## CALIFORNIA GOLDEN BEARS

## CAL OPENS HOMESTAND WITH COLORADO

### ABOUT THE SERIES

- Cal leads the series, 6-4.
- The Golden Bears won the most recent matchup, 33-21, on Nov. 24, 2018, in Berkeley. Elijah Hicks (34 yards) and Ashtyn Davis (35 yards) returned interceptions for touchdowns on Colorado's first two possessions, as Cal built a 21-0 first-quarter lead.
- Cal is 4-0 vs. Colorado in Berkeley, with the other wins coming in 1968 (10-0), 2010 (52-7) and 2014 (59-56, 2OT).

### NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP WEEK

- Cal is celebrating its annual National Championship Week, honoring eight champions from the 2020-21 seasons.

### CLOSE LOSSES

- Four of the five games Cal has lost in 2021 have been by seven points or less including a 31-24 overtime defeat in its Pac-12 opener at Washington and a 24-17 loss at No. 9/10 Oregon.

### GARBERS PICKING UP THE PACE AT QUARTERBACK

- Through the first six games this season, Chase Garbers is putting up some of the best numbers of his career. To date, he is 132-of-214 for 1,492 yards with nine touchdown passes.
- Garbers leads the Pac-12 in per game total offense (283.3 ypg), while he is second in passing yards per game (248.7 ypg) and third in completions (132).
- Garbers' passing yards per game are a career best, well ahead of his 196.9 ypg as a 2019 sophomore.
- Two of Garbers' four career 300-yard passing games have come in 2021 at Washington (319) and TCU (309).
- With a 7-yard rush for Cal's final TD at Washington, Garbers tied the school record for most rushing touchdowns by a quarterback with nine (also Brian Bedford and Dave Penhall).
- Garbers has 929 yards rushing for his career and is now two yards shy of the school record for by a Cal quarterback (931, Joe Kapp). He has 211 yards and two touchdowns on the ground in 2021 on 54 carriers (all second on the team).

### OFFENSE PRODUCING BIG PLAYS

- Garbers has 38 plays of 15+ yards in 2021 (31 passes, 7 rushes).
- Kekoa Crawford leads the team by being on the receiving end of nine plays of 15 or more yards from the line of scrimmage, followed by Jeremiah Hunter (8) and Trevon Clark (7). All three wide are among the Pac-12 leaders in yards per reception with Clark second (20.4), Hunter fourth (17.6) and Crawford seventh (15.3). Overall, Cal has 45 plays (14 rush, 31 pass) from the line of scrimmage of 15+ yards over five games including a season-high 13 vs. Sacramento State (8 rush, 5 pass).

### TOP-10 TAKERS

- Three Cal players – Marqez Bimage, Elijah Hicks and Daniel Scott – rank in the top-10 nationally in takeaway categories. Bimage's two fumble recoveries and 0.33 per game are tied for third nationally. Hicks' three forced fumbles are tied for fifth while his 0.50 per game are tied for sixth. Scott's 0.50 interceptions per game are also tied for sixth while his three total picks are tied for seventh.

## NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP WEEK

— Cal is celebrating its annual National Championship Week this week, with a variety of events to recognize the Golden Bears' title winners from 2020-21. These include a reception with Chancellor Christ on Monday and recognition during Saturday's football game. New banners honoring the champions are displayed outside Haas Pavilion.

— Cal won five individual and three relay NCAA titles last year – Ryan Hoffer, men's swimming (50-yard free, 100-yard free, 100-yard fly); Maya Bordas, women's gymnastics (uneven bars); Camryn Rogers, women's track & field (hammer throw); women's swimming – 200-yard free relay; men's swimming – 200-yard free relay and 400-yard free relay.

— In its history, Cal has won 97 national team titles in 16 different sports and 324 individual titles (includes individuals, relays, rowing boats and doubles teams).

## BEARS GETTING MORE FROM MOORE

— Damien Moore leads the Golden Bears rushing attack with 59.8 yards per game, including an average of 4.9 yards per rush. He has scored at least one touchdown in four games this season with a total of six to date (1 run vs. Nevada, 2 rush at TCU, 2 rush vs. Sac State, 1 reception at Washington).

— Moore's five rushing TDs all came in the first three games and were the most in the first three games of a season for Cal since Shane Vereen posted six rushing TDs in the first three games of the 2010 campaign.

— Moore's 26-yard TD catch at Washington was his first career TD reception.

— Moore has nearly twice as many rushing yards as he had last year (360 vs. 194) and he did not score a rushing TD before this season.

## GOODE PLAYING MUCH BETTER THAN GOOD

— Cameron Goode has accumulated 16.5 tackles for loss and 10.0 quarterback sacks over his last 14 games.

— Goode had his 15th and 16th career sacks for a combined minus-27 yards at TCU. The 2.0 sacks tied a career high (also at UCLA in 2019). Goode added another tackle for loss, giving him 3.0 TFLs (-30 yards) for the game.

— Goode has 26 total tackles this season and tied for team honors with eight at Washington while his three quarterback hurries lead the team, 3.0 tackles for loss (-30 yards) are second and 2.0 sacks (-27 yards) third.

## 9 SUPER SENIORS

— Nine members of the Cal roster are "super seniors" – student-athletes who took advantage of an extra year of eligibility granted by the NCAA due to COVID-19. All were set to play their final collegiate seasons at Cal in the fall of 2020, but decided to return for one additional year.

— The group includes Trevon Clark, Kekoa Crawford, Valentino Daltoso, Marcel Dancy, Kuony Deng, Josh Drayden, Cameron Goode, Elijah Hicks and Luc Bequette.

— Crawford, Daltoso, Dancy, Deng, Drayden and Goode are all in their sixth season of eligibility.

— Bequette was at Cal for five seasons from 2016-19, played at Boston College in 2020, then returned to Cal for 2021. He is a seventh-year senior.

## LONG PLAYS PART OF CAL OFFENSE

— Cal had a combined seven completions of 30 yards or more in two games at TCU and vs. Sacramento State. The last time the Bears had that many in back-to-back games was in 2016 vs. Arizona State and Utah when Davis Webb was the Cal quarterback.

— Garbers' 68-yard pass to Trevon Clark at TCU was the longest career pass and catch for both players.

