Colorado Head Coach Deion “Coach Prime” Sanders

Opening Statement

"Great win. We started off slow. Played like a lot of garbage in the first half. Probably five minutes left in the first half, we started picking it up quite a bit and doing what we're capable of doing. Hats off to the defense and how they were steadfast today. They atoned for the disappointment that we were last week defensively, but we still gave up a few plays. Overall, I think we foresaw the three main reasons for the three turnovers. An exception I think is two fumbles. So the three turnovers we didn't give up exploded to the end. So I'm really proud of the defense and special teams stepping up. The coaches did a great job. So overall, it was a win to just think that we played like we played and we won by that margin. That's a pretty good feeling for any coach, and I think for you all to see what we're capable of doing. The young men in that locker room as well as staff and support staff, truly believe in what we're capable of doing. It's not believing in me. It's believing in what we're capable of doing. That was the question I posed last week. It wasn't about me, it was about the young men and what we possess."

On This Week's Mentality

"We didn't just want to win. We wanted to dominate. In the first half we weren't dominant. In the second half, we got it together. We began to dominate but we wanted to really impose our will."

On Being A Proud Father

"As a father I'm really proud of him (Shedeur). I'm proud of Shilo and (Deion) Jr. as well for doing what he does for social media. He's very mature. He's always been very mature, very astute, and he studies his butt off and he's prepared. I'm not happy that we surrendered seven sacks I believe today. That's the expectation of a father, not a baby daddy, the father. I'm a real father and I take pride in that. I try to teach my sons the same, but overall as a coach and as a father I'm truly proud of all three of my sons and what they contributed on a daily basis."

On Boulder Scene

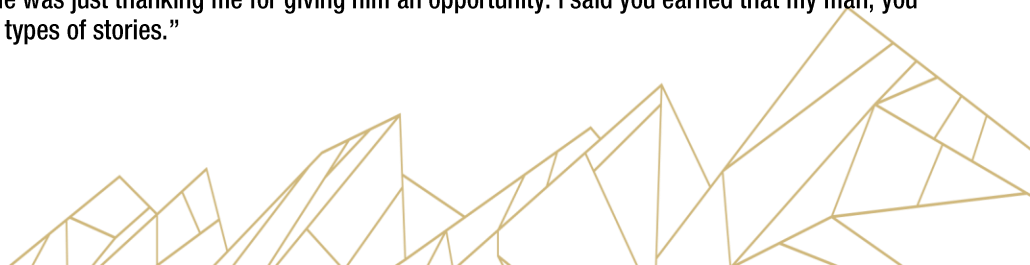
"Beautiful. A lot of this stuff is new to me. I know I have been to the highest level, the World Series as well as Super Bowls. But I am in the coaching aspect of Power Five. It was a sellout last week. It broke the attendance record for TCU. Also, to know what we accomplished today and to see that many people that came to see us perform, it was tremendous. Not just the number but the energy, the love, and expectation. I love that. Drive it over to the set for the big noon kickoff, it was phenomenal. Just feeling the energy of the student body, as well as the fan base here, was unbelievable. That was my first time experiencing that. We did not get to really fill it in the spring because it was snowing. I did not want to go out there and it was cold, so I did not really get to feel it. But we felt it today and I am pretty sure the kids are going to have a good time. Hopefully, they go take a nap, wake up with some energy, and they can celebrate with their families."

On Impact

"So, we are going to make an impact. It is hard to say what that means and what that is. We are simply happy. I am not really thinking about the economic impact. The thing about sports, the thing about competition, when Shedeur is doing what he is doing, and Travis and Xavier and all those guys, they are not Black Colorado Buffaloes, they are just Colorado Buffaloes. And we all come together, and we bring people together, uniting. And that is the part of it that I adore. I truly do."

