AD/Sports Information Director Dave Plati, Associate SID Tom Tom Petersen, and representatives from the Federal Express Orange, Sunkist Fiesta, USF&G Sugar, Mobil Cotton, Florida Citrus, Mazda Gator and Hall of Fame Bowls. Nebraska Assistant AD/SID Don Bryant, Associate SID Tom Simons, Assistant SID's Chris Anderson and Nick Joos, and SID intern Bill Doleman are all here to help make your afternoon and evening as productive as possible. Let us know how we can help.

[*] POST-GAME PROCEDURE: Following the game, the Nebraska locker room will be closed, but, following a brief cooling-off period, Coach Tom Osborne and requested players and assistant coaches will be available in the N Club Lounge in the South Stadium Building. To reach the N Club Lounge, it is necessary to leave the stadium, then enter the South Stadium Building through its main, center doors. The Lounge is down the hall on the right. In order to request players or assistant coaches, please submit a list to the interior press box public address at the end of the third quarter. Unrequested players making significant plays in the fourth quarter will be added as a matter of course. For those on tight deadlines, Coach Osborne's post-game news conference can be heard on the press box P.A.

[*] JUST THE FAX: A faxing service is available, with a \$10 charge going to the operator. Contact a Nebraska Sports Information staffer.

[*] THE SERIES: It's the 49th meeting in a series which began with a 23-10 Nebraska win at Boulder, Nov. 17, 1898. The Huskers lead, 34-13-1, although the teams have split the last four games after Colorado won 27-21 last year at Boulder to virtually clinch the Big Eight title. Nebraska has a 29-12-1 series edge in conference games since CU joined the then-Big Six Conference in 1948. The Huskers are 18-5 vs. the Buffs in Lincoln, including 5-15 at Memorial Stadium, where NU won the most-recent game, 7-0, in 1988. Nebraska has won 10-straight at home vs. the Buffs since a 21-16 loss in 1967. CU was 10-8-1 in the first 19 games of the series (1898-1961), Nebraska is 25-3 since.

[*] THE COACHES: The Huskers' TOM OSBORNE (Hastings, 1959) is 176-38-2 in his 18th year as a head coach, all at Nebraska, and ranks as the winningest active coach in the NCAA's Division I-A with an .819 winning percentage. His 176 wins and 216 games coached are Nebraska and Big Eight records, while the 176 wins tie him with Ralph Jordan of Auburn (1951-75) and Frank Kush of Arizona State (1958-79) for ninth among all-time NCAA Division I coaches in victories at one school. The Buffaloes' BILL MCCARTNEY (Missouri, 1962) is 53-46-2 in his ninth year as a head coach, all at Colorado. Osborne is 15-2 vs. Colorado (8-0 in Lincoln), 6-2 vs. McCartney (3-0 in Lincoln).

[*] TYRANCE RECEIVES NFF GRANT: Senior ILB PAT TYRANCE Tuesday was named one of 11 National Football Foundation 1990 Scholar-Athletes, and will be honored at the 33rd annual College Hall of Fame dinner in New York on Dec. 4. Tyrance, a Husker co-captain and academic All-Big Eight performer, is a pre-medicine major carrying a 3.66 grade-point average. He was named a winner of a \$10,000 scholarship. Tyrance is the 10th Husker to win the grant and the third in three years, following Mark Blazek in 1988 and Gerry Gdowski last year. Two other Big Eight players were among the winners, Missouri QB Kent Kiefer and Iowa State TE Craig Mahoney. The other winners were John Lavalette of Holy Cross, Greg Frey of Ohio State, Kevin Donnalley of North Carolina, Solomon Graves of LSU, Chris Howard of Air Force, Lance Pavlas of Texas A&M, Bill Musgrave of Oregon and Curtis Loveace of Illinois.

