FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

1 Coming off a 31-26 victory against Miami (OH), Minnesota (1-1, 0-1 B1G) plays its first road game of the year on Saturday when it visits Colorado (1-1, 0-0 PAC-12) at 12 p.m. on PAC-12 Network.

2 Minnesota enters Saturday's contest with 20 straight non-conference victories, the longest active streak in the country. Iowa is second with 13 straight wins, while Kentucky (12) and Alabama (10) are the only other teams in the country with a streak longer than six games. The Golden Gophers haven't lost a non-conference game since Sept. 3, 2015, at home to then-No. 2 TCU. Included in the streak are 16 regular season wins and four bowl victories (complete list of wins on Page 4). Also in the streak are three straight road wins against non-B1G teams, tied for the 10th longest streak in the FBS. The Gophers' last road loss out of conference came Sept. 13, 2014, at TCU. Minnesota is 12-0 under **P.J. Fleck** in non-conference games.

3 Minnesota is 59-65-9 all-time in road openers, including a 2-2 mark under head coach **P.J. Fleck**. The Gophers have won three in a row, however, when the first road contest of the season comes against a non-conference opponent, winning at Fresno State in 2019, Oregon State in 2017 and Colorado State in 2015.

4 With redshirt senior **Mohamd Ibrahim** out for the season with a lower leg injury that occurred in the season opener against Ohio State, the Gophers turned to redshirt sophomore **Trey Potts** Saturday against Miami (OH) and Potts came through in a big way. Making his first career start, Potts ran for 178 yards and two touchdowns on 34 carries, smashing his previous personal highs in all three categories. In fact, Potts' 34 carries are the most by any player in the country this season, while his 178 yards are the 10th highest total. Impressively, Potts' performance nearly matched his career output entering the contest. In eight career games prior, he had gained 206 yards and scored two touchdowns on 36 carries.

5 Saturday marks the 100th game of P.J. Fleck's collegiate coaching career. Now in his ninth season overall, he has posted a 57-42 mark in his previous 99 games. Fleck is in his fifth season at Minnesota, posting a 27-20 record to date. He is 10th already in school history in games coached, and ninth in wins, needing one more win to tie **Clarence Spears** (1925-29) for eighth place. Fleck's .574 win percentage is third best among the 11 Minnesota coaches with at least 45 games under their helm behind only **Henry L. Williams** (.786, 1900-21) and **Bernie Bierman** (.716, 1932-41, '45-50). Fleck's 26 wins through his first four seasons at Minnesota was second best in program annals, behind only Williams' 42 victories.



In his first ever start, Trey Potts ran for a career-high 178 yards on 34 carries and scored two touchdowns in Minnesota's 31-26 win over Miami (OH) Saturday.

FACING COLORADO

► Minnesota and Colorado meet for the fourth time on Saturday. The Golden Gophers are looking for their first ever win over the Buffaloes, going 0-3 so far in the series.

► Saturday will be the second matchup between the schools in Boulder. The first of which was a 58-0 Colorado victory in 1991. The other two meetings in the series (1972 and 1992) both took place in Minneapolis.

► The Gophers' 0-3 record against the Buffaloes marks their second-most games played without a win against a current FBS opponent. The top spot belongs to Notre Dame, against whom Minnesota is 0-4-1. In all, there are nine opponents that Minnesota has faced in its history without a victory.

► All-time against schools currently in the Pac-12, the Golden Gophers are 28-29-2. Minnesota has won three in a row against schools from the conference, beating Oregon State in the 2017 regular season, Washington State in the 2016 Holiday Bowl and the Beavers again in the 2016 regular season.

► Minnesota freshman WR **Brady Boyd** and Colorado grad transfer ILB Robert Barnes both attended Southlake Carroll High School in Texas, while Minnesota redshirt freshman QB **Lorenzo Faoa** and Colorado freshman ILB Zephaniah Maea both graduated from Liberty High School in Las Vegas and Gophers redshirt sophomore DL **Rashad Cheney Jr.** and Buffaloes freshman OLB Alvin Williams both went to Cedar Grove High School in Georgia.

