The Buffaloes started their comeback with a 95-yard touchdown drive that needed just four plays. Broussard ran up the middle for a 75-yard run on the first play and Ashaad Clayton ran for the 1-yard touchdown to pull the Buffaloes within a 13-7 margin.

The next touchdown drive was similar with Broussard's 59-yard run setting up Clayton's second touchdown run, this one from 4 yards out.

The big ground gains wiped out Arizona's promising start. The Wildcats jumped out to a 10-0 lead after running for 106 yards in the first quarter. Brightwell scored on a 26-yard run up the middle and Lucas Havrisik added a 38-yard field goal.

Arizona has struggled all season to stop the run, giving up about 230 yards per game going into Saturday.

BIG DEFENSIVE PLAYS

Arizona secured its first defensive takeaway of the season when safety Isaiah Mays forced a fumble by Colorado's La'Vontae Shenault. The play led to Havrisik's second field goal and pushed Arizona's advantage to 13-0.

The Wildcats got their second and third takeaways in the second half when linebacker Anthony Pandey intercepted Colorado's Sam Noyer twice.

THE TAKEAWAY

Colorado: It's another solid win for the Buffaloes, who found lots of success on the ground and decided to stick with what works. Broussard is an emerging star after four straight 100-yard games.

Arizona: The frustration continues for the Wildcats, who couldn't hold on to the early lead. Their rush defense is a real problem right now and shows no signs of improvement.

Veteran NFL and college coach Jedd Fisch was hired as the head coach of Arizona Football on Dec. 23, 2020. Fisch comes to Arizona after eight years of coaching at the collegiate level, including stints in the ACC, Big Ten and Pac-12 and 13 years in the NFL, most recently with the New England Patriots.

The 44-year-old Fisch has been a part of championship seasons throughout his career, including with the Los Angeles Rams as a member of head coach Sean McVay's staff as the Rams won the NFC championship and appeared in Super Bowl LIII. Fisch's coaching pedigree also includes working under future NFL Hall of Famers Bill Belichick and Pete Carroll, as well as college football Hall of Fame member Steve Spurrier and Michigan's Jim Harbaugh.

Fisch has served on coaching staffs that reached five bowl games, highlighted by the 2016 Orange Bowl when he served as Michigan's passing game coordinator. His college coaching career began as a graduate assistant at Florida under Spurrier as the Gators advanced to the 2000 Citrus Bowl and the 2001 Sugar Bowl and won a SEC championship.

A widely-respected offensive mind, Fisch has helped guide top offenses in the NFL with three of his offenses finishing in the Top 10 in total offense, including the top-ranked offense with the Denver Broncos and the second-ranked offense with the Rams. While offensive coordinator at UCLA in 2017, Fisch guided the Bruins' offense to a top-three ranking in the Pac-12 before leading the Bruins in their final regular season game and to the Cactus Bowl as the interim head coach.

Fisch arrives in Tucson after spending the 2020 season as the quarterbacks coach for the New England Patriots. Prior to his position with the Patriots, Fisch spent two seasons as a member of McVay's offensive staff with the Rams as they posted the top offense in the NFL in 2018 with quarterback Jared Goff making back-to-back Pro Bowls.

Fisch's offense at Michigan produced the Big Ten's top scoring and red zone offenses, as tight end Jake Butt won the Mackey Award and consensus All-America honors in 2016. Butt was one of 10 offensive players for Michigan to receive All-Big Ten honors that season. Fisch's impact was instant on the Wolverine offense as Jake Rudock became only the second quarterback in school history at the time to throw for more than 3,000 yards in a season.

In his second and third seasons as a college coach, the University of Miami's offense flourished under Fisch's quarterback tutelage. Stephen Morris set a single-season record for total offense with 3,415 yards in 2012 after Jacory Harris set a single-season Miami record with an efficient 65.0% completion for the season. Fisch first coached in a full-time capacity in

college with the Minnesota Golden Gophers, serving as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks' coach in 2009.

