Sean Kearney is in his sixth year with the University of Colorado men's basketball staff as the Director of Player Development, bringing nearly three decades of coaching experience to the Buffaloes.


He has enjoyed high-level success throughout his career at the collegiate level. Kearney has been on staff with 12 NCAA Tournament teams, including Colorado's last two (2014 and '16).

Regarded as one of the most respected and well-liked coaches in the game today, Kearney was the Associate Head Coach at the University of Notre Dame under head coach Mike Brey from 2000 through 2009. With the Irish, Kearney was part of nine postseason teams, including five NCAA Tournaments (Sweet 16 in 2003) and four NIT berths. Notre Dame posted a 188-101 record for a 61.0 winning percentage that included six 20-win campaigns and finished with an 88-60 record in Big East regular season play that

included five seasons with 10-plus wins.

Kearney also coached at least one player in each of his nine seasons that was named to the Big East All-Conference team, including a pair of conference player of year nominees, one rookie of the year, and nine first team selections.

Kearney aided in the development of first-round NBA Draft picks Troy Murphy in 2001 and Ryan Humphrey in 2002. Also under his tutelage, 2006 graduate Torin Francis earned Big East All-Conference honors two of his four seasons (as an all-rookie team 2003 selection, 2004 all-conference honorable mention) and finished his career as one of only seven players in school history with better than 1,000 career points and 900 rebounds. Forward Luke Harangody was named 2008 Big East Player of the Year and is the first player in league history to lead the conference in scoring in back-to-back seasons.

"Sean is a great asset to our staff," Boyle said. "Sean brings a lot of experience as an assistant and head coach, has a great perspective. He's a great-sounding board for me based on all the years of his experience he has in the game.

"He has recruiting ties all-around the country," Boyle added. "Sean has recruited nationally from coast-to-coast and has a lot of ties back east that some of our coaches on staff don't necessarily have."

After Notre Dame, Kearney was the men's basketball head coach for one year at the College of the Holy Cross (2009-10).

Although not on the coaching sideline for three years after leaving Holy Cross (2010-13), Kearney was not far from the college game working as a color analyst for Irish radio broadcasts, in addition to Big East and Big Ten games with ESPN during the 2012-13 season. During October and November months, Kearney traveled throughout the country attending NBA training camps and early season basketball practices at numerous college campuses.

Prior to Notre Dame, Kearney spent nine years (1991-2000) at the University of Delaware where he helped the Blue Hens to four NCAA Tournament appearances (1992, 1993, 1998, 1999).

In each of his final three years at Delaware, the Blue Hens registered at least 20 wins, a first in that school's history. Kearney was instrumental in developing the Blue Hens' post players. Three of the players he worked with -- Greg Smith, Spencer Dunkley and Mike Pegues -- combine to hold over 20 Blue Hens records.

Kearney began his coaching career in 1981 as an assistant at his alma mater, Cardinal O'Hara High School in Springfield, Pa.

From 1981-86, he spent five years working with his former high school coach, Bud Gardler. While coaching at Cardinal O'Hara, he was employed as a senior systems analyst for Cigna. It was during that time that Kearney joined the staff of the prestigious Five-Star Basketball Camps. That association helped him move on to the college coaching ranks.

His collegiate coaching career began in dramatic fashion at Providence College as a volunteer assistant under Hall of Fame head coach Rick Pitino. There he was on coaching staff that included Herb Sendek (former Arizona State head coach), Stu Jackson (former NBA Executive Vice President, Basketball Operations), Gordie Chiesa (former Utah Jazz NBA assistant), and Jeff Van Gundy (former NBA assistant and head coach).

During his only season at the Providence, R.I. school, the Friars advanced to the 1987 Final Four in New Orleans by winning the Southeast Regional championship, marking the school's second national semifinal appearance.

After Pitino moved to the NBA's New York Knicks, Kearney became an assistant under Hall of Fame coach Herb Magee at Division II power Philadelphia Textile (now Philadelphia University). After just one season, he moved to Northwestern where he was an assistant coach under Bill Foster from 1988-91.

Kearney graduated with honors from the University of Scranton in 1981 with a bachelor's degree in political science, was a four-year member of the Royals' basketball team. In his final two seasons, Scranton finished with consecutive 18-11 records. He was a member of teams that won three Middle Atlantic Conference titles and earned three NCAA Division III playoff appearances. As a senior, he averaged 4.2 assists per game.

Born Nov. 14, 1959 in Darby, Pa., he is married to the former Kimberly Lancaster. The couple have two daughters, Erin and Shannon.

Bill Cartun is in his ninth year with the University of Colorado men's basketball staff and his seventh as the Director of Basketball Operations.

Cartun is responsible for directing the day-to-day operations of the basketball program, overseeing the budget, and coordinating team travel and video. He also serves as the camp director of the CU basketball summer camps, which continues to grow with record numbers each and every summer.

In addition to his operation duties, Cartun is

also the team's video coordinator, supervising all aspects of the team's film and video needs, including opponent scouting, coordinating film exchange, managing the video room and supplying the coaching staff with game film.