► Colorado enters the game 1-1 on the season, opening the year with a 35-7 victory over Northern Colorado before falling Saturday to No. 5 Texas A&M in Denver, 10-7.

Allowing 8.5 points per game, the Buffaloes rank fifth in the nation in scoring defense, while they are 13th in rushing yards allowed (58.5 ypg) and 26th in total defense (272.0).

► Jarek Broussard is the team's top rusher at 72.5 yards per game, while quarterback Brendon Lewis is next at 60.0 yards per contest. Lewis has thrown for 191 yards on 57.5 percent passing through two games with one touchdown and one interception. Ten different Buffaloes have caught a pass this year with Brady Russell and Dimitri Stanley leading the way with four catches each. Daniel Arias has a team-high 37 receiving yards, while Montana Lemonious-Craig has the lone TD reception.

► Defensively, Nate Landman has a team-high 14 tackles, while Christian Gonzalez has a team-best 2.5 tackles for loss and Na'im Rodman paces the squad with 2.0 sacks. Mekhi Blackmon has Colorado's interception.

LAST TIME VS. COLORADO

► Quarterback **Marquel Fleetwood** threw for 262 yards and ran for an additional 110, but Minnesota fell to No. 11 Colorado, 21-20, in Minneapolis on Sept. 19, 1992.

► Fleetwood attempted 54 passes in the loss, which was the third highest total in program history at the time and currently ranks fifth.

► The Gophers led 7-0 at halftime as **Derek Fisher** recovered a block punt in the end zone and extended the lead to 17-0 midway through the third quarter thanks to a field goal by **Aaron Piepkorn** and 2-yard TD pass from Fleetwood to **Steven Cambrice**.

► A 49-yard TD pass from Koy Detmer to Michael Westbrook was followed on the next play by a 31-yard pick-six by Dwayne Davis and Colorado was within 17-14 in a span of 13 seconds. Piepkorn added an additional field goal to push the lead back to 20-14 for Minnesota but Detmer connected with Charles Johnson on a 24-yard score with 12:02 remaining.

► Minnesota had one final chance but Piepkorn's 55-yard field goal try with 17 seconds left missed wide right.

► The Gophers' defense recorded 10 tackles for loss in the game, including five sacks, and recovered four fumbles.

RECAPPING THE MIAMI (OH) WIN

► Via the AP: **Trey Potts** picked up for Minnesota where injured star **Mo Ibrahim** left off, rushing for 178 yards and two touchdowns in his first career start to help fend off Miami of Ohio 31-26 on Saturday.

► **Tanner Morgan** connected with **Dylan Wright** and **Daniel Jackson** on scoring passes in the second quarter as the Gophers (1-1) took a 21-3 lead into halftime, before the Redhaws (0-2) outgained them 128-15 in total yards in the third quarter to make a game of it down the stretch.

► After Brett Gabbert threw to Jack Sorenson for a 23-yard score that cut Minnesota's lead to one point with 12:32 to go, freshman **Mar'Keise Irving** returned the ensuing kickoff 41 yards. Potts took five straight handoffs to gain the remaining 53 yards and give the Gophers a cushion.

► **Tyler Nubin** intercepted Gabbert's third-down pass on the next drive to set up a career-long 50-yard field goal by **Matthew Trickett** to make it 31-20.

► Nubin broke up Gabbert's fourth-down throw from the Minnesota 48, but the Redhaws kept the ball on a roughing-the-passer penalty and scored on the next play when Mac Hippenhammer snagged Gabbert's 33-yard toss in tight coverage in the end zone. The 2-point conversion play failed with 3:43 to go.

► The Redhaws had two timeouts, but the Gophers had Potts and their experienced, imposing offensive line. Potts had five consecutive carries to drain the clock, finishing off the Redhaws with an 11-yard run on third-and-4 near midfield with 1:28 left.

O-LINE DEPTH AMONG THE BEST

► Minnesota boasts one of the deepest offensive lines in the entire country as 13 members of the unit have appeared in at least one game and 10 have started at least one contest (page 16).

► In fact, the Golden Gophers' offensive line has more combined starts at the FBS level than any team in the nation with 193. The next closest squad is Miami (FL) with 169, while Michigan State (161) is third.