Fisch broke into the NFL coaching ranks with the Houston Texans in 2001, serving as an assistant to head coach Dom Capers. He would go on to join the coaching staffs with the Broncos, Baltimore Ravens, Seattle Seahawks and Jacksonville Jaguars working for head coaches Mike Shanahan, Brian Billick, Pete Carroll and Gus Bradley respectively.

Fisch is a native of Livingston, N.J. and graduated from the University of Florida with a degree in Criminology in 1998. He earned his Master's degree from the University of Florida.

Fisch and his wife, Amber, have three daughters: Zaylee, Ashlee and Kendall.

RECAP

LAS VEGAS (AP) — Quarterback Jaren Hall accumulated 243 total yards and two touchdowns as BYU defeated Arizona 24-16 at Allegiant Stadium on Saturday night in the season opener for both teams.

Hall, the redshirt sophomore from Spanish Fork, Utah, made his third career start and first in the post-Zach Wilson era. Hall went 18-of-28 passing for 198 yards with two touchdowns for the Cougars, who won have won 12 of their last 13 games.

Hall also added one catch for nine yards and 36 yards on the ground, including a 39-yard dash down the left sideline that set up his second touchdown pass.

BYU's Neil Pau'u caught eight passes for 126 yards and both of Hall's touchdown passes.

Arizona, which played its first nonconference game in 721 days, lost its 13th consecutive game dating to 2019. It was also the debut for Wildcats coach Jedd Fisch, the former quarterbacks coach for the New England Patriots. Fisch replaced Kevin Sumlin, who went 0-5 in 2020.

Gunner Cruz was 34-for-45 passing for 336 yards with a touchdown and an interception as the Arizona starter. Cruz split time with Will Plummer, who amassed only nine yards passing on three attempts before Cruz finished the game.

THE TAKEAWAY

BYU: Even as the designated road team, the BYU contingent traveled well to Allegiant Stadium. The Cougars benefited greatly from a heavy blue-clad crowd after a slow start in the first quarter, when they had just 69 yards of offense.

Arizona: Despite going 2 for 2 on fourth down in the first half, the Wildcats only mustered three points. Lucas Havrisik missed two of three field goals, a 31-yard attempt in the second quarter and a 44-yarder in the third.

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — Senior Jordan Brookshire threw for two touchdowns and ran for another, Greg Bell broke a 55-yard scoring run on the fourth play from scrimmage and San Diego State beat Arizona 38-14 on Saturday night to extend the Wildcats' losing streak to 14 games.

Brookshire, who won the starting job late in fall camp, completed 9 of 11 passes for two scores in the first half as the Aztecs took a 35-7 lead.

Brookshire finished 10 of 14 for 183 yards and Bell had 125 yards rushing in 17 carries as the Aztecs opened 2-0 for the third straight season.

San Diego State had 454 total yards, 271 rushing.

Bell's 55-yard touchdown burst over the right side was an early indicator.

After Arizona (0-2) went three-and-out, Brookshire completed a 73-yard pass to Daniel Bellinger to set up a 3-yard scoring run. Bellinger had three catches for 113 yards.

San Diego State's Tyrell Shavers returned a blocked punt 27 yards for a score after Arizona's second three-and-out, and it was 21-0 less than eight minutes into the game.

Arizona's Gunner Cruz, who threw for 336 yards in a season-opening 24-16 loss to BYU last week, was 10 of 19 for 70 yards with a 43-yard scoring pass to Stanley Berryhill III and an interception.

Will Plummer was 8 of 17 for 109 yards and a 7-yard touchdown pass to Tavvian Cunningham after replacing Cruz late in the third quarter.

