Welcome to Lawrence and Memorial Stadium

Kansas home for first time since Sept. 8

Kansas returns home to Memorial Stadium today against 14th-ranked Colorado after completing its longest road swing since the 1945 season.

The Jayhawks, 1-4-1, lost 34-0 last week against Miami at the Orange Bowl, completing a stretch of four consecutive games away from home. The last time Kansas played four straight road games came in 1945.

The Miami game also marked the first time since 1977 that a non-conference opponent has been sandwiched between two Big Eight Conference opponents on the Kansas schedule.

Colorado, the defending Big Eight champion, will enter today's game with a four-game winning streak and a 2-0 record in league play.

The Buffaloes won 28-12 over Iowa State last week in front of 51,861 fans in Boulder, Col.

The Coaches

Kansas Coach Glen Mason (Ohio State '72) is in his third season with the Jayhawks. In two years, Mason has a 6-21-1 record at KU including a 4-7 mark last season. In four-plus years overall as a head coach on the Division I level, Mason is 18-31-1. Prior to coming to KU, Mason coached two seasons at Kent State University, compiling records of 5-6 in 1986 and 7-4 in 1987. In '86, Mason was named the Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year.

Colorado Coach Bill McCartney (Missouri '62) is in his ninth season in Boulder, where he has compiled an overall record of 51-46-2.

NOTE: Both coaches today spent eight years as assistants in the Big Ten Conference. Mason worked at Ohio State (1978-86) and McCartney at Michigan (1974-81).

Kansas vs. Colorado: the series

Colorado leads 28-18-3. In games played in Lawrence, the series is dead even at 11-11-3. Today's game is only the second in Lawrence since 1985. Kansas has not beaten Colorado since a 28-27 win in Boulder in 1984.

A look at Kansas

Recent injuries have taken their toll on the Jayhawks and will play a factor in today's game against Colorado.

Sophomore quarterback **Chip Hilleary** will start today after playing just one series at Miami with an injured shoulder. Hilleary hurt the shoulder late in the game against Iowa State two weeks ago.

The Jayhawks will be without injured senior inside linebacker **Curtis Moore** (broken and dislocated right thumb), and junior wide receiver **Jim New** (bruised shoulder) today. **Brad Peebler** and **Wes Swinford** will combine to take Moore's place, and **Rob Licursi**, **Matt Gay** and **Ron Page** will combine to fill in for New.

Defensively for Kansas, cornerback **Hassan Bailey** intercepted his second pass in as many games against Miami, and safety **Paul Friday** solidified his starting job with nine tackles and two pass break-ups against the Hurricanes.

A look at Colorado

Colorado has won four straight games after getting off to a 1-1-1 start.

Like Kansas, the Buffaloes have a quarterback with an injured shoulder. **Darian Hagan** did not start Saturday but came off the bench to help Colorado overcome a 10-0 deficit to defeat Iowa State, 28-12. The Colorado defense held ISU's **Blaise Bryant** to just 34 yards rushing.

Colorado is averaging 270 yards per game rushing behind **Eric Bieniemy**, one of the nation's leading rushers at 144.3 yards per game. **Mike Pritchard** is a reliable back-up to Bieniemy in Colorado's I-bone offense. Pritchard rushed for 217 yards against Tennessee in the season opener.

Mason vs. McCartney, Colorado

Kansas coach **Glen Mason** is 0-2 versus Colorado and coach **Bill McCartney**. Both losses have come in the last two seasons. In 1985, Mason's final season as an assistant coach at Ohio State, the Buckeyes defeated McCartney and Colorado 36-13 in Boulder.

Jayhawk-Buffalo Coaching ties

● Kansas running backs coach **Vic Adame** was a three-year letterwinner at Eastern Michigan from 1980-82. Colorado offensive coordinator **Gerry DiNardo** was the defensive line coach for the Hurons during the same time period.

● Jayhawk offensive coordinator **Golden Pat Ruel** served on the Texas A&M staff from 1982-84. Colorado assistant strength coordinator **Vernon Banks** also worked for the Aggies from 1981-83 as assistant strength coach.

Last year: Colorado 49, Kansas 17

Third ranked Colorado ran past Kansas 49-17 in front of a near capacity crowd in Boulder on Oct. 21 last year.

The Buffaloes raced to a 21-3 halftime lead and scored 21 unanswered points to begin the second half.

Tony Sands led Kansas with 115 yards and one touchdown on 22 carries. CU's **J.J. Flannigan** rushed for 178 yards and three touchdowns.

Notes from the KU-Miami game

● Kansas was shut out for the first time since a 49-0 loss at Auburn in the 1987 season opener. Kansas had scored in 37 consecutive games prior to the Miami game, and it was the

● **Eichloff** resumed duties as the starting punter last week and booted six punts for an average of 46.2 yards. **Eichloff** also kicks off, kicks extra points and field goals. He is the first Jayhawk to do all kicking jobs since **Mike Hubach** in 1980.

● While Kansas didn't light up the scoreboard against Miami, it did fair better statistically than most teams have done this season. The Jayhawks rushed for 86 yards (Miami was allowing 33 yards less per game) and held Miami to 463 yards on offense (36 yards less than its 499 yards-per game average).

