### Byron White (1952)

Byron "Whizzer" White was the first Colorado player inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1952. Playing at Colorado in the 1930s, he led the nation and set NCAA records in rushing, scoring, total offense and all-purpose yards in 1937 when he finished second in the Heisman voting. His rushing and all-purpose yard records until 1988 when college football had added games. He was also a Rhodes Scholar, led the NFL in rushing two seasons, served in the Navy during World War II, graduated first from Yale Law in 1946 and served on the U.S. Supreme Court.

### **Joe Romig (1984)**

A two-way player for the Buffs playing guard on offense and linebacker on defense, he was captain of the 1961 Big Eight Championship team and named the UPI Lineman of the Year. A three-time All-Conference and two-time All-American and also had a 3.9 GPA and was a Rhodes Scholar. He earned a Master's Degree in Physics at Oxford and returned to earn his doctor's degree.

### Dick Anderson (1993)

Dick Anderson, local Boulder High product, could have played any position at Colorado, but stood out at safety and in three years, had 14 interceptions and 123 solo tackles, both records at the time. An All-American in 1967, he went on to anchor the "No Name" defense of the Mlami Dolphins in the 1970s and was an All-Pro three times and a member of the 17-0 season for the Dolphins.

### **Bobby Anderson (2006)**

From nearby Boulder High School and younger brother of fellow Hall of Famer Dick Anderson, Bobby played quarterback as a sophomore, junior and first few games of his senior year before transitioning to running back. A consensus All-American in 1969, he closed out his career by rushing for 254 yards in CU's Liberty Bowl over Alabama.

#### Alfred Williams (2010)

Alfred Williams, the 1990 Butkus Trophy Winner as the nation's top linebacker, was the anchor of CU's defense from 1987-90 which culminated in the program's first National Championship in 1990. A unanimous first-team All-American, he led CU to two Orange Bowl appearances and Blg Eight Championships. He is CU's all-time leader with 35 career sacks. He had a nine-year NFL career that included back-to-back Super Bowl wins with Denver in 1997-98 and an All-Pro season in 1996.

### John Wooten (2012)

One of the first African American players to earn All-America honors as a lineman, John Wooten was an All-American his senior season in 1958 and anchored the line from 1956-58 when Colorado boasted one of the best rushing attacks in college football. The 1957 CU team led the nation in rushing (322.4) and was second in total offense (415.2). He helped CU to a 20-9-2 record and 27-21 win over Clemson in the 1957 Orange Bowl. He had a 10-year NFL career and was a two-time All-Pro player.

### **Bill McCartney (2013)**

"Coach Mac" was the head coach from 1982-94, one of the most prolific times in the history of Colorado Football. He helped the team to three conference championships and the 1990 National Championships, six straight top 20 finishes. The 1989 National Coach of the Year, in 13 seasons, he led CU to nine bowl games, three Blg Eight Championships along with the national championships. His 1988-92 teams went 25 games (23-0-2) without losing a game in Big Eight play.

### **Herb Orvis (2016)**

A first-team All-American as a senior in 1971, when the Buffs finsihed No. 3 in the nation, Herb Orvis was a nightmare for opposing offenses. He helped the Buffs to three bowl victories and was a consensus All-American in 1971 and he was instrumental in CU's 1970 win over Penn State, ending a 23-game win and 31-game unbeaten streak for the Nittany Lions, earning national palyer of the week honors. He finished his career as CU's all-time leader with 20 sacks and second with 32 tackles for loss. He had a 10-year NFL career with the Detroit Lions and Baltimore Colts.

### Michael Westbrook (2020)

The recipient of the MIracle at Michigan, Michael Westbrook was a consensus first-team All-American in 1994 and took home the Paul Warfield Trophy as the nation's top wide receiver. He finished his career as CU's all-time leading receiver with 167 receptions adn 2,548 yards, and helped the 1994 team his senior year to an 11-1 record and No. 3 final ranking, including CU's Miracle finish at Michigan by catching Kordell Stewart's 42-yard bomb as time expired to win 27-26.

#### Rashaan Salaam (2022)

Rashaan Salaam was just the fourth player in NCAA history to rush for 2,000 yarsd in a season when he did so in 1994, becoming the consensus National Player of the Year and taking home the progam's first Heisman Trophy. He was the 1994 Big Eight Offensive Player of the Year and led the nation in rushing (2,055), scoring (144) and all-purpose yards (2,349) while missing the fourth quarter in five games due to the Buffs dominance in it's 11-1 season and final No. 3 ranking.

### **Deion Figures (2024)**

Deon Figures was inducuted into the Hall in 2024. A lockdown corner and Jim Thorpe winner in 1992, he helped Colorado win three conference titles and the 1990 national championship, during which he had the game-securing interception to end the game. He also won the Jack Tatum Award as the nation's top cornerback and finished his career with 13 interceptions and 27 pass breakups.

