Colorado Head Coach Karl Dorrell

Opening Statement

"We shot ourselves in the foot early on. We weren't playing physical, especially on defense. We got a lot of offside penalties and were a little bit out of rhythm on defense, figuring out what adjustments we needed to make. They played hard, just didn't play smart at times. They (Oregon) had opportunities to make plays in the passing game and in the running game. That's a little uncharacteristic for us as a defense, particularly when they get moving. We've got to go back to work and figure out how to get better every day. I've got a very disappointed defense in there that felt like they didn't play as good as they should.

Offensively I thought we made some progress. We kept fighting throughout the game and had some spurts where we had some quick series, but I thought this team played hard overall. Our offense made some tough plays in critical moments. There were some fourth downs we had to go for, had to extend some plays and we made those plays. The offensive line had some good protection. They made a lot of progress in a short week with a new coach at the o-line position. I was very encouraged and that's a step of progress there."

On Being More Encouraged

"I do feel better. The things that we did over the course of the week, we actually did a great job of executing those things. That's what they're buying into now, they know that if we have a good week of practice, this is what we can be. They're starting to understand that process."

On Nate Landman's Absence

"We're going to have to grow and it's next man up. Nate can't do everything, and I don't think he would've done everything today. It was a number of issues on the defensive side that we struggled with and I don't think Nate would've been the answer either. We've got to get better, it's the next man up theory and guys got to step up and make plays.

They (Oregon) got us today. They had the ability to run the ball and throw the ball without any real risk. That's unfortunate for us and hasn't been characteristic of our defense. I'm sure that they'll learn it when they watch the tape and we'll get some things fixed, and get back to where we're capable of playing."

On Landman's Status

"We'll see, he's feeling better. I know they're doing a lot of treatment. It's really a weekly thing and he's definitely feeling better. We want to do what's best for Nate too. He has a potential career beyond here, so I want to make sure he's ready to play. We know how he plays, he only plays one way and we don't want to jeopardize his career and all those things. He wants to play and we want him to, but want to make sure he's healthy enough to."

On Brenden Rice

"He's showing some big play potential, he's getting very confident and he's practicing that way too. That's the thing that's encouraging, when you have young players and they understand what practice should look like. He's starting to understand that formula and when you start making plays, the quarterback starts looking for you more. We're hopeful we'll be able to keep all of those receivers coming along."

On the Offense's Production

"That's something we've been lacking the last couple of weeks. It's a step in the right direction. [Oregon] is a very good team. They're the No. 7 team in the country. They're a good defense for us to come out and produce points. It's a step in the right direction. That's us growing up as an offense."

On the Offensive Line Gelling

"You have to come together no matter what. 'Come together' is a weird term to use for the [offensive] line. All five of you guys that play have to be on the same page. The other [offensive lineman] that travel have to be on the same page. We have to be together all the time. We have to be a unit all the time."

On Coach William Vlachos' Message to the O-Line

"Coach Vlachos made some scheme changes, some technique changes and explained things differently. We had a lot of work to do. We had to put in a lot of work and practice and meetings to get things corrected. When it's a new coach, you always hear the term 'new energy.' That's true. A different coach brings a different style. Guys respond to that differently. We saw some results today."

On Playing Better

"I think it's a good mixture of both. I think Coach Vlachos gave us some new tools. Those tools worked well. We knew that we had to come together as a group. We knew we had to perform more. We have to put in extra [work]. We knew that coming in. It's a combination of both."

On Players Responding to Coach Vlachos

"We're always going to listen to our coach's voice. It's something we've got to respond to at all times because coaches coach [while] players play. We've got to be able to take the coaching and move forward. His loud personality gets guys attention."

On If the Offense Gained Confidence

"I believe so. We've got to keep building on top of this."

On Scoring Two Touchdowns

"It felt nice, but it would have felt nicer to bust some more yards. I'll take what I can get."

On the Offense's Production

"It's good. We're keeping our heads down and keep grinding no matter what. We know we're going to bust something like that anytime. We've got to keep on the right track."

On Brendon Lewis Gaining Confidence

"I think he's always had the confidence. He hadn't put it together fully yet. This game proved what he can do in the passing game."

On the Offensive Line Playing Better

"It was a big difference, honestly. I was seeing more holes [opening up]. The protection was overall better, especially against that type of defense. They changed a lot up in practice. The way that they block and the way that they [block for] the run game and pass game overall. It makes a world of difference. That gives us as [running] backs confidence that if we hit [the hole at] full speed, it's going to be there."