● Eight Kansas receivers caught a total of nine passes against Miami. The last time eight Jayhawks were on the receiving end of passes came against Iowa State in 1988.

Kansas is nation's fourth most improved

According to *Football News* columnist **Harry DeVold**, who has been charting conference power ratings for the past 40 years, Kansas is the fourth most improved team in the nation. DeVold's power ratings list Oklahoma as the nation's most improved team.

Last week: Hurricanes blank Kansas, 34-0

With injuries forcing two of its key players to the sidelines, Kansas found itself shorthanded in a 34-0 loss to the Miami Hurricanes last Saturday at the Orange Bowl.

The Jayhawks were minus senior linebacker **Curtis Moore**, the team's leading tackler, who was left behind with a broken thumb on his right hand. Sophomore quarterback **Chip Hilleary** played in just the initial offensive series as a shoulder injury forced him to the sidelines.

The shutout was the first administered to KU since 1987 as the Hurricanes were impressive on defense. The Jayhawks were limited to just 175 yards in total offense, 85 yards rushing and 90 passing. Redshirt freshman **Nate Florell** subbed for Hilleary at quarterback and completed nine of 18 passing attempts for 90 yards.

The Kansas defense had its bright spots against the explosive Hurricanes, holding Miami scoreless in the first and fourth quarters.

October 20 in KU football history

Kansas is 5-7-2 all-time on this date, including a 3-2-1 record at home. The Jayhawks last played on this date in 1984 at Oklahoma State (47-10 loss). KU and Colorado have never met on this date prior to today.

1984 - In a Big Eight loss at Oklahoma State, KU linebacker Willie Pless recorded 25 tackles. That mark is still tied for the Kansas school record.

1979 - Kansas jumped out to a 24-0 lead, then held on for a 24-7 win at Iowa State. The Jayhawk defense held the Cyclones to just 54 rushing yards on 36 attempts.

Drayton, Budde continue streaks

Junior wide receiver Kenny Drayton, KU's big play threat with three catches for more than 40 yards, has caught at least one pass in each of the last 17 games.

Senior center Chip Budde should make his 40th consecutive start today. Budde has started in every game of his four-year career.

Last year Budde saw his most impressive streak come to an end. The Lawrence (Kan.) native played in 1,906 consecutive snaps before the streak came to an end against Colorado.

Junior offensive tackle Christopher Perez has a streak of his own. Perez has also started every game of his career -- 28 games.

Wide receiver Matt Gay and inside linebacker Brad Peebler made their first career starts Saturday against Miami. Until Gay started against Miami, the Kansas offense had started the same 11 for four consecutive games. The Jayhawks began the game with three wide receivers in the starting lineup. Peebler's start broke a string of three straight games the KU defense had used the same starting lineup.

Kansas injury situation

Kansas sophomore quarterback Chip Hilleary (bruised shoulder) will start today after playing just one series against Miami last week. Junior tailback Tony Sands (bruised right thigh) will not start today but will play. Senior inside linebacker Curtis Moore (broken, dislocated right thumb) is not scheduled to play today. Junior wide receiver Jim New (shoulder) will not play today.

Three Jayhawks to make first start

Freshman tailback George White is expected to make his first start today in place of injured Tony Sands, who has started the last 17 games at running back. Also expected to make their first starts today are guard Dan Schmidt, who has played sparingly this season behind Smith Holland, and junior Rob Licursi, who gets the starting nod in place of the injured Jim New at wide receiver. Brad Peebler will make his second start at linebacker in place of injured Curtis Moore.

Sands reached 2,000-yard plateau

Kansas junior tailback Tony Sands, who rushed for a season high 169 yards against Iowa State and 48 yards last week at Miami, has reached the 2,000-yard career rushing mark.

Sands, a Doak Walker Award candidate for the top collegiate running back in the nation, enters today's game against Colorado with 2,057 career yards.

Sands, a Ft. Lauderdale (Fla.) native, is only the fourth player in Jayhawk history to reach the 2,000-yard mark. Sands now trails only Laverne Smith (1973-76 -- 3,074 yards), Gale Sayers (1962-64 -- 2,675), and John Riggins (1968-70 -- 2,659).

The KU Football (TV) Show:

The KU Football Television Show will appear each week on a statewide network of stations. KZKC in Kansas City will broadcast each show on Sundays at 9:00 p.m., WIBW-TV in Topeka will air Sundays at 11:00 p.m. and KSNW-TV in Wichita will air the program Sundays at 11:30 p.m. Please check local programming for schedule changes due to prior commitments.

Jayhawk practice policy

The Kansas lockerroom is closed following practices and games. Practices are open to the media, but it is asked that practice boundaries be observed. Upon completion of practice, media are asked to interview players before they enter the lockerroom or wait until finished dressing. No interviews will be conducted at the training table at Jayhawk Tower apartments.

At home contests, Jayhawk players and coaches will be made available, after a brief cooling off period, in an interview room to the immediate north of the Kansas lockerroom at Memorial Stadium.
