BOULDER — Karl Dorrell's Colorado Buffaloes overcame a slow start to grind out a 35-7 win over Northern Colorado in both teams' season opener at Folsom Field.

While new CU mascot Ralphie VI had a successful debut in front of an enthusiastic crowd of 44,153, the Buffs offense struggled to find its footing early. But CU finally put two scores on the board in the second quarter while the defense produced a first-half shutout, then added 21 points in the second half to wrap up the win.

CU's Jarek Broussard ran 15 times for 94 yards and a touchdown as Colorado dominated the game on the ground. The Buffs finished with 383 yards total offense, including an overwhelming 281-17 edge on the ground as four different CU running backs found the end zone. CU freshman quarterback Brendon Lewis completed 10 of 15 attempts for 102 yards and a touchdown in his starting debut.

One big downside to the night proved to be penalties, as CU was flagged for 12 miscues for 117 yards. And both teams struggled offensively in the first half before CU finally found its footing early in the second quarter.

Thanks to a UNC penalty that kept a Buffs drive alive at the Bears 38, the Buffs took advantage of the opportunity to get to the end zone. Lewis hit tight end Brady Russell with a 7-yard pass, Broussard burst up the middle for a 12-yard gain and two plays later, he capped the drive with a 1-yard touchdown run.

CU's defense continued to keep the Bears bottled up and forced two more UNC punts before the Buffs struck again.

Colorado drove 56 yards in five plays for its second touchdown and a 14-0 lead. Broussard provided a big play with a 30-yard run down the left sideline before Lewis then found Montana Lemonious-Craig in the end zone with a 17-yard throw.

CU's defense then turned away UNC's most productive drive of the half. The Bears moved from their own 25 to the Colorado 15, only to see UNC quarterback Dylan McCaffrey overthrow his receiver, giving CU's Mekhi Blackmon an interception in the end zone.

After Becker hit the crossbar on a 53-yard field-goal try on CU's first possession of the second half, the Buffs took their next possession and hammered out their third scoring drive of the night.

Starting from its own 10-yard line, Colorado drove 90 yards in 16 plays for a touchdown, using 7:25 off the clock. Alex Fontenot performed the bulk of the work, carrying six times for 32 yards, including a 3-yard touchdown run to cap the drive.

UNC finally got on the board on its next possession, going 75 yards in seven plays. The Buffs helped the Bears on the drive with two costly penalties, including an unsportsmanlike conduct flag on fourth down. Northern Colorado finally reached the end zone when McCaffrey connected with Washington State transfer Kassidy Woods for a 34-yard touchdown pass to cut CU's lead to 21-7 at the end of the third quarter.

The Buffs, however, quickly answered. After a nice kick return by Brenden Rice to the CU 46, the Buffs went 64 yards in six plays for a touchdown. Ashaad Clayton finished the drive with a 1-yard scoring run for a 28-7 Colorado lead.

The Buffs then tacked on another touchdown to their total midway through the quarter after the defense held at midfield on fourth down. Deion Smith ran for 21 yards, Lewis connected with La'Vontae Shenault on a 23-yard pass and Smith then ran 7 yards for CU's fifth touchdown of the night and a 35-7 lead.

GAME NOTES

Colorado now leads the series by an 11-2 count (2-0 since the rivalry resumed in 2017 after being dormant since 1934). CU leads 7-1 in Boulder ... Tonight's attendance of 44,153 was bolstered late in the week by the announcement of Ralphie VI and an awesome turnout by the students; all 14,000 sport passes sold out (all-time student tickets sold were 14,442 in 1972, followed by 14,000 in 1990; 11,537 students were scanned in tonight) ... The Buffaloes are now 83-44-5 in 132 season openers, 55-20-1 at home; it was the first season opening win in Boulder since 2005, as most openers since 1988 took place in Denver ... Colorado is now 20-3 in non-conference regular season games dating back to 2013 ... CU is now 19-25 all-time on Fridays ... Karl Dorrell improved to 40-29 as a collegiate head coach 5-2 at Colorado) ... The late Hank Aaron would be proud: this was CU's 715th all-time victory (715-517-36) ... UNC had 18 rushes for 20 yards; it was the fewest in a season opener since 1996, when Washington State had 21 rushes for a net 5 yards ... CU did not turn the ball over (or even have a fumble) in its third straight season opener; it's the second turnover-free game under Dorrell ... Colorado was 5-for-5 in the red zone (5 TDs), and is now an incredible 54-of-58 over the last 16 season openers (93.1%; 39 TDs/15 FGs). CU is 19-of-19 in the last four season lid-lifters ... The last time four different running backs scored in a game was on Sept. 26, 2015 in a 48-0 win over Nicholls State.



TEXAS A&M 10 COLORADO 7 **SEPTEMBER 11, 2021** EMPOWER FIELD AT MILE HIGH, DENVER

DENVER — Colorado's defense played lights out all afternoon, but the Buffaloes' bid for an upset of No. 5 Texas A&M fell just short as the Aggies used a fourth-quarter touchdown to escape Empower Field with a 10-7 win.

The Buffaloes scored first, putting a touchdown on the board in the first quarter, but they never found the end zone again. Both teams missed field goals in the first half, and CU also came up short on a fourth-and-1 attempt at the Texas A&M 5-yard line in the second quarter while the Aggies lost a fumble in the end zone in the fourth quarter.

The Buffs stymied the high-powered A&M offense for 57 minutes before the Aggies finally put together a 77-yard scoring drive to take their first lead with just 2:41 left in the game.

Colorado's defense had an outstanding first half, dominating the Aggies for most of the first two quarters. CU forced six three-and-out possessions in the first half and held the Aggies without a first down until their final possession of the half.

Offensively, the Buffs started slowly — Brendon Lewis threw an interception on CU's first possession — but then found their ground game to reach the end zone.

After Colorado's defense forced its fourth straight three-and-out, the Buffs drove 69 yards in nine plays for a touchdown. Lewis carried three times for 48 yards on the march, including a 30-yard gain, before Jarek Broussard bulled in from 2 yards out for the touchdown. Cole Becker's PAT gave CU a 7-0 lead with 2:24 still to go in the first quarter.