On Playing Time

"Well, you got to practice and prepare to get your shot. You cannot just think you are going to get your shot and meander around during practice. Chick's [Tar'Varish Dawson Jr] really been in the playbook. I have a vested interest in him. I wanted to see him do well. He is my homeboy coming from the hometown. Cam [Cam'Ron Silimon-Craig] played for me in high school. So, I want to see these young men go out there and perform, but they had to get it together at practice before we were able to put them on display for the whole world to see. Both came up big and Chick was in tears at halftime. He was just thanking me for giving him an opportunity. I said you earned that my man, you earned that and I'm proud of you. So, I love those types of stories."

On Shedeur and Xavier Connection

“See the stuff that you see on the field, I see in practice. I have been saying this for a long time and everyone is just getting the opportunity to see it. Xavier is a dawg. He is a go getter. He wants that ball. He high points it and he can get deep. He is great off the jam. Great run out the catch. He is really a return man as well. The kid loves the game of football. So, I promise you are going to see a season filled with that. Because that is the kind of kid he is and he loves to compete. He loves to compete.”

On Defensive Criticism

“They were not happy and satisfied with how they performed last week. That is not indicative to who they were. Coach Kelly called an excellent game. I'm hearing it on the headset. Guys got out of their gaps. They missed tackles. They just didn't do what they are capable of doing last week. But today, the way they started was phenomenal. They truly believed that they could be a dominant force. Mix in a few more sacks, pressures, and keep the quarterback in the pocket. Coach Kelly went crazy when Sims got out of the pocket. I wish you could have heard it. He was about to lose his mind. But overall, they really played well, and we are proud of them. We still must fix some things if we want to be who we want to be.”

On Shedeur Scrambling

“You got to understand when Shedeur holds on to the ball, it's not just easy holding on to the ball. Somebody probably ran a wrong route or somebody was signaled, something happened. He never just sits back there to hold on to that ball and his read may be here but you may see it got wide open over there. But that wasn't his read. They probably blew something, but that was his read. So the thing about him I used to question him all the time, especially coming up in high school coaching him because I was calling the plays for him. But then when I watched the film, I understand what he's saying. So I've learned to not be too quick to judge him when I don't see the full picture because he tells me what's transpiring.”

On Mental Strength

“They're mentally tough. I mean we look for the smart, tough, fast and disciplined young men to fill our locker room and our roster and majority of them feature several of those characteristics. I'm proud of them that they don't tire. They don't have a pity party. Coach hates to hear the words my bad on the sideline. You hate hearing that, but they're really upset when they know it's their fault and they've made a tremendous mistake to allow that team another possession. But they're getting it. They're getting it and it's only our second game, but they're getting closer and closer with every day of practice and every game. I'm proud of them I really am.”

On Media Attention

“We expect it. I know it sounds kind of boastful. It sounds at the risk of sounding arrogant. We truly expect that. And that's why those kids come, they want the biggest stage and they're getting that every darn week. The numbers justify. What numbers did we have last week? Over seven million viewers on Fox? I think it was their biggest opening day in their history, the first game out so shoot, I'm pretty sure these numbers are gonna justify it as well.”

On Travis Hunter

“You got to understand everybody who's critical of that in saying he's gonna tire he's gonna do that, shoot they can't cook and answer the phone at the same time. I don't subscribe to that foolishness because that's who Travis is. Travis is special. He has a tremendous gift and he wants to play. He loves to play. At six o'clock in the morning, probably at 5:45 a.m. I get a text every gameday saying let's go. That's what I get from Travis. Every gameday. Let's go. Let's go do this coach. So I love him like he's my son. I treat him like I would if he was my son, but he's a tremendous player and you got to put him on display and consistently put him on display. He loves to compete.”

On Different Style Of Play

“It tells me that we're resilient, that we're tough. We weren't as disciplined as we normally are early in the game, but we played a smart game and we just got to start quicker. We got to start quick. We got to come out and let's go. But I'm happy that we got the ball in the second half. That's a lot when you're able to go down and score, then you're gonna get the ball in the second half. It's like doubling down. And I love that. But this team hasn't scratched the surface of what it's capable of doing. We still got some players that are really good players, but they hadn't thrust themselves into that spotlight yet because of the lack of consistency, but they're going to get it. I truly believe in that.”