"Bill is very dependable and continues to branch out in his roles on our staff with the operations and team travel, along with his video coordination ability," said CU head coach Tad Boyle. "Bill's the best video guy I have ever been around in the business; very dependable and handles a lot of details in our office. He continues to develop and grow as a coach."

Prior to coming to the Boulder campus, Cartun spent three years (2007-10) with the Charlotte Bobcats of the NBA as the basketball operations assistant and assistant video coordinator. With the Bobcats, he prepared video scouting edits for the coaches and players, scouted collegiate talent, and assisted in NBA draft preparation.


He is a 2005 graduate of Bates College where he received his bachelor's degree in economics. Cartun earned a master's degree in sport management from the University

Troy Andre Associate Sports Information Director

Troy Andre is in his 16th year with the Colorado Sports Information Office, joining the Buffalo staff in July 2003 from the University of Minnesota-Duluth. Along with duties of internet managing editor, he was promoted from assistant director to associate director on Dec. 1, 2016.

His primary responsibilities are handling the SID

duties for men's basketball, assisting in the computer statistical needs for CU's other sports, and serving as the webmaster for CUBuffs.com, the school's Internet website. Andre is an active member of the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) where he has served on the prestigious Academic All-America committee since 2003.

In March of 2013, he served as the Media Coordinator for the first and second rounds of the NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament in Boulder. it was his second go-around in that role as he also headed media operations for the 2006 event at the Pepsi Center in Denver. The past 12 summers he has worked as a stringer for Major League Baseball Advanced Media at Coors Field for Colorado Rockies games, where he logs play-by-play for MLB.com's interactive Gameday platform.

Andre worked for five years at Minnesota-Duluth both as the assistant sports information director and ticket manager, helping to publicize and promote 14 NCAA Division II sports and two NCAA Division I programs. He was UMD's primary contact for volleyball, women's soccer, men's and women's basketball and baseball; maintained UMD's official website; supervised the office work-study students; and in 2003, coordinated the marketing, promotion and ticket sales for the 2003 Women's Frozen Four.

He graduated in 1996 from the University of Northern Colorado with a bachelor's degree in journalism and mass communication with an emphasis in public relations and advertising. He attended graduate school at North Dakota State University, majoring in mass communication, and worked for two years as a graduate assistant in NDSU's sports information office between 1996 and 1998.

At UNC, he worked two years in the Bears' sports information office as a student assistant, and also was a sports reporter for the Greeley Tribune, a job he actually started in high school and held for over five years. He covered the Denver Broncos training camp as a beat reporter for the Tribune, and later would work as a summer intern for the Broncos in 1996 following his senior year in college.

He also staffed the 2017 NCAA Final Four in Glendale, Ariz., 2008 NCAA Frozen Four and 2007 NCAA men's hockey West Regional in Denver, game four of the 2007 World Series at Coors Field, the 2003 NCAA Volleyball Championships in Dallas, the 2003 NCAA Midwest Men's Basketball Regional in Minneapolis, co-chaired the statistical crews for the 2001 and 2002 NCAA Division II Women's Basketball Elite Eight in Rochester. Minn., served two years as the official scorekeeper for the Duluth-Superior Dukes of the Independent Northern League, and was a summer board operator for KFKA-Radio (Greeley, Colo.). He also worked tournament week at the 1996 International at Castle Pines.

Born in Fort Collins, Colo., he graduated from University High School in Greeley, Colo., where he lettered in cross country and was also active in statistical work with football, basketball and baseball. He is married to the former Danielle Driscoll, originally of East Grand Forks, Minn.



Rawley Klingsmith Associate Athletic Trainer

Rawley Klingsmith is in his sixth year with the University of Colorado sports medicine staff as the athletic trainer for men's basketball and the spirit squad.

Prior to coming to Boulder, Klingsmith was an integral part of the University of Northern Colorado sports medicine staff since 2004. In January

2012, he was promoted to Assistant Athletic Director for Human Performance - Head Athletic Trainer.

During the summer of 2015 (July), Klingsmith was the athletic trainer for the 2015 United States Pan American men's basketball team in Toronto (bronze medal).

Klingsmith is reunited with CU men's basketball head coach Tad Boyle, who coached the Bears from 2006-2010. At UNC, Klingsmith helped with all of Northern Colorado's 19 intercollegiate sports, assisting with student athletic training instruction and coordinating physician/doctor involvement.

"Rawley has great prospective, because he was the trainer at Northern Colorado with me from day one," said CU head coach Tad Boyle. "He has a great feel for athletes; he's dealt with professional athletes with his background with the Denver Broncos. He's a great reader of people (student-athletes) and I think as a trainer, the psychological aspect of injuries and recovery from injuries isn't talked about enough, and Rawley has a areat feel for that."

Klingsmith graduated from the University of Northern Colorado in May of 2000 with a bachelor of arts degree in kinesiology/athletic training. As an undergraduate, Klingsmith was a student athletic trainer and assisted with football, baseball, wrestling, soccer, volleyball and swimming.

