

Quoting Colorado Coach Bill McCartney

- ON WHETHER THE SECOND HALF REMINDED HIM OF LAST YEAR'S TEAM: "Yes, it sure did. I was looking out there, and I thought, 'Hey, I've been here before, but it's been a long time.' We are definitely an improving team. We're getting a lot better."
- ON THE PLAY OF HIS DEFENSE: "I thought that on both sides we did a good job. But I hated to see us give up a touchdown because I thought the defense played well enough to shut them out. We gave up a fumble deep in our territory, and that hurt."
- ON SCORING ON THE FIRST POSSESSION OF THE SECOND HALF: "A big key was taking the opening kickoff in the second half and going eighty yards to score. When Eric broke the touchdown, I knew we were on our way."

Quoting the Colorado Players

ERIC BIENEMY (TB, Sr.)

On breaking the school scoring record: "I really don't know what it feels like right now, but I'm sure when I look back at it, it will feel great. The only thing I'm thinking about now is our win."

On CU's team morale: "Our confidence level is right where it should be for our next two big games. We feel real good right now about playing the Sooners and the Huskers. We'll give them a run."

DAVE McCLOUGHAN (DB, Sr.)

On his punt return for a touchdown: "I was trying to get to the corner. It was supposed to go to the left. I just cut underneath and there was great blocking."

On the CU defense: "We did a good job of stopping the run and forcing them into pass situations. Our defensive line did a great job and they got a great rush."

DARIAN HAGAN (QB, Jr.)

On the momentum change in the second quarter: "I wasn't afraid of Kansas gaining the momentum. We made a mistake and they capitalized. But our defense gutted it out and played great defense from there."

On the team as a whole: "We are becoming a better passing team, something we'll need in the next two weeks. The third quarter felt just like last year."

Kansas/Colorado Game Notes

Oct. 20, 1990

- * Kenny Drayton caught a pass in his 18th consecutive game.
- * Chip Budde made his 40th consecutive start - Christopher Perez made his 28th.
- * This is the first time Kansas has been shut out for 5 consecutive quarters since the first 2 games of the 1987 season.
- * Rob Licursi (WR) and Dan Schmidt (OG) made their first career starts.
- * Dan Eichloff kicked his 9th field goal (in 11 attempts). This is the most ever on record by a freshman kicker for Kansas.
- * A punt was returned for a touchdown against Kansas for the first time since Auburn did it in 1987.
- * The 90-yard return was not the longest ever against KU. That came in 1969, 96 yards, by Tom Elliot of Iowa State.

COLORADO POSTGAME NOTES

- Patched 114 yds - man into 7th place

- Eric Bieniemy became Colorado's all-time leading scorer, as his three touchdowns today (the third time this year's he's scored three in a game) gives him 218 career points. He passed Bobby Anderson's 212 to take the all-time lead; Anderson, a postgame lockerroom reporter for KOA-Radio, was on hand for the record. "It reminds me of the great players that I played with, and how so many people helped me with that record. It's fun to have been identified with something for such a long period of time, but records are meant to be broken as they say. It's a great credit to a little guy with a tremendous heart."
- Bieniemy, who added to his CU record with his 17th 100-plus yard rushing game, had 174 yards today to give him 1,040 for the season. He has thus become the first CU back to gain 1,000 or more yards in a season twice (he had 1,243 as a sophomore in 1988). His career total is now 3,352 yards. (10th - Big 8) 3rd @ CU - total of game
- The 41 points by Colorado was a season high; the 10 points by the opponent a low.
- The last player to have multiple punt returns in a season for touchdowns was Cliff Branch (4 in 1971). Dave McCloughan now has two (he had a 55-yard return for a score against Tennessee to go with today's effort).]
- Joe Garten started his 40th game of his career today, breaking the previous record of 39 by Mickey Pruitt.
- Alfred Williams now has a sack in all eight games this season.