On The Defense

“The defense is always focused. We don't just focus on one unit, but they're always trying to focus on fixing the things that we were horrible at a week ago. We tried our best to bring resolution to that as well as change personnel so that we would be better in those areas. But they played their butts off.”

On Winning In Front Of Recruits

“It says I ain't hard to find. That's what it says. The thing about it, you got to recruit to analyze everything, because I analyze stuff when I recruit. The atmosphere on top of that, and you don't have to sell Boulder, Boulder sells itself. So we're not selling anything. We're not promising anything. We just give them an opportunity. They have a tremendous education and a tremendous opportunity to get to the next level which is the NFL if they come here and play for us. It would be tough for me to turn this down if I were recruited, especially if I'm preparing.”

On Defensive Players On Offense

“They're better blockers than the opposite guys that we had doing it. Because they're grinders, they are defensive tackles so they know how to get lower. They drive and shoot. They are better. The formation that we use them in, it's called Rick Ross. So when I say Rick Ross, they are ready. I was hoping Bishop caught the touchdown pass. I'm pretty sure we would have got a penalty, but I just wanted to see it.”

On Shedeur's PrimeTime Shuffle Celebration-

“It was horrible. It was, you know, kicking the feet up. He doesn't want it. He's not a dancer. I can't dance. Our family dancer is Bossy, my daughter. She's the only one that really has rhythm. The rest of us, we didn't get that. The Lord passed us when it came to dance.”

On Defense's Impact

“They did a wonderful job of shooting. They did a phenomenal job. First of all, I love what they do. Just to build that throne for the guys that run over to celebrate, they got it. I love stuff like that. I mean, that's what guys want to do. So I'm all for it. 100% a year assessment. We got to be more physical, especially down in the goal line. We got to improve on that. We got to be a lot more physically minded.”

On The Field Storming

“I didn't get a chance to really see it because the security team was getting me out of there. But I'm pretty sure and by the way, Rick George and Peggy got game balls today. Colorado Players

Shedeur Sanders, Jr., QB

On how they shook off the slow start:

"It was just getting back to basics. They played Minnesota last week. So, it was a straight run the ball the whole game formation for Nebraska. It was hard. I studied the tape to get intimate and know their tails and what they are going to do. I truly appreciate going through this game with my team. We know how to respond when adversity hits. Because as we went, it was back and forth, back, and forth. But this week, the defense stepped up. The offense was really slacking. But it was a good defense we played though. I liked the scheme. It made it tough on us, but I am happy I was able to face it so that next time I go against it, I will be good."

On what it was like to play in front of the crowd today:

"I felt like I was at the spring game all over again. It was a little red. I have seen a picture when the stands were in full red a couple of years ago. I do not know when that was, but I have seen that. This year looks different. So, our fans came out in support. I want to dance; it is in my blood. So, I give you 10 out of 10."

On the statement the team made this week:

"The critics, they are going to hate regardless. They found a way to hate us last week and we were throwing it last week. So, this week, they will hate us, but we are not too concerned about that. We understand what we must grow and get better at. So, I am excited that we went through this, we were able to just stick together, and find a way to put up points on a board, but it is unacceptable. We cannot do that again: put that much pressure on the defense. The offense did not show up as early as the defense did. The defense played some good football. They had our backs."

His rating on the offense this week:

"It was bad today. It was a lot of mental errors. A lot of miss reads, missed throws, but we just must be able to start faster, be able to just lock in quicker. Mentally, we need to understand that going into practice, get everybody together, round them up, and tell him you know what time it is. At least we did not do one thing this week: we did not have the delay of game coming up sideline. We worked on it a little faster, but the tempo offense was not how it is supposed to be. There is good and bad that came from this game."