Colorado's defense continued to hold the Aggies in check. With backup OB Zach Calzada at the helm after an early injury to starter Haynes King, A&M failed to collect a first down on its first six possessions.

The Buffs missed a chance to add to their lead early in the second quarter when a 46-yard field goal try went wide right and they came away empty again 10 minutes later after driving from their own 29 all the way to the A&M 5. Needing just 1 yard, the Buffs came up short on two straight plays and turned the ball over at the A&M on downs.

The Aggies finally got on the board late in the second quarter, driving 57 yards to the CU 23-yard line before settling for a 41-yard field goal just before halftime.

After a scoreless third quarter in which neither team could muster any kind of offensive threat, CU's defense came up with a huge play after the Aggies drove from their own 13 to the Colorado 13 midway through the fourth.

On third-and-13, Calzada scrambled from the pocket up the middle and lunged for the end zone, with the ball coming loose just as he reached the goal line. Officials initially signaled a touchdown, but upon review, changed the call to a fumble and CU recovery, protecting the Buffaloes' 7-3 lead.

Cornerback Mekhi Blackmon came up with the recovery, the second straight week he produced a turnover in the end zone (he had an interception last week vs. Northern Colorado).

But the Buffs could not move the ball on their ensuing possession and the Aggies moved from their own 23 to go 77 yards in 11 plays. Calzada threw an 18-yard scoring pass to Isaiah Spiller with just 2:41 left in the game.

CU couldn't move the ball on its next possession and turned the ball over on downs and A&M ran out the clock to escape with the win.

GAME NOTES

Colorado now leads the series by a **6-4** count (4-1 in Boulder, 2-2 in College Station, 0-1 in Denver) ... With the temperature 92 degrees at kickoff, it tied the sixth-warmest at kick in CU history, and tied for the second hottest in the state of Colorado (warmer: 94, CU vs. CSU in Denver on 9/1/2012; matched 92 vs. Kansas in Boulder, 9/24/1949 ... Colorado is now **12-55-1** all-time versus top 5 teams ... The last time the Buffs lost a game allowing 10 points or less was on Nov. 12, 1988 in a 7-0 loss at Nebraska (and a similar 10-7 loss to Oregon in Boulder in the '87 opener); CU had won **75** straight games when allowing 13 points or less ... Texas A&M ran 27 plays in the fourth quarter to CU's 6 ... There were just **four** plays (out of 142 scrimmage and returns) for 20-plus yards: one rush (30 by CU's Brendon Lewis), two receptions (29 and 25 by Jalen Wydermyer by and Devon Achane or A&M) and a 21-yard kickoff return by Achane ... The 10 points No. 5 Texas A&M scored today tied for the second fewest by a Top 5 team against a Colorado for A&M) and a 21-yard kickoft return by Achane ... The 10 points No. 5 lexas A&M scored today tied for the second fewest by a Top 5 team against a Colorado defense ... Colorado forced A&M into six straight three-and-outs to open the game (a missed FGA counts), and didn't allow A&M a first down until its 19th play (at the 1:50 mark of the second quarter) ... A&M was just 2-of-23 in second down efficiency for the game, and missed on its first 18 tries ... **P Josh Watts** (7-49.0 avg., 0 ln20, 1 TB; 41.9 net), had the best day of his career, including three punts of 50 yards or more, matching the total he had in his first 30 kicks as a Buff (he averaged 54.7 yards on three punts inside-the-CU 30) ... **ILB Nate Landman** (8,2—10 TT) had the 19th double-digit career tackle game of his career.





BOULDER — Colorado's offense struggled from the beginning and Minnesota's ground game wore down the Buffaloes' defense as CU dropped a 30-0 decision at Folsom Field.

The Gophers put two touchdowns on the board in the first half, then added two more touchdowns and a field goal after intermission to hand CU its first shutout loss at home since a 48-0 loss to Stanford in 2012.

CU's offense, meanwhile, never established any kind of consistency. Colorado finished with just 63 yards total offense, did not cross midfield until late in the second quarter and did not hit Minnesota territory again until late in the fourth. CU starting quarterback Brendon Lewis completed 8-of-16 pass attempts for 55 yards. Backup quarterback Drew Carter, who came into the game in the fourth quarter, led CU in rushing with 9 yards on two carries.

Minnesota finished with 441 yards total offense, including 277 on the ground. Trey Potts led the Gophers with 121 yards and three touchdowns on 26 carries. Quarterback Tanner Morgan was an efficient 11-for-17 for 164 yards passing.

Buffs linebacker Nate Landman proved to be one of the few bright spots for Colorado, finishing with 13 tackles (10 solo, three for loss) and a forced fumble. Linebackers Quinn Perry and Guy Thomas chipped in 10 tackles each.

The Gophers dominated from the beginning, driving for two touchdowns in the first half while the Buffs' offense could not move the ball.

CU finished the half with just 7 total yards, including minus-27 on the ground due in great part to four quarterback sacks by the Gophers.

Minnesota, meanwhile, used a solid ground attack to slowly hammer the Buffs. Colorado dodged a bullet early when the Gophers' first possession ended at the CU 6-yard line with a missed field goal, but UM came back to tally a pair of touchdowns.

The Gophers drove 82 yards in eight plays for their first touchdown, getting a 13-yard scoring run from Potts for a 6-0 lead (the PAT try was no good).

Following CU's fourth punt of the day, Minnesota marched 62 yards in six plays for its second touchdown. Potts carried in from 2 yards out for a 13-0 Gophers lead.

Colorado, meanwhile, never found an offensive rhythm. The Buffs managed just four first downs in the first half, with their longest series consisting of just six offensive snaps. The Gophers had all four of their sacks in the first half and CU's longest play of the half was an 11-yard completion from Lewis to Brenden Rice.

The Buffs dodged a bullet early in the second half when the Gophers missed another field goal attempt. But CU failed to move the ball, gaining just one first down and punted.