[*] "NFL DRAFT REPORT" LISTS CROEL NO. 1: The NFL Draft Report, edited by David Te Thomas, announced this week that Nebraska OLB MIKE CROEL is the top player available for next year's NFL draft, with a grade of 8.11, ahead of Notre Dame CB Todd Lyght at 8.05. Husker DT KENNY WALKER is 11th on the NFL Draft Report's list. Other Big Eight players on the top 50 list were Iowa State RB Blaise Bryant, 26th; Colorado OLB Alfred Williams, 28th; Colorado SS Tim James, 31st; Colorado OLB Kanavis McGhee, 38th; Iowa State CB Marcus Robertson, 43rd; and Oklahoma DE James Goode, 48th. Croel is the Huskers' fourth-leading tackler with 39 total stops, including 18 solos. He's second to Walker on the team in both tackles for loss (11 for 61 yards) and sacks (five for 40), and shares the team lead in pass breakups with four.

[*] GLOVER IN ORANGE BOWL HALL OF HONOR: Former Nebraska All-American RICH GLOVER has been chosen for induction into the Orange Bowl Hall of Honor, along with Tom Landry, who played FB and DE for Texas in the 1949 OB, and Tommy Casanova, a two-time All-America DB for LSU who played against Nebraska and Glover in the 1971 OB. Glover played on three-straight OB champions from 1971-73, and won both the Outland and Lombardi Trophies as a senior in 1972. He now resides in San Jose, Calif., where he is a teacher and coach at a junior high school. Glover is the third Husker selected to the Hall, joining his coach, Bob Devaney, and former teammate Jerry Tagge, who was inducted last year.

[*] FLOWERS POWER: Junior IB LEODIS FLOWERS comes into today's game with a string of six-straight games in which he has run for at least 100 yards, equaling the third-longest such string in Nebraska history. Flowers, who has also scored at least one TD in each of those games, entered the season unlisted on the NU top-50 career rushing chart, but has moved all the way up to 18th on the chart with 1,579 yards. Last week at Iowa State, he ran for career highs of 208 yards and three TD's, to give him 884 yards in seven games (he missed the Minnesota game with a bruised knee). He's 116 away from recording Nebraska's 15th 1,000-yard season (the 11th in the last 12 years). He ranks ninth nationally and third in the Big Eight in rushing at 126.29 ypg (behind national leader Eric Bieniemy of CU and Oklahoma State's Gerald Hudson). His 7.0 per-carry average is the best among the nation's top 21 rushers.

[*] REGGIE COOPER UPDATE: The senior from Slidell, La., was this week named one of 15 semifinalists for the Thorpe Award, which is given to the nation's top defensive back. It's the second-straight year that Cooper has been a Thorpe semifinalist. He's Nebraska's third-leading tackler this fall (46 total, 23 unassisted), and shares the team lead in pass breakups with four. Earlier this season, he became the Huskers' all-time leading tackler among defensive backs, and comes into today's game with 170 career tackles, including 104 solos. He's tied for 19th overall in total tackles and ranks 10th overall in solo stops.

[*] KENNY WALKER UPDATE: The senior DT from Crane, Texas, continues to be a one-man wrecking crew, and has earned a spot as one of 14 semifinalists for the Outland Trophy, presented annually to the nation's top lineman. Last week at Iowa State, he had seven total tackles, including three behind the line for 16 yards lost, one of which was a 5-yard sack. Walker is the Huskers' No. 2 tackler with 52 (five behind LB Pat Tyrance), and one in every three of his tackles has been behind the line. He leads NU in tackles for loss (17 for 96 yards), sacks (nine for 62), unassisted tackles (26), and quarterback hurries (16). Kenny is sixth on the Nebraska season sack list, and is tied for sixth in tackles for loss (see charts below). Led by Walker, Nebraska had piled up 38 sacks this season, equaling the fifth-best total on the NU charts and 11 short of the school record of 49 set in 1985.