► In addition, the 10 individuals with starts was tied with Arkansas State for the most among all FBS squads entering the season.

► Redshirt senior **Conner Olson** leads the team by starting all 47 games he's played in, putting him four games shy of matching the school record of 51 games played set by long snapper **Payton Jordahl** from 2015-18. Fellow redshirt seniors **Blaise Andries** and **Sam Schlueter** have each started 35 contests. Those three have also started at least two games at multiple positions. In addition, **Daniel Faalele** (21), Utah State transfer **Karter Shaw** (19), **Curtis Dunlap Jr.** (15) and **John Micheal Schmitz** (12) have all started double-digit games.

► Not only does the offensive line have tremendous experience, but it also has impressive versatility. The unit has at least 27 combined starts at every position, with a high of 60 at right guard, and each position features starts from at least two different players, including four each at right guard and right tackle.

► Further showcasing the depth, in the 2021 season opener the Minnesota offense opened in a jumbo package that featured seven starting offensive linemen, and started 6 offensive linemen against Miami (OH).

MORGAN LEADS MAROON & GOLD

► Fifth-year senior quarterback **Tanner Morgan** is in his third full season as the Minnesota starter, and he's proven himself to be one of the best signal-callers to ever wear the Maroon and Gold.

► Morgan is 19-9 as a starter and has completed 427 passes (seventh most in school history) of 695 attempts (eighth most) for 6,345 yards (sixth most) in his career. His career completion percentage of .614 ranks first in school history, as does his 156.21 pass efficiency rating.

► Morgan also has 49 career touchdown passes, which rank fourth in program history. He is one away from joining **Adam Weber** (72), **Bryan Cupito** (55) and **Asad Abdul-Khalik** (55) as the only Gopher QBs to reach at least 50 career touchdown passes.

► If Morgan can throw at least one TD pass at Colorado, he would tie Abdul-Khalik for fewest games to get to 50 TD passes and could also get there in the fewest attempts.

► Morgan has 11 Minnesota season and game records and was named All-Big Ten Honorable Mention in 2020. In 2019, he was named All-Big Ten Second Team, a Davey O'Brien Award semifinalist and a Manning Award finalist.

► This season, Morgan has completed 22-of-42 passes for 317 yards and three touchdowns. He's one of 29 quarterbacks in the country to have thrown at least 42 passes without throwing an interception.

IBRAHIM OUT FOR THE YEAR

► **Mohamed Ibrahim**, the Big Ten's reigning Ameche-Dayne Running Back of the Year, suffered a season-ending lower leg injury in Minnesota's season-opening loss to Ohio State. He had surgery on Sept. 7.

► Ibrahim has 14 career 100-yard rushing games, including a streak of nine in a row from the 2020 Outback Bowl through this year's season opener. Ibrahim's nine-game streak is the longest in program history, two more than former Gopher great **Laurence Maroney**.

► Before leaving Minnesota's season opener late in the third quarter with his injury, Ibrahim ran for 163 yards and two touchdowns on 30 attempts. In two career games against Ohio State, Ibrahim has run for 320 yards and four scores on 53 carries.

► Ibrahim has 3,003 rushing yards for his career, the eighth Minnesota player to reach the 3,000-yard milestone.

► An All-Big Ten First Team honoree and AP Third-Team All-American last year, Ibrahim ran 201 times (25th most in school single-season history) for 1,076 yards (23rd most in school single season-history) and 15 touchdowns (most ever for a junior at Minnesota and ranks fourth in school-single season history). He led the Big Ten in the following categories: rushing attempts (201), rushing yards (1,076), rushing yards per game (153.7), rushing touchdowns (15), scoring (90), points per game (12.9) and all-purpose yards per game (168.4).

► He also set a school record with a rushing average of 153.7 yards per game and tied a school mark with four rushing scores in one game (at Maryland and at Illinois).

RB ROOM READY TO GO

► With the injury to Ibrahim, **Trey Potts** emerged last Saturday as the lead back with his 178 rushing yards and two touchdowns on 34 carries. However, he's not the only back capable of contributing.

