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2021-22 (Sophomore): Averaged 2.6 points and 2.8 rebounds as a key reserve off the bench. One of five Buffaloes to appear in all 33 games. Had 30 offensive rebounds, tying for the fourth on the team. Scored a career-high 14 points in the road win over Oregon State (2/15). Made 5 of 6 from the floor including 3 of 4 from 3-point range in his first double-figure scoring game and first with multiple 3-point field goals. Shot 44 percent on the season, improving that number down the stretch by hitting his final 15 of 32 from the floor (.469). Grabbed a career-high eight rebounds at home against Oregon State (2/5). Twice dished out a personal-best four assists, at home against Washington (1/9) and again at Stanford (2/19). Recorded a career-best four steals against Maine (11/15) which also tied for the team's season-best mark.

2020-21 (Freshman): Played in 10 games on CU's senior-laden squad, totaling 15 points and seven rebounds while shooting 43 percent (6 of 14) in limited minutes. Saw action in both NCAA Tournament games, pitching in a personal-best four points in the first round win over Georgetown (3/20). Had a career-best four rebounds against California (1/14), a game in which he also made his first career 3-pointer. Made his collegiate debut in the final three minutes of the season opener against South Dakota (11/25) and two days later scored his first career points at Kansas State (11/27).

High School: A 2020 graduate of Columbine High School. Named Colorado's Class 5A State Player of the Year as a senior, averaging 26.0 points, 12.0 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 2.0 blocks per game. Led the Rebels to a 21-5 record in 2020 and spot in the Class 5A State Tournament "Great 8" for the first time since 2011. A two-time Class 5A All-State First Team selection and

Played six years for the Colorado Miners club program.

Academics: Majoring in Communication at Colorado. Carried a 3.95 GPA in high school.

Personal: Born on Aug. 21, 2001, in Denver. He is the son of Steve and Corie O'Brien. Has three siblings, an older sister, Emma who attends Colorado State, and two younger brothers, Landon and Levi. His father, Steve, was a walk-on basketball player at CSU. Enjoys golf, bowling and video games and considers himself an above average golfer and bowler. His favorite NBA player is Steph Curry and his favorite pro sports team is Tottenham of the English Premier League. Chose Colorado in part because "the coaches and players were great and it felt like the right fit." The biggest moment of his prep career was scoring 33 points, including all 16 of his team's points in the fourth quarter, in a win over Boulder High School that sent Columbine to the State Tournament at the Denver Coliseum.

2021-22 (Freshman): Averaged 3.0 points and just over an assist per game in 29 appearances as a true freshman. Averaged 12.5 minutes for the season, but saw his playing time increase significantly throughout the season and was inserted into the starting lineup for the final five games. His first collegiate start was memorable to say the least, helping the Buffaloes to a win in front of a sold-out CU Events Center over No. 2 ranked Arizona (2/26). Dished out 17 of his season's 32 assists over the last six games (2.8 apg). Had a career-high five assists in the Pac-12 Tournament semifinals against Arizona (3/11) along with nine points. Named the Pac-12 Conference Freshman of the Week on Jan. 10 after his effort at home against the Washington schools, averaging 8.0 points, 2.5 rebounds, 2.0 steals and 2.0 assists while hitting 55 percent. In the win over Washington (1/9), he scored a career-high 14 points in just over 12 minutes of action, hitting 5 of 7 from the field including all four 3-point attempts. Against Washington State (1/6), he grabbed five rebounds, had four steals and dished out four assists; the four steals would

tie the team's single-game high for the season. Prior to the WSU game he totaled all of one assist and one steal in his first eight career games. Made his collegiate debut against Maine (11/15) scoring eight points with four rebounds in 16 minutes. Co-winner of team's Most Improved Player Award at the end of the season.

High School: A 2021 graduate of Cherry Creek High School. Averaged 19.4 points, 5.6 rebounds and 1.9 steals over four seasons for the Bruins. As a senior, he was named the Colorado Gatorade Player of the Year and the CSHAA Class 5A Player of the Year, averaging 22.4 points, 5.5 rebounds, 3.8 assists and 2.3 steals while shooting 51 percent from the field and 41 percent from 3-point range. He helped the Bruins to a 17-1 record, a Centennial Conference championship and a trip to the state semifinals. Two-time all-state and Centennial Conference Player of

Academics: An Open Option major. Plans to pursue a professional career in basketball.

Personal: Born Oct. 2, 2002, in Denver. He is the son of Ruby and Julian Hammond II, who both also played basketball at Cal Poly and Loyola Marymount. His father played professionally in Australia and grandfather, Julian, Sr., played for the Denver Rockets of the ABA from 1967-72. He has two brothers, Christian (16), a junior in at Cherry Creek, and Jeremiah (13), an eighth grader. Played alongside current CU wide receiver Chase Penry both on the basketball court and football field at Cherry Creek. Was recruited by Northern Colorado for both football and basketball, Denver and Wyoming for basketball and Idaho and Montana State for football. Chose Colorado because "It was the school I always wanted to play Division I basketball at."

2021-22 (Freshman): Earned All-Pac-12 Conference Freshman Team honors after averaging 7.4 points per game and leading the Buffaloes in assists (86) and steals (26). Shot 76.5 percent from the free throw line overall and increased that to 78.8 percent during conference games, the latter ranking 11th on the league charts during that span. At one point made 17 free throws in a row. The McKinley Wright IV Assist Award recipient, his 86 assists tied for the eighth most in a season by a CU freshman. Dished out a career and team-season high six assists against Oregon (3/10) in the quarterfinals of the Pac-12 Tournament. A two-time Pac-12 Freshman of the Week, earning those honors on Nov. 29 and Feb. 21. His first honor came after averaging 9.5 points and 3.0 assists while shooting 55 percent off the bench in Colorado's two wins over Brown (11/22) and Stanford (11/28). He scored a career-high 12 points, hitting 5 of 8 from the field in the Buffaloes' conference opener against Stanford. He had seven points,

including a perfect 5 of 5 from the free throw line, and four assists against Brown, in the Paradise Jam finale in the U.S. Virgin Islands. His second honor came after averaging 13.0 points and 3.0 rebounds during Colorado's three-game road sweep of Oregon State (2/15), California (2/17) and Stanford (2/19). He shot 44 percent from the field and 79 percent from the foul line, hitting 14 of 18 attempts. Scored in double-figures all three games including a career-high 19 points at California where he recorded personal-bests at the free throw line knocking down 8 of 10 attempts. He had 10 points, five rebounds and two assists at Oregon State and finished the week with 10 points, two rebounds and two steals at Stanford. Led or shared the team lead in assists 15 times and in steals 12 times. Had nine double-figure scoring games, twice leading the Buffaloes in scoring both representing his highest-scoring games: 19 at California and 17 at Arizona (1/13).

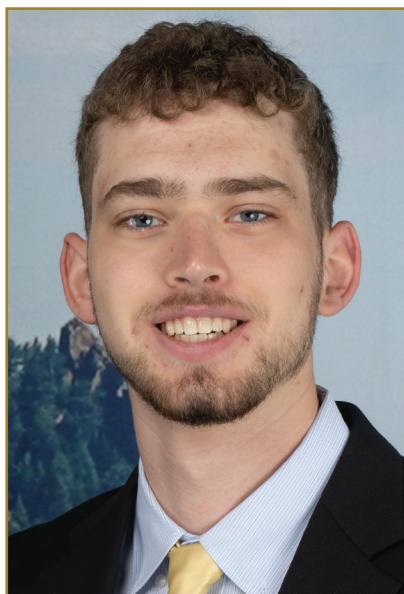
