Opening Statement - "Feels good to get a win. I definitely feel good about what our team did today. It was a good performance - I felt we had a really good mindset going into this game about how important it was for us to show the improvement that we've been working on the last couple of weeks on our bye. It was good to see that it paid off in a convincing fashion."

"I feel good about Brendon [Lewis]' progress today and I felt good about what he was doing the last couple of weeks and I felt it was just a matter of time before he was going to start to feel very confident in what he can do. We had some receivers that made some terrific plays, but he made some terrific throws. We really felt good about that progress that we worked on with getting him more foundationally set and doing some really really good things for us offensively."

"This is a really good win for us as a program because all three areas [defense, offense, and special teams] scored touchdowns. The special teams touchdown was huge on a blocked punt. A young freshman [Trevor Woods] made a big play - it was great to see that. It kind of gave us a chance to create some opportunities on the defensive side - Carson Wells did a tremendous job of stepping in front of a pass and going for another score. It's good to see that and then offensively in the second half, when we started hitting two or three more of those big plays down the field, you could tell that the shell was broken and finally getting ready to open up and we were going to do some very positive things."

"I like how we finished the game. That's a big thing. I think that's more important to me than to probably anybody in this room. We haven't been a great finishing program for a while - and we are learning that process. That's why I'm excited about how we finished the game. Very good win - we needed it. A lot of hard work went into it and a lot of faithful young men stayed true to themselves and it was good to get some reward from all this stuff that they've been committed to. Very, very excited about them being able to get themselves this opportunity in this one."

On hitting the reset button during the bye week - "It was big because we've played well in spurts and we were playing well in certain areas especially defensively early in the season. But we still weren't playing as well as we were capable of. I just think as we kept marching through the first half of the season it was very challenging - we had good programs we played against - but there were some things that we just weren't executing at a level that we should have. It was everything defense, offense, and special teams - Cole [Becker]'s first two kicks were missed - we were just not quite in rhythm. So we just went back to the square roots of playing the game - defenders have to get off blocks and make plays. That's everybody on defense. Offensively, we've got to protect and we knew that one of our issues was protection from our offensive

line. We just worked on some things that we felt were drastically strong issues that we needed to gain some ground on. We couldn't do everything but we did the things that were the most important. I think that was reflective today where Brendon [Lewis] had more time to throw and our defense did make a few plays on the football. In special teams, we've had chances in previous games of blocking the punt and then finally we blocked one today. So it does matter a lot that the things we work on show on the field and that we can be productive and execute - and that's what I saw today. So now, I think they'll have a better sense of why we do the things we do, because it results in some pretty fantastic things."

On if the punt return and pick six gave the offense some relief - "I think that's what our team felt. We needed someone to step up and it was great to see Trevor [Woods] do that. It gave everybody kind of a spark - It was a 6-0 game for almost three quarters - it was something where we needed a boost and I believe that does things to any team - particularly when we've lost four games in a row and we're trying to figure out our way of winning, you need someone to step up and make a play so everybody responds. It probably did give us all a little bit of a boost when that score happened and then Carson [Wells]'s score comes the next series and then Brendon [Lewis] starts to really get hold of doing some things aggressively. I wanted our offense to throw the football - particularly in the second half. He [Lewis] has made so much progress that I've seen these two weeks and I felt very confident that I wanted to get him in rhythm to make some plays. I think [CU offensive coordinator and WR coach] Darrin [Chiaverini] called some good plays for us to get some shots and it was good to see that our young receivers stepped up to the plate and made those plays too. There's definitely a great sense of accomplishment from all the stuff we've worked on and I feel we'll continue to grow in this fashion."