CU then forced a Minnesota punt and had decent field position at its own 40. But Lewis fumbled the ball away on the first play of the series and the Gophers then put the game away for all intents and purposes with a seven-play, 43-yard touchdown drive. Potts capped the march with a 3-yard scoring run with 23 seconds remaining in the third quarter to give Minnesota a 20-0 lead.

The Gophers then added a field goal and another touchdown in the fourth quarter to complete the scoring.

GAME NOTES

Colorado now leads the series by a 3-1 count (1-1 in Boulder, 2-0 in Minneapolis) ... The last time CU was shutout at home was on Nov. 2, 2012 in a 48-0 loss to Stanford; the last non-conference team to shutout CU in Boulder was Louisiana State on Sept. 15, 1979 (44-0) ... The last team to shutout Colorado at any location was Washington State in Pullman on Oct. 21, 2017 (28-0); CU had scored in 36 straight prior to today The 63 yards on offense was the eighthlowest in school history (the fewest since 46 against Oklahoma in the 2004 Big 12 title game at Kansas City). It was the third-lowest output in a home game (51 vs. Nebraska in 1964, 61 vs. USC in 2002) ... CU had just 7 yards of offense in the first half, the fewest since 29 years earlier, ironically at Minnesota when the Buffaloes had just 4 (CU rallied to win that game, 21-20) ... The scoreless first quarter was just the seventh involving the Buffaloes over the last 204 games (dating back to 2003); the first quarter against UNC was also scoreless; the last time there were multiple scoreless opening stanzas was in 2007, when there were three ... **P Josh Watts** (8-51.9 avg., 3 ln20, 0 TB; 46.4 net, 62 long) enjoyed the best game of his career for the second straight week, including five punts of 50 yards or more, including his career long of 62 (topping his 60-yarder in the 2020 Alamo Bowl). He averaged 51.9 for eight punts, the highest by a Buffalo with six or more punts since 2002, when Mark Mariscal had eight kicks for a 57.4 norm in a loss to USC at home (he went on to win the Ray Guy Award that season) ... ILB Nate Landman recorded 18 tackles (14,4—18 TT; 3 TFL, 1 3DS, 1 TZ), the 20th double-digit tackle game of his career, tying for fifth-most, and moved into the top 10 in tackles for loss with 39 (jumping from 11th into a tie for sixth) ... TB Alex Fontenot (3-4 rushing) finished the game with exactly 1,000 career rushing yards, the 55th Buffalo to reach that plateau.

TEMPE, Ariz. — Colorado finally ended its offensive drought, but it wasn't enough as the Buffaloes dropped a 35-13 decision to Arizona State at Sun Devil Stadium in the Pac-12 opener for both teams.

CU fell to 1-3 overall with its third straight loss and 0-1 in Pac-12 play while ASU improved to 3-1, 1-0.

Colorado's offensive struggles continued for much of the first half, as the Buffs came up empty on their first four possessions, one of which ended in a missed field goal.

Meanwhile, the Sun Devils found the end zone twice, with both scoring drives extended by third down penalties on CU.

ASU took its second possession 45 yards to the end zone, getting new life when a facemask penalty on third down negated a Colorado sack. Four plays later, Daniels scored from 7 yards out and the Buffs trailed, 7-0, with 7:45 to play in the first quarter.

Penalties plagued CU for much of the half, as they were flagged for six infractions for 59 yards in the first 30 minutes. CU finished with eight penalties for 84 yards.

After the two teams traded punts following ASU's score, the Buffs finally drove into Arizona State territory. CU's Brendon Lewis ran for 42 yards on back-to-back plays before the drive stalled at the ASU 28. A 46-yard field goal try, however, was partially blocked and the Buffs came away empty.

ASU then took advantage of another Colorado penalty on the ensuing possession. The Buffs forced an incompletion on third down, but a roughing the passer penalty kept the drive alive and Rachaad White scored from 11 yards out on the next play to extend ASU's lead to 14-0.

The Buffs finally ended their scoreless streak at eight quarters late in the half. CU drove 58 yards over the final three minutes before getting a 51-yard Becker field goal with 13 seconds left in the half, sending CU to the locker room trailing 14-3.

Finally putting points on the scoreboard seemed to inspire the Buffs as they took the opening kickoff of the second half and drove 75 yards to the end zone. Jarek Broussard had two carries for 20 yards to open the drive before Lewis dropped a jet sweep pass to freshman receiver Ty Robinson, who raced 26 yards upfield.

Alex Fontenot then took over, carrying five times in a row for 29 yards, capping the drive with a 1-vard dive into the end zone. Becker's PAT pulled the Buffs to within 14-10 with 11:01 still to play in the third quarter.

Colorado's momentum, though, didn't last long, as the Sun Devils quickly answered with a long drive of their own. ASU's Jayden Daniels completed three passes for 42 yards, setting up a 17-yard touchdown carry on a reverse, giving ASU a 21-10 lead midway through the quarter.

Colorado managed to move close to midfield on its next possession, but a dropped pass on third down ended the drive.

ASU then extended its lead to 28-10 two possessions later on a trick play when wide receiver Ricky Pearsall threw a 30-yard touchdown pass to White.

After another Colorado punt, the Sun Devils capped their evening with a 59yard scoring drive, with Daniels scoring from 15 out to wrap up the march for a 35-10 lead.

CU did get on the board once more, driving 61 yards before settling for a 33-yard Becker field goal late in the fourth quarter to complete the scoring for the night.

BOULDER — Colorado's defense couldn't contain Southern California's high-powered offense and consistency continued to evade the Buffaloes' offense as CU dropped a 37-14 decision at Folsom Field.

Colorado fell to 0-15 all-time vs. the Trojans.

USC scored the first 20 points of the game before the Buffs finally put together a touchdown drive following a forced fumble and recovery by the defense late in the second quarter.

The Trojans then built their lead to 30-7 in the third quarter before CU scored again to pull within 30-14 heading into the final period. But the Trojans put the game away with one more touchdown early in the fourth quarter.

