QUICKLY

► **Records.** Colorado now leads the series by a **16-9** count (7-5 in Boulder, 9-4 in Tucson) ... CU is now **18-11** this millennium (2000-present) in games preceding a bye week (**6-5** since joining the Pac-12) ... The Buffs are **68-80-2** all-time in night games (5 p.m. or later local time start; **25-43** on the road, **10-27** in Pac-12 league games) ... The Buffs are **0-5** for just the fourth time in its 133-year history (previous in 1980, 1984 and 2006).

► **First Possession Score.** The Buffs scored on their first drive of the game for the first time in 2022 (McCown 1-yard TD run) and a TD for the first time since Nov. 28, 2020 vs. San Diego State.

► **600.** Arizona had 673 yards on offense tonight; they were the last team to amass 600 in a regular season game against CU (616 in 2015); Texas gained 638 in the 2020 Alamo Bowl. It was the third time UA has put 600 on CU (also 670) in 2013, and overall, it was the most yards yielded since Oregon had 755, also in 2013.

► **Now it's 19.** Through five games, **19** different players have caught a pass for the Buffaloes – TB Charlie Offerdahl added to the list tonight – that ties the record for the most players catching at least one pass in season, previously done in 1999 and 2004.

► **First Road Game.** CU's seven true freshman quarterbacks are now 2-5 in their first road games. Marc Walters (at Kansas State) and Craig Ochs (at Texas A&M) won their first road games, which were also their first starts.

► **Remaining Disciplined.** CU's was flagged four times for 30 yards tonight, now just 22 times for 175 yards on the season. The defense has just three penalties (for 45 yards).

► **FIRST CAREER STARTS** three players made their first starts for the Buffaloes: **OT Gerad Christian-Lichtenhan**, **ILB Marvin Ham** and **TE Erik Olsen**. That brings the number of first-time starters this year to 19 (the most since 20 in 2019).

► **Freshmen Up The Middle.** Research isn't complete, but CU is at present the only team in 2022 to start true freshmen at quarterback and center in the same game.

► **FIRST ACTION AS BUFFALOES** One players saw his first action as a Buffalo: **SN Cameron Warchuck** (on punts). He's the 31st player to see first action in a Buff uniform in 2022 (the most since 32 in 2019).

INDIVIDUAL LINER NOTES

TB Charlie Offerdahl (3-18 rushing 1-36 receiving)

► He has now rushed for the most yards in a season by a walk-on in school history:

► His 36-yard reception was the longest by a walk-on (or former walk-on) since junior TE Scott Fernandez had a 71-yard reception for a TD at Arizona in 2012 (he was placed on scholarship for that fall).

TB Deion Smith (4-20 rushing, 1-41 receiving)

► The 41-yard reception was his career-long play; coming into the game, he had 13 career receptions for 62 yards, thus nearly doubling his output as a receiver.

S Trevor Woods (12 UT, 1 AT–13 TT)

► If they hold up in coaches video review, he had a career-high in both overall and solo tackles (topping 8 and 6, respectively at Air Force last month). He was also credited with four touchdown saves, a third down stop and a pass break up.
