GAME NOTES: COLORADO BUFFALOES (2-1-1) vs. WASHINGTON HUSKIES (3-0-0), SEPTEMBER 29, 1990

Special Welcome... to the Washington contingent headed by Athletic Director Mike Lude, SID Dave Senko, and Assistant SID Cindy Fester...we'd also like to welcome PSN-Northwest, televising the game (tape-delayed in Seattle), as well as Bruce Conway, former member of the Bluebonnet Bowl Committee...we're glad to have you with us this afternoon, along with all of our regulars...if we can be of any assistance to you, please don't hesitate to ask.

The Game... Colorado (2-1-1, ranked 16th in UPI & 20th in AP) vs. Washington (3-0-0, ranked 11th in UPI & 12th in AP)... • CU is shooting for its second straight victory after winning at Texas last week (29-22)...the Buffs opened the season tying Tennessee (31-31) in the Disneyland Pigskin Classic, then beat Stanford (21-17) in Boulder and lost at Illinois (23-22)... • Colorado is looking to extend its home winning streak to 10 games, carrying over from both the 1988 and 1989 campaigns... • Meanwhile, Washington is hoping to continue its four-game road winning streak, dating back to last year... • KOA-Radio (850 am in Denver) originates the 27-station CU Football Network...Kent Groshong, who normally does color commentary on the network, will fill in for Larry Zimmer (his Denver Bronco commitments prevent him from being here), and he'll call the play-by-play action...former Buff Bobby Anderson will serve as the color analyst.

The Crowd... The game is a complete sellout, with a capacity crowd of 51,463 on hand... • This marks the first time since 1974 that CU's first two home games drew over 50,000...the only other time that happened was in 1972... • For more on 50,000-plus crowds at Folsom Field, see page 3 of the game notes.

O-State Returns 1,000 Tickets... Oklahoma State has returned 1,000 tickets for the CU-OSU game, Nov. 10...the CU athletic ticket office will have these remaining tickets on sale for \$20 beginning Monday, Oct. 1...kickoff for this Homecoming game is set for 1 p.m.

The Coaches... Colorado head coach Bill McCartney (Missouri '62) is in his ninth season at Colorado...his overall record at CU stands at 48-46-2 (.510 pct.), while his career coaching slate is the same...McCartney is 41-21-1 (.659 pct.) over the last five seasons, and 34-12-1 (.734 pct.) since the start of the 1986 Big Eight Conference season...he is coaching in his 97th game at CU (eight-plus seasons), which puts him fourth in longevity at Colorado...Mac owns a 1-1 record vs. Washington... ● Washington head coach, Don James (Miami [Fla.], '54) is in his 16th season at Washington, posting a 125-52-3 (.703 pct.) record...the former Colorado assistant (under Eddie Crowder, 1968-70), who is returning to Folsom Field for the first time since his assistant coaching stint at CU, has a 150-71-3 (.675 pct.) mark in 20 seasons as a head coach...he is 1-2 against the Buffs.

Post-Game Press Conference... with Coach McCartney will be held in the SE meeting room of the CU team house (enter on south side of building) following a 10-minute cooling-off period after the game...the Buff locker room is open to the media...members of the CU Athletic Media Relations office will be in the locker room to help with interviews... ● Check with Washington SID Dave Senko for the Huskies' postgame locker room policy.

The Series... This is the eighth time these two clubs have met, as Colorado pulled even in the all-time series by virtue of its 45-28 win in Seattle last year... ● Neither team in this series has won two games in a row, while Colorado has never led... ● This will be only the second meeting between the two in Boulder, as the Huskies prevailed in the previous game, 21-12 (Sept. 19, 1959)... ● The last time these two squared off (Sept. 30, 1989), Darian Hagan directed No.5 Colorado to six scores in nine drives as the Buffs won 45-28 over No.21 Washington in Seattle...CU went to 4-0 on the year, while the Huskies dropped to 2-2...the win capped an emotional week for the Buffs, as former QB Sal Aunese succumbed to stomach cancer just one week earlier (Sept. 23)...the CU offense, which took a 21-6 halftime lead, galloped for 420 yards on the ground, and then put 17 more points on the scoreboard in the third quarter to ice the game...two of Washington's three TDs came against the second- and third-team CU defense.

Colorado vs. the Pacific Ten Conference...The Buffs are 30-24-1 against teams from the Pac-10 Conference, having posted victories in the last five matchups, including a 21-17 win over Stanford in their last home game this year...the four other wins were against Washington (1989), Oregon State (1988), and Stanford and Washington State (1977)... ● The Buffs have had the most success against Arizona from the Pac-10, owning a 12-1 mark... Here are the Buffs' marks against other Pac-10 teams: 3-1 vs. Stanford, 2-1 vs. Washington State, 6-6 vs. Oregon, 3-3-1 vs. Washington, 2-2 vs. California, 2-3 vs. Oregon State, 0-3 vs. Southern California, and 0-4 vs. UCLA.