► Bryce Williams (6'0, 215 pounds) has the most experience in the running back with 539 rushing yards and six touchdowns on 142 career carries. The majority of his production came as a freshman in 2018 with 502 yards and four scores on 117 carries, including a breakout performance against Miami (OH) with 33 carries for 141 yards.

► The biggest of the bunch at 6'2, 210 pounds, Wiley has 46 carries for 215 yards and one touchdown in 11 career games. He had a career-high 81 yards on seven attempts last season in a win at Nebraska.

► Two others that could see carries are redshirt freshman **Ky Thomas** (5'11, 205 pounds) and true freshman **Mar'Keise Irving** (5'10, 190). Thomas, who did not see any action last year, was four-star recruit and ranked the No. 25 running back in the country by 247Sports out of high school. Thomas finished his career with 7,703 rushing yards and 95 rushing touchdowns. Irving was also a four-star recruit by 247 and was the No. 10 running back, according to Rivals. Irving ended his high school career with 3,264 rushing yards and 587 receiving yards. Irving made his Minnesota debut Saturday with two kick returns for 64 yards, including a 41-yarder that was the longest for Minnesota since 2018.

AUTMAN-BELL NEXT WR UP

► Senior **Chris Autman-Bell** was Minnesota's No. 3 receiver two years ago behind **Tyler Johnson** and **Rashod Bateman**, and the No. 2 target last year before Bateman opted out. But with those two now on to the NFL, Autman-Bell is poised to be the team's next top target.

► Autman-Bell, who has missed the first two games of 2021 due to injury, has played in 33 career games with 78 catches for 1,250 yards (21st in school history) and six TDs. He boasts a career average of 16.0 yards per catch, good for a tie for 10th in team annals. He has caught at least one pass in 31 games and has made one catch in 27 straight games he's played in (10th longest active streak).

► In seven games last year, he caught 22 passes for 430 yards and one score. That came after recording 28 catches for 371 yards and five touchdowns in 2019 and 28 catches (fourth all-time for a Minnesota freshman) for 449 yards (third all-time for a Minnesota freshman) in 2018 (also led team with 16.03 yards/catch).

THE WRIGHT STUFF

► With **Chris Autman-Bell** missing the team's first two games due to injury, redshirt sophomore **Dylan Wright** has emerged as Tanner Morgan's top target so far.

► A transfer from Texas A&M, Wright leads the team in targets (15), receptions (8), receiving yards (130) and touchdown receptions (2). He also has the longest catch by a Gopher this year with a 31-yard TD reception Saturday against Miami (OH).

► In the season opener against Ohio State, Wright caught five passes for 57 yards and a touchdown, then followed with three catches for 73 yards and another score in the second game of the year vs. Miami.

► Wright played in eight games over two seasons for Texas A&M but did not record any stats. At 6'3, 215 pounds, Wright was an Under Armour All-American in high school and was the No. 12 wide receiver in the country by 247Sports.

LINEBACKER DUO PACING THE 'D'

► On a defense with its top nine tacklers back from last season, the linebacking duo of **Mariano Sori-Marin** and **Jack Gibbens** has paced the unit. Sori-Marin has a team-leading 16 tackles and 1.5 tackles for loss, while Gibbens is second with 10 stops on the year and 1.0 stops for loss.

► Sori-Marin was the team's top tackler from a year ago, registering 54 stops in seven games in 2020. He also made 1.5 tackles for loss, broke up three passes and forced a fumble. His top performance last year came at Nebraska when he recorded a career-high 18 tackles and forced a fumble en route to being named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week.

► Gibbens spent the past four seasons at the FCS level with Abilene Christian where he totaled 258 tackles, 22.5 tackles for loss, seven sacks and five interceptions. He was the team's leading tackler this past season and was second in both 2019 and 2018.

TURNING TO'S INTO POINTS

► Minnesota's defense has forced three turnovers this year and has capitalized by turning them into 17 points.

► In the opener against Ohio State, cornerback **Terrell Smith** returned an interception 23 yards against Ohio State, resulting in a Mohamed Ibrahim rushing touchdown.