On the Offense Taking Ownership of Their Mistakes - "My approach with that was to tell Brendon that it's not all his fault which it wasn't. I was telling you guys in press conferences before that protection was bad. (With) things that we were doing where it looks like he's doing everything wrong, he wasn't. Sometimes the receivers weren't open. There were a number of things that we weren't doing effectively to help him do his job. When I pointed those things out in the team setting with everybody watching, they had a better understanding about, you know, "I gotta do my job better." If we're going to get this thing right it's not just on Brandon Lewis. It's on the offensive line doing what they're supposed to do. The tight ends and receivers have got to make plays when they get a chance to make plays. They took ownership. That's really what happened. They took ownership over the (bye week). They weren't pointing fingers. It was more like 'I got to do that better'. I think once a team realizes that they can do it better, which collectively makes everything happen, that's where we're at right now. They see the results of everybody taking ownership of it."



Colorado Head Coach Karl Dorrell **(Cont.)**

On Young Players Getting Through Growing Pains - "It's being so repetitive in terms of my job. It is being true to the foundation of how you grow and learn this game and excel at this game. You go through the teaching elements of it, you go through the fundamental discipline of it, then you go through the execution of it. Usually in those first two areas, they struggle because first of all, they're not doing it well. It's easy for them to be down on themselves. If you stay true to it, and they see that light at the end of the tunnel, so to speak, that 'I'm getting better at it,' all of a sudden that light at the end of the tunnel is a little bit brighter. Then you get plays that are being made that are a little bit easier because the light bulb came on. That's what this team went through these first three or four weeks. We weren't quite hitting on all cylinders. That bye week helped us reorganize ourselves and to sort through it about everybody being responsible for it. That's where I think that light bulb came on."

On Young Players Believing in the Program - "It's instrumental. When you have nothing to show for it as to why it hasn't worked, it takes a lot of faith and hope. A lot of repetitive discussions I'm making, and the coaches are making, about telling them we're this close. They're going to tell you 'We're a good football team.' They know we're a good football team. We just haven't put it all together. Hopefully, this is a great example for them to realize 'Wow, when we have this type of mindset we can achieve the goals and aspirations we set for ourselves, which is winning ball games.' It's a great testimony to these young men that they accepted the challenge. We needed to get this win. We needed to start the second half of our season, knowing that they're all Pac 12 games. Every (game) matters. They're going to keep mounting up as we go. They're in a good place right now, in terms of understanding what we need to do."

On the Play of Quarterback Brendon Lewis - "I think his body of work today was pretty good. He still held onto the ball a couple times today. I'll remind him when I get into meetings with him that there were a couple times he flushed out (of the pocket). He always takes care of the football though. He always throws it out (of bounds). I'm trying to make him more efficient with his legs. If there's something that's not there, get me something with your legs, get down and we'll go to the next play. That's what I want him to improve on instead of trying to extend plays when he knows there's nothing there and he ends up throwing it away. He still does a great job of protecting the football. He's very excited about the things that have happened today, no question, but there's always a handful of things that we're still going to try to shore up as he moves forward. The big thing about it is the fact that he made a huge step in progress. He should be rewarded for the hard work he's put in these two weeks that showed today. There's no question in my mind he's going to be all in about continuing to stay on that path of playing really good football. That's going to help

everybody because everybody's going to be energized by (his play). We're in a good spot right now about building off this win and moving forward as we go through the season."

On Building Off Today's Win - "It's a great way to build off of anything. When you win like today, it's a pretty decisive win. There should be a level of confidence that they feel that they can play even better and do things even more successfully. What I like most as the head (coach) of the program is that all three phases did some great things that showed their ability to really dominate and have some dominating performances. There's a lot to build off this game but we're nowhere close to where we can be. They'll tell you that. You've got four gentlemen behind you (Brendon Lewis, Brenden Rice, Carson Wells, Nate Landman) that are going to tell you they made mistakes throughout this game that no one knows about. They know that if we really tighten the screws with our preparation and how we do things and move forward with having the same type of productivity, we have some opportunities to be special this year. This was a great win to build off of. It's great to go back into the film room off of this one and fix the things that we continue to need to fix. They're starting to understand that the standard of performance that needs to be done in practice (is a standard) that gives you a chance to have that level of play on Saturdays."