Following graduation, he was a graduate assistant at the University of Oregon in Eugene. For the Ducks, he assisted with the athletic training needs for the football and wrestling programs and graduated with his master of science in sports medicine in April 2002.

From March of 2002 to June of 2003, Klingsmith was an intern with the Denver Broncos, where he assisted with injuries as well as travel preparation and setup for the training staff. He has also worked for Langford Sports and Physical Therapy in Albuquerque, N.M. from August 2003 until May 2004 as well as interning with the University of New Mexico training staff.

Klingsmith is a member of the National Athletic Trainers Association and the Rocky Mountain Athletic Trainers Association.

Stephen Englehart is in his third season as the Strength & Conditioning Coach for men's basketball and eighth overall at Colorado. His duties expanded to the Director of Strength & Conditioning for Olympic Sports in July 2018.

Prior to his duties with men's basketball, which started in April 2016, he worked with the

Buffaloes' football, women's soccer, women's golf, men's golf and tennis programs.

He is certified as a strength and conditioning specialist (CSCS) by the National Strength and Conditioning Association. He also holds certifications with USAW, FMS and TPI Level 1&2.

Englehart, 37, came to CU from Southern Methodist University, where he worked one year (2010) as the assistant strength and conditioning coach for the Mustangs. That followed one season (2009) as the head football strength coach at Portland State University, his first full-time year in the profession. He got his start in the business as a graduate assistant at the University of Hawai'i, where he spent three years (2006-08). At Hawaii he was in charge of men's and women's basketball as well as other sports. He was on the Warrior staff the year the UH earned a Sugar Bowl invitation against Georgia as a "BCS" buster following a 12-0 regular season in 2007.

While at Hawai'i, he earned his Master's in Kinesiology and Rehabilitation Science in the spring of 2009. He received his Bachelor's degree in Exercise Science from Southeastern Louisiana University in 2005.

Scott Wilke enters his sixth year as the analyst for CU Basketball. Wilke left his mark on the CU record book from 1984-88 averaging 12.4 points and 5.2 rebounds per game. Entering the 2016-17 season, Wilke continues to rank in a number of categories, including No. 9 in field goal percentage (.536), No. 14 in scoring (1,366) and No. 24 in rebounding (576). After

college, Wilke played professional basketball for 12 years in Europe, including five years in England, and three years in Luxembourg. He also played in Australia, Japan, Austria, and Finland. Wilke is in his 14th year at Horizon High School in Thornton, where he teaches business and marketing courses. He's also an advisor for DECA and FBLA (co-curricular clubs). Wilke graduated with a bachelor's degree in business from CU in 1988 and earned a master's degree in business administration through Bellevue University (Nebraska) in 2006. Wilke and his wife, Susan, have two sons, Alex, a May 2014 CU graduate; Jax and a daughter, Phoenix.



Deric Swanson Executive Director of BuffVision

Deric Swanson is in his 20th year as the executive director of BuffVision, coordinating all aspects of production involving the video display boards at Folsom Field and the CU Events Center, both upgraded earlier this decade to a near \$10 million operation for both facilities combined. He is the only director the area has ever had since it was created in 1999.

Swanson, 44, is considered one of the best in his field and came to CU from the National Hockey League's Colorado Avalanche, where he had worked for a brief time as the manager of game entertainment and video production. He had previously worked three-plus seasons with the Colorado Rockies Baseball Club, first as a stadium camera operator, and then as video production coordinator, including the 1998 Major League Baseball All-Star Game at Coors Field.

In 2003, BuffVision won the Golden Matrix Award for "Best Overall Video Display" in the University Division at the Information Display and Entertainment Association (IDEA) conference in Atlanta.

The following year, BuffVision was awarded two distinctions, one for the 2004 Aurora Awards, a Platinum Best of Show statue for In-Game Entertainment Graphics/ Design, and a Telly Award for The Buffalo Stampede, CU's coaches' show. In 2006 and 2007, BuffVision won three more Telly Awards for Swanson's production, including two for the "Ralphie on Campus" institutional spot and another for The Buffalo Stampede, and in 2013 earned another Telly for a production involving CU's Men's Basketball team and the Navy SEALs.

He is a 1996 graduate of Colorado State University, earning his bachelor's degree in technical journalism and broadcasting. He graduated Magna Cum Laude and was recognized as CSU's outstanding graduate in journalism.

He was born May 24, 1974 in Oakland, Calif., and attended two high schools. His father was stationed in the Azores, Portugal, and he spent two years at Lajes High School, where he lettered in football, soccer, volleyball and basketball. After moving to Colorado, he graduated from Liberty High School in Colorado Springs, where he lettered in football. He played volleyball on CSU's club team for three years. Swanson has also competed in eight IronMan events, including a personal best of 11 hours and 29 minutes in Phoenix, Ariz., in 2009.

He has two sons, Gavin (10) and Dane (8).