► Versus Miami (OH), the Gophers recovered a fumble on the RedHawks' opening drive, and **Trey Potts** cashed in with a rushing touchdown. In the fourth quarter, **Tyler Nubin's** 18-yard interception return against Miami (OH) was followed by a **Matthew Trickett** field goal.

TRICKETT SOLIDIFIES KICKING SPOT

► Senior **Matthew Trickett** has solidified his role as the Gophers' kicker. He's 2-of-2 this year, making a 46-yard field goal in the opener against Ohio State and then converting on a career-long 50-yarder against Miami (OH). It was

Minnesota's first 50-yard FG since **Emmit Carpenter** made two (53, 50) versus Fresno State on Sept. 8, 2018.

► In addition to being perfect on field goals, Trickett is also 8-of-8 on extra points. He's one of 35 kickers in the country this year to have not missed yet this season.

► Trickett came to Minnesota after three seasons at Kent State where he earned All-MAC First Team honors in 2018 and was the MAC Special Teams Player of the Year in 2019. He made 47-57 (82.5%) field goals and was 94-95 on PATs for 235 career points. In 2019, he tied for the NCAA lead and set a Kent State record with 29 made field goals.

KESICH THE KICKOFF SPECIALIST

► Kickoff specialist **Dragan Kesich** has 10 touchbacks on 12 kickoffs this year. His 83.3 percent touchback rate is tied for 14th in the country, though only five kickers ahead of him have at least as many kickoffs as he does.

► Minnesota is tied for 12th nationally with only two opponent kick returns allowed this year.

CONTROLLING THE CLOCK

► Through two games, Minnesota has had an average time of possession of 35:39. That figure ranks second in the Big Ten and sixth nationally.

► Minnesota is 23-13 all-time under P.J. Fleck when holding the ball longer than its opponent.

ACTIVE LEADERS

► Among active FBS quarterbacks, **Tanner Morgan** ranks 11th in career pass efficiency (156.21), 16th in completion percentage (61.4) and passing TDs (49), 17th in passing yards (6,345) and 19th in pass yards per game (204.7).

HUNTINGTON BANK STADIUM

- Minnesota opened Huntington Bank Stadium with a 20-13 win against Air Force in 2009. All-time, the Gophers are 50-35 at Huntington, including a 41-19 mark in their last 60 games and an 18-11 record under Head Coach P.J. Fleck.
- Huntington Bank Stadium has hosted Gopher Hockey, MNF, an NHL game, international soccer, MLB All-Star concert, U2, Rolling Stones, Beyonce, One Direction, Luke Bryan and Florida Georgia Line. The Minnesota Vikings and Minnesota United also played seasons on campus while their stadiums were being constructed.
- Upon completion, Huntington Bank Stadium became the first new football stadium in the Big Ten since 1960.
- The Gopher locker room is a state of the art 60 x 25-yard area, shaped like a football with 120 custom-built lockers and 10 LCD televisions.
- The main high-definition video display in the stadium is one of the largest in college sports at approximately 48 feet high by 108 feet wide. It boasts Daktronics HD-16 technology and was the first of its kind in the Big Ten.
- The University achieved LEED certification (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) for Huntington Bank Stadium, making it the first LEED certified college football stadium in the country. The certification is achieved by accumulating credits for various environmentally and sustainable efforts in design and construction.

HEAD COACH // FIFTH SEASON

P.J. Fleck was named head football coach at Minnesota on January 6, 2017. Fleck, 40, is the 30th head coach in the program's history. He has a career record of 56-42 and is 26-20 at Minnesota.

While at Minnesota, Fleck has guided Minnesota to its most wins (11 in 2019) since 1904, has coached three All-Americans (Antoine Winfield Jr., Rashod Bateman and Mohamed Ibrahim), six Academic All-Americans (Blaise Andries twice, Sam Renner twice, Payton Jordahl and Gary Moore) and 194 Academic All-Big Ten performers. He was named Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2019, paced Minnesota to two top-10 wins (Penn State and Auburn) in the same season since 1956 and led Minnesota to its first New Year's Day bowl win (2020 Outback Bowl against Auburn) since 1962. He has also had eight players selected in the NFL Draft while at Minnesota.