On Being More Involved in the Passing Game

"It's never a bad thing. We do it all. We run and pass it."

**On the Offense Going for It on Fourth Down**

"When you're playing a team like this, we need points on the board. Sometimes three [points] won't cut it."

On Gaining Confidence from the Coaches Calling a Run Play on 4th-and-Goal -- "Definitely, especially when it's a run play. It means that he trusts me and the [offensive] line to get the job done."

On the Loss

"It came down to executing our assignments and paying attention to details. Our performance today was pretty unfamiliar overall. It will definitely be easy to go back, take notes and not make the same mistakes."

On Nate Landman Coaching Guys Up on the Sideline

"I give props to Nate. He was out there on the sidelines as if he was in the game. He's making sure guys are on their assignments. It came down to more, like I said, we've got to take on our roles and execute them no matter who's out there."

On His Interception

"We knew if we got the ball back, we could make this a game. That was the mindset from that point on. That's the mindset every down. We knew if we got the ball back it would make a difference in the game."

On Oregon's Athleticism

"We knew that their quarterback [Anthony Brown] was versatile. Their receivers are really good athletes. We made sure to have them schemed up and [we're] ready to play against them."

On Needing to Win with All Three Phases

"Right now, we need to play full-team football. All three aspects of our team need to be full go. I know we will execute the way we're supposed to. Special teams have been dominant all year. Our defense has been doing really well and the offense has found their spark. I'm excited to see these next four games and how we can compete."

On the Offense Playing Well Today

"I think it helped them more than anybody. We know that they can do that. Once they were starting to produce, we were like 'Okay, we've got a product here.' We can feed off each other."

On Feelings After Good Individual Performance Despite Loss

"Of course we had a loss today but you saw a lot of grow from our O-line, our QB's, receivers, all of us in general. Even our run game, running backs were making catches. They were running the ball explosively. Our line got pushed they were creating holes. So you just saw that jump from us as an offense. But there's no moral victory we didn't get the win so that's all that matters. "

On What He Saw Differently Today

"I'm going to give a big shout out to I believe (Coach Vlachos). First of all, he came out here and just he was already fired up. He fired the O-line up. The O-Line was fired up. So I guess a scene of change of intensity. Yeah, we went out with them, they let us out today. They set the example, they set tone and from that we just bounced energy off them."

**On How Guys Stepping Up In Practice Led To Their Game Performance**

"All that accountability because everybody started losing. I mean, we want to change the narrative honestly. You saw when passes were dropped, you wouldn't even have to tell a guy to do his push-ups. He would just get down. All these things it was more accountability at practice so like you didn't have you didn't have to go over to the guy you didn't have to mention it. He's going to go out and take care of it himself"

On Offense Moving The Ball

"I mean it feel great. I mean I'm happy B-Lew (Brendon Lewis). I'm happy for I mean that first touchdown I believe was Ty (Robinson). I'm happy for Alex (Fontenot) on that second touchdown. I'm happy for anybody who just went out there and balled out. It feels good after all the struggles and just to see everybody come about and make plays and that's what we've been looking for as an offense because we know we're explosive. We know how we have the capability to do these things it's just a matter of doing them. "

On His Touchdown Catch

"I'm just trying to sit down and find a hole on like a curl route. And out of nowhere, B-Lew just looks at I was like right in the middle of the hole he just kills it in there, bullet ball. That's the things we need from a quarterback. I'm happy to even see him do that. That was a confidence builder right there for me and him. That's a chemistry builder because that was in-between two guys. I was very also surprised, I was anticipating a hit.

On QB Brendon Lewis

"He came out just ready to go. He was calm, he was composed he was fluent in the pocket. That's also a big shout out to our O-line because they did their thing, so B-Lew was able to do those things. And like he made plays and I'm super proud of him. I mean, if you guys hadn't noticed, I don't think B-Lew had to pressure in the first half so that's a big step. I'm proud of everybody on that offense."

On His Kickoff Returns

"On that first one I thought I was going to take it to the house but out of nowhere I just see a flash of green or yellow or whatever and I just got hit. I was very disappointed. I was trying to get to the end zone all day. Big shout out to my kick return team because they were blocking their asses off for me today, and I couldn't ask for anything better from them."

On Offense Moving Forward

"I mean, the job's not finished. We've got to finish out the season, set the standard for next season. Like we still have I believe it's Utah, we have UCLA and Oregon State next week, and Washington. We still have those four teams to go out and play. We still got to finish all the way through. Utah's going to bring it, Oregon State's going to bring it, Washington and UCLA. All the teams are ready to go and we got to make sure that we're raising the standards and make sure that we're going to go out there and perform the right way. We need to perform better than what we did today."