Folsom Field Streak on the Line... In the summer of 1989, the 11-year-old artificial turf at Folsom Field was removed and replaced with a new carpet of AstroTurf-8... ● All three times that the AstroTurf has been replaced at Folsom Field, the Buffs have posted wins in the first game played on the new carpet...in fact, when the turf was replaced in 1971, the Buffs went undefeated at home that year (carried over into 1972 season for nine-straight victories) and in 1978, CU opened with five wins in-a-row at home... ● Last season, the Buffs went 6-0 at home to record another undefeated season at Folsom Field...this year, CU is looking for its second home victory, as they have yet to lose on the new artificial turf at Folsom.

Another Streak on the Line... With last year's 6-0 home mark, and two home victories to close out 1988, the Buffs are shooting for their 10th straight home win (the last CU home loss was 17-14 to Oklahoma in 1988, a night game carried by ESPN)... ● The CU record for most consecutive home victories is 12 (1895-1898)... ● The last time CU won 10 straight home games was from 1970-72, while the last nine-game home winning streak was from 1974-76... ● Here's a look at CU's last nine Folsom Field wins:

Folsom Field Capacity Crowds... The Buffs have had 11 50,000-plus crowds at Folsom Field since 1980 (33 all-time), including this year's crowd of 50,669 vs. Stanford...before today's sellout, the most recent sellouts were last year's Missouri (51,855) and Nebraska (52,877) games... ● Of the 11 50,000-plus crowds since 1980, six were against Nebraska, two against Oklahoma, and one against Missouri... ● The last time CU soldout against a non-conference opponent was vs. Notre Dame in 1983 (52,692)... ● Colorado posts an 18-16 mark all-time in front of 50,000-plus crowds... ● Here's a look at Colorado's 50,000-plus crowds since 1980:

- In its last 15 games on artificial turf, Colorado is 14-1.
- In Bill McCartney's tenure at CU, the Buffs are 34-12-1 when scoring first, and 14-33-1 when the opponent has drawn the first blood.
- Colorado has allowed 40 or more points only twice in the last five-plus seasons (spanning 63 games)...Oklahoma State was the culprit both times.

Colorado Notes (cont.)...

- The Buffs have thrown only 23 interceptions in the last 32 games, covering 365 passing attempts.
- Colorado has only 49 turnovers in its last 28 games, an average of a little more than one-and-a-half per outing...CU also has had 10 turnover free games in its last 38.
- Only Oklahoma State and Tennessee have been able to score more than 30 points on the CU defense in the Buffs' last 48 games.
- The Buffs are one of 26 teams in NCAA history to record 500 victories...with an overall record of 523-340-33, CU currently stands 25th on the all-time victory list...their .602 winning percentage puts them 28th on that ledger...the only other two teams from the Big Eight Conference to rank ahead of CU are Nebraska and Oklahoma.
- Colorado is in its 55th season at Folsom Field (originally called Colorado Stadium)...CU's all-time record on the "hilltop" stands at 214-109-8 (.667).
- Head Coach Bill McCartney is coaching his 97th game as the CU mentor, and will be fourth in coaching longevity in Boulder...he is topped by only Eddie Crowder (119), Dal Ward (110) and Fred Folsom (102).

Buffalo Injuries... ILB Chad Brown (mild left knee sprain) will play... ● QB Darian Hagan (minor left ankle sprain) will play... ● TB Eric Bieniemy (mild right ankle sprain) is 100 percent... ● ILB Greg Biekert (shoulder strain) is better, and will play.

Colorado Player Notes...

- OLB Alfred Williams became the third Buff in four weeks this season to be named Big Eight Player-of-the-Week (the second defensive player)...Williams had 10 tackles (seven solo), two quarterback sacks (one for a safety), a tackle for loss and two QB hurries in CU's win over Texas last week.
- For the fourth straight week, three Colorado players are represented on a couple of prestigious checklists... OG Joe Garten, OLB Kanavis McGhee, and OLB Alfred Williams are on the 12-man nominee list for the Lombardi Award...McGhee and Williams are also among the 12 early finalists for the Butkus Award.
- For the first time since 1958, Colorado is appointing its captains for each game...this season, Bill McCartney and his staff are selecting four seniors to serve as captains for each of the five non-conference games...once that portion of the schedule is over, the team will vote on the captains for the remainder of the season...this afternoon's captains are TB Eric Bieniemy, DT Garry Howe, LB Rob Hutchins, SS Tim James, and OT Ariel Solomon.
- OG Joe Garten now has 36 career starts, four shy of breaking the school record of 39 held by Mickey Pruitt (now of the NFL's Chicago Bears)...Garten has started every game of his career, but missed a game as a sophomore due to a sprained ankle.
- SS Tim James, OT Mark Vander Poel and OLB Alfred Williams have all started 28 straight games, the longest current streaks on the team.
- Four of Colorado's 25 seniors have already earned their sheepskin and are enrolled in graduate courses this fall...CB David Gibbs and CB Dave McCloughan (both marketing majors) are enrolled in CU's M.B.A. program, while TE David Brown and SS Tim James (both sociology majors) will be taking graduate courses in criminology.

Last Year... Colorado finished the regular season with an 11-0 mark, the nation's only undefeated team, and won its first Big Eight title since 1976...the Buffs attained their first-ever No.1 national ranking, and had a shot at the national championship, only to come up short in a 21-6 loss to Notre Dame at the Orange Bowl... ● Washington posted an 8-4-0 record, finishing 5-3-0 in the Pac-10 Conference (tied for second).