CU quarterback Brendon Lewis had his most productive game of the season, completing 10 of 17 passes for 162 yards, one touchdown and an interception. Brady Russell caught three passes for 87 yards, including a 65-yard reception (CU's longest play of the year) and the Buffs finished with 234 yards total offense.

But USC finished with 494 yards offense, with quarterback Kedon Slovis throwing for 276 yards and three touchdowns. Wide receiver Drake London had nine catches for 130 yards and a score.

The Trojans went 70 yards in 14 plays before settling for a field goal on their first possession, then added their first touchdown of the game following a CU punt. Slovis capped the drive with a 1-yard touchdown pass to London for a 10-0 lead, set up by a 28-yard completion to London.

Colorado's offense continued to struggle into the second quarter and the Trojans added another touchdown and field goal for a 20-0 lead.

While Colorado's offense managed just 40 yards on its first five possessions, CU's defense could not take advantage of good field position. The Trojans' first three scoring drives covered 70, 64 and 85 yards.

But the CU defense finally did come up with a big play late in the second quarter when linebacker Guy Thomas forced a USC fumble. Cornerback Christian Gonzalez recovered at the Trojan 48-yard line, giving CU its first takeaway in three games.

Colorado's offense took advantage of the opportunity, as the Buffs drove 48 yards for their first score of the game. Lewis completed passes of 7 yards to Dimitri Stanley and 13 to Russell, with Jarek Broussard adding a 19-yard run. Alex Fontenot then put the Buffs at the 1-yard line with a 5-yard burst before Deion Smith scored from 1 yard out and Cole Becker's PAT cut USC's lead to 20-7 at intermission.

But the Trojans extended their lead with 10 more points in the third quarter. USC added a field goal on its first possession after CU's Lewis was hit in the pocket and turned the ball over, then added a touchdown after taking over on downs near midfield on downs for a 30-7 lead with 6:52 left in the third.

Colorado finally answered with a 75-yard touchdown drive, fueled by a 65-yard Lewis pass to tight end Brady Russell, the Buffs' longest play of the year. Two plays later, Lewis connected with Chase Penry for a 2-yard touchdown pass with 5:18 left in the third quarter, giving the freshman receiver his first career TD catch.

USC finally put the game away for good early in the fourth quarter. After the Trojans claimed their second takeaway of the game — an interception by Lewis — USC went 35 yards for a touchdown, with Slovis throwing 15 yards to Gary Bryan for the score and 37-14 lead with 14:08 to play in the game.

GAME NOTES

USC now leads the series a 15-0 count (8-0 in Boulder, 7-0 in Los Angeles) ... The Buffaloes are now 24-31-1 all-time when wearing all black uniforms (0-5 vs. USC) ... CU has won four of five coin tosses this year, and dating back to 2016, 41 of the last 61 ... Weird Stat of the Game: the bulk of the yards in this game came on second down conversions: CU gained 158 yards on its 11 second down makes, while USC had 168 on its second down conversions (CU was 11-of-22 on second down compared to 1-of-10 on third) ... Five "new" NFL teams scouted the game, bringing the total to 23 that have seen CU games in person in 2021 ... Colorado has run just 289 plays on offense through five games (57.8 per; high of 64 in the opener against UNC; the last time CU didn't have a game with at least 70 plays in the first five of a season was in 2006, and before that, 1986) ... CB Nigel Bethel, Jr., and ILB Jack Lamb made their first career starts as Buffaloes; DT Mustafa Johnson made his first start of the season in the first game he became eligible ... It was the most penalties by an opponent since USC had 13 in the 2018 game and the most yards since Arizona had 129 later than same season ... TE Brady Russell (3-87 receiving) had career-highs for yards (87) and long reception (65), topping his previous bests of 77 and 34, respectively, against UCLA in 2020. It was just the second time since 2012 that a tight end led the Buffs in a game in receiving yards, and he had the other (5-77 vs. UCLA in 2020); it matched the most yards by a Buff tight end in a game also since 2012, when Nick Kasa caught three passes for 87 yards in CU's 35-34 win at Washington State, and the most in a home game since Oct. 20, 2007 (Tyson DeVree, 7-90 and a TD in a 19-14 loss to Kansas).





BOULDER — Colorado's defense and special teams provided a scoring boost and the Buffaloes recorded three touchdowns in a five-minute span, paving the way for a 34-0 win over Arizona at Folsom Field.

The Buffs ended a four-game losing streak while UA lost its 18th straight game.

CU led just 6-0 at intermission after getting two first-half field goals. But the Buffs recorded a 36-yard blocked punt scoop-and-score from Trevor Woods midway through the third quarter, then added a 50-yard interception return for a score by defensive end Carson Wells for a 20-0 lead with 5:32 left in the period.

CU's offense then stamped the exclamation point on a 21-point third quarter surge with a perfect 62-yard touchdown strike from quarterback Brendon Lewis to wide receiver Brenden Rice. Colorado's longest scoring play of the year gave the Buffs a 27-0 lead on the back of three touchdowns in a five-minute span — one from special teams, one from the defense and one from the offense.

Lewis then threw an 11-yard scoring pass to Dimitri Stanley in the fourth quarter to complete the scoring and wrap up his best day as a Buff. Lewis finished 12-for-19 for 248 yards and two scores.

CU's defense, meanwhile, was outstanding from beginning to end in recording the first CU shutout of an opponent since a 48-0 win over Nicholls State in 2015. The defense also produced two interceptions, held Arizona to just 3-for-15 on third-down conversion tries, and limited the Wildcats to just 280 yards total offense.

CU also had nine tackles for loss in the game, including four by Wells.

Defense ruled in the first half, as both teams came up with big red zone stops — but the Buffs had the biggest, when they stopped Arizona four straight times from the Colorado 1-yard line.

CU did manage to put two field goals on the board in the first half for a 6-0 lead at intermission.

But it was the Buffs' third-quarter surge that made the difference, starting with Woods' blocked punt after Colorado's defense forced Arizona's sixth punt of the day. The true freshman broke through the line, got inside the upback and got a hand on Kyle Ostendorp kick; he then scooped up the ball and raced 36 yards to the end zone for CU's first touchdown of the day and a 13-0 lead.