Q. On the offense being more consistent this week...

CRISTOBAL: We certainly improved in a lot of areas offensively. Some young guys got some significant playing time as well. We mixed and matched the O-Line due to a couple guys who were nicked up and some other things we saw over the course of the week that we thought would give us an advantage. All in all, some positive steps and plenty of stuff to clean up and get better at.

Q. What is your general opinion of the game and the team's performance?

CRISTOBAL: I think we took control of the game relatively early. In the second quarter, they got a couple scores, but our defense immediately came out in the second half and shut the door. When it was 45-14, we wanted to play a lot of guys. Guys who not only were backups but guys down the line a little bit that deserve playing time that are going to possibly have to step up and we wanted to let them play. Some of them made some really good plays and some other things we have to fix. Then at the end of the game we just wanted to make sure we closed it out. We wanted to let them play as long as we possibly could and then finish off the game. We put some of our guys back in to make sure we put the game out of reach. All in all, a lot of positive stuff, a lot of stuff to build on. 24 hours on it and looking forward to getting back to work and working our 1-0 process again.

Q. On quarterback Anthony Brown's performance today...

CRISTOBAL: He had a really good day, was really efficient. The O-Line protected him really well, was accurate, the receivers made some plays for him, ran the ball well also, made some really good decisions in the run game - RPO game. Really good football game for him and for the offense. And lots of areas we can keep getting better at so it's pretty exciting for us right now.

Q. Can you talk a bit about Byron Cardwell and Devon Williams' performances today?

CRISTOBAL: Byron played really well. Seven played really well. Troy went out there and caught himself a touchdown. Certainly every single week Devon shows more. There's more in the tank there. We have to keep pushing and challenging him because there's a lot in there and he's gonna keep bringing it. I know he is. And again, just a lot of guys making plays. Mycah made a lot of really good plays as well. He was really effective in the punt return game as well. Just really proud of a lot of guys and the way that they played and looking forward to getting on that tape and finding areas where we can keep improving. But they were excited. They were excited to get out here at noon and play in front of our fans. They went out there and certainly did a lot of things well.

Q. You had some guys get banged up today. Do you have any updates?

CRISTOBAL: I think that Steve (Stephens) had a soft tissue injury. Verone (McKinley) is fine. Happle did not play today, but we expect him back next week. Forsyth we held out, he is closer. You guys have heard me say that every week, but we are still not quite there. Daymon is fine, it looked like a stinger or something of that nature. It really threw his body around in there. I think he is good. That about sums it up, unless you guys have another one on there.

Q. On the offensive line switching spots and needing to be versatile due to injuries...

CRISTOBAL: Walk has been off the charts. TJ (Bass) is very versatile and so is George (Moore). Sometimes when you run certain things schematically - from a man-blocking scheme or double team, gap zone, or pin-pull, you just really see guys do really well. I can't get into all the specifics of why we move guys and the advantages that it gives us, but we felt today was a really strong move that paid off really well for us. So, we felt that the assessment was a good one.

Q. What are your thoughts on the overall offensive production, especially the passing game?

CRISTOBAL: We have been getting better in the last couple weeks in the passing game. I know that Anthony has invested the world into that, and into his receivers and his offensive line, and the running backs as well. If you dig deep into the film, you'll see a guy like Seven McGee early in the game picking up pressure, a blitz, to provide time to get the ball off and provide a big play and create a first down, and an explosive pass. A lot of credit to Anthony (Brown), the receivers, the O-Line, the backs and the coaches put together a really good plan. I felt there are some things we could attack and we attacked it went really well today, we were really efficient with the ball, and we made plays. The ball was in the air, those 50-50 balls, we came down with.

Q. What went into getting Byron Cardwell and Seven McGee into the game early?

CRISTOBAL: We never set anyone to two, three, four or five. So, I want to make sure that is clear first and foremost. He has played really, really well in practice, and so has Seven. That thing was just about a toss up right before the game. They both equally deserve time, and they both did get time. Byron had some monster runs today. Seven had some really big ones as well, really important ones. Ever since camp, we knew that there was enough there to get these guys ready to play this year. The most important thing was getting them to understand the things that go with this offense - especially protection-wise. Then, all of your duties and obligations in that passing game. To be a complete back and to allow to the coordinator to call the game that he wants to call. It can't be a pick and choose you know what I mean? Those guys have got to know every single thing, every single concept that is tied into their assignment, and those guys are there right now mentally because they have worked at it. And you

have saw them, they can get physical today, they can get a full head of steam and they can lower their pads with those legs turning. I am proud of them and still lots of area where those guys can improve. Credit to Seven on the kickoff, that forced a fumble we should have gotten. So, both of those guys, watch them. They are really productive on special teams also.