In 2020, Fleck guided the Gophers to a 3-4 record as Minnesota played an all-Big Ten schedule in the midst of the global Covid-19 pandemic. The Gophers posted wins road wins at Nebraska and Illinois and beat Purdue at home. They suffered overtime setbacks at Maryland and at Wisconsin. The season was highlighted by Big Ten Running Back of the Year Mohamed Ibrahim, who set school records in season rushing yards per game (153.7), consecutive 100-yard rushing games (8) and touchdowns in consecutive games (8). He tied school records in most rushing touchdowns in a game (4), most rushing touchdowns in a first half (4), most rushing touchdowns in one half (4) and consecutive 200-yard rushing games (2).

Ibrahim, who was named AP Third-Team All-America, rushed 201 times (25th most in school single-season history) for 1,076 yards (23rd most in school single season-history) and 15 touchdowns (most ever for a junior at Minnesota and ranks fourth in school-single season history) in the abbreviated and unusual season. He led Big Ten in the following categories: rushing attempts (201), rushing yards (1,076), rushing yards per game (153.7), rushing touchdowns (15), scoring (90), points per game (12.9) and all-purpose yards per game (168.4).

In 2019, Fleck led Minnesota to historic heights as the Gophers won 11 games for the first time since 1904. Minnesota also won seven Big Ten games for the first time in school history, beat two top-10 teams, won a Jan. 1 bowl game and ended the season ranked No. 10.

Fleck was voted Big Ten Coach of the Year by his fellow conference head coaches and was named AFCA Region 3 Coach of the Year. He was also named a finalist for the George Munger Award, Dodd Trophy, Eddie Robinson Award, Bear Bryant Award and AFCA National Coach of the Year.

Minnesota won four Big Ten games by at least 20 points for the first time since 1934 and beat No. 5 Penn State at home and No. 9 Auburn in the Outback Bowl. That was the first time that Minnesota beat two top 10 teams in the same season since 1956. It was also the first time that Minnesota won a Jan. 1 bowl game since 1962. The Penn State win was Minnesota's first win against a top-five team since it beat No. 2 Penn State on the road in 1999. It was Minnesota's first home win against a top-five team since it beat No. 1 Michigan 16-0 in 1977. The Outback Bowl victory against Auburn was Minnesota's best ranked nonconference win in school history.

The Gophers ascended to No. 7 in the AP Poll, which was the team's highest ranking since it was No. 5 on Nov. 19, 1962. Minnesota was also ranked No. 8 in the College Football Playoffs, which is its highest CFP ranking in school history. The Gophers ended the year ranked No. 10, which was their best ranking to end a season since 1962. Minnesota averaged 34.1 points per game, which was the third most in school history. The Gopher defense allowed only 306.6 yards per game, which was the fewest since 1977.

On offense, Minnesota was led by quarterback Tanner Morgan (All-Big Ten Second Team), running back Rodney Smith (All-Big Ten Second Team) and receivers Tyler Johnson (All-Big Ten First Team) and Rashod Bateman (All-Big Ten First Team). Johnson and Bateman became the first teammates ever to both be named All-Big Ten First Team wide receivers.

Morgan set a slew of single-season school records, including passing yards, passing touchdowns and consecutive games with a touchdown. Smith rushed for more than 1,000 yards and became Minnesota's career leader in all-purpose yards. Johnson set single-season school records in receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns and left Dinkytown as the school's career record holder in receiving yards and touchdowns. Bateman was named Big Ten Receiver of the Year and was one of 12 semifinalists for the Biletnikoff Award as he set program records for a sophomore in receiving yards and touchdowns.

Minnesota's defense was anchored by Antoine Winfield Jr. (All-Big Ten First Team) and Carter Coughlin (All-Big Ten Second Team). Winfield was named the program's seventh Unanimous All-American and was one of five finalists for the Bronko Nagurski Award, which is presented to the best defensive player in the nation. He led Minnesota in tackles and tied a school modern-era record with seven interceptions. Coughlin ended his career as one of the best to ever wear the Maroon and Gold, and he ranks third all-time in sacks and fourth in tackles for loss.