Colorado's defense then got in on the scoring action on UA's next drive when Wells picked off UA quarterback Gunner Cruz and rumbled 50 yards to the end zone, bumping the Buffaloes' edge to 20-0.

On the Buffs' next offensive possession, Lewis uncorked a perfect deep ball to a speeding Rice down the sidelines. Rice gathered in the pass in stride and raced to the end zone for a 27-0 lead.

The Buffs completed the scoring with 4:08 left in the game when Lewis hit Dimitri Stanley in the end zone with an 11-yard scoring pass.

The Buffs took the lead on their first possession of the game, going 68 yards in 10 plays before settling for a 19-yard Cole Becker field goal with 8:26 to play in the first quarter. CU added another field goal midway through the second quarter, going 61 yards in seven plays.

Colorado's defense then came up with a terrific goal-line stand. After the Wildcats had punted on their first four possessions, they finally put together a long drive, going from their own 25 to the CU 1-yard line for a first and goal.

But the Buffs defense came up with four straight stops for no gain, with Gunner Cruz throwing incomplete on fourth down.

Dating back to the fourth quarter of the Texas A&M game, the Buffaloes had been outgained, 1,975 to 818; but today, CU outgained Arizona, 365-280 ... S Trevor Woods blocked punt was CU's first since Alex Fontenot blocked punts at Cal (Nov. 24, 2018) and against Utah (Nov. 17, 2018), and CU's first blocked punt return for a TD since Lawrence Vickers recovered a punt in the end zone against Washington State in Seattle on Sept. 11, 2004 ... OLB Carson Wells' interception return for a TD was the first since Dante Wigley returned one 27 yards for a score against Oregon State in Boulder on Oct. 27, 2018 and the first by a CU linebacker since 2016 ... CU shutout an opponent for the first time since a 48-0 blanking of Nicholls State on Sept. 26, 2015; it was CU's first shutout over an FBS opponent since a 34-0 win at Oklahoma State on Oct. 1, 2005; it was the third time CU shutout an Arizona team (others: 14-0 in Boulder in 1955 and 18-0 at Tucson in 1959).





BERKELY, Calif. — Colorado's offense couldn't maintain its momentum from a win over Arizona and CU's defense had no answer for Cal quarterback Chase Garbers as the Buffaloes dropped a 26-3 decision at FTX Field.

Karl Dorrell's Buffs fell to 2-5 overall and 1-3 in Pac-12 play while the Bears improved to 2-5, 1-3.

Colorado could never get untracked offensively and the defense could not contain Cal's offense early. The Bears scored on all five of their first-half possessions while the Buffs could muster only a field goal and trailed 23-3 at intermission.

Colorado's defense stiffened in the second half and held the Bears to just one field goal. But the CU offense never crossed midfield after intermission, managing just 13 yards total offense over the last two quarters.

CU finished with only 104 yards total offense while the Bears compiled 438 (225 passing, 213 rushing). Garbers threw for 225 yards and two touchdowns and also ran for 96 yards.

Buffs starting quarterback Brendon Lewis, who was sacked six times, was nine-for-17 for 69 yards. Lewis was replaced by true freshman Drew Carter late in the fourth quarter.

Colorado linebacker Nate Landman, who surpassed 400 career tackles in the game, and defensive back Mekhi Blackmon were each credited with 10 tackles.

Colorado's offensive struggles returned in a big way in the first half, with the Buffs managing just 91 total yards while Cal rang up 297 in taking a 23-3 lead at intermission.

The Bears collected a field goal on their opening drive, then took over at midfield after Colorado couldn't convert a fourth-and-1. Broussard was stopped for a 1-yard loss, making it the seventh time in eight tries this year that Colorado failed to move the sticks on fourth down tries, and the Bears took over at the 50.

Cal quickly cashed in on the short field with a 50-yard scoring march in three plays. Garbers completed a 24-yard scoring pass to Keleki Latu for a 10-0 lead with 6:05 still to play in the first quarter.

The Bears then added another field goal early in the second quarter before the Buffs finally got on the board.

Thanks to a 67-yard kickoff return by Brenden Rice, the Buffs took over on the Cal 33-yard line. But after gaining a first down on a Cal penalty, the CU drive stalled at the Cal 15 and the Buffs settled for a 33-yard Cole Becker field goal to cut their deficit to 13-3.

The Bears added another touchdown on their next possession, getting a 31-yard scoring pass from Garbers to tight end Gavin Reinwald.

CU could not move on the ensuing possession and Cal went 50 yards in seven plays over the remaining 58 seconds to get a field goal on the final play of the half for a 23-3 lead at intermission.

CU's defense made some halftime adjustments and held Cal at bay for the entire third quarter, but the Buffs offense could not take advantage. Colorado's longest drive of the half covered just 15 yards.

The Bears added one more field goal in the final period to complete the scoring.

The Buffs were dominated in virtually every statistical category. CU finished 3-for-12 on third downs — none in the second half — while Cal converted six of its 15 tries. The Bears finished with 23 first downs while the Buffs had just seven; and CU averaged just 2.3 yards per offensive play while the Bears averaged 6.3.

EUGENE, Ore. — Colorado's defense struggled without injured linebacker Nate Landman but the offense provided a bright spot in a 52-29 loss to No. 7 Oregon at Autzen Stadium.

The Ducks scored on all five of their possessions in the first half — four touchdowns and a field goal — to take a 31-14 lead at intermission, then added two more touchdowns on their first two possessions of the second half.

But CU's offense did find some life, putting together two long touchdown drives in the second quarter and two more in the fourth. The Buffs had 152 yards total offense in the second quarter, their most productive quarter this year, and finished with 341, the third-highest output of the season and the second-most in Pac-12 play.

The Ducks took control early, going 67 yards on their first possession for a touchdown, then adding scoring drives of 78 and 90 yards on their next two possessions.

Colorado finally got on the board in the second quarter when quarterback Brendon Lewis engineered a nine-play, 77-yard touchdown drive.