In 2024, Travis Hunter was a unanmious first-team All-American, picking up at least one first-team honor from the five publications that comprise the consensus and unanimous teams selected by the NCAA, the AFCA, Associated Press, FWAA, Sporting News and Walter Camp. He was the first player in the history of the Walter Camp team to earn first-team honors on both offense and defense, and the first player in AP history to win two firstteam honors, which he did at all-purpose and cornerback, and three overall with a second-team nod at wide receiver. Ironically, it was the Walter Camp team that left Hunter off the unanious list in 2023 by not awarding a flex or all-purpose position, as he was first-team by the other four publications, the only four he could have been. In 2024, the AFCA, FWAA and Sporting News limited Hunter to just one first-team honor, not allowing him to appear at multiple positions. Thus, he was on every first-team he was allowed to be at both cornerback and all-purpose, and on first team on more than half of the ones who allowed him to be considered at wide receiver. So in 2023 the case could be made for him to be considered a unanimous first-team All-American and in 2024, it could be said that he was a unanimous selection at the all-purpose or flex position and cornerback and consensus at wide receiver.

#### **BYRON WHITE**

Colorado's first All-American and one of the greatest students in the history of the school, Byron (Whizzer) White, retired as a justice of the Supreme Court in March, 1993, after serving 31 years on the nation's high court.

White made all the All-America teams after a brilliant 1937 season in which he led CU to an 8-0 record and Cotton Bowl bid as he set national records with 1,121 rushing yards and 122 points. Those marks, erased nationally only after colleges went to 10- and 11-game schedules, set CU records

White was a Phi Beta Kappa, Rhodes Scholar, two-time All-Pro halfback with Pittsburgh and Detroit, leading graduate of the Yale Law School in 1946, decorated naval intelligence officer in World War II, leading Denver attorney, and deputy attorney general for the United States. White is a member of the NFL Hall-of-Fame, the National Football Foundation's College Football Hall-of-Fame, the GTE Academic Hall-of-Fame, and was selected to CU's "All-Century Team." In 1998, he was the first inductee into CU's Athletic Hall-of-Fame. He passed away at the age of 84 on April 15, 2002.

### **JOE ROMIG**

Romig, a two-time All-American selection, is a member of the Big Eight Hall-of-Fame and the National Football Foundation's College Football Hall of Fame. Now a senior research associate in radio physics in Boulder, Romig was the Buffs' 1961 team captain and the United Press International Lineman of the year. Romig had no peers as a linebacker, as he ranged far and fiercely from his middle linebacker position behind a four-man line. Fast and strong, he was consistently in on most of CU's tackles.

Offensively, Romig developed into an excellent straight-ahead and pulling blocker. Like White, he was an inspirational leader gifted with extraordinary physical and mental abilities.

Romig was a tremendous student, logging straight A's in his last six semesters and building a 3.9 grade-point average. He was also a Danforth and Woodrow Wilson Scholar. A Rhodes Scholar, Joe received his master's degree in physics at Oxford University in England and a doctorate in physics at Colorado in 1975. He is a member of the GTE Academic Hall-of-Fame and was selected to CU's "All-Century Team." In 1999, he was part of the second class to be inducted into CU's Athletic Hall-of-Fame. (His #67 jersey was retired at halftime of the spring game on May 11, 1963.)

### **BOBBY ANDERSON**

Anderson set 18 single-game, single-season and career marks during his three-season career with the Buffs along with earning All-Big Eight and All-American honors.

A professional player with Denver (the team's No. 1 draft choice), Washington and New England, Anderson started his CU career as a quarterback but switched to tailback for the third game of his senior season (1969). In his career, he rushed for 2,729 yards and had over 5,000 yards in total offense.

Anderson concluded his Colorado career with a 254-yard rushing effort in the 1969 Liberty Bowl as the Buffs beat Alabama 47-33. After his playing days, he spent several years as a Denver-area businessman and worked over two decades for KOA-Radio handling pre- and postgame shows as well as sideline reporting on the CU Football Network. He relocated to southern California in 2006 where he and his wife run a private tax business. A member of CU's "All-Century Team," in 1999, he received the prestigious University Medal, awarded to those who have performed outstanding service to or for the University. In December 2006, he became the fourth Buffalo to be inducted into the College Football Hall-of-Fame. (His #11 jersey was retired at halftime of the spring game on May 9, 1970.)

### **RASHAAN SALAAM**

Salaam had a dream season as a junior in 1994, leading the nation in rushing (2,055 yards), scoring (144 points on 24 touchdowns) and all-purpose yards (2,349). In doing so, he earned unanimous first-team All-American honors and won the first (and to date the only) Heisman Trophy in Colorado history, claiming the 60th annual award, easily winning by some 248 votes and 842 points.

He became just the fourth player in college football history at the time to rush for over 2,000 yards in a single season, despite not playing in five fourth quarters and on two other occasions, he played only briefly in the third quarter; over half of the yards (1,040) came against ranked opponents. He finished his career as only the second Buff to exceed 3,000 career rushing yards (3,057), and to date only five total have done so.