On his mentality in those hard plays:

"It is the long offseason in the weight room because Coach Sims got my legs strong. Coach Lewis talked to me about it repeatedly this summer, so that is when I see the weight room. It really helped on the field today. It's really the weight room. I do not really have too much quit in me like that. And I'm just not going to do that. Everybody's regular people to me, and me versus them, I know I am better."

On 2-0 Start:

"I feel like after getting a second win, we are very grateful and appreciative of it...but, you know, whenever you're coming off of a highlight, as we went in, everyone's talking about us and stuff like that. We have to be able to lock in and stay focused. That's really where the second game came in to where we just say okay - we want everybody talking about Colorado. Everyone's talking about how they don't believe us, so we have to be consistent. So, the fact that we were able to go out there and play good football...defense was able to step up for us and offense took their time to get started. It just shows that when times get tough, we have to lean on each other."

On The Buying Into The Nebraska Rivalry

"It was extremely personal...we go out there and warm up, you have the head coach from the other team trying to stand in the middle of the Buff. It's okay if a couple of players do it, it's fine, you know, just enjoy the scenery...but when you have the whole team trying to disrespect it, I'm not going for that at all. I went in there and disrupted it. So they know that the buffaloes mean a lot to me. Personally, that's just when I knew that it was extreme disrespect, and that's why it was coast to coast. I said a lot of things about my pops and about the program, but now that he wants to act nice and I don't respect that because you're hating on another man - you shouldn't do that. So, it was just all respect that was going for them in their program. Now, I like playing against them, but their respect level...you disrespected us first."

On what Coach Prime said in the locker room at the half to get them in the zone:

"I was in a locked room, you know, getting my back massage, and I held onto the ball a bit too long for the first half, so I missed the speech...but it was definitely showing that we're not going like that and we're making those players and that team look good for self-inflicted mistakes. We had a lot of penalties on offense that we can't afford to have, we added some grounding, missed a couple of throws, it was bad. So, I don't feel like it can get any worse than that. The worst first half of football we've ever played.

On Tar'Varish Dawson Jr.

"Yeah, Chick (Tar'Varish Dawson Jr.) is funny. One thing about a receiver group is that it's all family. The first thing that we did when we all got together was tell him 'Hey, don't be in your feels - this may not be your game, but everybody has to stay level headed. When you have a lot of talented guys, you know that some people gotta wait their turn. So, that's just the whole thing when you're handling that many talented players in one room, so Chick knew that his time was coming and he told me 'I got you bro.' Receivers, we talk different, so I know when they're ready and in focus. So, you have to work with them over and over and over. Now he got exactly what he wanted, he will do what he's supposed to do."

On Fans Rushing The Field:

"This was my first experience with the fans rushing the field so I was really excited. Then it's just bittersweet because I started getting beat up and it looked fun, but I'm telling you, stay out of that. They tried to tell me to go into the locker room and I said 'Nah, I want to enjoy it.' It was a bittersweet moment, it hurt a little bit."

Xavier Weaver, Gr., WR

On his receiving today:

"We got higher standards. Shedeur set the standard for 500 yards. So, 300 yards is nothing to him, but our receiver core is great. It is hard to stop all of us. We got 20 weapons on the field at once. So, it is hard for the team to play man they want to play man. We practiced this coverage all week and we just had to get a feeling of it and get rolling. Once it started rolling, we didn't stop."

On what it is like to have Shedeur as his QB:

"It starts in practice. If we don't like a certain look or feeling a certain way you ran, somebody is going to stop the whole practice and come tell you stop. So it's really just the connection we built in such a short amount of time. And it's only getting better. It is getting better. We still have multiple games left and it is only going to keep growing. Should Are you having"

On buying into the Nebraska rivalry and what the atmosphere felt like:

"When he told us it was personal, we did our homework to see why he meant that and why he said that...but yeah, a lot of disrespect going on. I'm in the pregame and in the middle of huddling up, they're punting the ball...almost hit our heads. So, yeah, this was personal. We wanted to run the score up."