## MORE OFFENSIVE NUMBERS ON THE RISE

— Cal is producing some of its highest numbers over the past five seasons in four major offensive categories: scoring offense (23.0 ppg), total offense (406.8 ypg), rushing offense (157.2 ypg) and passing offense (248.7 ypg).

— The Bears' per-game rushing average is the team's highest since averaging 183.0 ypg on the ground in 2012.

— Cal's 4.9 yards per rush is its highest since also posting a 4.9 average in 2012.

## LONG FIRST-QUARTER DRIVES

— Through six games this season, Cal has shown a knack for long first-quarter drives, with at least one drive in every game going 63 yards or more in the opening period. The Bears had two each vs. Nevada, TCU and Sacramento State and one at Washington, vs. Washington State and at Oregon. Cal has produced eight TDs on the nine drives.

— Cal opened against Nevada by going 63 yards on 15 plays over 9:03, culminating with a 1-yard TD run by Damien Moore. The Bears followed with a seven-play, 72-yard drive over 4:08 and closed it out with a 2-yard TD pass from Chase Garbers to Nikko Remigio. The last time Cal scored touchdowns on its first two possessions came against Colorado in 2018.

— At TCU, the Bears drove 68 yards on their first possession only to be stopped on downs deep inside Horned Frog territory. But the next time they got the ball, they went 68 yards again, finishing with a 54-yard touchdown pass from Garbers to Trevon Clark.

— Against Sacramento State, Cal's first two drives went 85 and 69 yards, both ending in 4-yard TD runs by Damien Moore.

— Cal had a 13-play, 67-yard drive for a TD at Washington and a seven-play, 79-yard opening drive vs. WSU.

— The Bears drove 75 yards on 13 plays for a TD on their opening drive at Oregon.

— The Bears have scored 54 of their 138 points in the first quarter (39.1%).

## REMIGIO AMONG PAC-12 AND NATIONAL LEADERS IN RETURNS

— Nikko Remigio co-leads Pac-12 and is tied for 17th nationally with 318 combined kick return yards, while he is second in the Pac-12 and tied for 15th nationally with a 27.2 yard kickoff return average (10 kickoff returns, 272 yards) that includes a 99-yard return for a touchdown against Sacramento State that was the first of his career and Cal's longest since Trevor Davis had a 100-yarder at Washington State in 2014 (one of two for Davis in that game) and the first for a touchdown since Ashtyn Davis went 89 yards against Idaho State in 2018.

## WELCOME TO FTX FIELD AT CALIFORNIA MEMORIAL STADIUM

— On Aug. 23, Cal Athletics, Learfield's Cal Bears Sports Properties, and West Realm Shires Services Inc., owners and operators of FTX.US, a leading U.S.-regulated cryptocurrency exchange, announced the first-ever collegiate cryptocurrency naming rights sponsorship.

— As part of the \$17.5 million, 10-year deal, Learfield will accept the full payment in cryptocurrency on behalf of the university.

## 'UNCLE LUC' BEQUETTE ONE OF MOST EXPERIENCED PLAYER IN HISTORY

- Luc Bequette, now in his seventh collegiate season – five at Cal, one at Boston College last year, back to Cal for 2021 – continues to be a productive force along the defensive line. Through six games, he has 30 tackles, including 3.0 tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks.
- Over his career, he has played in 59 games (48 at Cal) and made 55 starts (44 at Cal). He is tied for second among active FBS players in career starts and only two behind Thomas Hennigan of Appalachian State (57) while his 59 career games played are tied for sixth and three behind tri-leaders James Skalski, Will Spiers and Will Swinney of Clemson (62). The totals are also believed to be the most ever in FBS history.
- Bequette, whose first season in Berkeley came in 2015 when many of his current teammates were in middle school, has 178 career tackles, 18.5 tackles for loss, 13.0 sacks and six forced fumbles (includes Cal and BC).

## MISCELLANEOUS NOTES

- Cal's defense has limited three of six opponents to under 100 yards rushing this season – Nevada (61), Sacramento State (59) and Washington (92)..
- Cal outscored Washington, 14-3, in the second half after entering the game having been outscored, 53-37, in second halves through the first three games of the year.
- Josh Drayden and Cameron Goode, Cal's only two sixth-year seniors who have been teammates all six years, have been roommates since their first year in Berkeley.
- Lu-Magia Hearn and Jeremiah Hunter both had their first career starts vs. Sacramento State, while Trey Paster made his first career start against Washington State.
- Miles Williams had his first career interception vs. Nevada.

## 12 BEARS MAKE CAL DEBUTS (7 VS. NEVADA, 4 AT TCU, 1 VS. WSU)

- Seven Golden Bears made their Cal debuts against Nevada: Marqez Bimage, Ricky Correia, Lu-Magia Hearn III, Jeremiah Hunter, Keleki Latu, Stanley McKenzie and Raymond Woodie III. Hearn and Latu were the only two true freshmen to play against the Wolf Pack, while Correia, Hunter and McKenzie did not see any game action last season. Bimage (Texas) and Woodie (Florida State) are transfers. Hunter caught a pair of passes for 35 yards, including a 28-yarder that was Cal's longest pass play, and McKenzie was in on two tackles.
- At TCU, four more players made their Golden Bear debuts in Matt Horwitz, Darius Long, Femi Oladejo and Jermaine Terry II. Horwitz is a fifth-year senior who saw his action on kickoff cover while Oladejo became the third and fourth true freshmen to play in 2021.
- Nate Rutchen became the fifth true freshman to see action in 2021 when he made his debut against Washington State and had an interception that he returned six yards.

## EXPERIENCED GROUP OF BEARS

- Five student-athletes have started 25 or more games at Cal: Luc Bequette (44), Valentino Daltoso (40), Elijah Hicks (40), Cameron Goode (32) and Chase Garbers (29).
- Cal has 10 players who made at least nine starts during the team's last full season in 2019 in Christopher Brooks, Matthew Cindric, Valentino Daltoso, Kuony Deng, Chase Garbers, Cameron Goode, Elijah Hicks, Brett Johnson, McKade Mettauer and Jake Tonges.
- The offensive line is an experienced unit that includes seven players who have seen action in 2021 that have combined for 134 games played and 101 starts.