In 2018, Fleck led Minnesota to a 7-6 record and regular-season wins against Wisconsin, Purdue, Indiana, Fresno State, Miami (Ohio) and New Mexico State. The Gophers beat Georgia Tech 34-10 in the Quick Lane Bowl and the 24-point margin of victory was the largest bowl win in school history. Minnesota also made history when it won the final game of the regular season (Wisconsin) and its bowl game (Georgia Tech), as that was the first time ever that the Gophers won the final game of the season and a bowl game.

Under Fleck, a young Minnesota team beat rival Wisconsin for the first time since 2003 and for the first time on the road since 1994 to claim Paul Bunyan's Axe. The Gophers also downed Purdue's potent offense, as they held the Boilers to a season low in points (10) and yards (233). Minnesota also beat Fresno State, which finished the season ranked No. 18, to give the Bulldogs one of their two defeats on the season. The win against Fresno State also marked the first time that Minnesota beat a team ranked in the final AP poll since 1999. The Gophers had 112 players on the roster and 58 (51.7%) were freshmen, which was the most in the nation in 2018. The Gophers had 78 underclassmen (69.6%), which ranked tenth in college football.

Fleck played two freshmen quarterbacks (Zack Annexstad, Tanner Morgan) and both threw for more than 1,200 yards and seven touchdowns. Minnesota's two leading rushers (Mohamed Ibrahim, Bryce Williams) were both freshmen and three of Minnesota top-four receivers (Rashod Bateman, Chris Autman-Bell, Demetrius Douglas) were freshmen. On defense, freshman Terrell Smith led Minnesota with eight pass breakups.

Minnesota set a program record as eight Gophers were named Big Ten Player of the Week (record was tied in 2019), and Tyler Johnson became the first Minnesota receiver ever to record 78 catches, 1,169 yards (single season school record) and 12 (single season school record) touchdowns in a season.

In 2017, Fleck led a young and inexperienced Gopher squad, as 49 of Minnesota's 110 players (44.5%) were freshmen or redshirt freshmen and 76 (69%) were underclassmen. Fleck guided Minnesota to a 5-7 record and those five wins were the most by a first-year Gopher head coach new to the program since the legendary Murray Warmath won seven games in 1954.

Fleck won his Gopher debut against Buffalo, which made him the school's first head coach to win his debut since John Gutekunst in 1986 (before Fleck, Minnesota's six most recent head coaches all lost their first game). Minnesota then posted a dominating 48-14 win at Oregon State, which made Fleck the first Gopher coach to win a true road opener since 1954 when Warmath and the Gophers won 46-7 at Pittsburgh.

Minnesota's 34-point win at Oregon State was the Gophers' 11th largest margin of victory in a road game since 1920 and largest since 2006. The 48 points were the most the Gophers scored on the road since they beat Northwestern 49-21 in 1980.

Minnesota posted three 30-point wins in 2017, as it beat Oregon State by 34, Nebraska by 33 and Middle Tennessee by 31. The last time Minnesota won three games by 30 points in the same season was 2005 when it started the year with three straight with three straight 30-point wins. The Gophers beat Nebraska 54-21 in Fleck's first season. The 54 points were the most that the Gophers scored in a Big Ten game since they beat Indiana 63-26 in 2006. The 54 points were the 14th most scored by Minnesota since 1946 and the fifth most against a Big Ten opponent in the same span.

Off the field, Fleck and his team can often be found at the University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital and annually host a diaper drive during training camp and a turkey drive during Thanksgiving to give back to the community. Minnesota has also hosted a canned food drive and school supplies drive under Fleck. In the classroom, Minnesota has posted program record GPAs under Fleck, which included a school record 3.33 cumulative team GPA after the 2020-21 academic year.

Fleck came to Minnesota after spending four years as the head coach at Western Michigan, where he was 30-22 overall and 21-11 in the Mid-American Conference. While leading the Broncos, Fleck authored one of the most memorable turnarounds in college football history. The Broncos were 1-11 in his first year in 2013, but ended the 2016 season with a No. 12 ranking, a 13-1 record, a conference championship and a berth in the Cotton Bowl.

The Broncos were 12-0 in the 2016 regular season and posted wins against Big Ten opponents Northwestern and Illinois. Fleck then led his team to a 29-23 win against Ohio in the Mid-American Conference championship game before ending the season with a narrow bowl game defeat to Wisconsin.