Lewis completed three passes on the drive, including a 28-yarder to tight end Brady Russell. The Buffs gained 40 yards on the ground on the march, with Alex Fontenot, Deion Smith and Jarek Broussard all picking up nice gains.

The Buffs then capped the march with a 9-yard pass from Lewis to Ty Robinson, giving the freshman receiver his first collegiate score. Cole Becker's PAT pulled the Buffs to within 21-7 with 9:10 still left in the first quarter.

But the Ducks answered with another long touchdown march, going 73 yards in 10 plays.

Colorado, though, stayed within striking range as CU took the ensuing kickoff and drove 65 yards in eight plays for a touchdown. Lewis had completions of 26 and 36 yards to Rice before finding a wide open Fontenot on fourth-and-goal from the 2-yard line for the score to pull CU to within 28-14.

But the Ducks had an answer again, using the remaining time on the clock to drive downfield and collect a field goal just before the half ended for a 31-14 lead.

Oregon left no doubt about the outcome early in the third quarter. The Ducks forced a CU punt on the Buffs' opening possession, then drove 68 yards for a touchdown. Oregon's sixth score on its sixth possession gave the Ducks a 38-14 lead with 9:46 to play in the third quarter.

The Ducks then made it 7-for-7 after another Colorado punt. The Ducks went 81 yards in six plays, with QB Anthony Brown capping the drive with his third touchdown pass of the day, a 25-yard strike to Devon Williams for a 45-14 lead late in the third quarter.

But the Buffs didn't go away quietly, adding two fourth quarter touchdowns to throw a minor scare into Oregon.

CU scored early in the fourth period, driving 67 yards in 17 plays. CU converted its third fourth-down try of the day, getting a 1-yard touchdown run from Fontenot on fourth-and-goal to pull within 45-21.

Then, following an interception by safety Isaiah Lewis, the Buffs went 65 yards for their fourth touchdown of the day. CU kept the drive alive by converting yet another fourth-and-1 on a Smith run, then capped the drive with a 16-yard Lewis pass to Rice. Lewis then added a two-point conversion throw to Chase Penry, and CU trailed 45-29 with 6:04 to play.

But the Ducks quickly turned the game back into a three-score contest, driving 46 yards in eight plays on their ensuing possession for the final score of the game with just 50 seconds remaining (though most teams would have taken a knee that late).

BOULDER — Colorado's Cole Becker kicked a 43-yard field goal in the second overtime to lift the Buffaloes to a 37-34 win over Oregon State in front of a Folsom Field homecoming crowd of 47,984.

The Buffs led for most of the game (over 49 minutes), but were forced to rally late in the fourth quarter. A 16-yard Brendon Lewis touchdown pass to Montana-Lemonious Craig gave CU a 27-24 lead with 2:24 left to play.

OSU's Everett Hayes then missed a 51-yard field goal on the Beavers' next possession, but CU couldn't move the ball after taking over and punted, using just 27 seconds off the clock.

The Beavers reaped a 26-yard return to take over a midfield with five seconds remaining. That was enough for a 9-yard gain on first down, then a 60-yard field goal from Hayes as time expired to send the game into OT.

Both teams scored touchdowns in the first overtime, with Lewis cashing in for the Buffs on a 9-yard run for a 34-27 lead.

But after tying the game with a touchdown, the Beavers then came up empty on their next possession when Hayes was wide left on a 38-yard try.

The Buffs then ran the ball three times before Becker booted the game winner.

The Buffs, who hadn't scored a first-quarter touchdown since the second game of the season, broke that drought against the Beavers.

 $\hbox{\rm CU}$ took the opening kick and marched to the OSU 5-yard line before settling for a 28-yard Becker field goal.

But the Colorado defense quickly gave the offense another possession by forcing a three-and-out from the Beavers, and the offense took full advantage.

Moving from their own 21, the Buffs drove 79 yards in seven plays to find paydirt. Lewis capped the drive when he found a wide-open Daniel Arias from 43 yards out for a touchdown and Becker's PAT gave CU a 10-0 lead with 6:47 still to play in the first period.

But the Beavers finally found their run game on the ensuing possession. OSU marched 75 yards in 13 plays and got a 14-yard scoring run from Jack Colletto on fourth-and-1 to cut Colorado's lead to 10-7.

Colorado pushed its lead to 13-7 late in the second quarter when Becker delivered a career-long 52-yard field goal with 39 seconds left in the half.

That, however, was just enough time for the Beavers to drive within field goal range, and a 45-yard Hayes field goal as time expired sent Colorado into intermission with a 13-10 lead.

The two teams traded punts early in the third quarter before CU defensive end Carson Wells came up with a big fourth-down play, forcing an incompletion from OSU quarterback Chance Nolan.

That gave the Buffs the ball at the OSU 41-yard line. Six plays later, including runs of 14 and 16 yards from Jarek Broussard, Lewis found Brenden Rice for a 5-yard touchdown pass to give CU a 20-10 lead.

But the Beavers quickly answered, going 75 yards for a touchdown to cut Colorado's lead back to three, 20-17 with 3:19 to play in the third quarter.

OSU then took its first lead of the game midway through the fourth on a 27-yard Nolan pass to Tre'shaun Harrison for a 24-20 edge.

Colorado regained the lead two possessions later. A 49-yard Broussard run put Colorado deep in OSU territory. Six plays later Lewis stepped up in the pocket under pressure and connected with Lemonious-Craig giving CU the lead back with 2:24 to play.

That set the stage for the wild final two minutes of regulation and overtime.