## CAL ROSTER GROWS FOR 2021 SEASON

- After the NCAA allowed student-athletes to return for an additional year, nine Bears who were set to finish their final season of eligibility have decided to return for one additional year as "Super Seniors". Trevon Clark, Kekoa Crawford, Valentino Daltoso, Marcel Dancy, Kuony Deng, Josh Drayden, Cameron Goode and Elijah Hicks all returned from the 2020 Cal team. Luc Bequette also returned to Cal after playing one season at Boston College. Crawford, Daltoso, Dancy, Deng, Drayden and Goode are all in their sixth years of eligibility, while Bequette is in his seventh.
- Between nine seniors who returned for an additional year and another nine early enrollees, Cal had a large roster of 103 players available for spring ball and started training camp with 118.
- Cal signed 22 members to the team in the class of 2021. The recruiting class ranked No. 20 nationally according to ESPN, the highest the Bears have been ranked since 2011. The class included eight four-star recruits and seven who were ranked in the top 300 by at least one publication. Thirteen members of the class played their prep football in California, where the Bears had a recruiting emphasis.

## CARRYING SUCCESS INTO 2021

- Cal has defeated the reigning Pac-12 champion in three consecutive years (2018 vs. USC, 2019 vs. Washington, 2020 vs. Oregon).
- Cal also has wins over Washington (2018) and Oregon (2020) in the year they won the Pac-12 titles.
- Cal has defeated a ranked team in each of the first four seasons of Justin Wilcox's tenure (2017 vs. No. 8/9 Washington State, 2018 vs. No. 15/13 Washington, 2019 vs. No. 14/12 Washington and 2020 vs. No. 23/21/20 Oregon).

## TRAVERS FAMILY ENDOWS HEAD COACH POSITION

- The Travers Family made a \$10 million commitment from the Travers Family Foundation to UC Berkeley's Light the Way campaign, including a \$7.5 million commitment to endow the Travers Family Head Football Coach position, providing essential resources for Cal football to ensure a world-class program, an exceptional coaching staff and a continued positive impact on student-athletes. In addition, the Travers have also made a \$2.5 million commitment to augment their endowment for the Charles and Louise Travers Department of Political Science that supports this preeminent, nationally-ranked department.

## VIRTUAL TOUR

- The NCAA instituted a dead period starting at the onset of the pandemic that extended to May 31, 2021. To combat the void in on-campus recruiting, Cal created a virtual tour to highlight all of the aspects of attending the No. 1 public school in the country. The tour showcases a 360-degree 3D view of Cal facilities, including the Aaron Rodgers Locker Room, weight room, FTX Field at California Memorial Stadium and other aspects of Cal's world-class program.

## GARBERS IN FOURTH YEAR AS CAL STARTER

- Chase Garbers has led the Bears to a 15-14 record as the starting quarterback, and Cal is 15-10 in games when Garbers has played more than half the game, including 7-0 in 2019.
- Garbers has 43 career touchdown passes, now ranking tied for eighth in Cal history for most TD passes. Aaron Rodgers also had 43 TD passes from 2003-04.
- Garbers had a career-high 30 completions in Cal's game at Washington on Sept. 25 (41 attempts) and a career-high 43 attempts at Oregon (25 completions).
- Garbers has nine career rushing touchdowns, which ties the school record for most rushing TDs by a quarterback.
- Garbers was named Offensive MVP of the 2019 Redbox Bowl after passing for 272 yards and recording five total touchdowns (4 passing, 1 rushing).
- Ryan Glover started 10 games at QB for Penn in 2018, finishing 122-for-205 for 1,482 yards and seven touchdowns. He also rushed for 300 yards and two touchdowns. He spent the 2020 season at Western Carolina, where he went 86-for-147 with 832 yards and 3 touchdowns.
- Robby Rowell played at Utah in 2019 and threw for 13 yards on three attempts.

## DEEP STABLE OF BACKS

- Damien Moore led Cal in rushing in the first three games this season - 79 yards vs. Nevada (1 TD), 71 yards at TCU (2 TDs) and 87 yards (2 TDs) vs. Sac State. He had 67 yards at Washington and his average of 76.0 ypg puts him fourth in the Pac-12.
- Moore set a career high with 121 yards rushing on only 10 carries vs. Stanford last fall. Moore had runs of 54 and 29 yards as he recorded Cal's only 100-yard game of 2020.
- Christopher Brooks scored 12 total touchdowns (8 rushing, 4 receiving) in 13 games during the 2019 season, including multi-score games vs. Washington State and UCLA in 2019.
- Brooks has 1,318 rushing yards and 261 receiving yards in his career. He had a team-high 68 yards rushing at Oregon in 2021.
- Marcel Dancy started and totaled 76 yards rushing on a career-high 17 carries vs. Oregon State in 2020.
- DeCarlos Brooks had a 38-yard run vs. Nevada in the season opener. He was named Arizona's Offensive Player of the Year during his senior year of high school in 2019.
- Chris Street was a four-star recruit who played in two games during his freshman season in 2020. He had his biggest day for the Bears with a team-high 51 yards on eight carries vs. Washington State.

## CAL INCORPORATING TIGHT ENDS

- Jake Tonges leads Cal's tight ends this season with 13 catches for 172 yards, including a 1-yard TD reception at Washington and a 9-yard TD catch at Oregon. He had the longest play of the 2019 season as he had a 60-yard touchdown and 88 total yards in Cal's win at Ole Miss.
- Collin Moore caught a touchdown in Cal's Redbox Bowl win to end the 2019 season.
- Gavin Reinwald has 29 career catches for 271 yards while adding three touchdowns. He had his first start of 2021 at Washington and caught a 4-yard TD pass at Oregon.
- Nick Alftin moved to tight end in 2020 after previously playing at outside linebacker. He blocked a punt on special teams vs. Washington State.
- Jermaine Terry was a consensus four-star recruit and was the top-ranked tight end in the class of 2021 according to ESPN. He decided to stay home and live up to his "Hometown Hero" nickname.