Arizona Head Coach Jedd Fisch

OPENING STATEMENT- “Okay, very tough game for us today need to play better need to coach better really need to improve in every single area. We need to really go back halftime of the season, great opportunity, as I said, to our team. When you're at halftime, I've never been a part of the game played, coach, whatever it might be that at halftime, you don't see the score 0-0. And that's our mentality that we've got halftime, the first half didn't go the way we wanted, and now we got the second half to go out and have a great second half of the season, or the best second half of the season we can have. The game didn't go the way we thought. First half of the game kind of did, it was six nothing we had the ball first and goal on less than one yard line. We had four plays within the two, didn't get in the end zone and that was ve”ry, very critical to, to our game to our half. Ended up being about two and a half minutes left, stopped them and wound up coming into halftime six nothing game, and then had a block punt for a touchdown had an interception where we lost Gunner, Gunners thumb, not a good situation, it doesn't sound like. So, would not expect much. I don't think we can get Gunner back this year. So, seems like that will be an injury that will require some more work, we'll know for sure tomorrow but it's not one that he'll be able to play this season or at least I don't think so at this point. That being the case, Will's gonna our guy, we're gonna ride with Will. Will is our quarterback and he did a nice job in the second half. Unfortunately, you know we into the red area a couple of times, didn't score, so that'll be the story and that'll be the situation and we've got to get better at that and it comes down to everything. And we'll evaluate everything. We got a short week, play on Friday, excited about the opportunity to be back at home, excited about playing Washington and going out there and playing our best game. And I will continue to challenge our team to do that, we'll coach our best game and we'll play our best game.”

ON DECIDING WHETHER TO GO FOR FIELD GOAL ON FOURTH DOWN- “Yeah no I didn't think it at that point in time, I had felt very good about our short yardage throughout the season. I felt we were in a situation. Our defense has been very good in terms of being able to knock guys back. I thought we already had one possession where we were inside the two and we stopped them and they punted about a 68 yard punt but I was going to, you know, give our chances and I believe in the analytics on that one and then if it's a fourth and one or a fourth and two inside the two or fourth and three inside the three, you're better off going for it and taking the field position and then I said that our defense out there if we don't get it. But I had full, full trust in our team getting that. We were within a yard.”

ON WHEN GUNNER GOT HURT- “It was on the interception for a touchdown. It was when he went to throw it to the tight end he hit a helmet. As he was throwing the ball kind of fluttered got intercepted and he tore a ligament I believe we'll see.”

ON GUNNER'S PERFORMANCE BEFORE HE HAD TO LEAVE - “Yeah, I think that we're in the middle of growing pains playing with young quarterbacks that have not had a lot of playing

experience. And I think that's, unfortunately, where we are at. But I also believe it's fortunate for where we can go. So you give guys opportunities to grow and develop, and you see how they can get there. You know there were some plays I think he started out, you know, hitting a bunch of yard balls behind the line of scrimmage at the line of scrimmage. We had some opportunities to hit some bigger plays we didn't hit them. But, you know he's got to learn from that, Will's gonna have to learn from that. And that's where we're at as a team.”

ON LOCKER ROOM SPIRIT- “You know the guys were good in terms of, there's no bickering, everybody's rooting for one another. Everybody wants to win and I challenged the team to go out there and find a way to get better. And what else can you do, you know why else do you play the sport and why else do you participate in a team sport like this other than to go find a way to keep competing and keep competing and keep competing. And it's hard right now. But you know what it is what it is in terms of what's gone on in the past and all we can control is what goes on on Friday night. And our job on Friday night to go out against Washington is to play our best game of football, and to do everything we humanly possibly can to move the football and get a victory.”

ON PUNT RETURN TEAM ISSUES- “There have been three different issues. One of which was a complete mental mistake against San Diego State where pointed one way went the opposite way, caused a guy to run screaming free in the b gap. UCLA overloaded aside, we had to make an adjustment after we saw a new overload, that's what caused that one. And this one it looked like they took Pandy and kind of just pushed him back into the pot, but I didn't see exactly what caused it or exactly how that, you know bull rush, what happened there.”