Q. With injuries to the safeties do you anticipate adjusting your scheme next week? And do you need to change what you do in practice to avoid more injuries?

CRISTOBAL: Well, the injuries happen in the game, so I don't think there's anything that points to changing the way we practice. The second part is looking at our guys, I don't think we're going to lose more than one, if one, with what happened today. I'm very hopeful. But, if that is the case, and we do have some guys who cannot play, we'll mix and match and move guys around guys that have played corner or whatnot to nickel and safety positions. But, we feel that we have the depth necessary to adjust and move forward.

Q. How did Ty respond to the conversation about putting Anthony back into the game?

CRISTOBAL: The conversation? Well, there's really no conversation to be had. All the sudden, we let a lot of guys play, and it's a 16 point game. I want to make sure it's a three-score game. Ty's an excellent player. He's done some really good stuff. Yeah, he threw an interception today. We don't get down on our players when they don't perform to their capabilities. We just find a way to coach them better and come back. Ty is tough, and is an excellent player who will bounce back.

Q. Do you think you made a statement with this victory?

CRISTOBAL: Well, I think we showed out when we played our starters. When we play and execute, yeah, we're a really good football team — can be a really good football team. And I think what makes us good is that know we can get a lot better. That's the best way to put it. It's a hunger-driven team. We did some really good things today, some things we can do better. I'm not too concerned about that term 'style points.' I want to play our guys. I want to get our guys ready to go down this home stretch and have them get reps, and get experience playing so that when they do have to play, in critical parts of games down the line, that they are ready to play. That was the most important thing. We did that and still won a game comfortably. So, I think it speaks strongly about us. We certainly have big goals and expectations, but it all starts with the 1-0 and we're right back on that process.

Q. Anthony Brown has been self-critical throughout the season, does he also celebrate better games like this?

CRISTOBAL: The best part about him is he's just very real and very honest. So, I don't see an issue. I don't think a great day or a not-so-great day is going to make him move one way or the other way. He knows he's surrounded by people that appreciate him, love and support him, and that he is always willing to go the extra mile for the guys around him. So, I don't think outside noise affects us, it just doesn't.

Q. Where do you think Anthony Brown has improved his performance over the last couple weeks?

CRISTOBAL: Well, I mean time, reps, extra time invested. Certainly those guys spend a lot of time after practice, and then they get together at other times, I think. I don't know, but I see them all the time getting in the facility late in there, getting reps. That is the kind of guys that they are. They're just competitors and, again, the best part is that they know we have to get a lot better. They know there's a lot of meat left on the bone, but that and the coaching staff has poured into it a bunch and the offensive line continues to step up – running backs, the tight ends, everybody has just – the supporting cast continues to elevate their play – which in turn, as Anthony continues to elevate his play, his attention to detail, his accuracy, his decision making– all those things cumulatively add up to better play as an offense. But we gotta get a lot better, and we're looking forward to doing so this week.

Q. On Bryan Addison earning more playing time over the last few weeks..

CRISTOBAL: Bryan is a really unique athlete now – I mean not many guys that are almost 6-foot-5 that can play safety, and play corner as well. The past, I would say almost three weeks, there's been some marked difference in his approach to preparation. Your practice preparation will always equal your game reality, or something close to it. He's bought into that concept fully. It's paid off in more repetitions and then actual live play success. So, we think that this week, especially with the way and the things he did today, will generate some more enthusiasm and some more investment by him in the process, so that he can have even a better week and just come out next week and have the best game he's had.

Q. What did you think of the defense, especially late in the game?

CRISTOBAL: Well, later on in the game we gave up some points. We were playing a lot of different guys, mixing and matching some parts – which we don't want to do – and the truth of the matter is when we watch the film and we get with our players we're not gonna make excuses. 'Well we took out so and so or so and so wasn't playing' – Bologna! We're not gonna make excuses. We're going to grade and coach every single person on the team. Whether he's the first guy in or whether he's the fifth guy in, and our

guys will take pride in that. To play here you got to be able to handle the right type of constructive criticism, because when you're not playing to a certain level it comes with a challenge. And, a challenge is constructive. A challenge comes with a teachable moment – that's the way we coach. That's the way we approach this, okay? We're teachers, progression teachers, so that's how we want to approach this. I'm really looking forward to jumping on that film, because I did see a lot of guys that were just inches away from making a big play but all of a sudden - boom - they bust a play that costs us a 25 yard gain, or potential sack from across which - boom - we missed because we lose our balance and body control because our appetite goes through the roof, were about to get a sack and then we failed to realize we've got to come to balance and keep our eyes on those hips, so all those things are great teachable moments that we will jump all over tomorrow and look forward to getting our guys just back to work and getting focused on our next opportunity.