## CAL RETURNS BALANCED RECEIVING CORPS

- Nikko Remigio leads the Bears with 22 receptions this season, including a pair of TDs. He had a team-high seven catches in the season opener vs. Nevada, including a 2-yard TD reception.
- Remigio was Cal's leading receiver in 2019 with 38 catches for 513 yards and 3 TDs.
- Trevon Clark ranks second in the Pac-12 with 20.4 ypc, while Jeremiah Hunter is fourth at 17.6 ypc.
- Clark had two catches for 122 yards (44 yards after catch), including a career-long 68-yarder, and one TD at TCU, and has 16 receptions for 322 yards (2 TDs) in 2021 (20.1 yards per catch).
- Crawford has 20 receptions for 206 yards had season highs with eight catches for 107 yards at Washington.
- Hunter had two catches for 35 yards vs. Nevada, including a 28-yarder for Cal's longest play of the game, then had two receptions for 48 yards (with a 42-yard reception) at TCU.
- Hunter led the Bears with five catches for 78 yards vs. Sac State, including a 45-yard TD reception.
- Justin Richard Baker came to Cal after a standout high school career in Washington, which also saw him lead a rally to support to LGBTQ+ teachers at his school who were being discriminated against.

## OFFENSIVE LINE RETURNS EXPERIENCE, DEPTH

- The offensive line has seven players that have seen action in 2021 who have combined to play in 127 games and make 96 starts.
- Valentino Daltoso is a starter for the fifth consecutive year after exercising his option on a sixth year of eligibility. Daltoso has 40 games and 39 starts — starting 12 times at left tackles, 12 times at left guard, 10 at right guard and six times at right tackle (all in 2021).
- After McKade Mettauwer and Matthew Cindric combined for 25 starts during their freshman seasons in 2019, the duo combined to start seven games at guard during the 2020 season.
- Will Craig played in two games at left tackle in 2020 after starting one game in 2019. He played nine games as a freshman in 2018, spelling current Baltimore Raven Patrick Mekari at left tackle.
- Ben Coleman switched to offensive line last fall and has made an immediate impact earning reps at all of the interior positions on the line. He earned his first start (at left guard) vs. Nevada.

## JH TEVIS AND LUC BEQUETTE RETURN ON DEFENSIVE LINE

- Luc Bequette returned to the team this fall. After spending five seasons at Cal, he played the 2020 season at Boston College after the Pac-12 announced it wouldn't play a season. He has transferred back to Cal for his seventh year of eligibility.
- Bequette played his 59th collegiate game (48th at Cal) and made his 55th career start (44th at Cal) at Oregon. He had an 8-yard sack in Nevada opener and has 30 total tackles on the year (fourth on the team).
- Ethan Saunders leads the team with 3.5 tackles for loss (minus 16 yards) and is tied with Bequette with 2.5 sacks (minus 15 yards).
- JH Tevis made his first career start in Cal's 2020 season opener vs. UCLA, and he set a career high with 10 tackles, including four solo stops.
- Tevis led the Bears with six total stops, including 2.5 tackles for loss, vs. Nevada this fall.
- Brett Johnson will miss the 2021 season after surgery to repair a broken hip sustained in an automobile accident during spring of 2021.

## GOODE, DENG HIGHLIGHT CAL'S OUTSIDE LINEBACKING CORPS

- Cameron Goode notched at least 1.0 TFL in each game in 2020, ranking second in both the FBS and the Pac-12 in tackles per loss per game. He also ranked 30th in the FBS in sacks per game at 0.75.
- Goode is 3.5 sacks and 6.5 TFLs from entering Cal's all-time top 10 list in both categories. He had two sacks and three TFLs at TCU.
- Kuony Deng was named a team captain by his teammates in his second year in the program last fall after transferring to Cal from Independence CC (Kansas), which was the subject of the Netflix show "Last Chance U" during Deng's lone season at Independence. Deng did not see much screen time on the program.
- Deng, who led Cal with 31 tackles in 2020, has missed the past four games (Sac State, UW, WSU, Oregon) with a lower body injury.
- Deng has six career games with 10+ tackles and 10 games with 8+ tackles.
- Braxten Croteau set a career high with five tackles in Cal's season opener at UCLA last fall. He also had a crucial fourth-down tackle for loss on C.J. Verdell in Cal's upset of No. 23 Oregon.
- Orin Patu's father, Saul, played at Oregon alongside Justin Wilcox and Peter Sirmon.

## TALENTED YOUNGSTERS LOOK TO MAKE MARK AT ILB

- Cal returns every inside linebacker who played during the 2020 season.
- Evan Tattersall is the oldest outside linebacker in the group as a redshirt junior with three years left to play. He has 28 tackles this year - a career high for a season. He tied for the team lead with eight stops at TCU and had a career-high 10 tackles vs. Sac State.
- Muelu Iosefa recorded his first career start in the 2020 Big Game vs. Stanford. He followed that with five tackles and a fumble recovery vs. No. 23 Oregon.
- Iosefa had four tackles with 0.5 TFL against Nevada, six tackles at TCU and a career-best nine tackles (1.0 TFL) vs. Sac State.
- Trey Paster switched positions and will be playing inside linebacker after spending his freshman season at safety in 2020. He started vs. Washington State and Oregon State this fall.

## DEFENSIVE BACKFIELD SHOWCASES EXPERIENCE

- Senior Josh Drayden played in four games during both the 2019 and 2020 seasons and is back in 2021 for his sixth year with the program.
- Drayden recorded an interception at Oregon State and averaged 1.2 passes defended per game in 2020, tying for 13th in the FBS and second in the Pac-12.
- Drayden broke up two passes vs. Nevada, tying his career high. He has 22 PBUs for his career.
- Both Drayden and safety Elijah Hicks have played in 48 games and are within four of tying Syd'Quan Thompson's school record of 52 games played (2006-09).
- Chigozie Anusiem stepped into the starting lineup for the 2019 Redbox Bowl. He recorded 15 tackles and five PBUs during the 2019 season and followed that with 12 tackles in 2020.
- Collin Gamble had three tackles and a PBU vs. Nevada in the season opener after earning his first start. For the year, he has a team-high five passes broken up. His 11 tackles at Oregon are the most for a Golden Bear this season.
- Lu-Magia Hearn III started vs. Sac State and finished the game with three tackles and two passes broken up. He also earned starts vs. Washington and Washington State.

