MEMORABLE QUARTERS / HALVES

Oct. 20, 1934 (48-6 win at Brigham Young): Leading by just 14-6 after three quarters, three weeks before CU adopts "Buffaloes" as its official nickname, the then-Silver & Gold score 34 fourth quarter points to earn a decisive win.

Oct. 19, 1935 (58-0 win over Colorado Mines): The Buffaloes score 38 points in the third quarter behind quarterback Kayo Lam, who scored four times in the game and had runs of 44, 31, 79, 57 and 40 yards in rushing for 265 yards on just seven carries.

Oct. 7, 1961 (20-19 win over Kansas): Trailing the Jayhawks 19-0 entering the fourth quarter, Gale Weidner throws then a school-record three touchdown passes in rallying the Buffs to the win; later that year, CU would win its first Big Eight Conference title.

Sept. 30, 1978 (55-7 win over Northwestern): A 14-7 game at halftime turns into a rout when James Mayberry scores on four short TD runs in a 27-point third quarter; CU adds to more scores in the fourth for a 41-point second half.

Oct. 14, 1989 (52-17 win at Iowa State): It's a 10-10 game one play into the second quarter, and the Cyclones are smelling a possible upset over the No. 3-ranked Buffaloes. But those thoughts are doused after CU puts up 35 points in the second quarter: five scoring drives covered 304 yards on just 25 plays.

Nov. 2, 1990 (27-12 win at Nebraska): On a cold, windy and rainy day in Lincoln, the third-ranked Cornhuskers lead 12-0 over the No. 9 Buffaloes through three quarters. But behind Eric Bieniemy's four fourth-quarter touchdown runs that led to all 27 CU points, Colorado takes command of the Big Eight race en route to the league title and eventual consensus national championship.

Sept. 16, 1995 (66-14 over Northeast Louisiana): Herchell Troutman scored three times, two TDs rushing and one receiving, to pace a 35-point first quarter (284 yards on 20 plays) and the game's easily over at that point (CU was ahead 49-7 at the half).

Dec. 31, 1999 (62-28 over Boston College): In building a 45-7 halftime lead over the Eagles in the Insight.com Bowl, CU scores on two interception returns and one punt return over a seven-minute stretch from late in the first into early in the second quarters.

Nov. 23, 2007 (65-51 win over Nebraska): The winner would earn a bowl bid, the loser would be home for the holidays. Nebraska led 35-24 at halftime, but a 41-point second half (20 in the third, 21 in the fourth) rallied the Buffs to the win; 34 of those points came in a row to open the second half. The teams combined for 1,128 yards.

Sept. 7, 2019 (34-31 overtime win over Nebraska): With just over four minutes left in the third quarter, Nebraska had silenced Folsom Field, leading 17-0 and outgaining the Buffs, 293-124. CU got on the board with 1:24 left in the third, and then got back into the game with the longest play from scrimmage in school history: a 96-yard touchdown flea-flicker catch and run by K.D. Nixon from Steven Montez 24 seconds into the fourth quarter. The Buffs would tie the game with 46 seconds left and won in overtime on a 34-yard field goal by James Stefanou after gaining 327 yards and scoring 31 points in the final 16:42.

AND SOME NOT SO MEMORABLE: All teams have quarters or halves they want to forget; Colorado is no exception. Some of those in CU's history include:

Sept. 28, 1946 (76-0 loss at Texas): The Longhorns score 48 points in the first half, 24 in each quarter.

Sept. 13, 1980 (56-14 loss at UCLA): The Bruins score 28 points in the first and second quarter in building a 56-0 lead.

Oct. 4, 1980 (82-42 loss to Oklahoma): The Sooners are up, 34-21, at halftime, but 48 in the second half (27 in the third quarter).

Oct. 22, 1983 (69-19 loss at Nebraska): Ahead by just 14-12 at halftime, the Cornhuskers score 48 points in the third quarter to pull away.

Sept. 15, 2012 (69-14 loss at Fresno State): The Bulldogs use two 90-plus scores to take a 35-0 lead after the first quarter and lead 55-7 at halftime.