ON QUARTERBACK SITUATION MOVING FORWARD- “Yeah I think we're gonna have to really research how we're gonna dig deep into what we can do with our team in terms of the second quarterback. We have Luke Ashworth we travel with, who takes none of the reps, and really hasn't taken many at all. We have Jumari, who has played some quarterback and we have Will that you know we need to try to keep healthy. I mean I don't know I don't think I can remember, other than in Baltimore in 2007, where it was, you know you just lose quarterback and quarterback and have other injuries throughout. Just one of those situations that occurred. We're gonna to do our best to get Will ready to go and figure out how we can handle the backup.”

ON WILL PLUMMER'S OVERALL PERFORMANCE TAKING OVER FOR GUNNER- “I think he did fine. You know, I mean, I'd like to hit the deep ball to you know Tayvian, I'd like to hit the deep ball to Boobie. I'd like to, you know, hit Stanley on a dig route and all those things right, we'd all like to see that happen. But, you know in terms you're also jumping into a game, it's the fourth quarter, you're down a bunch of points, you kind of have some adrenaline and you overthrow something, you don't necessarily know exactly the speed and the tempo. But, he handled the plays well. I think we had one false start with him in. We had no delay games we didn't have any wasted timeouts, he was able to get it in and out of the huddle, those are all important.”

ON TRESHAUN HAYWARD NOT PLAYING- "Personal issues. He wasn't able to make the trip."

ON COMING BACK FROM TURNOVERS AND PENALITIES- "Very challenging, very challenging. I mean you give up two touchdowns, as you said on the other two phases which you're not accustomed to doing. You know, defensive offsides I think what happens is you get into a game now and it's 20-nothing, or whatever it might have been at the time. They get a little bit anxious, they jump. And that's the one thing you can't do, you know you can't fall asleep at corner when they jump. Now I didn't see exactly what happened other than the fact that they were up the sideline with a little bit of separation which normally doesn't happen on our go balls. And that's something we do all the time we practice, two or three days where we were always using quick cadences and different cadences and hard counts to try to get the defensive offsides. We throw it up there too. They did a good job executing on that, and we did not do a good job of defending it."

ON SEEING MORE OF JALEN JOHNSON THEN DRAKE ANDERSON- "I think Drake got a little dinged up, I didn't get the exact medical report but we had to pull him. I think it was somewhere early in the first quarter. I don't know exactly what his prognosis is. And when it came to Jalen, Jalen's another freshman that got in the game and really battled. I mean him and Stevie Rucker, you know you got two guys that have four years of football to play, and they're just battling. And they came in and I think Jalen saw Stevie have some success and he wanted some. And he ran extremely hard and did a really really good job and should have capped that off with a touchdown on that. I think what happened was they reviewed it or we would have just jumped the ball real quick and they were trying to figure out if it was a fumble or not a fumble so they held us over the ball on that one and went to a TV timeout and that was unfortunate. But I think he was running really hard, and you Jalen Johnson's gonna be a good running back for us in the future."

QUICKLY

► **Records.** Colorado now leads the series a **16-8** count (7-5 in Boulder, 9-3 in Tucson) ... The Buffaloes are now **20-9** in games on Family Weekend dating back to 1992 (**4-6** in the Pac-12, **1-2** vs. Arizona) ... CU has won five of six coin tosses this year, and dating back to 2016, **42** of the last **62** ... CU is now **31-24** following a bye since World War II (**5-6** since joining the Pac-12).

► **Forward Ho ... Not.** CU had seven tackles for loss in the first half, eclipsing its season high of six for a game (versus Northern Colorado); UA ran 29 first half plays, 14 for zero or minus yardage (four gains of 0, three incomplete passes). CU finished with a season-high 9 nine TFL's.

► **Back In Front.** When CU took a 3-0 lead with 8:26 left in the first quarter, it ended a run of trailing the opponent for **201:27** (and tied for **47:48**). It also was CU's first score on an opening drive in 2021 (opponents are 0-of-6).

► **Goal Line Stands.** CU recorded its second goal-to-go stop of the season when it held Arizona to four straight gains of 0 at its 1-yard line; the other came in the opener against Northern Colorado.