On how the defense improved on stopping runs:

"We did way better than last week. As a defense, we just must keep stacking days and getting better because we still had a few assignments that we messed up on. We can get better and correct those assignments."

On 2-0 to start the season:

"I feel like we know what type of group we have. We just have to keep staying hungry and stacking days, I feel like the sky's the limit for our team."

On his game after no sacks last week:

"I feel like there was a lot of fire for all of us as a unit because obviously it's not good when you have a whole game and nobody on the D line gets upset. So, this week, I felt like it was real personal for us. I feel like we have to achieve our goal and just keep stacking days."

On what Coach Prime said in the locker room at the half to get them in the zone:

"Well, he's pretty much just told us that it's personal. You wouldn't want anyone coming to your house and doing whatever in your house...so it's personal for us. I feel like we approached it that way everyday in practice, and the results showed it."

Nebraska Head Coach Matt Ruhle

Opening Statements

"First of all, a lot of credit to them. They are well put together, fast, dynamic and explosive. Sean (Lewis) with the offense does a great job and a lot of credit to coach Sanders and his team. They played well today. As I was walking off the field, one of their longtime coaches who I've coached against many times, he said hey coach, uncharacteristic of your team to have that many turnovers; 17 points off turnovers. And that's the same thing as last week. I really think we're better than we're showing but what does that mean? We'll get the offense right. We'll get the turnovers right. The defense played really hard and well for long stretches, and then eventually just kind of wore out. I thought we were able to control the line of scrimmage with the power running game in the first half. We had the ball in the red zone twice, and yet again, came away with no points. So really the same tale as last week, just versus probably a little bit more of an explosive offense and it got away from us."

Thoughts on putting Jeff back in after halftime-

"Yeah, there's never thought of putting Heinrich in. We have some plays for him that we were going to potentially utilize so he might be getting ready for one of those things. I won't be able to really comment truly because it's such a big deal to comment on the quarterback. We know globally, too many turnovers. We're going to keep working at it until we get it fixed."

On what was the turning point-

"They had three big plays in the second half on third downs. When they ran by us in zero coverage, we bought a max blitz. One was that play where they're kind of scrambling. Those plays really tilted the field. We're not getting those same explosive plays. The great thing about the defensive staff that we have is they're gonna go back and we're gonna see what they can do better. I thought we had some really good things early on, getting some pressure dropping out, not getting pressure, and we've had a chance to get a hit. That's the type of game you need to put your hands on the ball, pick a ball off and turn it back. We had some chances."

If you think the nerves played a role-

"I think we're a good team. I really do. I think offensively just kind of like a little bit of a shaky starting team. The last few times being on the road we're a little bit nervous about what the right personnel were for. I have to go back now and look. You come in with a certain identity that you want, Hey, we're gonna do X, Y and Z. Then I think guys have to settle down at the very end of the game. But you won't get a sense of panic. It's more like, "Hey, I've got to get this team just to continue to just keep getting a little bit better."

What did Colorado do if they did anything differently that got their offense rolling?

"Yeah, I think I think we were down. But I also don't take any credit away from them. I thought that they made an adjustment and they just threw a couple of balls up on third down that hurt us and the screen game you know, they went to the screen game because we were kind of showing max and even when we were dropping out underneath it. They did a good job of going and getting on guys. That was one of those games where we kind of needed to pick a ball off or something and get the ball the offense and get something going you know. I'm always gonna play to win. I'm not gonna play to not win. I think Sean Lewis is a great offensive coordinator. They have a ton of skill. They got a great young quarterback. I think probably the screen game was the thing that helped them in the second half."

That the 3rd and 18 in the first half, where Jeff runs out of bounds. Were you guys trying to score at that moment? You're trying to run the clock so they didn't have any time?