## SAFETIES RETURN KEY PLAYERS

- After starting 12 games at cornerback in 2019, Elijah Hicks moved to safety during the Bears' 2019 bowl practices and has played the position ever since.
- Hicks tied his career high with seven tackles and set a career high with two PBUs in the 2020 season opener vs. UCLA. He set a career high with eight tackles vs. Stanford.
- This year, Hicks has 32 tackles on the season (third on the team) and has forced three fumbles.
- After earning his first career start in the Redbox Bowl, Daniel Scott started, and led the team with a career-high 11 tackles vs. UCLA in the 2020 season opener. He also recorded an interception in the 2019 Big Game vs. Stanford.
- Scott returned an interception nine yards for a TD at TCU, Cal's first pick six since 2018 vs. Colorado. He also intercepted passes vs. Sac State and Washington State to give him a team-high three picks. He leads the team with 39 tackles this season.
- Miles Williams picked off his first career interception at the 1-yard line to stop a potential Nevada scoring drive in the fourth quarter.
- Florida State transfer Raymond Woodie III played in 19 games and recorded 34 tackles the past two years for the Seminoles, also contributing 4.0 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks.

## SPECIALISTS ENTIRE UNIT FROM 2020 SEASON

- Dario Longhetto went 4-of-5 on field goals during the 2020 season and was 1-for-2 vs. Nevada in the 2020 season opener. He was also 1-for-2 at Washington and made a 45-yarder at Oregon.
- Longhetto made a 52-yard field goal as time expired in the first half vs. Oregon State in 2020, a career-best and the longest by a Cal player since Matt Anderson also hit a 52-yard field goal vs. Arizona in 2017.
- Longhetto was the Bears' primary punter in five games during the 2019 season as he served as an injury replacement for Steven Coutts. Longhetto averaged 40.9 yards per punt on his 18 attempts.
- Former Australian rules football player Jamieson Sheahan is the Bears' punter for the 2021 season. Sheahan competed in his first-ever organized football competition in the Bears' 2020 season opener vs. UCLA.
- Nico Ramos joins the team from Princeton where he set a school record with 56 extra points in 2018. He was 7-of-9 on field goals with a long of 37 during the 2018 season.
- Slater Zellers returns after serving as the team's long snapper throughout the 2019 and 2020 season.

**BERKELEY** – A two-week break from game action did little to stunt the forward momentum of a Cal football team still hungry to improve, as defensive touchdowns on each of the game's first two drives put the Golden Bears in the driver's seat against visiting Colorado and laid the groundwork for what would end up a 33-21 victory over the Buffaloes on Senior Day at California Memorial Stadium.

When poor air quality caused by deadly wildfires in Northern California forced the postponement of the 121st Big Game, Cal (7-4, 4-4 Pac-12) found itself pointed towards a Colorado game that was initially scheduled to be the final regular season game of the 2018 campaign.

But once the Bears did get back to action, it didn't take long for a familiar narrative to reappear. A pass attempt by Colorado's Steven Montez on the third play of the game ended in the first points of the game for Cal as Elijah Hicks anticipated the route, intercepted the pass and raced 34 yards to give the Bears the first lead of the day.

Cal's defense was just getting started. On the third play of Colorado's next drive, Ashytn Davis created his own chance to hit the scoreboard, intercepting Montez and taking it 35 yards for Cal's second defensive touchdown of the day.

"I'm not sure I've been a part of that," Cal head coach Justin Wilcox said. "Two huge plays that were the difference in the game. The takeaways in general, the turnover margin was the difference in the game. That was pretty obvious."

After a three-and-out by Colorado (5-7, 2-7), Cal's offense took its turn and added to the lead. A fumbled punt return by the Buffaloes, forced by Traveon Beck and recovered by Quentin Tartabull, gave Cal the ball back on the Colorado 29-yard line. Given another chance, the Bears capitalized, scoring on a 1-yard pass from Chase Garbers to Patrick Laird to make it 21-0 with 4:41 left in the first quarter.

A touchdown early in the second quarter put Colorado on the board but a few minutes later, the Bears forced another Buffaloes miscue to come up with points of their own. This time, a muffed punt gave the Bears the ball on the Colorado 15 and a 24-yard field goal by Greg Thomas put Cal ahead 24-7.

Davis' second interception helped the Bears finish the half with that score intact while also finishing off a half in which Cal forced a season-high five turnovers, four of which came in Colorado territory.

Colorado's comeback attempt included a 14-3 advantage in the third quarter but Cal responded to begin the fourth. Garbers connected with Moe Ways for a 7-yard touchdown pass, Ways' first career score, with 10:35 remaining and although the 2-point conversion failed, the Bears took a 12-point lead that stood to the end of the game.

As has been the case throughout the 2018 season, linebackers Evan Weaver and Jordan Kunaszyk stood out on the stat sheet. Weaver registered a then-career-high 19 tackles, one sack and two tackles for loss while Kunaszyk finished with 14 tackles. Garbers completed 14-of-26 passes for 116 yards and two touchdowns to lead Cal offensively, while Laird rushed for 45 yards and passed the 2,000-yard mark for his Golden Bear career.

Justin Wilcox is in his fifth season as the Travers Family Head Football Coach at Cal and his 21st campaign in collegiate coaching in 2021. Wilcox compiled a long list of accomplishments and signature wins in his first four seasons as the Golden Bears' head coach, leading Cal to back-to-back winning campaigns and bowl games in 2018 and 2019 for the first time since 2008 and 2009, as well as four victories that knocked off a combination of five reigning and current Pac-12 champions in 2018 at USC (2017 champion) and Washington (2018 champion), 2019 at Washington (2018 champion) and 2020 against Oregon (2019 and 2020 champion). His teams have produced victories over all five schools in the Pac-12 North and been road winners at each of the Pac-12's other three California schools, ending droughts that dated back to 2000 at the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum, as well as 2009 at both the Rose Bowl and Stanford Stadium. The Bears have also taken down a top-20 team in each of Wilcox's first four seasons with victories over No. 8/9 Washington State, No. 15/13 Washington, No. 14/12 Washington and most recently in 2020 against No. 23/21/20 Oregon. In addition, Wilcox's teams are 9-2 in non-conference regular-season games including a 4-1 record against Power 5 schools.