THE TAKEAWAY

San Diego State: With quarterback play like this, the Aztecs will contend in the Mountain West West. The Aztecs play good defense in their 3-3-5 scheme and with Bell can run the ball; the emergence of Brookshire could give them an arm to compete with the likes of Nevada's Carson Strong, Fresno State's Jake Haener and San Jose State's Nick Starkel.

Arizona: the Wildcats took a step backward after showing well in a 24-16 loss to BYU in Las Vegas last weekend, giving up chunk plays of the sort that hurt them in 2020, when they allowed 473 yards a game, ranking 116th of the 128 FBS teams.

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — RJ Martinez threw a 9-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter and Northern Arizona stopped a late 2-point conversion attempt, extending Arizona's school-record losing streak to 15 games with a 21-19 victory Saturday night.

The Lumberjacks (1-2) didn't play like a winless FCS program, coming to life offensively in the second half after struggling in the first. Kevin Daniels scored on a 12-yard TD run in the third quarter and Martinez found Hendrix Johnson in the back of the end zone for a 9-yard score.

Arizona still had one last chance.

Trailing 21-13, the Wildcats (0-3) marched quickly down the field and Jordan McCloud hit Boobie Curry on a 3-yard touchdown pass with 2:16 left. After multiple stops starts, the Lumberjacks pressured McCloud into an incomplete pass on the 2-point conversion.

Northern Arizona fair caught a pooch kick and wound down the clock, picking up one of the biggest wins in program history while ending a losing streak to Arizona that dated to 1932.

Arizona hired coach Jedd Fisch in hopes of ending a losing streak that stretched back to October 2019. The former NFL and college assistant did all the right things off the field, generating a buzz around the program.

Not much has changed on the field so far.

The Wildcats took away some positives after rallying late in a 24-16 loss to No. 23 BYU, but little went right in last week's 38-14 loss to San Diego State.

Arizona's defense was sharp against NAU after giving up 454 yards last week, creating three turnovers and holding the Lumberjacks to 87 first-half yards.

The offense couldn't get out of its own way.

Arizona's offensive line struggled with the Lumberjacks' quickness early and the Wildcats were held to a pair of field goals after starting deep in NAU's end.

Will Plummer found Curry on a 49-yard TD pass, but also threw an interception that Shough returned 28 yards for a touchdown just before halftime, pulling NAU within 13-7.

Arizona's defense then started to bend in the third quarter.

The Wildcats had two players get ejected for targeting and the Lumberjacks picked their way down the field, taking a 14-13 lead on Daniels' TD run.

An interception by Devontae Ingram set NAU up near midfield and the Lumberjacks took advantage of poor Arizona tackling on two long third downs to keep the drive going. Martinez put NAU up 21-13 with his TD pass to Johnson.

McCloud replaced Plummer — who finished 19-of-34 passing for 191 yards with two interceptions — for Arizona's final offensive possession going 6 of 7 for 66 yards

THE TAKEAWAY

Northern Arizona sputtered offensively most of the night, but moved the ball when it needed to and shut down Arizona to pick up one of the biggest wins in program history.

Arizona suffered one of its worst losses ever, plagued by poor tackling and an ineffective offense.

EUGENE, Ore. (AP) — Anthony Brown threw for 206 yards and three touchdowns, and No. 3 Oregon handed Arizona its 16th straight loss with a 41-19 victory on Saturday night.

Oregon (4-0, 1-0 Pac-12) extended its winning streak at Autzen Stadium to 15 games. The Ducks are the lone undefeated team left in the Pac-12.

Despite being winless this season, the Wildcats (0-4, 0-1) closed to within 24-19 late in the third quarter on Drake Anderson's 1-yard touchdown run.

Oregon extended its lead with Camden Lewis' 43-yard field goal early in the fourth quarter, then added Brown's 18-yard scoring pass to Spencer Webb to make it 34-19 with 8:26 left.

The Ducks put it away on Bennett Williams' 68-yard interception return for a touchdown on Arizona's ensuing series.