[*] THE RECORD: This is Nebraska's 964th game, its 526th in Lincoln and its 371st in Memorial Stadium. The Huskers' 101-year record is 643-281-39 for a .688 winning percentage. NU ranks fifth among NCAA Division I-A teams in victories (one ahead of Penn State, which plays at West Virginia today), ninth in winning percentage. Nebraska is 386-119-20 all-time at home (.754), and 261-96-13 (.723) in Memorial Stadium, including 119-15 since artificial turf was first installed in 1970.

[*] JON BOSTICK UPDATE: The junior SE from Bellevue, Wash., comes into today's game as Nebraska's leading receiver, with 12 catches for 269 yards and four TD's. He's caught at least one pass in eight of nine games this year (the exception being Oregon State), and in 11 of the Huskers' 12 games since last year's Colorado game. The 6-foot-2, 185-pounder knows what to do with the ball once he catches it, too. He's no better than tied for 49th on the NU career receiving chart (with teammate Nate Turner and Dick Hutton), but he's 27th in receiving yards (558) and ninth in TD receptions (10). [*] THE STRINGS: Today is Nebraska's 175th consecutive home sellout, a continuing NCAA record which dates to 1962. The Huskers are assured of their 29th consecutive winning season, another continuing NCAA record which dates to 1962 (the last losing campaign was 3-6-1 in 1961), and a win today would assure 8-0 NU of its 22nd-consecutive nine-win season, an NCAA record which dates to 1969. The Huskers have won 19-straight home games since a 17-7 loss to Oklahoma in 1987. Nebraska is third in this week's Associated Press poll, and today's game is the 66th in a row for the Huskers in the AP top 10 and their 115th in a row in the top 20. NU has lost its last three games vs. top-10 teams since a 7-3 win at ninth-ranked Oklahoma in 1988. The Huskers have won 19-straight home games since a 17-7 loss to Oklahoma in 1987. Nebraska has scored in a Big Eight-record 206-consecutive games since a 27-0 loss at Oklahoma in 1973, and has won 60-straight Big Eight games vs. teams other than the Sooners and Colorado since a 35-31 loss to Missouri here in 1978.

[*] THIS DAY IN HUSKER HISTORY: Nebraska is 6-4-0 all-time in games played on Nov. 3, most-recently beating Iowa State 44-0 at Ames in 1984. On Nov. 3, 1962, the Huskers lost to Missouri here, 16-7. It was the first defeat for first-year head coach Bob Devaney, whose team had gotten off to a 6-0 start. Nebraska scored on Missouri for the first time in four years when Noel Martin returned a pass interception 88 yards for a second-quarter TD to tie the score, 7-7, but the Johnny Roland-led Tigers were too much for NU in the second half. It was the first of Nebraska's NCAA-record 175 consecutive home sellouts. On Nov. 3, 1973, Nebraska beat Colorado here, 28-16, after taking a 28-3 halftime lead. The Buffs' final score came on the old "swinging gate" play, when QB David Williams flipped the ball across the field to HB Billy Waddy, then ran downfield and caught a 73-yard TD pass from Waddy.

[*] ALL IN THE FAMILY: It's brother vs. brother today, as Nebraska's starting QB is junior MICKEY JOSEPH, and Colorado's No. 3 signal-caller is his younger brother, freshman VANCE JOSEPH. Mickey, 22, and Vance, 18, are the sons of Robert and Linda Joseph of Marrero, La., and both attended Archbishop Shaw HS in New Orleans. Mickey will see his first-ever action vs. Colorado today, while Vance, a true freshman, would obviously see his first action vs. Nebraska if he gets in the game. Another family affair involves Buffalo CB DAVE McCLOUGHAN, who is the son of KENT McCLOUGHAN, who played on Coach Bob Devaney's first three Nebraska teams (1962-64), and was an All-Big Eight HB for the Huskers as a senior. The elder McCloughan rushed for 860 yards and scored 112 points in his career. A two-way player, he led NU in interceptions in 1963 with three.