Four of the Bears' five losses in 2021 have come by a touchdown or less including a 31-24 overtime defeat at Washington in the Pac-12 opener and a 24-17 loss at No. 9/10 Oregon in which the Bears led in the fourth quarter. The Bears 2021 offense led by Chase Garbers has been an improved unit through the campaign's first six games with the fifth-year senior quarterback pacing the Pac-12 in total offense per game (283.8 ypg, #21 NCAA), while ranking second in per-game completions (22.0, #17 NCAA) and passing yards (248.7 ypg, #31 NCAA) with all his numbers career highs. Wilcox's defense has come on in the last two games holding Washington State and Oregon to an average of 22.5 points per contest.

Wilcox's defense was just getting on track in 2020 when COVID-19 ended an often-delayed season after four games with its final performance a second-half shutout of eventual Pac-12 champion Oregon in a 21-17 home victory over the Ducks. Cal was the only team to blank the Ducks for a half in 2019 or 2020 and did it twice, adding a first-half shutout of the high-powered offense in Eugene in 2019.

Wilcox began the 2019 season with four straight wins to move the Bears into the No. 15 spot in the AP Top 25 and No. 16 in the Coaches Poll. The victories included road wins at then-No. 14/12 Washington and Ole Miss, with the latter the first road triumph by a Pac-12 school at an SEC foe since 2010. The two signature victories helped the Bears to a 4-2 mark in true road games to give Cal back-to-back winning seasons on the road for the first time since 2004. A strong defense led by consensus first-team All-American and Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year Evan Weaver defined the 2019 squad. Weaver led the nation in total tackles (school-record and career-high 182), total tackles per game (14.0), solo tackles (103) and solo tackles per game (7.9) for a defense that allowed only 21.9 points per game and ranked fourth in the Pac-12 in both scoring defense and total defense (389.9 ypg). On offense, Cal put together game-winning drives on its final possessions both at Washington and Stanford while committing only 13 turnovers, two less than the previous school record of 15 set in 2016. Cal also sported a 7-0 record in games that quarterback Chase Garbers started and finished.

Wilcox guided the Bears to the Cheez-It Bowl and a 7-6 record in his second campaign in 2018 with the bowl appearance Cal's first since 2015. The Bears won four of five Pac-12 games in one stretch, highlighted by signature wins over eventual Pac-12 champion and then-No. 15/13 Washington as well as at USC. The victory over the Trojans clinched bowl eligibility and marked Cal's first win against USC since 2003 and its first at the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum since 2000. Cal also started the season with a 3-0 mark and in Week 5 made its first appearance since 2015 in the AP Top 25 at No. 24. Cal's defense finished the 2018 campaign among national and Pac-12 leaders in nearly every category. Cal ranked in the top 10 nationally and paced the conference in interceptions (21, No. 2 NCAA), defensive TD's (5, No. T4 NCAA), turnovers gained (28, No. T6 NCAA) and passing yards allowed (175.1 ypg, No. 9 NCAA). The Bears also led the league and ranked in the top 20 in the country in pass efficiency defense (107.26, No. 11 NCAA) and first downs allowed (227, No. 18 NCAA). In addition, Cal was 15th nationally in total defense (317.2 ypg) and 22nd in scoring defense (20.4 ppg).

The highlights of Wilcox's first season as the head coach in Berkeley in 2017 included a 3-0 start and non-conference wins over Power 5 programs North Carolina and Ole Miss, as well as a 37-3 victory over then No. 8/9 Washington State. The victory was the Bears' first against a top-10 team since 2003 and only its second top-10 win dating back to 1977. Cal finished 5-7 overall and also notched a Pac-12 victory over Oregon State while taking three conference opponents to the wire before falling by a combined total of seven points to Arizona, and on the road in its final two games at Stanford and UCLA.

Wilcox spent 11 seasons as a defensive coordinator at Boise State (2006-09), Tennessee (2010-11), Washington (2012-13), USC (2014-15) and Wisconsin (2016) before being hired as Cal's head coach in January of 2017. He has been a member of staffs that have gone to 15 bowl games and won five conference or division championships.

Wilcox spent three seasons as Cal's linebackers coach from 2003-05 in his first position as a full-time coach following two campaigns as a graduate assistant at Boise State (2001-02). The Bears posted a 26-12 record during his first stint in Berkeley with trips to the Insight, Holiday and Las Vegas bowls.

A 1999 graduate of Oregon with a bachelor's degree in anthropology, Wilcox is the son of Dave Wilcox, a Pro Football Hall of Famer who played for the San Francisco 49ers from 1964-74. His uncle, John (Philadelphia Eagles, 1960), and brother, Josh (New Orleans Saints, 1998-99) also played in the NFL.

As a collegiate student-athlete, Wilcox was a safety and cornerback at Oregon (1996-99), helping the Ducks to three bowl games (1997 Las Vegas Bowl, 1998 Aloha Bowl, 1999 Sun Bowl). In 1999, he was named second-team All-Pac-10 and earned Pac-10 All-Academic honors.

## Bill Musgrave (OC/QB) ... Field



Musgrave is in his second season as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Cal in 2021. Musgrave has more than two decades of coaching experience in the NFL and collegiate ranks, including 13 seasons as an offensive coordinator. The long list of quarterbacks he has tutored includes Pro Bowlers Steve Beuerlein, Matt Ryan and Derek Carr. Musgrave's 20 NFL seasons have included stints with Oakland (1997, 2015-16), Philadelphia (1998, 2014), Carolina (1999-2000), Jacksonville (2003-04), Washington (2005), Atlanta (2006-10), Minnesota (2011-13) and Denver (2017-18). Musgrave had some of his biggest success in Cal's backyard with Oakland when he inherited an offense that had ranked last in the NFL in 2014 in total offense (282.2 ypg) and second to last in scoring (15.9 ppg). The Raiders made the biggest offensive improvement in the NFL in yards per game (+91.1 ypg) and scoring (+10.2 ppg) in two seasons under Musgrave, finishing sixth in the league in 2016 in total offense (373.3 ypg) and seventh in scoring (26.0 ppg).