The Ducks got off to a quick start, with Brown's pass to Jaylon Redd for a 63-yard touchdown just more than a minute into the game. Then Oregon intercepted Arizona starter Jordan McCloud on the Wildcats' first series.

Arizona's depth chart this week included all three quarterbacks as possible starters.: Will Plummer, Gunner Cruz and McCloud.

Plummer started last weekend's loss to Northern Arizona, throwing for 191 yards and a touchdown. McCloud was inserted in the fourth quarter, throwing for 66 yards and a score.

It was clear from pre-game warmups that Plummer was nursing an injury. McCloud started and threw for 233 yards and a touchdown, but was intercepted five times.

Lewis gave the Ducks a 10-0 lead with a 21-yard field goal, and Arizona answered with McCloud's 11-yard scoring pass to tight end Bryce Wolma.

CJ Verdell scored on an 11-yard run for the Ducks before the opening quarter was over. Brown's 9-yard scoring pass to Terrance Ferguson gave the Ducks a 24-7 lead.

Lucas Havrisik's 28-yard field goal made it 24-10 with 4:24 left in the half.

Mo Diallo's safety and Anderson's touchdown run narrowed the margin in the third quarter.

Oregon was favored by more than four touchdowns in the game, according to FanDuel Sportsbook. But Arizona had surprised the Ducks before: The Wildcats' last victory over a ranked opponent was in 2018, when they routed No. 19 Oregon 44-15. In 2014, Arizona beat No. 2 Oregon 31-24 in Eugene.

Arizona's losing streak is the longest currently in FBS.

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — Brittain Brown ran for 146 yards and a touchdown, Dorian Thompson-Robinson accounted for three touchdowns and UCLA extended Arizona's school-record losing streak to 17 games with a 34-16 victory Saturday night.

UCLA (4-2, 2-1 Pac-12) relied on its ground game early as Thompson-Robinson struggled to find the mark and Brown sealed the victory with a 48-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter.

Thompson-Robinson was limited to 82 yards passing, but ran for two scores and threw for another.

Arizona (0-5, 0-2) struggled in the red zone after moving the ball well against the Bruins and lost quarterback Jordan McCloud to a right knee injury in the fourth quarter.

The Wildcats scored one touchdown in six trips across midfield - three in the red zone - and McCloud was in tears as he was helped off the field after getting twisted up in a sack.

Coming off a 42-23 loss to Arizona State the Bruins went to the ground early against Arizona.

UCLA had 165 yards rushing by halftime and Thompson-Robinson had a hand in two touchdowns. He threw a 3-yard TD pass to Chris Dulcich in the first quarter and scored a 2-yard run in the second to put UCLA up 14-6.

Thompson-Robinson started to hit a few passes in the second half, setting up a 4-yard keeper that put UCLA up 24-16. Brown put the game out of reach by bursting up the middle for his 48-yard score.

The Wildcats have shown signs that their losing streak might come to an end soon and were coming off a bye week.

They had the Bruins on their heels early with their up-tempo offense, marching down the field throughout the first half.

Finishing drives continued to be a problem.

The Wildcats, 124th nationally in red-zone efficiency, had to settle for two field goals after reaching UCLA's 9- and 20-yard lines. A third drive ended at UCLA's 28 on a failed fourth-and-1.

A trick play finally got the Wildcats into the end zone. McCloud threw a back pass to Jamarye Joiner, who then hit Michael Wiley for a 10-yard TD to pull Arizona within 14-13 at halftime.

Arizona reached UCLA's 15 on its opening second-half drive, only to settle for another field goal, thanks to a penalty for blocking below the waist.

Then McCloud went down and so did the Wildcats' chances.

THE TAKEAWAY

UCLA racked up 337 yards rushing and buckled down on the Wildcats defensively in its own end of the field to avoid losing to a team that hasn't won since 2019.

Arizona's red-zone woes continued to take toll. A bigger concern could be McCloud's knee.