Q. Can you walk through the touchdown pass to Troy Franklin with the blitz pickup by Seven McGee?

CRISTOBAL: Yeah, tremendous recognition by Seven. First, the line making the right call. The quarterback knowing he is protected. Seven for identifying the blitz. We will be all over him about it to make sure that he meets him at the line of scrimmage, you know that any cushion you give up could end up in the quarterback's lap. I think he ended up grabbing onto Anthony's leg as he launched the ball. Everyone knew their assignment. Everyone tried to do it at the highest level, and that is a perfect example of 'Alright, Seven. Next time, this is going to happen an extra yard and a half to the yard closer to the line of scrimmage.' There won't be that distraction of a guy wrapped around Anthony's ankle, and the throw will come out cleaner. And then on the flip side is Troy finding himself open and then going up and pulling that ball down in traffic, because there were lots of hands and bodies over there. Two young guys working with an older guy. We are counting on all of them, so for those guys to actually get real live time together and having success doing so.

► **Records.** Oregon leads the all-time series with by a **14-9** margin (6-3 in Eugene, 6-1 with both as members of the Pac-12) ... C Colorado is now **5-10** all-time in the state of Oregon (3-7 in Eugene, 2-1 in Corvallis, 0-2 in Portland) and is **4-10-1** all-time on "Halloween Eve" ... Colorado is **25-99-3** all-time against Associated Press Top 10 teams, its last win coming over No. 3 Oklahoma in Boulder by a 27-24 score in 2007 (have dropped the last 165 encounters) ... CU won the coin toss, the sixth out of eight this year; dating back to 2016, **43** of the last **64** (which is **67** percent) ... The rare point total of **29** was actually the 14th time CU scored that amount in a game (last: vs. USC in 2013).

► **Productive Second Quarter.** Colorado had 152 yards in the second quarter, its most in a single quarter this season (precious most was 145 against Northern Colorado in the third quarter). The 14 points tied for the second most (but the most on offense; CU has 21 in the third quarter against Arizona but that included two by returns).

► **No Turnovers, Again.** For the fourth time this season, CU did not suffer a turnover and has just a total of six on the season (which entering today was the 12th-fewest in the nation).

► **Spreading the Wealth.** A season-high 11 different Buffaloes caught passes, with several making career-highs in receptions: Brenden Rice (5), Jarek Broussard (4), Chris Carpenter (2), Matt Lynch (2) and Ty Robinson (2); Deion Smith tied his high (2).

► **First Career Starts.** On defense, OLB Joshka Gustav and CB Tyrin Taylor made their first career starts.

WR Brenden Rice (5-102, 1 TD receiving; 1-17 rushing; 6-162 KOR; 281 all-purpose yards)

► Rice had the 25th 250-yard all-purpose yards game in CU history; the 281 yards rank 13th on the all-time list. The last one occurred last Dec. 5, when TB Jarek Broussard had 301 yards at Arizona (all rushing); the last one with yards gained in all three areas was on Nov. 23, 2007 (Hugh Charles: 169 rushing, 33 receiving, 125 kickoff return vs. Nebraska in Boulder).

► The 162 kickoff return yards tie for the sixth most; the six KOR returns tie the 10th-most.

► Rice had his second career 100-yard receiving game.

TB Alex Fontenot (8-42, 1 TD rushing; 2-7 1 TD receiving)

► His 2-yard reception on fourth down for CU's second TD was the first receiving TD of his career ... and CU's first receiving TD by a running back since Travon McMillian had a 57-yard one at Arizona on Nov. 2, 2018.

► First Buff to have a rushing and receiving TD in the same game since Laviska Shenault had two of each versus Arizona State in 2018.

QB Brendon Lewis (33-25-0, 224, 3 TD, 162.8 rating)

► He had a career-high three TD passes, along with a career-best completion percentage (75.8); second-best numbers for rating and yards.

► He became the 35th player in school history to pass for 1,000 career yards (1,016, ending the day in 34th).

SS Isaiah Lewis (5,2-7 TT, 1 INT)

► Lewis made his first career interception today, coming in the 35th game of his career.