## Peter Sirmon (DC/ILB/RC) ... Field



Sirmon is in his fourth season at Cal in 2021 and has defensive coordinator duties for the second year after spending 2019 as the co-defensive coordinator. Sirmon was instrumental to Cal's success in his first two seasons on the Bears' staff in 2018 and 2019, leading to his seventh and eighth consecutive bowl appearances as a coach. ## GAME 1: BEARS FALL TO NEVADA IN SEASON-OPENER

**BERKELEY** – A season-opener that began with so much promise ended in disappointment for the Golden Bears, as Cal fell to Nevada 22-17 at FTX Field at California Memorial Stadium.

Cal scored on each of its first two possessions of the game to establish a 14-0 advantage just before the end of the first quarter, but could only manage a 24-yard field goal by Dario Longhetto the rest of the way.

The Bears played their first game in front of their home fans since Nov. 16, 2019, and gave the crowd of 35,117 a reason to celebrate with two sustained drives early.

Cal took the opening kickoff and forged a 15-play, 63-yard drive that ate up over nine minutes of the clock and ended on Damien Moore's 1-yard touchdown run. The Wolf Pack promptly went three-and-out on its first possession of the game, and Cal's offense went right to work again. The Bears put together a nine-play, 72-yard drive, with Nikko Remigio scoring on a 2-yard pass from quarterback Chase Garbers.

But Cal's offense suddenly went silent, and Nevada started to climb back in it. The Wolf Pack cut it to 14-13 by halftime, and Nevada scored a touchdown on its first possession of the third quarter to take a 19-14 lead. The Wolf Pack added another field goal with 6:26 remaining in the third quarter.

Longhetto's field goal cut Nevada's advantage to 22-17 with 12:59 left, and after Cal safety Miles Williams recorded an interception at the Golden Bear 1-yard line, Cal put together a promising 77-yard drive that ultimately stalled at the Wolf Pack 22. Longhetto missed a 40-yard field goal attempt with 7:11 to play.

Cal had two late possessions with chances to come back, but Garbers was intercepted and the Bears ultimately turned the ball over on downs with 47 seconds remaining.

## GAME 2: TCU EDGES CAL IN TIGHT CONTEST, 34-32

**FORT WORTH** – Quentin Johnston caught two of Max Duggan's three touchdown passes, with the go-ahead score coming on a nifty catch-and-run as TCU beat Cal, 34-32, on Saturday.

Johnston put the Horned Frogs (2-0) ahead to stay with the 45-yard TD catch with 9:53 left, when he twisted around one defender who fell down near the 30 and then shed the attempted tackle by another inside the 10. Johnston finished with five catches for 95 yards.

Zach Evans ran for 183 yards on 22 carries, with a 51-yard TD just before halftime for the Horned Frogs. Duggan completed 17 of 31 passes for 234 yards and added 71 yards rushing on 19 carries with a 9-yard keeper for a TD with 5:47 left for a 34-26 lead.

Chase Garbers threw for 309 yards and two touchdowns for Cal (0-2). He had 235 yards passing in the first half - a career best for one half - with 199 of that coming on only four plays (49, 54, 28 and 68 yards).

Cal led 19-7 after Garbers threw a 7-yard TD to Nikko Remigio. That was a play after a 68-yard catch by Trevon Johnson, whose only other catch was a 54-yard TD.

But Evans scored with 11 seconds before halftime, and the Frogs opened the second half with a 15-play, 75-yard drive that ended with Johnston's 18-yard catch that gave them their first lead at 21-19.

-- Garbers finished 16-for-27 for 309 yards and 2 touchdowns. He was 11-for-14 for 235 yards and 2 touchdowns in the first half - his most yards ever in one half. He threw for 202 yards in the second half at Ole Miss in 2019.

-- Garbers had a career-long 68 completion to Trevon Clark in the second quarter. It marked Cal's longest pass play since Ross Bowers had a 75-yard TD pass to Kanawai Noa at Oregon on Sept. 30, 2017.

-- Damien Moore scored two touchdowns for the first time in his career (on runs of 12 and 1 yards). He finished the game with 71 yards on 14 carries.

-- Daniel Scott had 9-yard pick six in the second quarter to give Cal a 12-0 lead. It was his second career interception. The play marked Cal's first pick six since the Bears had two vs. Colorado on Nov. 24, 2018 (Elijah Hicks, Ashtyn Davis)

-- Cameron Goode had his 15th and 16th career sacks for a combined minus-27 yards. The two sacks tied a career high (also at UCLA in 2019).

## GAME 3: PROLIFIC OFFENSE CARRIES CAL PAST SACRAMENTO STATE

**BERKELEY** – The Cal football team had its most prolific offensive performance in three years Saturday as the Golden Bears notched their first win of the season, a 42-30 triumph over Sacramento State at FTX Field at California Memorial Stadium.

The Bears racked up 534 yards of total offense, their highest output since amassing 539 yards in a 49-7 win over Oregon State in 2018. Quarterback Chase Garbers went 22-for-34 for 288 yards and two touchdowns while also rushing for 68 yards and a score.

"We know our potential as an offense," said Cal running back Damien Moore, who rushed for 87 yards and a pair of touchdowns. "This was just another way we were able to show it. I know we can do more, and we're going to need to go into Pac-12 play."

Nikko Remigio returned the second half kickoff 99 yards for a touchdown to put the Bears up 28-6 to give themselves some breathing room against the Hornets, who racked up 467 yards of offense themselves and kept pressure on Cal's defense the entire game.

Wide receivers Jeremiah Hunter and Trevon Clark caught touchdown passes from Garbers. Evan Tattersall led Cal's defensive effort with a career-high 10 tackles.

"You never minimize a win," Travers Family Head Football Coach Justin Wilcox said. "It's hard to win in college football, regardless of who you are playing. Sac State has good players and they are as well-coached as any team we will play. It's good to get a win, but we all know we need to be much, much better."

-- Cal's 534 yards of total offense were a season best, and the most since posting 539 against Oregon State in 2018.

-- Chase Garbers completed 10-of-10 passes in the first quarter and his first 11 consecutive passes.

-- Jeremiah Hunter hauled in his first career touchdown on a career-long 45-yard reception in the second quarter. He ended the day with career highs in receptions (5) and receiving yards (78).