Fleck was named MAC Coach of the Year in 2014 and 2016 and in 2016 he the Broncos to their first MAC Championship since 1988. Earning FBS Region 3 Coach of the Year from the American Football Coaches Association, Fleck was also named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award and the George Munger Award after Western Michigan became the first team in MAC history to win each of its eight league games by 14 or more points.

Fleck turned Western Michigan into a pipeline for the NFL as well, as seven of his players were taken in NFL Drafts. Fleck coached receiver Corey Davis and offensive lineman Taylor Moton while at Western Michigan. Davis, who was the first Consensus All-American in Western Michigan history, caught 91 passes for 1,427 yards and 18 touchdowns in 2016. He ended his career with 5,212 yards in four seasons, which made him the Football Bowl Subdivision all-time career receiving record holder. Davis, who was selected fifth overall in the 2017 NFL Draft, joined Randy Moss as the only Mid-American Conference receiver to be drafted in the first round. Moton signed one of the NFL's most lucrative contracts (four-year, \$72 million) for an offensive lineman in July 2021.

Off the field, Western Michigan had a program-record seven student-athletes named to the 2016 MAC Distinguished Scholar Athlete team and the Bronco team posted a 3.14 program GPA in Fleck's last semester at the school.

Prior to his time at Western Michigan, Fleck served as the wide receivers coach for the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2012 and coached the receivers at Rutgers from 2010-11. He coached receivers and was the recruiting coordinator at Northern Illinois in 2009 and tutored the receivers for the Huskies from 2007-08. Fleck's coaching career began at Ohio State as a graduate assistant in 2006.

Fleck played receiver at Northern Illinois from 1999-2003 and helped lead the Huskies to a No. 10 ranking, a 10-2 record and wins against Maryland, Alabama and Iowa State in his final season. He ranks in the top five in Northern Illinois history in career receptions (179) and receiving yards (2,162). Fleck holds the school record for punt returns (87) and ranks second in punt return yards (716). He earned First Team All-Mid-American Conference in 2003 and was named Academic All-MAC and Second Team CoSIDA Academic All-American. He graduated in 2004 with a bachelor's degree in elementary education.

Fleck played the 2004-05 seasons with the NFL's San Francisco 49ers. He signed with the 49ers as a free agent in 2004 and spent most of his time on the practice squad before seeing action against New England late in the season. He spent the 2005 season on the injured reserve roster and in 2006 he stopped playing professionally and started his coaching career.

Fleck and his wife, Heather, have four children, Gavin, Carter, Paisley (P.J.) and Harper.

By applying ROW THE BOAT, one can have the proper perspective to overcome adversity and humble success by living a lifestyle dedicated to serving and giving.

FUTURE: When rowing a boat, as in life, you aren't able to see what is coming your way. Your back is actually facing the future, unable to see what's coming next. Facing the opposite direction can be a very scary and uncomfortable position to be in. However, as in life, worrying about the future only prohibits you from being your absolute best in the present. You aren't able to control the future, but you can control how you react and prepare for it with every stroke you take.

PRESENT: You are rowing in the present, which is the **ONLY** thing you can actually control while rowing a boat. You determine whether you take your oar out of the water or keep rowing. You control whether you ROW fast or slow, confident or hesitant, efficient or rushed and whether you ROW for yourself or others! If you stop rowing, you will not go anywhere. As a team, you control whether all of you want to ROW together with purpose, or ROW because you have to. If you ROW on just one side of the boat, you will go in circles. ROW in unison with everyone else in the boat, no matter the circumstance (chaotic storms or calm seas), you will come out on the other end better and more experienced for never quitting. Getting everyone in the boat to ROW, no matter what circumstances life throws you, can be very difficult; however... keep ROWING!

PAST: When rowing the boat, the only thing you can actually learn from, but can't change, is the horizon you are looking at. With every passing stroke you learn, but can never go back! You aren't able to change the past, only learn from it and take with you the lessons to make you better today. You must embrace and learn from your past to create your future! Changing your best daily will take you places you thought were impossible!