The game time temperature of 73 was warmer than CU's four October games (66, 64, 62, 52) ... The series is now tied 6-6 count (CU leads 4-3 in Boulder) ... Colorado is now 8-9 in overtime games (1-3 multi-OT: 1-2/2OT, 0-1/3OT). It was the 8th time CU started on offense ... CU improved to 65-36-5 record in Homecoming contests (winning four of the last five) and to 69-24 against unranked teams in the month of November dating back to 1985 ... Colorado had 144 yards in the first quarter, its most in an opening quarter this season (previous: 127 against Texas A&M); CU scored on the back-to-back possessions to open a game for the first time this season ... The 10 points in the first quarter matched the total CU had in the first eight first quarters in 2021 ... For the fifth time this season (and second straight game), CU did not suffer a turnover; it has just six on the season (third-fewest in the nation). UCLA 44 COLORADO 20 NOVEMBER 13, 2021 ROSE BOWL, PASADENA

PASADENA, Calif. — Colorado jumped out to a 20-7 first-half lead, only to see UCLA score 37 unanswered points as the Buffaloes dropped a 44-20 decision at the Rose Bowl.

The loss dropped Karl Dorrell's Buffs to 3-7 overall and 2-5 in the Pac-12, and eliminated the Buffs from postseason contention. The Bruins improved to 6-4 and 4-3 to clinch bowl eligibility.

The Buffs started quickly, taking a 10-0 lead for the second week in a row.

CU took its second possession and drove 70 yards for a touchdown. Jarek Broussard had a 16-yard run on the march, quarterback Brendon Lewis converted a third-and-3 with a 4-yard run and completed three passes on the drive. Ale Fontenot wrapped up the march with a 1-yard scoring burst for a 7-0 Colorado lead.

The Buffs then got a break on UCLA's second possession when a Zach Charbonnet 51-yard run was nullified by a Bruins penalty, and another break on UCLA's next turn with the ball when a 40-yard touchdown pass was negated by another penalty.

Colorado took advantage by driving 56 yards deep into UCLA territory before settling for a 23-yard Cole Becker field goal and 10-0 lead.

But the Bruins finally found the end zone on their next possession. Dorian Thompson-Robinson guided a 64-yard touchdown march in just three plays, with the big gainer a 47-yard toss to Kyle Philips.

The Buffs, though, had an answer, going 75 yards to the end zone in six plays. Broussard covered the bulk of the march with a 46-yard run before Fontenot scored his second touchdown of the game, another 1-yard burst with 5:22 to play in the half for a 17-7 CU lead. The Buffaloes then pushed their margin to 20-7 with just 57 seconds left in the half on a 40-yard Becker field goal.

But that left the Bruins enough time to maneuver into position for a field goal as the half ended, sending CU into the locker room with a 20-10 lead.

The Bruins opened the second half with a bang. UCLA drove 76 yards for a touchdown on its opening possession to pull within 20-16 after the PAT try clanged off the upright.

Colorado then punted on its next possession and UCLA needed just 1:54 to drive 83 yards in seven plays for the go-ahead touchdown. Thompson-Robinson ran 23 yards for the score and Colorado trailed for the first time in the game, 23-20.

CU had one more chance to pull back into the game. After UCLA's second touchdown of the half, the Buffs drove to the Bruins 25, but Becker was wide right on a 43-yard field goal try.

The Bruins then marched 75 yards for their third touchdown of the quarter, getting a 3-yard Zach Charbonnet run for the score and a 30-20 lead with just 30 seconds left in the period. The Bruins had 219 yards of offense in the period, including 149 on the ground.

Down by 10, the Buffs then gambled early in the fourth quarter by trying to convert a fourth-and-1 in their own territory. But tight end Brady Russell, lining up as the fullback, was stopped for no gain and the Bruins took possession. UCLA then drove 34 yards for its fourth touchdown in four possessions for a 37-20 lead with 12:12 left in the game.

Colorado's offense failed to move the ball again and the Bruins put the game away for good when Philips returned a Josh Watts punt 82 yards for a touchdown. The PAT provided UCLA with its 37th unanswered point and a 44-20 lead with 10:10 to play.

COLORADO 20 WASHINGTON 17 NOVEMBER 20, 2021 FOLSOM FIELD, BOULDER

BOULDER — Colorado's defense produced four takeaways and the offense came up with a game-clinching 90-yard touchdown drive as the Buffaloes claimed a 20-17 win over Washington at Folsom Field.

Washington dominated nearly every statistical category except one — turnovers. CU's defense collected two interceptions and two fumble recoveries while the Buffs offense did not turn it over once. CU's defensive takeaways included an 88-yard scoop-and-score by linebacker Jack Lamb in the first quarter that gave CU a 10-0 lead; a Robert Barnes interception to stop a UW drive in the third quarter; a Barnes fumble recovery that CU converted into a field goal in the fourth quarter; and an interception by Nikko Reed that opened the door for the Buffs' game-clinching touchdown.

CU started by taking the opening kickoff and marching 58 yards before settling for a 35-yard Cole Becker field goal and 3-0 lead.

The Huskies then took the ensuing kickoff and drove to the CU 3-yard line for a first and goal. But following a timeout, UW quarterback Dylan Morris fumbled the snap and Colorado's Lamb alertly scooped up the loose ball and rumbled 88 yards for a touchdown.

But the Huskies finally answered, going 59 yards on their next possession for a field goal to cut Colorado's lead to 10-3.

Colorado's offense then stalled while the defense held, resulting in five consecutive punts before Washington tied the game with a 40-yard scoring drive. The Huskies used seven plays to reach the end zone, getting an 8-yard Dylan Morris pass to Rome Odunze to knot the game at 10-10.

Washington threatened to score twice early in the third quarter, but both times Colorado produced drive-stopping moments. A Barnes interception of a tipped ball stopped one UW drive at the Colorado 36, and following a CU punt, a Mustafa Johnson sack of Morris forced the Huskies to attempt a 49-yard field goal that sailed wide left.

Colorado's defense came up with another big play late in the third quarter when Barnes recorded his second takeaway of the day, pouncing on a UW fumble deep in Huskies territory. The Buffs couldn't get into the end zone, but did get a Becker 22-yard field goal with 14:35 left in the game to take a 13-10 lead.

The Buffs added another takeaway on UW's next possession. After the Huskies drove to the Colorado 28, Reed came up with a big interception in the end zone.

Following a penalty, CU then drove 90 yards for the clinching touchdown. The drive was kept alive when a UW penalty on third down gave the Buffs new life, and the Buffs followed with a 15-yard Brendon Lewis completion to Chris Carpenter and a 26-yard run by Jarek Broussard to the UW 14-yard line.