► **TD-Less Half.** This was the first CU game where neither team scored a touchdown in the first half since Oct. 20, 2007, when Kansas led 3-0 in Boulder en route to a 19-14 win),

► **Reversal.** Dating back to the fourth quarter of the Texas A&M game, the Buffaloes had been outgained, **1,975** to **818**; but today, CU outgained Arizona, 365-280.

► **Non-Offensive Scores.** CU had two non-offensive touchdowns in the same game for the first time since 2013 and for the seventh time this millennium. It was the first time touchdowns were scored by all three phases of the game since two occasions in 2004. A look at all seven instances:

► Firsts Since ...

S Trevor Woods blocked punt was CU's first since Alex Fontenot blocked punts at Cal (Nov. 24, 2018) and against Utah (Nov. 17, 2018), and his first blocked punt return for a TD since Lawrence Vickers recovered a punt in the end zone against Washington State in Seattle on Sept. 11, 2004.

OLB Carson Wells' interception return for a TD was the first since Dante Wigley returned one 27 yards for a score against Oregon State in Boulder on Oct. 27, 2018.

► **Shutout Roll Call.** CU shutout an opponent for the first time since a 48-0 blanking of Nicholls State on Sept. 26, 2015; and:

—It was CU's first shut out over an FBS opponent since a 34-0 win at Oklahoma State on Oct. 1, 2005 (the first in Boulder since three weeks earlier that year, 39-0 over New Mexico State on Sept. 10);

—It was the third time CU shutout an Arizona team (others: 14-0 in Boulder in 1955 and 18-0 at Tucson in 1959);

—It was only the second true shutout of a Pac-12 team as a conference member, with a 12-0 win at Washington State on Sept. 18, 1982 (Bill McCartney's first win); Arizona was not in the league in the 1950s and 13 shutouts over Utah all came prior to 1960;

—It was the first time an opponent had been shutout through three quarters since leading CSU 37-0 in Denver on Sept. 2, 2016;

—And it was the second time CU held an opponent scoreless in the first half this year (also UNC); the last FBS opponent not to score in the first half against the Buffs was Washington on Nov. 23, 2019 (CU led that, 13-0 at half en route to a 20-14 win).

**INDIVIDUAL LINER NOTES****OLB Carson Wells (4,0—4 TT, 4 TFL, 1 INT-TD)**

- He now has 31 career tackles for losses, moving him into a tie for 19th in the school history; one of those was a quarterback sack, the 12th of his career, now tied for 27th on CU's all-time list.
- The interception was the third of his career (other two were against UCLA's Dorian Thompson-Robinson).
- The first CU linebacker to return an interception for a TD since Rick Gamboa returned one against Oregon State in 2016 (20 yards; the longest since Kenneth Olugbode returned one 60 yards against Colorado State in 2015).

ILB Nate Landman (4,3—7 TT; 1 TFL, 1 3DS, 1 4DS)

- He is closing in on 400 tackles and the sixth to achieve that many in CU history; if these numbers hold up in coaches review, he will have 398 for his career (280 solo, 118 assists).
- He added to his all-time CU leading totals in third down stops (52) and fourth down stops(9).
- He is now alone in sixth with 40 career tackles for loss.

QB Brendon Lewis (19-12-0, 248, 2 TD, 207.5 rating)

- He threw for a career-highs of 248 yards and two touchdowns, and posted the best QB rating of his career as well.
- His rating of 207.5 was the best by a Buff QB since Steven Montez recorded a 246.8 figure in the 2018 season opener against Colorado State.

WR Brenden Rice (3-111, 1 TD receiving; 2-9 rushing; 3 FDE)

- He had the first 100-yard receiving game of his career (and CU's first this season).
- The 62-yard TD he scored receiving is the longest pass play for a TD since a 71-yard TD pass from Steven Montez to Laviska Shenault against USC in 2019.
- His three career TDs at Colorado have averaged **68.0** yards per (two TD receptions of 61 and 62 yards, one punt return of 81 yards).