-- Nikko Remigio returned the second-half kickoff for a 99-yard touchdown. It was Cal's first kick return for a touchdown since Ashtyn Davis ran back an 89-yarder vs. Idaho State in 2018. The kick return TD was also the longest since Trevor Davis took one to the house for 100 yards at Washington State in 2014 and tied for sixth all-time in school history.

-- Daniel Scott secured his third career interception - his second in as many games - in the third quarter.

-- Lu-Magia Hearn III and Hunter made their first career starts, while Braxton Croteau made his first start of the season.

## GAME 4: BEARS FALL TO HUSKIES IN OVERTIME. 31-24

**SEATTLE** – Sean McGrew scored his second touchdown of the game in overtime, Washington's defense forced California's Damien Moore to fumble at the 1-yard line and the Huskies escaped with a 31-24 win over the Golden Bears.

The Pac-12 Conference opener ended after Washington linebacker Jackson Sirmon and defensive back Cameron Williams converged on Moore before he reached goal line. Moore was hit hard, the ball popped free and Ryan Bowman pounced on the loose ball.

The 100th matchup between the schools was another wild conclusion to a series that has recently featured close games.

McGrew scored on a 5-yard run in the first half and his 2-yard run in overtime gave the Huskies (2-2, 1-0 Pac-12) the lead. Cal (1-3, 0-1) looked poised to force a second OT, driving with ease to the Washington 2.

Washington's Dylan Morris threw a pair of first-half touchdowns, but the Huskies will lament the fact the game ever got to overtime. They led 21-10 at halftime and ruined several chances in the second half to extend the lead, giving the Golden Bears a chance to rally.

Cal quarterback Chase Garbers was great in the second half, making just one mistake when he was intercepted by Tyler Gordon for the second time early in the fourth quarter. Washington failed to capitalize on the turnover and Garbers' 7-yard run with 2:51 left tied the game at 24-all.

Garbers was 30-of-41 passing for 319 yards and two touchdowns. He also added another 71 yards rushing. Moore rushed for 67 yards and had a 26-yard TD catch midway through the third quarter.

Washington twice missed chances to extend the lead with a fumble and a missed field goal early in the fourth quarter and Garbers put together a late drive to pull the Bears even.

Garbers hit Jeremiah Hunter for 19 yards to convert one third-down and scrambled for 23 yards on another third-down to reach the Washington 11. And on the last third-down of the drive, Garbers strolled into the end zone on a designed keeper to tie the game at 24-all with 2:51 left.

Morris threw touchdown passes of 19 yards to Taj Davis and 6 yards to Jalen McMillan as part of an impressive first half. After going three-and-out on its opening possession, Washington scored touchdowns on its next three possessions of the half, capped by McGrew's first TD run.

## GAME 5: BEARS FALL TO WASHINGTON STATE

**BERKELEY** – The Cal football team struggled to find consistency on offense while allowing Washington State to convert 50 percent of its third downs, and the Golden Bears fell 21-6 to the Cougars at FTX Field at California Memorial Stadium on Saturday afternoon.

The Bears (1-4, 0-2 Pac-12) had been off to a hot start offensively so far this season, entering the game averaging 440.8 total yards per game. But Cal could only manage 273 yards against WSU and converted just 3-of-15 of its third down opportunities.

"We expected to play much better than that," Travers Family Head Football Coach Justin Wilcox said. "We really didn't do much of anything, and that falls on me. It's my job to help our team prepare to be successful, and I failed."

Sophomore running back Chris Street was a bright spot for the Bears, amassing a team-high 51 yards on eight carries. He entered the game with just two career yards rushing.

Cal quarterback Chase Garbers completed 14-of-30 passes for 152 yards with an interception while receiver Kekoa Crawford had three catches for 67 yards.

The Bears recorded two interceptions, including Daniel Scott's third this season and fourth in his career. Freshman linebacker Nate Rutchena made his collegiate debut and also picked off Cougars quarterback Jayden De Laura.

"We need to go out and show that standard that we need to play at every week," Scott said. "We can't look at our record right now – that's behind us. We just need to keep playing and keep improving."

After Washington St. scored a touchdown on the first possession of the game, the Bears immediately answered with a scoring drive of their own, marching 79 yards in seven plays and culminating in an 11-yard touchdown run by running back Christopher Brooks. The Bears failed to convert the extra point and trailed 7-6 with 7:45 remaining in the first quarter.

Brooks finished with 40 yards rushing on eight carries.

The Cougars extended the lead to 21-6 midway through the third quarter and that completed the scoring for the afternoon.

"They flat out they just played better than we did," Garbers said. "It's that simple – you saw it on the scoreboard. We had a great week of practice but they just came out here and beat us. It's as simple as that."

## GAME 6: BEARS COME UP JUST SHORT AT NO. 9 OREGON

**EUGENE** – The Cal football team drove to the 2-yard line on its final possession of the game but couldn't convert on fourth down with two seconds remaining and fell to No. 9 Oregon 24-17 on Friday night at Autzen Stadium.

The Bears got to the Oregon 3 after Chase Garbers' fourth-down pass to Kekoa Crawford preserved the drive, but his final attempt fell incomplete.

Cal took a 17-10 lead early in the final quarter, but Oregon quarterback Anthony Brown answered with a 20-yard touchdown pass to Jaylon Redd to tie it. The Ducks (5-1, 2-1 Pac-12) pulled in front on Brown's scamper into the end zone. The Ducks then took the lead on Brown's 11-yard keeper with 4:50 to play.

Garbers, who went into the game leading the league in total offense (281.2 yards per game) and ranked third in passing yards (249 per game), threw for 242 yards and two touchdowns. Cal, who like Oregon was coming off a bye, defeated the Ducks last season in Berkeley, 21-17, with Garbers accounting for a pair of touchdowns, one via pass and the other on a keeper.

The Bears took an early 7-3 lead on a 9-yard touchdown pass to tight end Jake Tonges. Cal tied it at 10-10 in the third quarter on Dario Longhetto's 45-yard field goal.

Garbers found Gavin Reinwald with a 4-yard touchdown pass to give the Golden Bears a 17-10 lead.