Five plays later, Lewis rolled to his right, then tucked the ball and headed for the pylon, diving to the end zone for a 2-yard touchdown and 20-10 Colorado lead.

Washington quickly answered, driving 75 yards in just five plays, getting a 55-yard touchdown pass from Morris to Ja'Lynn Polk to narrow CU's lead to 20-17 with 2:30 left in regulation.

Washington then got one more chance with the ball, taking possession with two minutes left. But the Buffs held, getting a pass knockdown from Terrence Lang on third down and a quarterback pressure from Carson Wells on fourth down to force an incompletion.

CU then took victory formation to run out the clock, with senior linebacker Nate Landman, who didn't play defense because of an injury, lining up in the backfield for the final few snaps of his final game at Folsom.

NOVEMBER 26, 2021 RICE-ECCLES STADIUM, SALT LAKE CITY

SALT LAKE CITY — Colorado came up with big plays on defense and special teams, but Utah wore CU down with a punishing run game as the Buffaloes dropped a 28-13 decision in their season finale at Rice-Eccles Stadium.

Karl Dorrell's Buffs finished the season 4-8 overall and 3-6 in the Pac-12.

The Buffs jumped out to a 3-0 lead after getting an interception from safety Mark Perry on the Utes' opening drive, and trailed by just one early in the third quarter when Nikko Reed's 100-yard kick return for a touchdown pulled Colorado to within 14-13.

But the Utes answered the kick return with two touchdowns on their next two possessions and CU's offense could never find the rhythm necessary to produce a trip to the end zone.

The injury-riddled Buffs were outgained 444-148, with Utah piling up 265 yards on the ground along with three touchdown passes from quarterback Cameron Rising. Colorado played without All-American linebacker Nate Landman for the fifth straight game.

Also absent from CU's lineup was leading rusher Jarek Broussard (illness).

Colorado struck first on the scoreboard, thanks to an interception from safety Perry on Utah's opening possession of the game.

Perry returned his third interception of the season 40 yards to the Utah 15-yard line. The Buffs offense couldn't move the ball, but still reaped a 33-yard Cole Becker field goal for a 3-0 lead less than three minutes into the game.

CU's defense and special teams then stepped up. The defense came up with a big stop on third down in Colorado territory, and Terrance Lang followed by blocking a Utah field goal attempt to maintain CU's 3-0 lead.

Colorado had a chance to extend its lead on its next possession when the Buffs drove into Utah territory. Lewis had a 13-yard run on the drive and a 29-yard completion to Dimitri Stanley on third-and-8. But the drive stalled at the Utes 30 and a Becker 48-yard field goal try floated wide right.

Utah finally took control, scoring touchdowns on its next two possessions. The Utes got a 19-yard scoring pass from Rising to tight end Brant Kuithe for a 7-0 lead early in the second quarter, then bumped the margin to 14-3 when Rising found tight end Dalton Kincaid for a 19-yard scoring pass.

But CU's defense came up with a big stop later in the second quarter. After a Colorado punt following the Utes' second touchdown, CU's held on fourth down deep in Buffs territory. Rising kept the ball around the right side but linebacker Carson Wells stopped him short of the sticks.

CU's offense then answered with a 39-yard drive in the final seconds of the half, getting a career-long 56-yard field goal from Becker as time expired. The Buffs converted two third downs on the drive on two Fontenot runs, and Becker's kick sent Colorado into intermission trailing just 14-6.

CU then needed just 15 seconds into the third quarter to cut the deficit to one. Reed took the opening kick of the half, broke three tackles early and raced 100 yards to the end zone. Becker's PAT pulled CU to within 14-13.

But the Utes regained control with back-to-back touchdown drives sandwiched around a CU punt. Tavion Thomas ran 12 yards for a score to cap a 68-yard Utah drive before Rising tossed a 13-yard touchdown pass to Britain Covey to give Utah a 28-13 lead with 6:45 to play in the third quarter to complete the scoring for the game.

GAME NOTES

Utah has won nine of the 11 games between the two schools that bookend the Rockies and thus has taken a 33-32-3 series lead (Utah leads 19-14-2 in Salt Lake City) ... CU finishes its 132nd year of football with a 4-8 mark, and is now 8-10 under head coach Karl Dorrell) ... CU is now 19-26 in Friday games ... The Buffs finished 0-3 against ranked programs in 2021 ... The 46 degree temperature at kickoff was the coldest for a CU kickoff in 2021; the average temperature for all 12 games at kickoff was exactly 68 degrees ... The Buffs set the school mark for Scoring Percentage Inside-the-20 (Red Zone), scoring 31-of-33 times (20 TD/11FG); 93.9 percent. Old mark of 90.6 was set in 1985 and matched in 1994. On defense, opponents finished 32-of-43, or 74.4 percent, the 19th-best figure dating back to 1953 ... No Turnovers Again and Again: CU did not have a turnover for the seventh game this year (old school record was four several times; CU had just one in the final five games (a strip-sack of Drew Carter late in the UCLA game) ... CU had 7 turnovers on the year, a **school record** for the fewest in a season (old: 11 in 1956, five fumbles lost, six interceptions), the second-fewest in the NCAA ... Under Karl Dorrell, it was CU's eighth TO-free game (out of 18) ... CB Nikko Reed made his first career start but had the play of the game, as his 100-yard kickoff return for a TD to open the second half was the 12th 100-yard play in school history (eighth KOR); it actually covered 103 yards ... PK Cole Becker (1-1 PAT, 2-3 FG, 7 points) made a 56-yarder at the end of the first half, the longest by a freshman in school history; old record was 54 by Davis Price versus Oregon State in Boulder on Oct. 1, 2016; old best by a frosh on the road was 53 by James Stefanou at Arizona State on Nov. 4, 2017. It ties the seventh longest in school history and the fourth longest on the road. He made three 50-plus yard field goals this season (51, 52, 56), the most in a season since Mason Crosby made 5 (of 7) in 2005.