He opted to turn professional following his junior season (he made the announcement minutes after CU defeated Notre Dame in the Fiesta Bowl), he was a first round pick by Chicago in the 1995 NFL Draft (21st overall). He played three seasons for the Bears (1995-97), winning the NFC Rookie-of-the-Year honor in 1995 when he rushed for 1,074 yards and 10 TDs. Knee and ankle injuries cur short is career (he underwent an ankle reconstruction), though he did make one final go of it with San Francisco in 2003.

He was inducted into CU's Athletic Hall of Fame in 2012 and into the Colorado Sports Hall of Fame in 2018. His number was retired in October 2017 during CU's homecoming festivities. Tragically, he took his own life on Dec. 5, 2016 at the age of 42. (His #19 jersey was retired at halftime of CU-California on Oct. 28, 2017.)

### **TRAVIS HUNTER**

One of the most decorated players in a season in college football history, Travis Hunter was the consensus National Player of the Year in 2024 by taking home the program's second Heisman Trophy, the Walter Camp Award and being named the National Player of the Year by both the Associated Press and Sporting News, as well as the consensus Defensive Player of the Year winning the Bednarik Award and Lott IMPACT Trophy. He also became the first player to repeat as the Paul Hornung Award winner given to the nation's Most Versatile Player, and the Biletnikoff Trophy as the best receiver regardless of position.

He earned seven first-team All-America honors from the five publications that the NCAA recognizes and is the first player in the history of both the Walter Camp and Associate Press teams to win first-team honors at multiple positions (the other three capped at one position). He finished the season with 96 receptions for 1,257 yards and 15 touchdowns on offense and four interceptions, 11 pass breakups and a forced fumble on defense and led all of college football with 1,483 plays during the season, playing 87 percent of offensive snaps and 83 percent of defensive snaps.

Hunter had his jersey retired alongside teammate Shedeur Sanders at the 2025 CU Spring Game on April 25, 2025.

#### **SHEDEUR SANDERS**

Shedeur Sanders was named the nation's top quarterback when presented with the Johnny Unitas Award as a senior in 2024. The Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year, Sanders completed 353-of-447 passes for 4,134 yards with 37 touchdowns and 10 interceptions with a QB rating of 165.9. In two seasons at CU he broke more than 100 school records and was also finished college as one of the most accomplished quarterbacks in history completing 1,267-of-1,808 passes for 14,353 yards and 134 touchdowns with 27 interceptions, becoming the second player in history to pass for 14,000 yards and complete 70 percent of his passes.

Sanders had his jersey retired alongside teammate Travis Hunter at the 2025 CU Spring Game on April 25, 2025.



# All-Century Team: 1890-1989



The University of Colorado selected an "All-Century Football Team," as public balloting in 1989 tabbed 11 All-Americans among the top 25 selected to the 100-year squad.

Over 6,200 ballots were received in the public selection process, with over 150,000 votes cast from those ballots. Former CU players pared a list of 881 lettermen down to 118, which were in turn presented to the public for the final team selection.

Byron White, the U.S. Supreme Court Justice who was CU's first All-American (1937), received 5,812 of a possible 6,265 votes. Bobby Anderson, who starred at both quarterback and tailback between 1967 and 1969, was the second leading vote-getter with 5,636, and two-way-star Joe Romig, who led CU to its first outright Big Eight Championship in 1961, was third with 5,145. White (#24), Anderson (#11) and Romig (#67) are the only Buffs to ever have their numbers retired.

One other player topped the 5,000 vote mark, as flashy Cliff Branch, whose name still frequently appears in the CU record book and who played a big part in the Buffs' No. 3 national ranking of 1971, captured 5,111 votes. The player with the fifth most votes, 3,989, was the only active Buff at the time to make the top 25, tailback Eric Bieniemy (a junior in 1989).

Joining White, Anderson and Romig as All-Americans on the century squad were Dick Anderson ('67), Pete Brock ('75), Mark Haynes ('79), Dave Logan ('75), Herb Orvis ('71) and Bob Stransky ('57).

Four players in the early years of CU football made the team, led by Walt Franklin, who played center and end between 1917 and 1921. Back Lee Willard ('21), Judge Hatfield Chilson ('25) and guard Bill McGlone ('26) round out the quartet which represents the formative seasons of CU football, when the team was known as the "Silver and Gold."

Other familiar names on the team include Hale Irwin, who starred at defensive back in the mid-60's but gained his fame on the PGA Tour; John Stearns, another pivotal player of the 1971 team who went on to be a star catcher with the New York Mets; Dave Logan, a veteran of 10-plus NFL seasons and current sportstalk celebrity in Denver; Carroll Hardy, who played in the early 1950's and is the only man ever to pinch-hit for Ted Williams; and John Wooten, one of the first African-American players at CU who has spent several years in the scouting departments of the NFL Dallas Cowboys and Philadelphia Eagles.