"That's one that we're hoping the quarterback doesn't go out of bounds. Hoping he would scramble and keep the clock moving. That's putting a lot on him to make a play and try and score. Our whole thing there was to get a first down, then take off and go no huddle. Some plays got behind us and I think in the coming weeks, I hope you'll see the offense taking some steps. I think the defense is right, it's hard to say that up to this point don't get me wrong, but on offense we really need to take some steps moving forward. I'm happy to answer anything else after a game like that. I should answer everything that you guys ask on."

Do you view and address the fumbles differently?

"I think part of it is just going back and figuring out what it was. Is it the cadence? Is it the noise? We're still in field goal range, balls on the ground and we pick it up with one hand. So I think we have a team that wants to win so badly. Sometimes they're doing things that we're not really wanting them to do and I think it's out of care. It's not out of not care. These guys really care. Even on the sideline at the end you know, that was tough. I thought they just battled to the end. So we try to address everything, not emotionally, like just say this is this, this is this, but we got way too many ball handling issues. So the first two games, there's nothing, there's just no way to get around it. And that falls squarely on my shoulders and nobody else."

You mentioned the timing of the turnovers, how did you see your guys react? Mentally?

"Yeah, I thought the defense came out on the first one and played inspired, held them to a field goal. Even after the first half, I walked into the locker room and told them it was just one play, they made one play against us in the first half. And that's not to take anything away from them. I just thought our defense played well. They hit the nice cross country for the touchdown. They hit that on us and we just didn't communicate great didn't get the call, so I don't think they panicked. But when you kind of have that uneasiness that Sam was talking about to try to settle down, you need some success sometimes early to kind of settle down into a rhythm and we just haven't had that yet."

You knew this was going to be a really big game whether or not coach Sanders came here when it was on your schedule. What was the atmosphere like and how did it affect you on the sidelines or your players?

"I don't think the atmosphere affected us. I thought it was a great coach, great college football experience, you know, and that's what you come to the University of Nebraska for for games like that. I think every game is a big game that we play in. And so, we know when we go on the road, there's going to be a packed crowd. There's a packed crowd in Minnesota. There was a packed crowd here today and I'm sure when we go on the road next there will be a packed crowd."

How do you get your guys to flush this 0-2 start, knowing what the magnitude of these first two games were worth?

"I'll tell you exactly what I said to them. I said, number one, we will get it corrected. If we stick together, which I know we will, we'll get it corrected. If there's any sliver of hope, if there's anything that's good. It's that in these moments where we're having four turnovers or something gets away from us, the guys get to see, you know, coaches that they didn't really sign up to play for. Players sometimes have an incentive to play with, they get to see how we all react and they get to see that I am going to be the same guy every day. I'm gonna take ownership of things I can control and try to get better. So I hope that we go closer and I hope this is the type of thing that teaches our guys what wins football games, you know, can't turn the ball over and win. Then we grow closer as a team and closer as a program and we reckon I recognize that there's going to be things said and all that but we will absolutely improve from this."

Is Heinrich the definitive number two quarterback?

"Chuck has been dealing with a little tweak for something, he's not purely himself. About a week and a half ago good enough to practice, but just not truly himself. But yes Heinrich is the number two."

Less carries this week after 19 in week one, was (Sims) he just taking what the defense was giving him? Was that a strategy going into the game not having him run as much early on?

"Yeah, they weren't gonna let us run him as much as they were running. I thought early on we were hitting them on the ground and getting some good runs. I thought if we didn't have those turnovers we could have kept them off the field and that was our game plan. Once we fell a little behind in the second half that's when we knew we had to open it up more with him running."

How much of your game plan dealt with tempo, limiting possessions, and controlling the pace?

"We knew with their offense we would have to control the line of scrimmage. We just thought the best way for us moving the ball was for us to be physical for us to be downhill. Had we stayed on the field and not had those penalties and converted some scores down in the red zone, it would have been more just unfortunate it got away from us."
